There is no polite way to say this: MVPmaterial is sitting in the ninth percentile of the field and ranked last in the NBA Jam division, and the draft record does not offer much of a rebuttal. The manager leaned hard on a running back corps headlined by Derrick Henry and Chase Brown, which sounds fine until you notice that Henry alone cost nearly two rounds of draft capital beyond his ADP, a price that left the back half of the roster looking skeletal. Khalil Shakir projects as the weakest starter on the team at WR51, and the receiving group as a whole grades weak, meaning there is no hidden depth waiting to bail anyone out. Josh Allen at QB1 is a genuine building block, and Cam Ward falling to pick 12.11 at a QB23 projection qualifies as the lone stroke of luck in an otherwise grim draft. But Allen cannot carry ten starting spots, and with eight chalk picks, four minor reaches, and two major reaches logged against just one steal, the draft itself feels like a series of compounding bets that mostly did not pay off.

seriousschmidt sits 11th in the NBA Jam division and in just the 18th percentile of the field, and the roster doesn't hide many secrets about why. The good news is real: Brock Bowers (TE1), Tyler Warren (TE4), and Harold Fannin (TE6) form a genuinely elite group at the top of the lineup, and Nico Collins (WR9) is the one draft-day bargain on a roster that otherwise leaned heavily on chalk picks with almost no upside swing shots to show for it. The bad news is that the roster thins out fast after those names. Brian Thomas Jr. (WR31) is a projected starter who has spent two seasons raising questions about whether his connection with Trevor Lawrence can actually sustain fantasy relevance. Malik Willis (QB24) is the weakest projected starter on the team and is not a player who inspires confidence at that rank. When your highest-upside path forward is hoping Willis outperforms a QB24 projection and Thomas rediscovers chemistry that may never have been real, the lever simply isn't there to pull.

Last year CoreyHirt827 went 28-8 and scored in the 98th percentile, which means the NBA Jam division is expecting something. What they are getting, at least on paper, is a team projected 21st percentile and sitting 10th in the division, which is the fantasy equivalent of showing up to your own surprise party and finding out it was cancelled. The receiver group is legitimately strong, with Justin Jefferson at WR6 and Malik Nabers at WR12 anchoring a projected starting corps, and the Kyler Murray and Jefferson stack adds a correlation bonus that could pop in the right week. But the draft itself was not aggressive enough to justify optimism, logging zero steals and one major reach in Mike Gesicki at TE33, a player taken three full rounds before his ADP suggested anyone should want him. The weakest projected starter is Brenton Strange at TE17, himself a minor reach. CoreyHirt827 built a reputation on a historically efficient 2025, and this roster is not that team. Reputation does not start.

There is no kind way to frame what dbattery did in this draft. The team sits ninth in the NBA Jam division and projects at just the 22nd percentile of the field, which tracks perfectly with a draft that produced four major reaches and zero steals. The most damning evidence: Bucky Irving, a projected RB21, was taken 2.2 rounds before his ADP, and Jacory Croskey-Merritt, the team's weakest projected starter at RB40, was reached on by nearly the same margin ten rounds later. That is not building a roster, that is paying a premium twice for the bottom of what you started. Jayden Daniels and Bijan Robinson give this team a legitimate foundation, and Drake London at WR7 was a genuine value, but those anchors cannot carry a draft philosophy that consistently overpaid for depth that did not need to be forced. The 2025 season ended at the 18th percentile. Nothing in this draft suggests dbattery has figured out why.

JBBarry sits 8th in the NBA Jam division and in the 29th percentile of the field, and the draft log doesn't offer much hope that things will improve. The headline problem is at the top of the roster: Jalen Hurts and Saquon Barkley, two players who were supposed to anchor this team, were both taken before their ADP, meaning JBBarry paid early-round premiums for guys who were already available at fair value everywhere else. Hurts slipped nearly two rounds from his ADP before landing here as a QB9, which is fine, but Barkley was reached on by almost a full round and projects as only RB8, a number that doesn't scream "worth the overpay." Meanwhile, the bottom of the projected lineup bottoms out at Michael Pittman at WR44, and Greg Dulcich at TE25 is the weakest link at his position in the tournament. Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 is a genuine asset, but one star at the top can only mask so much mediocrity below it.

RodayRodriguez finished 35th percentile in scoring last year and the 2026 roster does not read like a team that has figured out what went wrong. The draft tells most of the story: four major reaches against a single steal, a ratio that suggests a manager who kept falling in love a few rounds too early. Alec Pierce was taken WR32 but cost a fourth-round pick when his ADP sat in the seventh, and Deebo Samuel was pulled nearly four rounds ahead of market at WR70, a lot of draft capital to spend on a player projected outside the top 60 at his position. The saving graces are real, Lamar Jackson at QB3 stacked with Trey McBride at TE2 is a genuine weapon, but a roster leaning on Xavier Worthy as its projected weakest starter, sitting at WR49, has very little margin for injury or variance. Seventh in the NBA Jam division and 32nd percentile in the field, RodayRodriguez is not rebuilding so much as hoping the bottom holds.

ekosmas23 is the team that quietly haunts you at 11 PM on a Sunday night, close enough to hurt, never close enough to celebrate. The foundation is genuinely good: CeeDee Lamb at WR5, Christian McCaffrey at RB3, and a pair of projected starters at tight end in Sam LaPorta and George Kittle. But the margins are where this roster gets interesting and not entirely comfortable. Kittle arrives carrying Achilles recovery questions, and Brock Purdy's supporting cast in San Francisco keeps shrinking by the week, which adds a slow leak of uncertainty to an otherwise functional stack. The draft offered no steals and logged two major reaches, including LaPorta himself taken more than two rounds early, meaning ekosmas23 spent real capital to secure a position that now comes with an asterisk about early-season availability. Nothing here is broken. Nothing here is dominant. At 39th percentile entering the season and sitting sixth in the NBA Jam division, this is a team where a handful of healthy Sundays from Kittle and Purdy is the entire argument, and an injured one dissolves it just as fast.

atlmikey didn't win the draft with one thunderbolt pick. He won it by being right, repeatedly, in the middle rounds. The clearest example is Jordan Love, snagged at 9.09 when his ADP was 7.06, a fall of more than two rounds that handed atlmikey a projected QB10 at a discount. The catch is that Love has never cracked 35 passing touchdowns in a season and has finished outside the top 10 in fantasy scoring two years running, so the value only cashes if the Packers finally lean on his arm the way Green Bay insiders are promising they will. Trevor Lawrence, also bought late relative to his ADP, gives atlmikey a viable QB10 floor if Love disappoints. The pattern holds elsewhere: A.J. Brown at WR8 slipped nearly a full round before atlmikey grabbed him at 3.09, and Colston Loveland at TE3 anchors a positional group that is genuinely elite. The 2025 squad finished in the 30th percentile. This roster projects to 68th. That is not a lucky bounce. That is a better draft.

fabianonfl didn't need a single unicorn pick to build one of the more quietly impressive rosters in the NBA Jam division. The foundation starts with Puka Nacua at WR1, taken fifth overall when the field expected him to go first, a small margin that still represents getting the best receiver in the pool on your terms. From there, the draft became a steady accumulation of edges: Drake Maye fell half a round past his WR2 equivalent value at quarterback, Aaron Jones slipped a round and a half before fabianonfl scooped him up, and Daniel Jones came two full rounds late as a back-end safety valve. None of those individually changes a season, but five values against zero major reaches across the whole board is a draft that consistently punched above its weight. The result is a roster sitting at the 68th percentile with a projected starting corps anchored by Nacua, Tetairoa McMillan at WR15, and Emeka Egbuka at WR18. The conversation about which rosters are actually built to contend in 2026 should include this one.

justmax67 didn't chase upside in the Scott Fish Bowl so much as methodically collect it, and the roster sitting third in the NBA Jam division at the 81st percentile reflects exactly that approach. The headliner is Jahmyr Gibbs, projected at RB1, a player who makes a lineup look immediately credible just by appearing on it. But the draft's most telling moment came quietly in the ninth round, when justmax67 landed Jared Goff at QB16 nearly three rounds after Goff's ADP suggested he'd be gone, the kind of patient opportunism that separates good drafters from lucky ones. Pair that with Ashton Jeanty at RB7 anchoring the starting core alongside Gibbs, and the foundation here is genuinely difficult to argue with. Garrett Wilson at WR17 and Kyle Pitts at TE7 round out a starting group that doesn't ask managers to cross their fingers on any single night. This roster wasn't built on one big swing. It was built by consistently being right, and in a field this competitive, that tends to be enough.

FFatHomeDad did not build this roster on one flashy swing. They built it by being right, over and over, in small ways that compound. James Cook at RB5 slipped to pick 2.09 when his ADP said 2.04, and FFatHomeDad was there. Dak Prescott at QB7 drifted a round and a half past his ADP, and again, FFatHomeDad was there. Those are not lottery tickets, they are the quiet tax you collect when the rest of the room loses focus for a moment. Add Ja'Marr Chase projecting as WR2 and Omarion Hampton as RB9 to anchor the lineup, and the foundation is genuinely difficult to argue with. Yes, there were reaches, Jayden Reed and Tre Tucker both came off the board earlier than the market wanted, but reaching on depth pieces late is a different conversation than overpaying at the top. The top held. That 2025 record of 26 wins and a 72 percent win rate suggests this manager knows how to turn a strong build into actual results, and this roster gives them plenty to work with in 2026.

SashaY sits first in the NBA Jam division and at the 96th percentile of the field, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. The value discipline here is real: four players taken past their ADP, zero reaches of any kind, and the kind of board management that separates deliberate drafters from lucky ones. Jonathan Taylor at RB4 anchors the whole operation, and the surrounding cast of Kenneth Walker III, Kyren Williams, and Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 means this roster does not need a miracle to perform. Ladd McConkey, projected WR20, fell nearly two rounds to land here, which is the sort of quiet gift that compounds across a long season. The Patrick Mahomes situation carries a real asterisk given his recovery from a torn ACL and LCL, but reports have him ahead of schedule, and if he suits up in Week 1 alongside Rashee Rice, that stack alone makes opposing managers uncomfortable. The weakest projected starter is Jordan Addison at WR43. In an SFB lineup that starts ten players, that is a fine floor to stand on.
