DJCraze enters 2026 ranked dead last in the Gauntlet division and in just the 11th percentile of the entire field, and the roster offers very little reason to argue with either number. The best-case scenario here leans heavily on Jahmyr Gibbs, the RB1 projection, doing what top backs do when everything goes right. The problem is that after Gibbs the floor drops fast, and the draft tendencies made things harder rather than easier. Quinshon Judkins, projected RB22, was taken nearly three full rounds before his ADP, meaning DJCraze paid a steep premium for a player who grades out as a solid but unremarkable contributor. Malik Nabers carries a WR12 projection and cost a full round more than he should have. Reaching on two players that firmly in a 15-round draft is the kind of early tax that leaves a roster thin on late-round upside precisely when it needs it most. Trevor Lawrence projecting as QB10 does not help the cause. Coming off a 3rd-percentile scoring season in 2025, this team needed a reset. The 2026 draft did not deliver one.

JoeChapeau enters 2026 sitting 11th in the Gauntlet and in just the 17th percentile of the field, and nothing in the draft history suggests a turnaround is hiding around the corner. The headline problem is at receiver, where Terry McLaurin at WR24 is the only projectable starter on the depth chart, a thin foundation to build anything on. The backfield is genuinely deep and talented, with James Cook at RB5 and Chase Brown at RB11 leading a long chain of contributors, but in a positionless format that abundance can only take you so far when the rest of the roster is pulling in the other direction. The draft itself offers little comfort: two major reaches, both at quarterback, consumed early capital on Jayden Daniels at QB5 and Jaxson Dart at QB11 before the market said either was worth taking. Daniels and McLaurin stack together, which is a real thing, but it is a life raft on a sinking ship, not a championship blueprint. JoeChapeau looks like a team that drafted its ceiling first and ran out of floor.

Vikings0606 drafted like someone who read every cheat sheet and waited patiently for the market to come to them, and the cruelest part is that the patience mostly worked. Justin Herbert fell two full rounds to pick 5.09, Mark Andrews slid more than a round to 10.04, and Cam Ward was practically a gift at 14.04. Nine chalk picks and two legitimate steals is a draft profile that should produce a competitive roster. Instead, Vikings0606 sits 10th in the Gauntlet and in the bottom fifth of the field, which means all that disciplined waiting produced a team that projects to lose more than it wins. The culprits are easy enough to spot: Parker Washington and Josh Downs were reached a combined five rounds early, burning capital that could have addressed exactly the kind of depth the team now needs. Lamar Jackson and Andrews form a real stack, and Jonathan Taylor at RB4 gives the roster a genuine anchor, but anchors do not move a ship. The value was found. The roster still does not add up.

There is no elegant way to spin a 21st-percentile roster projection, and rgoldstein deserves the honest version. The draft leaned heavily on chalk, nine picks tracking ADP almost exactly, and the two major reaches, Matthew Stafford at QB14 and Hunter Henry at TE18, consumed real draft capital on players whose ceilings are already priced in. Jaxon Smith-Njigba grades out as a legitimate WR3 and Drake Maye offers real upside at QB2, so the floor is not dirt, but the projected starter pool beyond those two thins out quickly. Tony Pollard projects as the weakest starter on the roster at RB30, and the Stafford-Davante Adams stack is the kind of move that feels clever until you remember Stafford is QB14 and Adams is WR25 and you are essentially doubling down on a middling outcome. rgoldstein went 53 percent last season in a reasonably competitive field, which is survivable, not a foundation to build on. The lever was the draft, and the draft was mostly chalk with a couple of expensive overcorrections.

Rdip444 enters 2026 ranked eighth in the Gauntlet Division and sitting at just the 27th percentile of the field, and the draft record is not going to inspire any rallying cries. Six major reaches across the board tells you everything: this is a roster built on hope over market reality. Deebo Samuel, a projected WR70, came off the board more than five rounds early. Darnell Washington, a projected TE38, was taken more than seven rounds before his ADP warranted. Those are not aggressive gambles on upside, they are draft capital spent in the wrong places at the wrong prices. The roster does have genuine talent at the top, Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and Ashton Jeanty at RB7 give Rdip444 a real foundation, and Kenneth Walker III at RB10 was the one legitimate value of the entire draft. But when your projected weakest starter is Kenneth Gainwell at RB34, and last season produced a 39 percent win rate, there is no comfortable cushion beneath those stars and no obvious fix available now that the draft is done.

DJDeBlaz is sitting at seventh in the Gauntlet division and projects out at the 33rd percentile of the field, and the roster tells you exactly why. The backfield is genuinely elite, with Bijan Robinson (RB2), De'Von Achane (RB6), and Saquon Barkley (RB8) forming a top line that most managers would trade their firstborn for, and Barkley arriving as a legitimate steal at 4.08 against a 3.02 ADP makes the haul even sweeter. But this is a positionless format that starts ten, and elite backs can only carry so much water when the rest of the roster is this thin at the top. Bo Nix (QB15) and Zay Flowers (WR16) are the headliners beyond the backfield, and neither is scaring anyone. Five minor reaches and a major reach on David Njoku (TE29), taken more than two rounds early, suggest a drafter chasing depth in places that didn't need it while the roster's ceiling went unaddressed. There is no obvious move left, no hidden upside player lurking. DJDeBlaz has real pieces and a real problem, and those two things are not currently speaking to each other.

KnowBull didn't make headlines on draft day, and that's probably why they're worth watching. The story here isn't one splashy pick but a quiet accumulation of correct decisions, most visible at the top of the roster where it counts. Brock Purdy landed at QB13 when the board fell two full rounds past his ADP, and Kyler Murray followed at QB19 under similar circumstances, each of them arriving cheaper than they should have. Stack those quarterbacks with George Kittle and Justin Jefferson respectively and you have two built-in upside levers that cost a fraction of what they were worth. Justin Jefferson at WR6 and Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 anchor a receiving corps that is genuinely difficult to argue with, and Tetairoa McMillan at WR15 and Garrett Wilson at WR17 keep the quality from dropping off fast. The 2025 campaign was modest, 46th percentile in scoring, but the draft capital deployed here suggests the front office learned something. Sixth in the Gauntlet is a provisional address. This roster has a case for better.

The Windrunners sit 5th in the Gauntlet Division and 61st percentile overall, which is a perfectly respectable place to be when your draft looked, at times, like someone was shopping without looking at the price tags. Two major reaches, two minor reaches, and zero steals is not a flattering receipt. But here is the thing: the receipt does not match the pantry. Josh Allen at QB1 anchors everything, Colston Loveland at TE3 gives the lineup a genuine edge at a position where edges matter, and Derrick Henry at RB12 arrived as a value, falling nearly a full round past his ADP. The conviction play that most deserves scrutiny is Courtland Sutton, taken 2.1 rounds early at WR37, a price that assumes health and opportunity break right. Jordan Love is the other name worth watching closely. Green Bay has talked about leaning on Love's arm more, but he has never cracked 35 passing touchdowns in a season, and his supporting cast is still sorting itself out. If Love finally closes the gap between his NFL value and his fantasy output, the Windrunners look smart. If he does not, they look lucky. Probably both things are a little true.

dido2242 did not stumble into correlation, they engineered it. The two stacks anchoring this roster, Joe Burrow paired with Tee Higgins and Patrick Mahomes paired with Rashee Rice, are not hedges or happy accidents, they are the architecture. When Burrow goes off, Higgins goes off with him. When Mahomes is locked in, Rice is the first beneficiary. That dual-stack construction is what pushes this team into the 78th percentile, because the ceiling on any given week is not capped by a single game script, it is multiplied by two. The Mahomes situation deserves acknowledgment, recovering from a torn ACL and LCL is no small thing, but the reports out of his camp are genuinely encouraging, and if Mahomes is on the field in Week 1, Rice becomes one of the most attractive starters in the tournament. Brian Thomas Jr. landing at WR31 after falling more than two full rounds past his ADP gives dido2242 a live starting option behind those stacks. The correlation is the plan. When it hits, this team is very difficult to beat.

After finishing in the bottom 17 percent of the field in scoring a year ago, marcusmanzoni has rebuilt into something genuinely worth admiring, currently projecting at the 83rd percentile and sitting third in the Gauntlet division. The engine of this turnaround is a receiver corps headlined by Puka Nacua (WR1), A.J. Brown (WR8), and Nico Collins (WR9), three projected starters who would be the envy of most rosters in this tournament. Brown in particular carries real upside after his move to New England, where Drake Maye's blossoming arm could unlock the kind of production Brown flashes when healthy and featured. The draft process behind this roster deserves credit too: Jalen Hurts (QB9), Breece Hall (RB14), and Dallas Goedert (TE15) were all snagged past their ADPs, giving marcusmanzoni a foundation built on patience rather than panic. Last year this roster was the story no one wanted to tell. In 2026, it looks like the one everyone will be watching.

dennisd414 didn't win the draft with one thunderbolt pick. They won it by being right, over and over, in ways that quietly compound. Christian McCaffrey slipping to 2.01 when his ADP sat at 1.09 is the kind of thing that looks obvious in hindsight and requires genuine conviction in the moment. Ladd McConkey followed a similar path, falling more than a round past his ADP before dennisd414 scooped him up as a projected WR20 starter. Stack those values against a clean reach profile, just two minor ones and nothing catastrophic, and you have a draft that kept accumulating small edges instead of gambling them away. The top of the roster reflects it: CeeDee Lamb at WR5 pairs with a Dak Prescott stack that adds real upside, and Harold Fannin anchors the tight end group at TE6. After a 34th-percentile finish in 2025, dennisd414 rebuilt the process and landed at 87th percentile in the field and second in the Gauntlet. That's not luck. That's what disciplined drafting looks like when it finally cashes.

Gregmanzoni enters 2026 sitting first in the Gauntlet division and in the 94th percentile of the field, and the draft record explains exactly why: two steals, two values, just one minor reach, and zero major reaches across the entire board. The headliner is Caleb Williams, a projected QB6 who slid two full rounds past his ADP and lands in a live stack with Luther Burden, a WR22 projection that gregmanzoni grabbed slightly early but at a price that looks more than fair in hindsight. Add Brock Bowers at TE1 and Tyler Warren at TE4 as projected starters, and the positional advantage at that spot alone could carry weeks. Christian Watson fell nearly two rounds before gregmanzoni pounced, and Drake London projects as a WR7 anchor holding the whole receiving corps together. The weakest projected starter is Jordan Addison at WR43, which is the kind of floor most managers would envy. This roster was not built on luck or a single home run swing, it was built pick by pick, and the result is one of the cleaner constructions in the tournament.
