There is no version of this draft that flatters jwassyoda, and the numbers make no effort to hide it. Zero steals, zero values, five reaches including four major ones, and a division rank of 12 tell you everything about how this board went. The headline damage is at the top: Derrick Henry landed at RB12 after being taken a full round and a half before his ADP, and Mike Evans came in at WR27 after jwassyoda grabbed him nearly two rounds early. Those two picks alone consumed premium capital chasing players whose ceilings were already baked into their prices, which means the rest of the roster was built on fumes. Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 is the one genuine anchor here, and the quarterback situation offers no comfort, with Tyler Shough and C.J. Stroud projecting as QB20 and QB22 respectively. Shough is 27 years old with a polished enough game, but even optimism about his Year 2 development lands in "maybe" territory. This is a team that paid full price for discount goods and is now sitting at the bottom of the Last of Us division hoping the projections are wrong.

The headstone for DiegolsWin's 2026 season might as well read: reached early, reached often, reached into the void. Four major reaches in a single draft is not bad luck, it is a philosophy, and this particular philosophy produced Quentin Johnston at WR41 and Deebo Samuel at WR70 as the top two receivers on the roster. Johnston was pulled off the board 4.5 rounds ahead of his ADP, Samuel nearly 5.5 rounds early, and both landed in the same projected cellar anyway. The running back group, anchored by Bijan Robinson at RB2 and De'Von Achane at RB6, is genuinely strong, but this is a positionless format and strength at the top of a lineup is only as meaningful as what surrounds it. What surrounds it here is thin at quarterback, thin at receiver, and capped by Juwan Johnson as the weakest projected starter on the entire roster. The team sits third in the division and in the third percentile of the field. DiegolsWin had a real draft board once. Whatever happened to it.

RAHolz sits 10th in the Last of Us division and in just the 16th percentile of the field, and the roster does not hide why. The top end is genuinely fine: Drake Maye projects as a QB2 and James Cook as an RB5, giving RAHolz a credible foundation. But credible foundations do not win tournaments, and everything below that top tier goes soft in a hurry. Kyren Williams at RB15 and Chris Olave at WR11 are useful, not dangerous, and projected starters like Josh Downs at WR46 represent the kind of depth that gets exposed over a long season. The draft did not do much to change the trajectory. Jake Ferguson was pulled two full rounds ahead of his ADP and projects only as a TE12, which is the most visible symptom of a draft that leaned on wishful thinking over patience. Jared Goff fell to RAHolz as genuine late value, but a QB16 functioning as your contingency plan is a detail, not a turnaround. There is no obvious lever left to pull here, just a long season and a roster that is already showing its ceiling.

Mcbobs23 sits ninth in the Last of Us division and projects at just the 32nd percentile of the field, and the roster itself tells you why there is not an easy fix. The receiver group is genuinely excellent, Justin Jefferson at WR6, Nico Collins at WR9, and Ladd McConkey at WR20 headlining a corps that most managers would envy, but that group is already doing the heavy lifting it can do, and there is nowhere left to squeeze more juice. The problem is at the other end of the roster, where Blake Corum projects as RB35, Rico Dowdle as RB32, and Hunter Henry as TE18, and none of them are the kind of player who changes a season's ceiling. The draft did not help matters: Collins was the one meaningful reach of the draft, taken nearly a full round before his ADP at 2.02, which means resources went toward securing a player the market said could have waited. Mcbobs23 is banking on their stars carrying dead weight, and in a field this competitive, that is a hard ask.

BrettFord33 sits eighth in the Last of Us division and barely cracks the 46th percentile of the field, and the roster construction does not offer much reason for optimism. The anchor here is Ja'Marr Chase at WR2, a genuine difference-maker, but the supporting cast grades out thin fast. Colston Loveland at TE3 is a legitimate bright spot and technically a value after falling nearly a round past his ADP, yet one elite tight end does not reshape a roster's ceiling. The draft process itself was uneven: six chalk picks, three minor reaches, and a major reach on Malik Willis at QB24 taken 2.2 rounds early, a cost that is hard to justify for the QB24. Meanwhile, the projected weakest starter is Stefon Diggs at WR56, which is the kind of floor that tends to decide close weeks in the wrong direction. BrettFord33 posted a serviceable 58 percent win rate in 2025, so the competence is there, but this roster as constructed gives Chase too much to carry and leaves the rest of the lineup hoping projections break kindly.

Cptowers sits at that uncomfortable middle altitude where good enough and not good enough start to blur together. The 63rd percentile projection and a 7th-place division standing are not alarm bells, but they are not reassurances either. The foundation is genuinely strong: Lamar Jackson at QB3 and Trey McBride at TE2 are the kind of cornerstones that give a manager a weekly floor, and Harold Fannin at TE6 only deepens that advantage. The concern is what happens at the margins. Malik Nabers at WR12 and Marvin Harrison Jr. at WR33 are the projected starters at receiver, and Harrison's WR33 projection is the kind of number that wins close weeks when he runs hot and costs them when he does not. The draft leaned chalk, with eight picks landing right at ADP and only one real value surfacing in Trevor Lawrence. Brian Robinson, taken nearly three rounds ahead of his ADP, represents the one significant gamble. Cptowers will not be anyone's easiest matchup, but in a tournament decided by thin margins, thin margins are exactly the problem.

Cornseller didn't need a blockbuster moment to build something worth watching in 2026, just consistent decision-making that quietly stacked the odds in their favor. The clearest example is Christian McCaffrey, projected RB3 and snagged at 2.03 when his ADP sat at 1.09, half a round of free value on one of the best players in the tournament. That kind of disciplined patience shows up in the receiver group too, where Amon-Ra St. Brown (WR4), Rashee Rice (WR13), and Zay Flowers (WR16) form a projected starting core that most managers would take without hesitation. The Mahomes-Rice stack adds a ceiling layer that can swing a week in a hurry. Eleven chalk picks out of twelve and zero reaches tells you cornseller wasn't gambling on upside or panicking under pressure, just drafting the board. Sitting 64th percentile in the tournament field coming off a below-average 2025, this roster looks like a meaningful step forward, built the boring, effective way.

Knicks On Fire didn't need a single headline moment to build something worth watching in the Last of Us division. The foundation starts with Josh Allen, a QB1 who somehow slipped to pick 1.09 despite an ADP of 1.05, a small gap that still counts as winning. Pair him with Joe Burrow at QB4 and the passing game alone could carry weeks. The real story, though, is how consistently the back end of the draft held up. Josh Jacobs fell nearly two rounds past his ADP before Knicks On Fire scooped him up at 7.09, and Tyler Warren at TE4 anchors a position group that gives the roster a genuine edge on most nights. Yes, Rachaad White was a significant reach at 10.04, and Khalil Shakir projects as the WR51 in the starting lineup, but one reach and one thin projection are manageable taxes on an otherwise disciplined draft. Last season's 64 percent win rate and 56th percentile scoring suggest a team that competes without drama, and the 2026 construction points in exactly the same direction.

FBGDylan did not build this roster with one flashy swing. The draft was built brick by brick, and the cumulative result is something worth taking seriously. The centerpiece is a receiver group that would make most managers envious, anchored by Jaxon Smith-Njigba (WR3) and A.J. Brown (WR8), with Tetairoa McMillan (WR15) and Jameson Williams (WR21) providing genuine depth behind them. Brown is the wild card here: now paired with Drake Maye in New England after four productive seasons in Philadelphia, the combination of his talent and Maye's arm raises his ceiling considerably, provided he can stay on the field through a history of missing games. The quarterback situation is quietly excellent. Jayden Daniels (QB5) fell two and a half rounds past his ADP, which is the kind of gift that defines draft grades in retrospect, and he arrives in the lineup already stacked with Terry McLaurin (WR24). Nine chalk picks signal a manager who trusted the board and did not force anything. The result is a team currently sitting at 79th percentile, built not on drama but on discipline.

Maddogwm94 sits third in the division and at the 82nd percentile of the field, and the draft record tells you exactly why: one steal, two values, eight chalk picks, and just one minor reach across the whole board. That is not an accident, that is discipline. The headliner is Cam Skattebo, snagged at 9.04 despite an ADP of 7.02, a two-round freefall that Maddogwm94 was patient enough to let happen and sharp enough to capitalize on. Pair Skattebo with Ashton Jeanty at RB7 and Kenneth Walker III at RB10 and the top of this roster is genuinely difficult to argue with. Jaxson Dart sliding more than a round past his ADP gave the manager a QB11 projection at a discount, and Puka Nacua at WR1 gives this team a receiver who can carry a week on his own. Tony Pollard at RB30 is the weakest projected starter, but in a positionless format where the best players simply play, the floor here is high and the ceiling is higher.

msavoca didn't swing for the fences and whiff, didn't gamble on upside and get burned. This roster was built pick by pick, and the cumulative effect is a team sitting at 85th percentile in the field heading into 2026. The foundation is a receiver group that would make most managers uncomfortable to face: Drake London at WR7, George Pickens at WR10, and Tee Higgins at WR19 all projecting as starters, with London arriving a full round past his ADP. Then add Brock Bowers at TE1 anchoring the tight end group alongside Kyle Pitts at TE7 and George Kittle at TE9, with Kittle sliding nearly two rounds past his ADP before msavoca quietly grabbed him. Seven chalk picks and three genuine values tells the story cleanly: this was a draft that simply kept winning the small moments. Last season's 94th percentile scoring output suggests the process is sound. Nothing flashy, nothing lucky, just a manager who came to work and left with the better end of the deal more often than not.

MEGABUSH69 sits at the top of the Last of Us division and in the 89th percentile of the entire field, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. The marquee move is a two-quarterback haul that reads like a masterclass in patience: Caleb Williams fell to pick 6.01 despite projecting as QB6, and Justin Herbert landed at 5.12 despite a QB8 projection, each sliding more than two rounds past their ADP while other managers apparently looked elsewhere. That kind of discipline at quarterback translates directly into lineup flexibility everywhere else, because the format rewards whoever fields their best ten players regardless of position. Anchoring the skill positions are Jonathan Taylor at RB4, Saquon Barkley at RB8, and CeeDee Lamb at WR5, a core that most managers would trade their entire bench to own. The one soft spot in the projection is Oronde Gadsden at TE16, whose path got murkier when the Chargers signed David Njoku late in the offseason. But one unsettled depth chart at tight end does not dent a roster this clean.
