SPlissken enters 2026 sitting third in the Disney Infinity division and in the bottom three percent of the entire field, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. The headline asset is real: CeeDee Lamb at WR5 gives this roster a genuine anchor, and the surrounding receiver group has enough projected starters to keep the lineup competitive on paper. But the decisions made to build around that core range from curious to indefensible. Michael Wilson, a WR39, was taken three full rounds before the market thought he was worth touching. Josh Downs, a WR46, went two rounds early. Carson Beck, a QB40 who projects as barely a functional streamer, was reached on by more than six rounds. The one player who actually fell to SPlissken was Tua Tagovailoa, a QB31, and he is not exactly a consolation prize worth celebrating. Six major reaches across a single draft is not bad luck, it is a philosophy, and the philosophy is wrong. Lamb deserved a better supporting cast than this roster managed to build around him.

There is not much to celebrate in TampaTonyUSMC's Disney Infinity outlook, and the draft record explains a lot of why. The big swing of the offseason was taking Caleb Williams at 2.02, a full 1.3 rounds ahead of his ADP, and then doubling down by grabbing D'Andre Swift at 5.11 when the market said he was an eighth-round player. Paying round premiums that steep tends to compress the rest of a roster, and sure enough, Tony's projected starters grade out at QB3 Lamar Jackson and WR14 DeVonta Smith at the top, then fall off sharply into the likes of WR30 Rome Odunze, WR45 Jakobi Meyers, and TE21 Kenyon Sadiq holding down the back end of the lineup. That is not a championship core; that is a team with two good players and a lot of hope. Sitting 11th in the division and in just the 5th percentile of the field, TampaTonyUSMC is not looking at a rebuilding year so much as a surviving one.

There is a particular kind of exhaustion that comes not from catastrophe but from accumulating mediocrity, and ace5869 is living it. Sitting 10th in the Disney Infinity division and projecting into just the 13th percentile of the field, this roster does not have one glaring problem to fix, it has the quieter and harder problem of having no obvious fix at all. The backfield is genuinely strong, with Jahmyr Gibbs projecting as RB1 and Kyren Williams and TreVeyon Henderson both earning starting projections, but that strength keeps running into a receiver group that tops out at Brian Thomas Jr. at WR31, a player ace5869 reached three full rounds early to acquire. The draft tilted toward optimism rather than value, logging six minor reaches and one major one against zero steals. And then there is George Kittle, projected as a starting TE9 but coming off an Achilles tear, with "on track for Week 1" carrying exactly as much certainty as that phrase ever does after that injury. There is no lever left to pull here, just a long season to survive.

Sitting at 9th in the Disney Infinity division and projecting out at just the 23rd percentile of the field, Maye the Force Be With U is in the kind of position where you start mentally calculating how many wins you need just to feel okay about yourself. The foundation is not without merit: Drake Maye grades out as a QB2, Amon-Ra St. Brown anchors the skill positions as a WR4, and Tucker Kraft at TE5 gives this roster genuine upside at the top. The problem is the steep drop-off after those names. The projected final starter slot belongs to Rhamondre Stevenson, a RB31, which tells you everything about how thin the margin for error gets. The draft did nothing to change the math, producing zero steals and capping out with just one value pick across twenty-plus selections, while burning a pick on Chris Brazzell II five rounds ahead of consensus. There is no hidden upside waiting to be unlocked here, no cavalry coming. This roster is mostly what it is.

There is no graceful way to spin an 8th-place division ranking and a 35th-percentile tournament projection, and PooPoo4tu probably should not try. The roster has one genuinely elite pillar in the tight end group, where Trey McBride (TE2) and Tyler Warren (TE4) project as two of the best at their position in the entire field, but the supporting cast around them does not hold up under scrutiny. The quarterback situation is quietly damaging: Jordan Love (QB17) and C.J. Stroud (QB22) are both projected starters, and neither ranks inside the top fifteen at their position. Meanwhile, the draft offered almost no route to upgrade on the margins, producing zero steals and thirteen chalk picks against two major reaches, including Warren himself taken a full round early. The rest of the lineup leans on WR48 Jayden Reed as a projected starter, which tells you most of what you need to know about how thin this gets past the top names. McBride and Warren can carry a week, but they cannot carry a season.

sitdowndave is the kind of team that makes you nod slowly while reviewing the roster, never quite finding the thing that excites you and never quite finding the thing that worries you either. The ceiling here is real: Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and Brock Bowers at TE1 are genuine difference-makers, and Rashee Rice at WR13 and Zay Flowers at WR16 give the scoring column plenty of ways to stay warm. But the floor is where the margins start doing their quiet, grinding work. Rico Dowdle projects as the weakest projected starter at RB32, and Christian Kirk at WR100 cost four and a half rounds of draft capital before his ADP even knew what hit it. That reach matters in a tournament where a single bad week can end everything. Sitting at 55th percentile and seventh in the Disney Infinity division, sitdowndave is not a pretender and not a contender, just a team that will win or lose based on whether Taylor stays healthy and whether the back of the roster quietly holds its weight.

gordish03 didn't win the draft with one flashy move. They just kept making sensible ones, round after round, until the board had been picked clean in their favor. The foundation is legitimately elite: Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and Drake London at WR7 anchor a starting group that most managers in the Disney Infinity division would envy, and London arriving two spots past his ADP is the kind of quiet win that separates careful drafters from lucky ones. Layer in Garrett Wilson at WR17, Davante Adams at WR25, and D.J. Moore at WR26 as projected starters, and the top of this roster has real teeth. Chase Brown at RB11 keeps the ground game relevant, while Sam LaPorta at TE8 and Mark Andrews at TE14 give gordish03 genuine flexibility at a position where most managers are scraping. Sixteen chalk picks and zero major reaches tell the whole story: no gambling, no panic, just a manager who trusted the board and came away with a lineup that projects well into the 59th percentile of the field.

After finishing 11-25 last season and scraping the bottom 13 percent of the field in scoring, brianhuss has rebuilt with the kind of roster that makes that 2025 nightmare feel like a distant memory. The engine here is obvious: Josh Allen at QB1 and De'Von Achane at RB6 give this team a genuinely elite ceiling at the top of the lineup, the sort of one-two punch that turns a 3,900-point season into a distant, embarrassing footnote. Derrick Henry at RB12 and Travis Etienne at RB18 round out a backfield group that projects as one of the stronger collections in the Disney Infinity division. The draft wasn't flashy, mostly chalk with a handful of good values late, but brianhuss did squeeze Jacory Croskey-Merritt and Tyler Allgeier past their ADPs, adding real depth at the back end. Kyle Pitts and Dallas Goedert give the tight end room legitimate upside. The wide receiver group is thinner, with Jameson Williams as

the projected WR21 anchor, but the top-end talent elsewhere is more than enough to project a genuine bounce-back into the top half of the field.

EvRitt3 didn't need a lottery ticket to build a winner in the Disney Infinity division, just a draft that quietly, repeatedly made the right call. The anchor of this roster is Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, a projected top-three receiver who gives the team a genuine centerpiece, and Ashton Jeanty at RB7 and Colston Loveland at TE3 mean the elite production doesn't stop there. Add Jeremiyah Love at RB13 and Cam Skattebo at RB20 as projected starters alongside them and you have a lineup where the depth chart reads like a highlights reel before the bench even gets involved. The one concrete value on the board was Justin Herbert at QB8, taken a full round and a half after his ADP suggested he'd be gone, which is the kind of patient execution that separates good drafts from great ones. The 2025 campaign ended at 39 percent wins, but this roster looks materially stronger, and sitting at the 75th percentile of the field entering 2026, EvRitt3 has constructed exactly the kind of team that makes noise in a tournament like this.

Sven_CJ didn't win the draft with one flashy move, just a series of small advantages that stacked up into something real. The foundation is legitimately elite: Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Justin Jefferson at WR6 give this roster a ceiling that most managers in the Disney Infinity division would envy. From there, the draft kept finding edges. Saquon Barkley fell nearly a full round past his ADP and landed at pick 3.12, RJ Harvey slipped a round and a half before Sven_CJ grabbed him at 11.12, and Alvin Kamara arrived almost two rounds late in the eighteenth round. Four values across the board, zero major reaches, and a Kyler Murray/Jefferson stack that adds upside the raw rankings alone don't capture. The 2025 season, 22 wins and a 70th-percentile scoring finish, suggests this is a manager who knows how to convert a well-built roster into actual production. Third in the division and 75th percentile in the tournament, Sven_CJ enters 2026 as a genuine contender, built the quiet, correct way.

NFTThree didn't build this roster by swinging for the fences on one marquee move. They built it by simply drafting better than the board expected them to, round after round. Joe Burrow at QB4 fell nearly a full round past his ADP, Matthew Stafford landed even later than that, and David Montgomery came off the board over a round after the field thought he would. None of those picks look glamorous in isolation, but stacked together they paint a picture of a manager who stayed patient and kept collecting on a market that kept mispricing talent. The Burrow caveat is real, of course: his injury history is not a footnote but a central plot line, and a health concern that's bitten hard in multiple seasons. Still, the roster doesn't hinge on any single outcome. Bijan Robinson projecting as RB2 gives this team a weekly anchor, A.J. Brown at WR8 provides a reliable ceiling alongside him, and consistent draft execution pushed NFTThree to second in the Disney Infinity division and into the 88th percentile of the field.

JNewcott lands at 97th percentile and first in the Disney Infinity division not because of one splashy pick but because of a draft that quietly won almost every exchange. Six value picks against zero major reaches is a distribution that holds up under scrutiny, and the key ones are doing real work here. Malik Nabers fell a full 1.2 rounds past his ADP before JNewcott grabbed him at pick 5.01, and he projects as WR12, a locked starter. James Cook slid nearly a round and lands as RB5, which is about as safe a foundation as this format offers. Patrick Mahomes, taken at 6.12 with an ADP of 5.08, gives the roster a QB12 projection at a discount most managers didn't get. Puka Nacua projects WR1 and anchors the whole group. The weakest projected starter is Jordan Addison at WR43, who was himself a value pick, which tells you something about the floor here. This is a roster built by someone who knew exactly what things were worth and kept collecting the difference.
