Last year, Samus finished in the 96th percentile and went 29-7. This year, the projections say 8th percentile and last in the division. That is not a slump, that is a collapse, and the roster tells you why. The receiver group is the wound that won't close, with DK Metcalf at WR36, Courtland Sutton at WR37, and Michael Pittman at WR44 leading a group where the projected starters rank in the middle third of the position at best. The backfield is legitimately good, with James Cook at RB5 and Derrick Henry at RB12 anchoring a deep group, but in a positionless format, strength at one position only carries you so far when your pass-catchers are this uninspiring. There is also no draft ingenuity to hold onto, as the team produced zero steals and zero values, drafting almost entirely to consensus. Even David Montgomery, a minor reach at pick 6.02, comes with real risk after a diminished role in Detroit and a move to Houston to compete for a job. Samus earned its reputation. The 2026 version is living off it.

Donkey Kong enters 2026 sitting 11th in the Super Smash Bros. Melee division and in just the 10th percentile of the field, and there is precious little on this roster to suggest the math improves. The draft tells a quiet, damning story: zero steals, only two values, and a reach on Omarion Hampton at pick 2.03 when the market had him pegged a full round later. That kind of early-round surplus spending on a RB9 projection would be forgivable if the rest of the build were airtight, but it is not. Justin Jefferson checks in at WR6 and Malik Nabers at WR12, and those are real assets, but after them the depth thins toward names like Wan'Dale Robinson (WR47), projected to be the weakest starter on the roster. Patrick Mahomes grades as a QB12, fine but not spectacular in a positionless format where you need every pick to land. The levers that might fix this, a steal here, a late-round breakout there, simply are not present. Donkey Kong does not look broken so much as quietly outgunned.

Last year jley48 went 30-6 and scored in the 89th percentile, which is the kind of résumé that makes a manager feel untouchable going into a draft. The 2026 roster suggests the draft did not share that confidence. Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Saquon Barkley at RB8 are legitimate, and Nico Collins at WR9 gives the starting group real teeth, but the draft produced zero steals and zero values across the entire board, thirteen chalk picks and five reaches, including Daniel Jones hauled in roughly two rounds early and Skyler Bell taken six rounds before his ADP. Jones projects as QB25, which is a back-of-the-roster depth piece dressed up like a plan, and Bell sits at WR103, which is not a dart throw so much as a blindfolded one. The projection has jley48 sitting tenth in the division at the 25th percentile, a staggering reversal from where they finished twelve months ago. Reputation built in 2025 does not start in 2026, and right now this roster is living off borrowed credibility.

Here is the cruel math on Blakes Hope: nearly every pick landed at or after ADP, the draft tendencies show three legitimate values and zero major reaches, and the team still projects to sit ninth in the Super Smash Bros. Melee division, right at the 49th percentile of the field. Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 is genuinely elite, and the Caleb Williams and Colston Loveland stack gives the roster a real upside lever. But the moment you look past those anchors, the floor drops fast. Dak Prescott fell more than a round past his ADP, which sounds like a win until you remember Williams and Prescott are both projected starters, meaning the value Prescott represents sits mostly on the bench. The RB group projects as the weakest part of the roster, with Jonathon Brooks at RB37 leading a tier of players nobody would choose if the standings were already on the line. Blakes Hope did the draft correctly by the numbers and arrived somewhere deeply average anyway, which is not bad luck. It is the specific punishment reserved for rosters that draft efficiently and still never find an edge.

Pikachu enters 2026 sitting eighth in the Super Smash Bros. Melee division and right at the tournament median, which sounds more comfortable than it is when the gap between median and contender is this unforgiving. The roster has genuine anchors, Christian McCaffrey at RB3, Lamar Jackson at QB3, and Chris Olave at WR11 give this team a credible top end, but the drop-off from those stars to the next tier is steep enough to matter. What makes the outlook bleaker is how the draft unfolded: 17 chalk picks and two major reaches, including Aaron Rodgers at QB29 taken more than three rounds early and Alvin Kamara at RB50 taken nearly three rounds ahead of schedule. Those are the kinds of swings that were supposed to create upside, and instead they produced late-round deadweight. Travis Kelce at TE10 sliding to pick 9.07 was the one genuine windfall, but one steal cannot paper over a draft that left almost no margin for error on a roster that already grades out near the bottom of the field.

nirobi03 is a team that exists in the exact center of the Venn diagram between "this could work" and "this might not," and the margins will decide which circle wins. The core is legitimate: Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and Rashee Rice at WR13 give this roster genuine upside at the top, and Joe Burrow at QB4 means the points-per-game floor doesn't cave in ugly weeks. But the roster was built almost entirely to chalk, with 19 of 20 picks landing right at ADP, which means nirobi03 is betting on projections rather than edges. The one exception, Javonte Williams falling a full round past his ADP to RB17, is interesting precisely because it might not be enough. Quinshon Judkins, projected RB22, adds intrigue if the fibula heals cleanly and he's ready for Cleveland's 2026 camp, but "if" is doing heavy lifting in that sentence. A 52nd-percentile team that finished in the 81st percentile last year knows exactly how thin the line is between those two numbers.

hollymark23 sits at the 52nd percentile and seventh in the Super Smash Bros. Melee division, which is exactly the kind of placement that keeps a manager up at night. Brock Bowers at TE1 and De'Von Achane at RB6 give this roster a genuine ceiling, the kind of top-end production that can carry a week when everything breaks right. But this team lives and dies by the middle of the lineup, and that middle is decidedly unspectacular. Garrett Wilson at WR17 and Jaylen Waddle at WR23 are solid contributors, not difference-makers, and the quarterback situation leans heavily on Jared Goff at QB16, which is functional until it isn't. The draft offered no steals and no real values, just chalk with a few minor reaches, meaning hollymark23 enters the season without a hidden edge to lean on. Bowers can win a matchup by himself on the right week. The question is whether the weeks when he doesn't are survivable, and right now that answer is genuinely unclear.

Bowser did not swing for the fences in 2026, and that restraint looks like wisdom in hindsight. The draft logged 17 chalk picks and zero steals, which sounds uninspiring until you look at who those chalk picks were: Josh Allen at QB1, Drake London at WR7, Zay Flowers at WR16, Terry McLaurin at WR24, and Kenneth Walker III at RB10 all project as starters, and that is a lineup built on a foundation of real production rather than hope. The one blemish is Michael Mayer, a major reach taken nearly five rounds ahead of his ADP, but at TE39 he projects as a depth piece rather than a load-bearing wall. The more interesting call is Jordan Love at QB17, a minor reach that looks defensible given Allen's presence, the two together giving Bowser genuine flexibility as the season unfolds. Coming off a 56-percent win rate in 2025, Bowser enters the Super Smash Bros. Melee division sitting fifth, projecting at the 54th percentile in the field. There is real upside here if the projected starters hit, and the draft suggests a manager who understood the assignment.

Harris10 lands at 66th percentile in the field and fourth in the Super Smash Bros. Melee division, which sounds modest until you actually look at how this roster was assembled. There were no splashy steals, no moments where the room gasped, just a draft that kept returning solid value pick after pick, with 17 chalk selections and only three minor reaches across the entire board. The foundation here is legitimately strong: Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 is the kind of anchor that makes a roster credible from the first pick forward, and George Pickens at WR10, Emeka Egbuka at WR18, and Luther Burden at WR22 give Harris10 a receiver group that will consistently produce at the top of the lineup. Tyler Warren at TE4 was taken about half a round early, but that is the least alarming reach imaginable when the result is a top-five tight end. The QB situation projects as the softest part of the roster, but in a positionless format, Chase and company can paper over a lot. This team did not overpay for anything, and that discipline tends to compound.

After a brutal 2025 that saw Diddy Kong scrape the bottom of the scoring barrel with a 9-27 record and a 20th-percentile finish, this roster looks like a genuine course correction. The engine is Jayden Daniels, a QB5 projection that gives the manager a true difference-maker at the position, and he is flanked by Puka Nacua at WR1, a pairing that alone represents a different tier of ambition than last season. Jonathan Taylor, landing at RB4 despite slipping nearly a full round past his ADP, looks like the kind of quiet draft-day win that separates contenders from also-rans, and Tee Higgins at WR19 adds another projected starter with legitimate upside. The rest of the roster is built on chalk with just a handful of minor reaches, meaning this manager did not gamble his way into this position, he drafted it. Sitting third in the division and in the 66th percentile tournament-wide, Diddy Kong is not yet a championship favorite, but the gap between where this team was and where it is now is the whole story.

Fox didn't need a single moment of draft-room lightning to build one of the more quietly formidable rosters in the Super Smash Bros. Melee division. The foundation is Trey McBride, a TE2 projection snagged four picks later than his ADP suggested he'd last, and CeeDee Lamb, a WR5 who anchors the skill group with the kind of projection that makes the rest of the roster feel like a luxury. The luxury, in this case, is a tight end room that extends through Tucker Kraft at TE5 and Harold Fannin at TE6, giving Fox a level of depth at that position that most managers in the field would trade significant draft capital to match. Ladd McConkey, a WR20 who fell more than a round past his ADP, pairs with Justin Herbert in a stack that adds another layer of upside to an already steady lineup. The 2025 résumé, a 90th percentile scoring season, tells you this isn't a roster that merely looks good on paper, and the 2026 construction gives no reason to expect regression.

PVCLARK did not construct this roster with one galactic swing of the hammer. They built it the way a good contractor builds a house: methodically, efficiently, and with almost nothing wasted. The foundation is genuinely elite: Jahmyr Gibbs projects as the RB1 in the entire field, and A.J. Brown comes in at WR8 with George Kittle right behind him at TE9, giving PVCLARK a top-tier anchor at three different positions simultaneously. What makes this roster quietly impressive is how the value accrued in the middle and late rounds without a single major reach to offset it. Dallas Goedert fell nearly two rounds past his ADP before PVCLARK scooped him at TE15, and Adonai Mitchell landed 1.3 rounds late at WR67, extending real depth at a position where depth pays dividends in a positionless format. The draft logged three positive-value picks against zero major reaches, which is exactly the kind of quiet competence that produces a 64 percent win rate and an 81st-percentile standing. Division-leading, loaded at the top, and disciplined throughout: PVCLARK belongs in the conversation.
