There is a version of this team that looks fine on paper, and then you look closer and the seams start to show. Brock Bowers at TE1 and Saquon Barkley at RB8 are genuine top-end assets, and Tee Higgins, Rome Odunze, and Jordyn Tyson give the starting lineup some usable depth at receiver. But the draft shaped this roster in ways that are hard to overlook: Malik Willis and Fernando Mendoza were both taken multiple rounds before their ADPs, eating up real capital on QB24 and QB27 projections that do not justify the price of admission. Meanwhile, Barkley himself was a reach at pick 2.05. You can survive one or two early mistakes in a draft; you cannot easily survive three, especially when the floor collapses this fast. Danvers sits 12th in the division and at the 23rd percentile of the field, and the projected lineup does not offer an obvious path to better. This is a roster built on hope more than leverage, and hope is not a strategy in the Scott Fish Bowl.

SeahawkStu12 enters 2026 sitting 11th in the Man division and at just the 27th tournament percentile, and there is not much in the data suggesting a turnaround is imminent. The receiver group grades out weak, with Marvin Harrison Jr. at WR33 and Carnell Tate at WR29 leading a corps that falls off sharply after Courtland Sutton at WR37, a player Stu reached a full round early to acquire. The draft itself offered little relief: zero steals, sixteen chalk picks, and a major reach on Troy Franklin at WR80, taken nearly three rounds before the market agreed. Christian McCaffrey at RB3 is a genuine anchor, and Drake Maye at QB2 gives the roster a ceiling, but those two stars are propping up a structure that thins out quickly beneath them. Last year's 15-21 record and 15th-percentile scoring were not flukes, they were a diagnosis. Unless Maye and McCaffrey carry a historic workload, Stu is essentially hoping the rest of the field trips over itself.

The 2026 Scott Fish Bowl is shaping up to be a long autumn for y2zet, who sits 10th in the Man division and projects at just the 30th percentile of the field after a 2025 campaign that landed in the 15th percentile of scoring. The roster has real pieces: Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Ashton Jeanty at RB7 give this team a genuine foundation, and Tetairoa McMillan at WR15 is a legitimate contributor. But the draft didn't add much runway. Fourteen chalk picks, zero steals, and a pair of major reaches that strain credulity, most notably Kaytron Allen taken 5.2 rounds ahead of his ADP. Quinshon Judkins, recovering from a fractured fibula, is reportedly on track for training camp but arriving healthy and arriving productive are two different things for a player on Cleveland. Caleb Williams at QB6 offers upside, but Rhamondre Stevenson projecting as the weakest starter at RB31 tells you everything about where the floor is. There is no obvious lever left to pull, and the margin for error here is essentially zero.

There is no sugarcoating what the numbers say about Blinky in 2026: a 31st-percentile projection and a ninth-place divisional standing paint the picture of a team already fighting from behind before a single week is played. The roster carries some genuine talent, Josh Allen at QB1 and A.J. Brown at WR8 headlining a group that, on paper, should not look this grim, but the draft board tells a grimmer story underneath. Of 19 picks, the team produced zero steals, leaned on 12 chalk selections, and absorbed two major reaches, most notably taking D.J. Moore two full rounds ahead of his market value. Brown's move to New England alongside Drake Maye creates legitimate upside, but Brown has missed at least two games in five of his seven seasons, and a team already projected near the bottom of the field cannot afford to absorb that kind of injury tax. The floor here is low, the ceiling requires several things to go right simultaneously, and there is no obvious move left that changes the math.

Inky Blinky Pinky & Clyde enters 2026 sitting seventh in the Man division and projected in just the 31st percentile of the field, and the roster construction explains exactly why. The receiver group is genuinely elite, CeeDee Lamb (WR5), Justin Jefferson (WR6), DeVonta Smith (WR14), and Zay Flowers (WR16) headlining a unit that any manager would covet. But that strength is doing a lot of heavy lifting for a roster that is thin everywhere else it counts. The backfield tops out at Rico Dowdle (RB32) and Zach Charbonnet (RB42), and the quarterback situation is quietly alarming: the projected starters are Tyler Shough (QB20) and Cam Ward (QB23), which would be fine as depth insurance but is less inspiring as the ceiling. Worse, the draft board offers little reassurance. The team logged two major reaches in MarShawn Lloyd (RB66) and Ray Davis (RB62), players taken rounds before the market agreed they were worth selecting, with zero steals to offset the overpayments. The receivers are real, but receivers cannot save everyone.

TheRealBigRigg enters 2026 sitting eighth in the Man division and in just the 31st percentile of the field, and the roster does not hide why. The quarterback situation is quietly catastrophic: Jordan Love projects as QB17 and C.J. Stroud as QB22, meaning the position that most reliably separates winners from also-rans is a liability before the season even tips off. The saving grace is a legitimate RB corps headlined by Kenneth Walker III (RB10), Chase Brown (RB11), and Breece Hall (RB14), plus Ja'Marr Chase (WR2) anchoring the skill positions. But the draft did little to change the trajectory, producing one steal and fourteen chalk picks while also featuring a reach on Braelon Allen taken nearly four rounds ahead of his ADP. Allen slots in at RB58, meaning TheRealBigRigg burned premium draft capital on a player who projects as a depth piece. Last season's 33 percent win rate and 27th-percentile

scoring look less like a bad stretch and more like a baseline, and nothing about this offseason suggests the floor has risen.

PHILLYGREEN is the team that will decide its own fate, because nobody else is going to hand them anything. Sitting sixth in the Man division at the 44th percentile, this roster is built on genuine strengths and one glaring dependency. The top end is legitimately impressive: Lamar Jackson at QB3, Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4, Rashee Rice at WR13, and a projected starting group at tight end that includes Sam LaPorta, Jake Ferguson, Isaiah Likely, and Dallas Goedert. That's the kind of upper tier that keeps a manager competitive week to week. The issue is that everything underneath it thins out fast, and when the elite guys don't deliver, the fallback options, Khalil Shakir at WR51, Jalen Coker at WR55, are players you tolerate rather than trust. Jaxson Dart is the wildcard, a QB11 projection carrying real upside but also a track record of inconsistency and medical tent visits that make him a

complicated bet. PHILLYGREEN drafted smartly, finding genuine value on Likely and Coker, but smart drafting only matters if the margins fall their way. In 2026, they almost certainly will, or they won't. That's the whole story.

joefritz sits at 45th percentile heading into 2026, and that number feels exactly right in the most uncomfortable way. The receiver group is legitimately good, Drake London (WR7), Chris Olave (WR11), and Malik Nabers (WR12) forming a top-of-roster core that gives this team a real floor, with Jameson Williams (WR21) and Luther Burden (WR22) offering genuine upside deeper down. The problem is that the margins around that core are thin in the ways that matter most. Sam Darnold (QB21) is a weak link in a format where quarterback production still counts, and Theo Johnson (TE37) offers almost nothing. Jonathan Taylor (RB4) gives the backfield credibility, but joefritz reached on him slightly and leaned on late-round running backs throughout the draft, yielding little proven upside there. A 53-percent win rate and 64th-percentile scoring last year says this manager knows how to compete, but in

a field where small edges compound over a long season, running out the same middle-of-the-pack formula without a clear separator might be exactly one margin short.

Circus Clowns did not build this roster by swinging for fences and missing. They built it by repeatedly being right. The anchor is Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and De'Von Achane at RB6, a pairing that gives the Clowns legitimate elite production before they even scroll down the depth chart. From there, the draft just kept delivering: Derrick Henry at RB12 and Jeremiyah Love at RB13 round out a backfield group that would be the envy of most tournaments. The quarterback picture is understated but functional, with Trevor Lawrence projecting as QB10 and Brock Purdy sliding to QB13 despite an ADP that had him going a full round earlier, genuine value that the Clowns quietly pocketed. The 2025 ledger adds credibility here too, a 64 percent win rate and a scoring total that landed in the 80th percentile of the field. Sitting fourth in the Man Division at the 57th tournament percentile, Circus Clowns look like a team that won the draft by never doing anything stupid.

andreww9 sits third in the division and at the 63rd percentile tournament-wide, and that standing undersells what this roster actually looks like on paper. The draft was almost surgical: 15 chalk picks, three genuine values, one steal, and a single minor reach across the whole board. That lone reach is Patrick Mahomes at QB12, taken a round early, and given that Mahomes is reportedly ahead of schedule in his ACL and LCL recovery, that early trigger looks more like conviction than impatience. The real craftsmanship shows in the receiver room, where Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 anchors the group and Nico Collins, a WR9 projection, landed nearly a full round after his ADP. Stack in Davante Adams and Michael Wilson as projected starters, and andreww9 has the kind of receiver depth that keeps the lineup humming regardless of injury variance. Joe Burrow at QB4 gives the team a true upside anchor at the position. This roster was built with patience, drafted with precision, and has very little on it worth apologizing for.

Mike Blewitt built this roster the way good drafters always do: not with one flashy swing, but by repeatedly coming out ahead on fair exchanges. James Cook lands as RB5 after Blewitt grabbed him at 2.09 against an ADP of 2.04, a modest but real edge. Travis Kelce arriving nearly two full rounds after his ADP of 7.05 is the quieter win here, and in a positionless format that kind of late-round value on a player projected TE10 compounds quickly. Puka Nacua projects as WR1, Omarion Hampton sits at RB9, and Travis Etienne checks in at RB18, giving Blewitt a top line that could carry a bad week without flinching. The Matthew Stafford and Nacua stack adds ceiling, and the Baker Mayfield and Emeka Egbuka pairing offers a second lever to pull when matchups line up. Coming off a 21st percentile finish in 2025, there is obvious room to climb, and a roster that projects at the 84th percentile suggests Blewitt found it.

After finishing in the bottom 17 percent of scoring in 2025, SneakyJoe has rebuilt into something that looks a lot like a contender, sitting first in the Man division and at the 93rd percentile of the entire field. The engine of this turnaround is a tight end group that borders on unfair: Trey McBride at TE2, Colston Loveland at TE3, Harold Fannin at TE6, and Kyle Pitts at TE7 give SneakyJoe a week-to-week advantage at the position that most managers can only dream about. Pitts alone looks like a bargain, snagged a full round past his ADP. Layered on top of that foundation are legitimate playmakers at receiver, led by George Pickens at WR10, while Justin Herbert at QB8 adds another projected starter who came in late, taken nearly a round after his ADP suggested he would go. The draft was disciplined across the board, producing five value picks with no catastrophic misses. SneakyJoe was miserable last season and learned exactly the right lessons.
