There is no flattering angle here, no buried upside to excavate, no way to spin scramblingNscraping's 5th-percentile standing into a comeback story. The draft is the diagnosis. This roster logged zero steals and four major reaches, which means every time the board presented a reasonable path, this manager manufactured a worse one. The most damning example is Jacoby Brissett, a QB28 taken three-plus rounds before his ADP, a pick that consumed a mid-round pick to acquire a player who projects as a deep backup on most rosters. Meanwhile, Blake Corum arrives as an RB35 plucked nearly three rounds early, and Jakobi Meyers checks in as a WR45 taken two rounds ahead of schedule. Trey McBride is a genuine asset, a TE2 who slipped nearly a full round past his ADP and represents the one moment this manager got the market right. But a single good read cannot carry a lineup whose projected floor is Rico Dowdle at RB32. This team did not get unlucky. It reached its way here.

Bennyr11 played the draft almost exactly right and is sitting 11th in the Tecmo Bowl division anyway, which is the kind of outcome that makes you question the whole enterprise. Eight chalk picks, only three minor reaches, and a genuine steal in Brenton Strange, who fell nearly two rounds past his ADP to land at 12.02. The value was real. The problem is that value still needs to convert into points, and this roster is asking a lot of its moving pieces to do exactly that. Justin Jefferson is the centerpiece, a WR6 projection that leans heavily on the theory that his 2025 struggles belonged to JJ McCarthy rather than Jefferson himself, and that Kyler Murray arriving in Minnesota fixes the chemistry problem rather than introducing a new one. That quarterback stack is either the roster's best idea or its most expensive prayer. Chase Brown and Bucky Irving project as credible contributors, but the overall scoring picture lands this team in the 12th percentile of the field, which confirms the cruel irony: Benny11 did the homework and the homework still did not help.

ConnerJD finished in the 92nd percentile last year, and the 2026 roster is currently projected 23rd percentile, which is not a slide so much as a cliff. The engine of this team is a deep collection of running backs, Kenneth Walker III (RB10), Kyren Williams (RB15), Javonte Williams (RB17), Travis Etienne (RB18), and David Montgomery (RB23) all projecting as starters, and that group carries genuine upside. The problem is what surrounds it. Carnell Tate (WR29) and Kenyon Sadiq (TE21) are projected starters who rank well outside the top tier at their positions, and in a positionless format where you field your best ten, thin production from those spots matters. The draft did not obviously fix it either: reaching 1.4 rounds for Williams and landing D'Andre Swift a full two rounds past his ADP are interesting choices that mostly cancel each other out. ConnerJD has the kind of name in this tournament that earns a knowing nod, but the 2026 roster is being asked to defend a reputation the projections do not currently support.

TheKingofKings11 sits ninth in the Tecmo Bowl division and in just the 26th percentile of the field, and the roster makes that standing feel about right. The bright spots are real: Josh Allen is a QB1, A.J. Brown checks in at WR8, and George Pickens at WR10 gives this team a genuinely dangerous top end. But after that the floor drops fast, and the draft history suggests the manager sensed it coming and tried to outrun it. The most telling move is RJ Harvey, reached for 3.2 rounds ahead of his ADP and projecting as an RB28, which is a lot of draft capital committed to a player who grades out only modestly. Kyle Monangai, the team's weakest projected starter at RB33, underscores the problem: when the supporting cast around Allen and Brown is this uneven, the ceiling collapses in a hurry. There is no obvious lever left to pull, no late-round steal to point to as a wild card, and the schedule does not negotiate.

GonnaKickTomorrow enters 2026 sitting at the 27th percentile and eighth in the Tecmo Bowl division, which is a polite way of saying the math is not flattering. The roster does have genuine anchors: CeeDee Lamb projects as WR5 and pairs with Dak Prescott in a stack that at least gives the manager a coherent offensive identity, and Colston Loveland at TE3 is a real asset. The problem is that the draft did not meaningfully upgrade the floor around those pieces. Loveland cost a first-round pick despite an ADP closer to the second round, a reach that compresses the overall talent curve downward. Below the top names, the projected starters include Xavier Worthy at WR49, which is a thin margin for error when the team is already asking a lot of Breece Hall at RB14 and Bhayshul Tuten at RB25 to carry their weight. Coming off a 2025 finish in the 18th percentile, GonnaKickTomorrow needs things to break right at almost every level of the roster, and nothing in the draft record suggests the manager found the hidden edge that would make that likely.

acefrehley2024 had a genuinely strong 2025, finishing in the 76th percentile in scoring, but the 2026 projection tells a grimmer story: 32nd percentile, seventh in the Tecmo Bowl division, with no obvious path back up. The roster's best asset is a legitimate backfield core headlined by Jonathan Taylor (RB4) and Ashton Jeanty (RB7), but Jeanty cost a 2.01 pick when his ADP sat at 2.09, a reach that shrinks the margin for error everywhere else. That margin was already thin. Kenneth Gainwell projects as the weakest starter on the roster at RB34, which is a significant drop-off from the top of the lineup and not the kind of depth that steadies a ship taking on water. The draft offered only two real values against eight chalk picks and two major reaches, meaning acefrehley2024 essentially paid full price or more for a roster that still grades out near the bottom of the field. Stafford and Mayfield project as QB14 and QB18 respectively, serviceable but not difference-makers. There is no single lever here left to pull.

johnnyescarole is the kind of team that finishes 9-7 and spends the last three weeks of the season doing math. The foundation is legitimately good: Brock Bowers at TE1 is an anchor most managers would build around, and the receiver group, led by Chris Olave at WR11 and Jaylen Waddle at WR23, gives the lineup enough ceiling to beat anyone on a given week. The problem is the margins cut both ways. The QB situation is a slow leak, with Jordan Love projected at QB17 and C.J. Stroud at QB22, and while johnnyescarole drafted Stroud as a major value at 12.12, getting value on a player and getting production from him are different conversations. Meanwhile, reaching three rounds early on Matthew Golden at WR52 is the kind of draft-night optimism that looks either brilliant or expensive by October, and Wan'Dale Robinson projecting as the weakest starter at WR47 is exactly the thin margin that separates a winning record from a quiet early exit. Last year's 58 percent win rate says this roster knows how to grind. Whether it can do more than grind is the whole question.

Daninsinga is the kind of team that wins 24 games one year and spends the next quietly daring you to find a reason to worry about them, which is exactly the problem. The engine here is real: Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and James Cook at RB5 form a backfield core that most managers would happily trade their entire receiving corps for, and the Caleb Williams and Luther Burden stack adds a ceiling-raiser that could detonate on the right week. But margins decide this season, and the margins are thin. Dalton Kincaid, snagged at 10.08 when his ADP was 7.11, is the kind of late-round discount that looks brilliant until Brandon Beane is at a podium describing a knee as "too early to tell." A healthy Kincaid paired with Josh Allen is a genuine contributor at TE11, but "if healthy" is doing enormous structural work in that sentence. Jaylen Warren projecting as the weakest projected starter tells you exactly where the floor lives. The good version of this roster finishes top third in the Tecmo Bowl. The bad version finishes exactly fifth.

DelloDello lands at 77th percentile in the field and fourth in the Tecmo Bowl division, and the draft record tells you exactly why: mostly chalk, yes, but chalk laid on a foundation that kept coming out ahead. The headliner is Christian McCaffrey, an RB3 projection snagged nearly a full round after his ADP suggested he'd be gone, the kind of quiet windfall that separates disciplined drafters from lucky ones. Pair him with Bijan Robinson at RB2 and you have a top of the roster that most managers would trade their late rounds to own. George Kittle fell a round and change past his ADP and slots in as a projected TE9 starter, which is the sort of value that feels minor in the moment and matters when the standings tighten. The one blemish is De'Zhaun Stribling, taken more than three rounds early at WR73, a reach that sticks out against an otherwise steady sheet. But one overreach at the margins does not undo what DelloDello built: a roster assembled with patience, not flash, that projects to compete.

ShaneSays lands at 81st percentile in the field and third in the Tecmo Bowl division, and the draft record explains exactly why: nine chalk picks, one steal, one value, and only a minor reach on Denzel Boston to speak of. That is a disciplined board, and the roster reflects it. The headliner is a receiver group that reads like someone ran a perfectly efficient draft simulation, Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, Drake London at WR7, Rashee Rice at WR13, and Tetairoa McMillan at WR15 all projecting as starters. Patrick Mahomes arriving at 7.09 when his ADP sat at 5.08 is the steal of the draft, and pairing him with Rice in a Kansas City stack turns a two-round discount into a multiplier. Jeremiyah Love slides in at RB13 after falling a full round and a half past his ADP, giving the team legitimate positional value at a spot that is often an afterthought in SFB construction. The floor here is high, the draft was clean, and there is almost nothing to argue with.

GoldRazz enters 2026 sitting second in the Tecmo Bowl division and in the 87th percentile of the field, and the draft board tells you exactly why. This is a roster built on patience and positioning, not panic. Four values, eight chalk, one minor reach, zero major reaches: that is a manager who knew what they wanted and waited for the market to come to them. Trevor Lawrence fell nearly two rounds past his ADP before GoldRazz pulled the trigger at 6.09, and Brock Purdy followed the same pattern, sliding a round and a half before getting scooped at 7.04. Both are projected starters, and both were essentially gifted. The receiver corps does the heavy lifting here, with Ja'Marr Chase at WR2, Nico Collins at WR9, Zay Flowers at WR16, and Garrett Wilson at WR17 all projecting into the starting lineup. The one minor reach, Flowers at 3.04 against an ADP of 4.06, barely registers as a blemish on an otherwise disciplined sheet. Clean draft, real talent, legitimate contender.

TheFFRealist sits at the top of the Tecmo Bowl division and in the 99th percentile of the field, and the draft record explains exactly why. The headline is the tight end group: Tyler Warren at TE4, Tucker Kraft at TE5, Travis Kelce at TE10, and Dallas Goedert at TE15, all projected starters, and Kraft and Kelce both came in well past their ADPs. That is not luck, that is board discipline. Jalen Hurts landed at QB9 a full round and a half late, and the Hurts-Goedert stack adds a layer of ceiling that most managers would envy. The one blemish is Deebo Samuel, reached five-plus rounds early at WR70, which is the kind of aggressive swing that occasionally backfires. But one reach in a draft this clean is almost a rounding error. After a 2025 campaign that landed in the 43rd percentile, TheFFRealist came back with sharper process and a roster that looks built to finish what last season started.
