However, with Najee Harris struggling to climb beyond the depths of RB36, and a wide receiver lineup that fails to inspire confidence beyond Malik Nabers' promising WR4 rank, the roster seems riddled with uncertainty. Despite finding value in the draft with Cam Skattebo, questionable

draft decisions, like reaching for Bo Nix and Jerome Ford, have dealt a significant blow to their potential. Even with some minor synergies like the Sutton/Nix stack, FFChef faces an uphill battle to claw their way out of the basement they've found themselves in, their hopes of betterment slipping through their fingers like sand.
