FROBEARD drafted like someone who had already decided they were right before the board confirmed it, and the numbers have no interest in playing along. Zero steals, zero values, and five major reaches across an 18-round draft is not bad luck, it is a philosophy, and a costly one. The most damning exhibit is Jaxson Dart, pulled off the board at pick 3.12 when his ADP sat more than a round and a half later, a price that would be defensible for a QB1 and is quietly embarrassing for a QB11. Ashton Jeanty is the real thing at RB7, and Justin Jefferson at WR6 gives this roster a legitimate foundation, but FROBEARD then spent the rest of the draft compounding the Dart decision with four additional major reaches, including Blake Corum and Zach Charbonnet at RB35 and RB42, positions where the market had already told everyone else to wait. Coming off a 29th-percentile scoring season in 2025, FROBEARD is currently projecting third in the division, and nothing about how this roster was assembled argues for optimism.

The Blue Bombers did almost everything right on draft day and still landed at 26th percentile, which is the kind of outcome that makes you question the entire enterprise. The value column is genuinely impressive: Rashee Rice at WR13, Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4, and a backfield loaded with projected starters, most of them acquired at or after their average draft positions. Denzel Boston fell more than four rounds past his ADP before this team grabbed him, and Jordan Addison and Jakobi Meyers each fell nearly two rounds into Blue Bombers territory. The draft was disciplined, patient, and largely correct. Then you look at where it all lands: 11th in the Mega Man division, 26th percentile in the field, with Addison projecting as the weakest projected starter at WR43. The pieces were priced right and assembled carefully, and the sum is a roster projected to finish near the bottom of its division anyway. Value hunting is only a strategy if it builds toward something, and right now the Blue Bombers are proof that buying low and arriving nowhere is its own kind of trap.

Mega Manning did almost everything right at the draft table. The receiver values were real, with Romeo Doubs, Stefon Diggs, and Ryan Flournoy all sliding past their ADPs, and the tight end group around Tyler Warren, George Kittle, Mark Andrews, and Dallas Goedert is legitimately strong. The problem is that buying value at positions of strength does not fix weakness elsewhere, and the receiver group, even discounted, tops out at Parker Washington at WR35. Meanwhile, the Geno Smith reach at round 11.10 for a QB30 is the pick that quietly unravels everything. Lamar Jackson and Joe Burrow anchor the position well enough, but spending pick equity two-and-a-half rounds early on a third quarterback, in a positionless format where that draft capital could have addressed the receiver ceiling, is a real cost. Mega Manning trusted the value game, followed the process faithfully, and arrived at a roster sitting tenth in the division and in the 28th percentile of the field. Sometimes the math is just honest with you.

scotteking did almost everything right at the draft table. Thirteen chalk picks, two genuine values, zero steals but also just one reach, and that patience produced a roster that projects 41st percentile in the tournament, good for ninth in the Mega Man division. The cruelty is in the details. Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and Saquon Barkley at RB8 are the kind of cornerstones that should carry a team deep into October, and Jayden Daniels at QB5 adds genuine upside at a position most managers ignore until late. But the floor drops off faster than you'd like. Brian Thomas Jr. at WR31 was the best value on the board, falling nearly a round and a half past his ADP, and he projects as a starter. Xavier Worthy at WR49 is the projected weak link, and Elijah Arroyo, the one player scotteking actually reached for, cost seven and a half rounds of draft capital to land a TE40. The stars are real. The depth behind them is where this carefully constructed value exercise quietly falls apart.

Last year's Average Joes went 34-2 and finished in the 100th percentile, which is the kind of résumé that makes a manager dangerous, because everyone, including the manager, starts believing the name on the back of the jersey matters more than the players on the field. The 2026 roster projects at the 44th percentile and sits eighth in the Mega Man division, and the gap between those two numbers is not a slump, it is a roster construction story told in draft capital. Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Harold Fannin at TE6 are legitimate anchors, but the draft behind them leaned hard on speculation: Jaylen Warren was taken nearly three rounds ahead of his ADP, Darnell Washington nearly five rounds early, and Jaydon Blue almost eight full rounds early, all of them projecting well outside the top 30 at their positions. Jordan Love and Cam Ward headline a quarterback group graded weak, with Love slotted at QB17. The talent ceiling is real, but this roster was built on last year's confidence more than this year's evidence.

Pew Pew Pew sits at the 51st percentile, which sounds like a polite way of saying "fine," and fine is exactly what this roster is. The margins decide everything here, and the margins are genuinely close. Trey McBride at TE2 is a real weapon, and the surrounding tight end depth, including Dalton Kincaid at TE11, gives this team legitimate upside at the position, assuming Kincaid's knee cooperates. Bills GM Brandon Beane's "too early to tell" comment is not the kind of ringing endorsement that inspires confidence, and if Kincaid misses time again, that upside shrinks fast. Drake London at WR7 and Kenneth Walker III at RB10 give the lineup a credible top end, and the draft was largely disciplined, 13 chalk picks with only one minor reach in Rome Odunze. Nothing here blows you away, and nothing here embarrasses you. Pew Pew Pew bounced around a 27th-percentile scoring season in 2025, and whether 2026 looks different probably comes down to whether the players who were supposed to stay healthy actually do.

azacc13 sits at 53rd percentile and sixth in the Mega Man division, which is exactly where the roster feels like it belongs: capable enough to beat you on a good week, beatable enough that nobody is losing sleep over the matchup. The top of the lineup is genuinely strong, with Josh Allen at QB1 and CeeDee Lamb at WR5 giving this team a ceiling that most managers in the field would take. The problem is what surrounds them. Travis Kelce is officially back for 2026, but he's projecting as TE10, hoping to claw back into top-12 relevance rather than commanding it, and that uncertainty bleeds into a roster where the margins decide everything. The draft only sharpened the tension: two major reaches in Deebo Samuel and Kayshon Boutte, both pulled four rounds ahead of consensus, suggest a manager who knows what they want but may have paid too much to get it. When your best weeks depend on Allen and Lamb carrying freight, and your depth hinges on players taken on faith, the difference between a winning record and an early exit is thinner than it looks on paper.

Moonpipe did not build this roster by swinging for the fences and missing. They built it by consistently coming out ahead, and the cumulative effect is a team that sits at the 58th percentile with real upside baked in. The foundation starts with Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and Caleb Williams at QB6, two projected starters who anchor the lineup and give moonpipe a ceiling most managers in the Mega Man division cannot match. The draft board backed that foundation up quietly: Jalen Hurts fell nearly a full round past his ADP, and moonpipe was there to take him at QB9. Add Colston Loveland at TE3, a legitimate difference-maker at his position, and the Williams-Loveland stack gives this roster an additional point of leverage. Terry McLaurin, Davante Adams, and D.J. Moore all project as starters and all land within a few spots of each other in the WR20s, which means depth here is real, not theoretical. No single pick looks like a heist, but pick after pick held its own, and that kind of quiet competence adds up.

Nix in 5 didn't need a unicorn pick to build something worth watching, just a draft that kept finding the right player at the right time. Jonathan Taylor landing at RB4 two picks after his ADP and Jameson Williams slipping to WR21 a full round and a half past where the field expected him to go are the kinds of quiet wins that separate competent managers from lucky ones. Stack those against the foundation of Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and George Pickens at WR10, and this roster has genuine top-end production before you even get to the depth. The one blemish worth noting is Chimere Dike, reached nearly three rounds early at WR84, a price that rarely pays off at that tier. But one aggressive swing in the back half of a draft is survivable when the earlier rounds look like these did. Sitting 62nd percentile and fourth in the Mega Man division, Nix in 5 is exactly the kind of quietly assembled team that makes noise in January.

New York Rcs landed at 69th percentile and third in the division, and the draft sheet looks like a manager who was perpetually jumping the line. Two major reaches, two minor reaches, and zero steals. And yet the roster they built is genuinely hard to argue with. Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 is a star, James Cook at RB5 gives them a backfield anchor, and Chase Brown at RB11 means the depth behind him is real. The two players who look worst on paper are actually the ones that tell the whole story. Ray Davis, reached on by 7.3 rounds, sits at RB62, which is a gamble. Christian Kirk, reached on by 7.8 rounds, sits at WR100, which is another one. Both picks suggest a manager who saw something the board did not, or who got sentimental late and got away with it. The difference between those two explanations matters less when Jared Goff and Sam LaPorta are stacked together in the lineup and Smith-Njigba is the centerpiece. New York Rcs drafted with conviction. The roster, mostly, backed it up.

Nova Strike did not win the draft with one thunderbolt pick. They won it by showing up to every round. Patrick Mahomes at QB12 slid more than a full round past his ADP and Nova Strike was right there to collect. Jauan Jennings fell over two rounds before they grabbed him at WR63. Juwan Johnson dropped the same distance before landing at TE20. None of those moves look like genius in isolation, but the pattern is the point: this roster accumulated value the way a good team accumulates wins, steadily and without drama. Anchoring it all is Puka Nacua at WR1, a projected starter who gives the team a genuine top-of-the-market asset, flanked by Garrett Wilson at WR17 and Tee Higgins at WR19. De'Von Achane at RB6 adds another elite projection. Nova Strike sits second in the Mega Man division and in the 85th percentile of the field, which tracks exactly with how this draft looks: not flashy, just consistently better than the competition.

Shamet&Co didn't need a splashy moment to build a division-leading roster, just a draft that kept finding the right player at the right price. Trevor Lawrence is the clearest example. Taken in the sixth round against an ADP closer to the fifth, Lawrence arrives off a career year that featured 4,000 passing yards, nearly 30 touchdown passes, and a career-high nine rushing scores, all while his supporting cast around him was murkier than anyone expected. That kind of production at that kind of discount is the quiet engine behind a 92nd-percentile roster. Dak Prescott fell a full round past his ADP as well, giving this team two QB starters who project as QB7 and QB10 without paying top-of-market prices for either. Layer in Brock Bowers at TE1 and a receiving corps anchored by A.J. Brown at WR8 and Nico Collins at WR9, and the picture becomes clear: Shamet&Co simply drafted well, pick after pick, and the standings reflect it.
