The draft strategy saw some shrewd moves, with David Njoku and Romeo Doubs being snatched up later than expected, adding potential value to the squad. However, some choices like Matthew Stafford and Malik Nabers were made earlier than their average draft positions, indicating a mix of calculated risks and confident selections. With the small stack bonus from Kyler Murray and Trey McBride potentially adding synergy, Muzio is poised for an intriguing season where every decision and performance factor in heavily against stiff competition.
