Drop it like it's CD enters the 2026 Scott Fish Bowl sitting third in the Sonic Division and in just the third percentile of the field, and the roster grades offer little reason for optimism. The foundation looks deceptively promising: Christian McCaffrey, Derrick Henry, and Chase Brown are all projected starters, and the depth behind them is real. But this is a positionless format, and what ultimately separates contenders from also-rans is the quality of your best players across the whole lineup, and that is where the cracks show. Chris Olave checks in at WR11, a reasonable anchor, but he was a reach of 1.3 rounds and the receiver room falls off fast after him. Baker Mayfield, taken two full rounds early, is the QB18 on a Tampa offense that just lost Mike Evans in free agency, the exact variable that may have dragged him down in 2025. There is no obvious lever left to pull here, no sleeper waiting to pop, no mispriced asset lurking in the depth. What you see is, unfortunately, what you get.

Jae the Echidna didn't just miss on this draft, they drafted with apparent conviction that the board owed them something it didn't. Four major reaches in a single draft is a particular kind of achievement, and the results speak for themselves: a team sitting 11th in the Sonic division and in just the 7th percentile of the entire field. The reach on Patrick Mahomes at 2.03, a full 3.4 rounds ahead of his QB12 ADP, set the tone early, and taking Travis Kelce at 4.03 when the market had him sitting comfortably at 7.05 only compounded the damage. Both picks gave back surplus value at picks where surplus value is the entire point. The Mahomes/Kelce stack is real and the upside is real, but you can't overpay for two players in the first four rounds and then paper over it with Xavier Worthy as your projected weakest starter at WR49. A team built on paying full price and calling it strategy finished at 50th percentile last season and shows no structural reason to expect improvement.

There is no sugarcoating what charlesroberts2771 is looking at in the Sonic division: a 10th-place projected rank and a finish in the 9th percentile of the field, with no obvious path to climbing out. The receiving corps has genuine star power, Justin Jefferson at WR6 and Nico Collins at WR9 anchoring a group that looks formidable on paper, but the draft cost those players dearly, and the rest of the roster reflects the budget constraints. Jared Goff was pulled three full rounds ahead of his ADP, a significant overpay for a quarterback whose own scouting note concedes he is "not a league winner" even in his best seasons. That is a brutal trade-off in a positionless format where every pick is precious. Keaton Mitchell at RB49 is the lone notable non-receiver depth piece, and the projected weakest starter, Matthew Golden at WR52, tells you how thin the floor gets when the top names inevitably miss time. This roster needed everything to break right and the draft gave it precious little margin to work with.

Batulok drafted like someone who panicked early and never recovered. The big swing was reaching 1.8 rounds early for Sam LaPorta at TE8, then doubling down by grabbing T.J. Hockenson 2.4 rounds before his number was called, as if the TE position were about to be discontinued. Those capital spent chasing tight ends left the back end of the roster looking desperate, which explains how Keenan Allen at WR99 and Chris Brazzell II at WR101 ended up as mid-to-late round selections taken a combined 11.7 rounds before their respective ADPs. That is not savvy maneuvering. That is a manager who saw a name they recognized and flinched. George Kittle is clouding things further, since he is recovering from an Achilles tear and his Week 1 availability is genuinely uncertain, meaning even the TE investment Batulok overextended for may not pay on time. A 24th percentile projection and ninth in the Sonic division, this team is a cautionary tale about drafting the board you feared rather than the board in front of you.

EricYahola did almost everything right at the draft table. Thirteen picks landed at chalk, four more came at genuine value, and the major reach on Brock Purdy, pulled 1.6 rounds ahead of ADP at 4.02, is at least a defensible gamble on a QB13 projection with a Purdy/Mike Evans stack attached. The trouble is that doing things right and finishing things right are different problems entirely. The team sits at 26th percentile in the tournament, ranks eighth in the Sonic division, and projects a weakest starter in Jayden Reed at WR48, which is a quietly brutal number for a lineup that needs ten contributors to function. Ashton Jeanty at RB7 and Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 give EricYahola a genuine elite shelf, but after them the value picks, Tyler Shough at QB20, Tony Pollard at RB30, quietly start to feel like what they are: late-round insurance dressed up as depth. The 2025 squad scored at the 70th percentile. This one, built smarter on paper, is projected to land considerably further south.

OnlyOneAtababy sits at 53rd percentile and seventh in the Sonic Division, which is about as middle-of-the-road as fantasy football gets. The engine here is real: Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Omarion Hampton at RB9 give this roster a genuine top-end that most managers would envy, and the Caleb Williams-Rome Odunze stack adds a multiplier effect when Chicago gets cooking. But the margins that separate a playoff push from a quiet exit live in the rest of the lineup, and that's where the questions pile up. Jakobi Meyers projects as the weakest starter at WR45, and Brenton Strange, nominally the receiving threat at tight end for Jacksonville, projects at TE17 on a depth chart that just added Nate Boerkircher. Strange figures to hold the job, but figures to is not the same as will. The draft was mostly chalk with one legitimate steal in Williams falling a round and a half, so there is no hidden upside baked in. This roster goes as far as its stars carry it, and that distance is not yet settled.

CommandersofChaos sits at 53rd percentile in the field, and that number is almost too accurate, a team that could finish anywhere from genuinely dangerous to quietly forgettable depending on which version shows up. The case for optimism starts and ends with Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and De'Von Achane at RB6, a projected-starter pairing that gives this roster a legitimate weekly ceiling most managers would envy. Drake London at WR7 adds a third elite piece, and the fact that Achane and London both fell past their ADPs means the manager extracted real value in building that core. The case for doubt is the margin work: three major reaches in the draft, including Bo Nix at QB15 burned in round four against an ADP of round six, and Dalton Schultz landing as the weakest projected starter after being taken nearly three rounds early at TE22. Gibbs and Achane can carry a lot, but when the games are close and the difference is a quarterback decision or a quiet week at the back of the lineup, CommandersofChaos does not have much cushion to absorb the variance.

Thunder The Hedgehog didn't build this roster with any single flashy moment, just a draft that kept returning value round after round. Four players came off the board at meaningfully better prices than their ADPs suggested, and the cumulative effect shows up in a projected field rank sitting at the 71st percentile. The headliner is Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, a legitimate difference-maker, but the supporting cast is what makes this dangerous. Jaylen Waddle, snagged a full round late at 6.07, now lands in Denver after escaping one of the more dysfunctional passing situations in the league, sliding into an offense where Bo Nix led the league in pass attempts last year and targets figure to be plentiful. George Pickens projects as WR10 and Jaylen Waddle as WR23, both projected starters, both acquired below cost. Even the back end of the build shows discipline: Rashid Shaheed and Isaac TeSlaa each fell over a round past their ADPs before Thunder grabbed them. Last season's 95th-percentile scoring performance wasn't a fluke of circumstances. This looks like a team that simply drafts well.

The OKC Brock Bowers didn't win the draft with one flashy move. They won it pick by pick, round by round, and the ledger reflects it. The foundation is a tight end group that would make other managers physically uncomfortable, anchored by Brock Bowers at TE1 and Tyler Warren at TE4, with Harold Fannin sitting right behind them at TE6. Fannin is the interesting one: he essentially pushed veteran David Njoku off the Browns' roster last season with elite play, and while Cleveland's quarterback situation is genuinely grim, any offensive improvement opens the door to more red zone work for a player who already proved he belongs. Meanwhile, Jayden Daniels projects as QB5 and Justin Herbert came in as genuine value at QB8, taken a full round after his ADP. Travis Etienne fell nearly three rounds past his ADP before landing here at RB18. None of those acquisitions made headlines. All of them made the roster better. A 77th percentile projection and fourth in the Sonic Division feels like the floor for a team built this carefully.

FRITOBANDITO is not gambling on a stack, they are building an entire philosophy around one. With Joe Burrow sitting at QB4 and both Ja'Marr Chase (WR2) and Tee Higgins (WR19) locked in as projected starters, this roster is essentially a Cincinnati offense wearing a fantasy uniform. When that offense detonates, the scoring ceiling here is genuinely frightening, a Burrow-Chase connection alone can swing a matchup, and pairing it with a simultaneous Burrow-Higgins thread means a big Bengals game does not just help, it floods the scoresheet. The rest of the construction exists to support that core: Colston Loveland at TE3 and Tucker Kraft at TE5 give the lineup elite optionality at a position most managers scramble to fill, and Marvin Harrison Jr. at WR33 provides real upside behind the Cincinnati pieces. The caveat is written into the architecture itself. If the Bengals go cold, the correlation

cuts both ways, and a 78th-percentile roster living at the mercy of one offense has to hope Cincinnati stays exactly as dangerous as projected.

There was no single flashy moment that defined jlwatkinsjr's draft, just a steady accumulation of edges that added up to something hard to argue with. The clearest example sits at receiver, where A.J. Brown, Garrett Wilson, and Emeka Egbuka all landed more than a round past their ADPs, each one a quiet dividend from simply staying patient while the board drifted. Brown projects as WR8 in a Patriots offense that finished last season with Drake Maye playing at an MVP-runner-up level, and the pairing of that kind of quarterback with Brown's first-option talent is the kind of setup that makes you forget he has missed at least two games in five of his seven seasons. Add CeeDee Lamb at WR5 and Rashee Rice at WR13 as projected starters, and the top of this roster belongs in any serious conversation. Jonathan Taylor projects at RB4 and anchors the ground game. The result is a team that finished 2025 in the 86th percentile and, with a draft that consistently came out ahead, has every reason to expect more of the same.

DerekWomack enters 2026 sitting at the top of the Sonic division and the 100th percentile of the entire field, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. The foundation is Puka Nacua at WR1, taken at 1.05 when his ADP sat at 1.01, and Lamar Jackson at QB3, both secured at or near fair value before the board got thin. What separates this roster from a merely good one is the discipline shown in the middle and late rounds, where Womack collected eight values against zero reaches. Ladd McConkey fell nearly two full rounds before Womack grabbed him, and RJ Harvey slipped all the way from a 10th-round ADP into the 12th, where Womack was waiting. The projected weakest starter is Michael Pittman at WR44, which is the kind of floor that makes other managers quietly furious. Jaxson Dart carries real questions about durability and whether the passing acumen matches the highlight reel, but as a late-round QB11 sitting in a Dart-Isaiah Likely stack, the upside is priced in correctly. Clean from top to bottom.
