There is no kind way to read GardenStateDynasty's draft, so this preview will not try. The most damning single pick is James Conner, a RB56 projection taken in the seventh round at a cost that would have been steep for a player projected ten rounds later. That is not a bet on upside, that is a misread of the market on a player who has no business going there. Calvin Ridley compounds the damage, a WR78 projection burned at the cost of a WR31. Together those two picks represent the kind of draft capital destruction that does not get papered over by a strong top end, and the top end here is not strong enough to absorb it. Justin Jefferson at WR6 and Saquon Barkley at RB8 are genuine assets, but Barkley cost a reach and George Kittle, the projected starter at TE9, is coming off an Achilles tear with a timeline that remains genuinely uncertain. GardenStateDynasty sits last in the Mike Tyson's Punch Out division, and the draft record, five major reaches against zero steals, explains precisely how they got there.

There is a lived-in exhaustion to Go Glass Joe On Them heading into 2026, the kind that comes from watching a 6-30 season and then looking at the new roster and feeling roughly the same way. The draft did not help matters much: eight chalk picks and a major reach on Bhayshul Tuten, taken more than two rounds ahead of his ADP, is not the kind of aggressive swing that turns a franchise around, it is the kind that leaves a manager explaining himself in September. The position group that was supposed to carry the load grades out average across the board, with Trey McBride as the one legitimate standout at TE2 and James Cook offering something at RB5, but the rest of the projected starters are the sort of names you squint at and then refresh your projections hoping something changed. Tyler Shough, the lone draft value, anchors the quarterback spot at QB20. That is not a foundation. That is a roof with no house under it. The division is called Mike Tyson's Punch Out, and at 19th percentile entering the year, Go Glass Joe On Them is already familiar with the canvas.

There is a specific kind of exhaustion that comes from doing everything right and still ending up here. The Laguardians played the value game almost to perfection, with seven picks at chalk and only two minor reaches across the entire draft, yet they sit tenth in the Mike Tyson's Punch Out division and in the 29th percentile of the field. The roster tells you why. Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 is a genuine weapon, and the Jared Goff stack behind him offers real upside on the nights New England is airing it out. But below that peak, the terrain flattens fast, and Michael Pittman at WR44 is the projected weakest starter. That is not a crime in a positionless format, it is just a number, and the number is uncomfortable. Goff himself was the draft's clearest steal, falling two full rounds past his ADP, and the Laguardians capitalized. Good process. Correct decisions. The standings do not care about any of that, and that is the cruelest thing a draft can tell you.

Jckstrw drafted like a textbook. Every single pick landed at or after ADP, zero reaches across twelve selections, a perfectly disciplined exercise in taking what the board gives you. The problem is that what the board gave you is a roster sitting ninth in the Mike Tyson's Punch Out division and in the 37th percentile of the field, which is what happens when value and quality refuse to show up at the same time. The star power is real, CeeDee Lamb at WR5 and Drake London at WR7 anchoring a receiver group that looks genuinely dangerous, and Harold Fannin projects as a TE6 on the strength of a breakout that sent veteran teammate David Njoku out the door entirely. But Malik Willis sits at QB24, the weakest projected starter on the roster, and in a positionless format where every lineup slot is a competition, dragging a QB24 into that fight every week is a quiet tax on an otherwise credible roster. Jckstrw did everything right by the draft script. The script just did not care.

HAVOC2823 finished in the 74th percentile last season, so the 39th percentile projection for 2026 is not a minor dip, it is a structural collapse. The receiver room carries the roster, with Ja'Marr Chase (WR2) and A.J. Brown (WR8) doing genuine heavy lifting at the top, but the drop to Jayden Higgins at WR54 as the projected final starter is the kind of cliff edge that wins you nothing in a tough field. The quarterback situation is quietly brutal: Bo Nix grades out as a QB15 and Kyler Murray as a QB19, which means this team is leaning on two signal-callers who project as fringe starters at best, with Daniel Jones (QB25) lurking behind them as an emergency option nobody wants to exercise. The draft offered no relief, charting zero steals and zero values against eight chalk picks and a trio of minor reaches, including Murray taken nearly a round and a half before his ADP. There is no hidden upside waiting to be unlocked here, just a roster that grades out eighth in the division and has already shown you exactly what it is.

Little Mac sits seventh in the Mike Tyson's Punch Out division and projects at just the 42nd percentile of the field, and the draft sheet doesn't offer much reason for optimism. The manager went chalk on seven of eleven picks, generated zero steals, and the lone bright spot on draft day was Dak Prescott sliding a full round past his ADP. Prescott stacked with George Pickens gives the roster an identifiable core, but Pickens was taken half a round early at WR10, which means the manager paid a slight premium for the privilege of hoping that connection holds. The receiver group is genuinely strong on paper, with Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 and Pickens at WR10 anchoring a deep set of projected starters, but strong receivers can only carry a team so far when the floor is defined by T.J. Hockenson projecting as TE23 and the draft generated nothing resembling a surprise weapon. Seventh in the division feels like a ceiling here, not a floor.

MR. SANDMAN sits at 53rd percentile, which is exactly the kind of standing that makes a season feel like it lives and dies on execution rather than talent. The backbone here is legitimate: Josh Allen (QB1) and a ground game anchored by Kenneth Walker III (RB10), Derrick Henry (RB12), and Kyren Williams (RB15) give this roster a floor that holds up. The margins, though, show up in the details. Caleb Williams (QB6) was the one notable reach, taken nearly a full round early at pick 2.08, and while he projects as a starter, that early investment could pinch flexibility elsewhere. On the other end, TreVeyon Henderson (RB19) falling to 8.08 when his ADP sat at 7.01 is the kind of quiet value that separates middling rosters from ones that sneak into contention. The receiver group is thin at the top, with Mike Evans (WR27) and Carnell Tate (WR29) projecting as the primary contributors. Nothing here screams contender, but nothing collapses it either. Sixth in the division is not the ceiling if the right players stay healthy.

vinnyhey didn't build this roster with one flashy move. They built it by simply drafting better than expected, over and over. The headliner is Brock Bowers, who projects as TE1 and anchors the lineup as the kind of player most managers would have taken two rounds earlier. Then there's Matthew Stafford, the clearest example of the roster's philosophy: a QB14 projection sitting there at pick 8.06 when his ADP was 6.02, a two-round freefall that vinnyhey calmly pocketed. Pair that with David Montgomery, another player who slipped a round and a half past his ADP, and you start to see the pattern. Eight of the eleven picks came in right at market value, which sounds boring until you realize that chalk is only boring when the market is wrong about your players, and here it mostly wasn't. The weakest projected starter is Jadarian Price at RB26, which is the kind of "problem" most managers in Mike Tyson's Punch Out would gladly accept. This roster sits 64th percentile in the tournament, and it has the composition to climb.

Krisbelle11 didn't win the draft with one flashy swing, they won it by being right over and over again. The receiver group anchored by Puka Nacua at WR1 and Nico Collins at WR9 gives this roster a genuinely elite top end, and the depth behind them holds up rather than just filling space. Ashton Jeanty at RB7 adds a high-floor workhorse to the mix. Nine chalk picks in the draft sounds conservative until you notice that most managers chasing upside came away with less, and landing C.J. Stroud at QB22 roughly a round and a half after his ADP quietly compensates for a quarterback tier that projects soft. Even the weakest projected starter, Wan'Dale Robinson at WR47, comes with a reasonable case: Robinson crossed 1,000 yards in 2025, followed Brian Daboll to Tennessee, and now operates with Cam Ward in what could be a growing offense, though a new high-profile target competing for looks keeps the ceiling honest. The result is a 69th-percentile roster sitting fourth in the Mike Tyson's Punch Out division, and it got there the unglamorous way, by simply not making mistakes.

TimSones enters 2026 looking like the platonic ideal of how to build a fantasy roster, and the numbers back that up completely. The foundation is almost unreasonably deep at running back, with Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and De'Von Achane at RB6 leading a projected starting corps that extends down to Chase Brown at RB11, Breece Hall at RB14, and Josh Jacobs at RB16. That is not luck, that is architecture. The draft discipline shows in the value column too: Jaxson Dart, Jordan Love, and D'Andre Swift all fell past their ADPs and TimSones collected all three without blinking. Love carries the familiar caveat that his real-life excellence has not always translated to fantasy production, and until Green Bay solves its receiver situation and Tucker Kraft returns healthy, that gap may persist. But Love is the floor, not the ceiling, here, because Dart sits projected as QB11 with the volume to push higher. A 72nd percentile tournament projection and a third-place division standing feel like the floor for a roster this carefully constructed, not the ceiling.

wikel39 sits second in the Mike Tyson's Punch Out division and in the 84th percentile of the field, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. The headline is Joe Burrow, snagged nearly a full round after his ADP and immediately paired with Tee Higgins in a stack that gives this roster a genuine high-ceiling engine. That kind of discipline, landing a QB4 at a discount and then locking in his best receiver on the same team, is the draft equivalent of checking your work twice. Chris Godwin adds another layer, falling more than two full rounds past his ADP to become the steal of the board at WR38. Bijan Robinson anchors the skill positions at RB2, and Colston Loveland at TE3 means wikel39 is not scrambling for tight end production the way most of the field is. One minor reach on Parker Washington is essentially a rounding error against a draft that produced a steal, two genuine values, and seven chalk picks placed cleanly. There is not much to argue with here.

WazNFL sits at the top of the Mike Tyson's Punch Out division, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. The big story is Patrick Mahomes landing at QB12 despite an average draft position that put him more than two full rounds earlier, a steal that gave manager WazNFL a legitimate starter at a price that should have been impossible. Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Jonathan Taylor at RB4 give this roster a top-end foundation that most teams in the field simply do not have, and Garrett Wilson falling a round and a half to become a WR17 starter is the kind of disciplined patience that separates good drafters from great ones. Justin Herbert adds real upside if Mike McDaniel can open the offense up in a way Harbaugh never quite did, though Herbert's rushing contributions have always been modest and the ceiling question lingers. Eleven chalk picks and zero reaches round out a draft profile that is almost clinical in its execution. At the 89th percentile, this team earned its number.
