There is no soft landing here, no angle that flatters damoney8888, and the draft record makes sure of it. Four major reaches in a single draft is not bad luck, it is a philosophy, and this roster is what that philosophy produces. The most damning exhibit is Rashid Shaheed, scooped up nearly five rounds ahead of his market value and projected at WR57, a player who costs a premium and delivers a bench spot in return. Meanwhile, the roster's legitimate centerpiece, Drake Maye, arrives with real upside, a new weapon in AJ Brown and a convincing MVP-contention resume, yet even Maye cannot carry a team whose supporting cast thins out so quickly. Chris Olave projects at WR11 and is a genuine asset, but the receiver group collapses almost immediately after him, with Jayden Higgins sitting as the projected weakest starter at WR54. This team is sitting dead last in the Perfect Dark division, in the second percentile of the field, and the draft sheet explains every bit of it.

KupNation enters the 2026 Scott Fish Bowl sitting 11th in the Perfect Dark division and projected in just the 12th percentile of the field, and the roster does not offer much reason for optimism. The quarterback situation is genuinely strong, with Lamar Jackson at QB3 and Joe Burrow at QB4 projecting as legitimate weapons, but the rest of the lineup grades out as average at best, and the draft offered no relief. Of the 20 picks logged, not one qualifies as a steal or a value, the entire board was chalk with a handful of minor reaches sprinkled in. The deepest positional group, those eight running backs, tops out at Derrick Henry at RB12, and the projected lineup bottoms out with Tony Pollard at RB30. Luther Burden projects as the WR22, which is fine, but fine does not move the needle when you are already this far behind. Jackson and Burrow can win a week, but a QB advantage only carries so far when everything underneath it is middling. KupNation is not broken, just quietly outgunned.

pacattack24 drafted with patience and precision, running nearly the entire board at or after ADP, and the roster still lands at 46th percentile, which is the kind of outcome that makes a person question everything. The foundation is real: Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Omarion Hampton at RB9 give this team a genuinely elite upper tier, and the Herbert-McConkey stack adds connector tissue between the positions. But the math gets cruel fast after that. Justin Herbert was the one place the draft jumped the gun, taken nearly a round early at QB8, and the payoff is a guy who profiles as a fine starter but not a difference-maker at that cost. Meanwhile the tight end group, led by Juwan Johnson at TE20, is the weakest projected starting spot on the roster, and when the rest of your depth is mid-tier, that ceiling matters. pacattack24 did almost everything right and is still sitting 10th in the Perfect Dark division, a reminder that in a field this sharp, doing things correctly is the entry fee, not the prize.

TylerBuecher did almost everything right at the draft table, which makes the result sting more than a chaotic roster would. Sixteen chalk picks, two values, zero major reaches: this was a disciplined, patient exercise in letting the board come to you. Malik Nabers fell nearly a full round, and TylerBuecher was there to collect a WR12 at a discount. The receiver group as a whole projects as a genuine strength, with Puka Nacua, George Pickens, and Nabers all penciled in as starters. The problem is that the rest of the roster never caught up to that ceiling. The projected starters thin out fast once you move past the top names, and Jayden Reed clocking in at WR48 as the weakest projected starter is a real number. A Dak Prescott and Pickens stack adds connective tissue, but Prescott projects as a QB7 on a team that needed him to be more. Good process, modest outcome: that is the cruelest verdict a draft can hand down, and TylerBuecher is sitting with it at ninth in the Perfect Dark division.

jjzachariason finished 2026 in 54th percentile territory, which is exactly as unglamorous as it sounds and exactly as defensible. The roster is built on a genuinely elite receiving corps anchored by Justin Jefferson at WR6 and Trey McBride at TE2, and when those two are humming alongside DeVonta Smith at WR14 and Zay Flowers at WR16, the weekly floor is real. The Murray-Jefferson stack adds the kind of ceiling correlation that turns a good week into a great one. But this team lives and dies in the margins, and the margins are thin. The quarterback situation tops out at Kyler Murray as a QB19, meaning jjzachariason needs Jefferson and McBride to consistently outperform their positional neighbors just to stay even with the field. DK Metcalf at WR36 arriving later than his ADP suggested is the kind of quiet draft win that compounds over a long season. Nothing here collapses under scrutiny. Nothing here makes opponents nervous either. Division rank of eighth is the honest summary: a team that is right there, waiting for the field to make a mistake.

FntsyIntrvntion sits at 57th percentile heading into 2026, and that number tells the whole story: good enough to compete, not good enough to coast. The receiver group is genuinely dangerous at the top, with Jaxon Smith-Njigba projecting as WR3 and A.J. Brown coming in at WR8 despite being drafted three rounds later than his ADP, which is the kind of quiet advantage that wins close weeks. The problem is that the margins this team needs to win are the same margins that could break it. Jaydon Blue was taken seven full rounds before his ADP, a gamble that either looks prescient or wasteful by October, and Trey Benson was similarly rushed off the board three rounds early. Those are not death blows in a positionless format, but they represent draft capital spent on hope rather than certainty. Ashton Jeanty at RB7 gives the team a genuine difference-maker, and the Jared Goff and Jameson Williams stack adds a ceiling game. But with no proven closer at the TE spot and two major reaches already baked in, FntsyIntrvntion is betting that its floor never gets tested.

Andelo finished 91st percentile in scoring last year and came into 2026 drafting like someone who trusted their own board over the consensus, which is either a character trait or a liability depending on how it plays out. The most telling example is Elijah Sarratt, taken 5.5 rounds ahead of his ADP, a swing that looks reckless on paper until you remember that Ja'Marr Chase is WR2 and Tucker Kraft is TE5 and the roster underneath them has genuine depth. The reach that actually deserves scrutiny is Keon Coleman at WR91, taken nearly three rounds early, a player whose upside projection still lands him outside the top 90 at his position. That is not conviction paying off, that is conviction in process. Gadsden at TE16 carries a real asterisk after the Chargers signed David Njoku, which adds some noise to what should have been a clean value. Still, a team with Chase, Garrett Wilson at WR17, and Cook at RB5 as projected starters can absorb some late-round gambling. The draft looks messy. The core does not.

jshilhan didn't make headlines on draft day, and that's kind of the point. The roster sitting at 65th percentile in the field and fifth in the Perfect Dark division was built the same way a good poker player accumulates chips: quietly, consistently, one good decision at a time. The foundation is a receiver room that genuinely belongs in the top tier, anchored by Amon-Ra St. Brown (WR4) and CeeDee Lamb (WR5) as projected starters alongside Tee Higgins (WR19) and Brian Thomas Jr. (WR31). That's not depth for depth's sake, that's four legitimate contributors who can each carry a week. The tight end corps is equally compelling, with Tyler Warren (TE4) and Isaiah Likely (TE13) both projecting as starters, and Likely arriving as the one clear value of the draft, slipping a full round past his ADP. Brock Purdy and Matthew Stafford give jshilhan functional quarterback options at QB13 and QB14. This roster didn't need a splash pick to be dangerous. It just needed to be right more often than it was wrong, and by that measure, draft day went well.

Weaves\_ didn't manufacture this roster through lottery-ticket swings. They built it the way a good contractor builds a house: methodically, pick by pick, consistently coming out ahead. Josh Allen at QB1 anchors the whole operation, and Patrick Mahomes at QB12 arriving a full round past his ADP means Weaves\_ essentially got a discount on a Patrick Mahomes and Travis Kelce stack, one of the more reliable point-generating combinations in the tournament. De'Von Achane at RB6 and Saquon Barkley at RB8 give the roster genuine upside at the top, while Jeremiyah Love at RB13 and Kyren Williams at RB15 keep the quality from dropping off quickly. Jadarian Price came in nearly two rounds after his ADP, which means that even the weakest projected starter on this team was acquired efficiently. The 66th percentile projection feels like it undersells what Weaves\_ actually assembled here. Fourth in the Perfect Dark division is a reasonable floor, not a ceiling, for a team that simply refused to make a bad deal.

CarliDD didn't swing for the fences and miss, didn't mortgage the middle rounds chasing upside, just drafted a clean, disciplined roster that sits 68th percentile in the field and third in the Perfect Dark division. The foundation is real: Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Drake London at WR7 are projected starters who give this lineup a ceiling worth respecting, and George Kittle at TE9 adds a third blue-chip name without any creative accounting required. What makes the draft quietly impressive is that CarliDD never reached, posting zero reaches against a draft sheet that logged three values. Kyle Monangai came in 1.6 rounds later than his ADP suggested he'd last, Jauan Jennings fell nearly two full rounds, and De'Zhaun Stribling slid past his number as well. None of those are lottery tickets, but that's the point. This wasn't a roster built on hope, it was built on the boring, reliable discipline of taking good players when the board offered them cheap. In a format this competitive, that kind of draft shapes a season.

keeganjcmahon finished 2025 at the 87th percentile and enters 2026 looking every bit as dangerous, not because of one thunderbolt pick but because the draft held up at almost every turn, 17 chalk selections and two genuine values with almost nothing given back. The foundation is real: Jahmyr Gibbs projects as RB1, Nico Collins sits at WR9, and Colston Loveland is the TE3, a trio of starters who would anchor a contender in any format. The wide receiver group running behind Collins is quietly impressive too, with Tetairoa McMillan (WR15) and Emeka Egbuka (WR18) both projecting as starters alongside Marvin Harrison Jr. (WR33), whose upside remains genuine despite two uneven seasons and a murky situation at quarterback in Arizona. Khalil Shakir slipping a full round past his ADP in the late rounds is exactly the kind of quiet win that separates 82nd-percentile rosters from the ones sitting at home in January. This team did not swing for the fences. It just kept making contact.

joshnorris54 didn't reshape the Perfect Dark division with one seismic swing, they just kept winning the small arguments. Jonathan Taylor at RB4 slipping half a round past his ADP at 2.07, Brock Bowers projecting as TE1 and anchoring what shapes up as one of the deeper tight end groups in the field, and a starting quartet that includes Sam LaPorta at TE8 and Mark Andrews at TE14, these are the kinds of edges that compound quietly into a division title and an 84th percentile tournament standing. The quarterback situation carries real uncertainty, with Jalen Hurts projecting at QB9 and Tyler Shough sitting at QB20, and Shough's ceiling in Year 2 depends on whether the talent around him in New Orleans, Chris Olave when healthy, top-ten pick Jordyn Tyson developing, actually translates into volume. That is the one thread joshnorris54 cannot fully control. Everything else reads like a manager who understood the board, stayed patient, and collected advantages while the rest of the room was chasing.
