arm1323 sits 12th in the Bulbasaur division and in just the 18th percentile of the field, and the roster reveals exactly why. The top end offers something to work with: Amon-Ra St. Brown projects as WR4, and Jalen Hurts anchors a nice stack with Dallas Goedert, who quietly held the Philadelphia passing game together last season and stuck around on a one-year deal, meaning this is likely the last year to extract value from that pairing. But the draft created its own problems before the season even started. Derrick Henry came at RB12 value, fine on paper, except arm1323 paid a round and a half in advance to get him, and Braelon Allen was grabbed nearly five rounds before the market said to, projecting out at just RB58. Those two picks alone burned capital that could have deepened the roster. Matthew Golden projects as the weakest projected starter at WR52, and there is no obvious move to upgrade him. This team is not a work in progress. It is simply behind.

There is no spin available for TURumHam, and at this point the weary observer stops looking for one. The draft told the whole story: three major reaches, three minor reaches, zero steals, and a roster sitting 11th in the Bulbasaur division at the 23rd percentile of the field. The major reaches are where things get genuinely hard to defend. Josh Jacobs, a projected RB16, was taken a full 1.3 rounds early, which is the kind of aggressive bet that needs to pay off to justify itself, and at RB16 the margin for error is thin. Then, deep in the draft, Keon Coleman at WR91 came off the board nearly five and a half rounds before his ADP, followed by Tory Horton at WR93 taken almost four rounds early. Those are not bold swings. Those are a manager who fell in love with names and drafted accordingly. Ashton Jeanty and Jaxon Smith-Njigba give this team a real foundation, but the rest of the construction suggests TURumHam ran out of patience before it ran out of picks, and the standings projections reflect exactly that.

There is a particular kind of draft exhaustion that sets in when you do everything right and still end up staring at a roster that does not quite get there. JFAR played the value game correctly, landing 15 picks at chalk, picking up Tua Tagovailoa at QB31 nearly three full rounds after his ADP suggested he would go, and snagging Keaton Mitchell well past his expected range. The problem is that correct process and useful outcomes are not the same thing. Tagovailoa sits at QB31. Mitchell projects at RB49. The receiver group is genuinely impressive, with A.J. Brown, Rashee Rice, Emeka Egbuka, Brian Thomas Jr., and Brock Bowers anchoring the starters, but the format does not reward depth so much as it rewards peaks, and the peaks here outside of receivers and Bowers are soft. JFAR finished at the 67th percentile last year and projects 24th percentile this season, which is what a roster built

on disciplined process but insufficient upside tends to produce: a draft you cannot criticize and a finish you cannot celebrate.

jloww77 sits ninth in the Bulbasaur division and in the 24th percentile of the field, and the roster makes a compelling case for why. The draft was almost entirely chalk, with 15 picks landing right at ADP and zero genuine steals. The two major reaches sum up the problem: Javonte Williams, grabbed two rounds ahead of his ADP at RB17, and Germie Bernard, taken three rounds early at WR79. Those are exactly the kinds of swings that leave a team light on value everywhere else. Drake London at WR7 and Malik Nabers at WR12 give the roster a real top end, and the Jaxson Dart and Nabers stack adds a correlation bonus worth chasing. But below that top tier the roster thins quickly, with Jaylen Warren projected as the weakest starter at RB27 and the rest of the depth chart populated by players whose ranks suggest they will spend the season watching from outside the lineup. When the margin for error was this small to begin with, using premium draft capital on a reach is not a recoverable mistake.

Birdgang enters 2026 sitting eighth in the Bulbasaur Division and in just the 38th percentile of the field, and the roster does not offer many reasons for optimism. The receiver room is genuinely elite, with CeeDee Lamb (WR5) and Justin Jefferson (WR6) forming as good a top-two as anyone in this tournament can claim, and Tetairoa McMillan (WR15) and Jameson Williams (WR21) adding real depth behind them. The problem is that the rest of the roster does not come close to matching that ceiling. The backfield is middling at best, headlined by David Montgomery (RB23), who left Detroit after losing ground to Jahmyr Gibbs and now lands in Houston competing with Woody Marks for carries, which is a softer room but hardly a guaranteed workhorse role. Matthew Stafford (QB14) and Fernando Mendoza (QB27) bracket a position that grades out weak. The draft offered no steals and produced two major reaches. Lamb and Jefferson are carrying a house that needs a new foundation, not a coat of paint.

Shoryuken! posted a respectable 75th-percentile scoring season in 2025, which makes the projected slide to 41st percentile this year all the more disorienting. The core is real enough: Jayden Daniels at QB5 stacked with Terry McLaurin gives the team a functional spine, and Jonathan Taylor at RB4 alongside James Cook at RB5 keeps the ceiling from caving in entirely. But the draft did this team no favors at the margins. Two major reaches in the late rounds, Dontayvion Wicks and Keenan Allen, consumed picks 17 and 18 on players projecting at WR96 and WR99 respectively, and the whole board turned up just two values against sixteen chalk selections. Mike Evans adds intrigue after his move to San Francisco following an injury-shortened 2025, but at WR27 he is hardly a difference-maker on his own. The top of this roster is legitimate. Everything below it is filler, and in a positionless format where depth shapes outcomes, that gap is precisely the problem.

Ruben1out sits at the 47th percentile and sixth in the Bulbasaur division, which is exactly as unremarkable as it sounds, and yet this roster is close enough to dangerous that the margin between a winning season and a forgettable one comes down to a handful of swing players. Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and Saquon Barkley at RB8 give the lineup a genuine ceiling, and Tucker Kraft at TE5 alongside Sam LaPorta at TE8 adds real depth at a position where most managers are scraping. The question is whether those pillars carry enough weight when the supporting cast wobbles. Isaiah Likely, now following John Harbaugh to a lighter tight end room in New York, could push his TE13 projection upward and quietly become one of the better calls in the draft. On the other end, Josh Downs projects as the weakest projected starter at WR46, and in a format where the margins decide everything, that is not a name that inspires confidence when the schedule gets hard.

DynastyKaz didn't win the draft with one flashy moment, they won it by repeatedly coming out on the right side of value. The foundation is hard to argue with: Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and De'Von Achane at RB6 give this team a top-six punch at that position before a single receiver lines up, and Caleb Williams, secured roughly eight picks later than his average draft position, slots in as a projected QB6 with a direct stack to Luther Burden at WR22. That quarterback-receiver connection is the kind of built-in upside that turns good weeks into great ones. Chris Godwin, another player who fell past his ADP, adds WR38 production with real reliability behind a strong top three at receiver. The one genuine blemish is Tyquan Thornton, a four-round reach who projects as WR97, a distant last among the starters. But in a format this deep and this flexible, that weakness is easy to bury. A 67-percent win rate in 2025 and 63rd-percentile tournament standing say this manager knows how to convert a clean draft into actual points.

Chenzi didn't manufacture this roster through one bold swing or a lucky slide, just round after round of steady, accumulating advantages. Josh Allen landing at 1.09 when his ADP sat at 1.05 is a small edge, the kind most managers shrug off, but small edges are exactly how this draft was built. Pair Allen with Drake Maye, who followed up a near-MVP season by inheriting AJ Brown as a weapon, and Chenzi is walking into 2026 with two quarterbacks most managers would fight to start one of. The receiving corps adds texture: Tee Higgins came a full round late at 5.09, and Marvin Harrison Jr. rounds out a group where even the WR25, Davante Adams, is a projected starter. With 14 chalk picks keeping the foundation stable and only two minor reaches on the whole board, this is a roster built on discipline rather than desperation. Sitting 4th in the Bulbasaur division and in the 68th percentile, Chenzi is exactly the kind of team that quietly makes deep runs while louder rosters flame out.

EagleDanFF didn't build this roster on one flashy gamble that happened to pay off. They built it pick by pick, and the cumulative effect is a team sitting at the 72nd percentile that genuinely could climb higher. The foundation starts at the top of the receiver room, where Puka Nacua at WR1, Nico Collins at WR9, and Garrett Wilson at WR17 give this squad three projected starters who would anchor almost any team in the field. Add Tyler Warren at TE4 as another projected starter, and EagleDanFF was already in strong shape before the middle rounds even arrived. That's where the draft got quietly efficient: Michael Pittman, a projected starter at WR44, slipped a full round past his ADP and landed at 11.01, a clean value in a draft that logged sixteen picks at chalk and only three minor reaches across the whole board. No heists, no panic, just a manager who consistently made sensible decisions when options narrowed. Third in the Bulbasaur Division is the current standing, but this roster has the ceiling to make that look modest.

FFChef didn't build this roster the way most managers do, accumulating talent position by position and hoping everything meshes. The entire architecture bends toward one outcome: Joe Burrow and Ja'Marr Chase erupting on the same Sunday, the way they have humiliated defenses before. That stack is not a bonus sprinkled on top of a balanced roster, it is the plan itself, and the plan is a good one. Burrow comes in as QB4 and Chase as WR2, meaning FFChef is running the most dangerous pairing in the tournament at the top of the board. The supporting cast, anchored by Omarion Hampton at RB9 and Jaylen Waddle at WR23, gives the lineup real floor when the stack cools, but make no mistake about what this team is chasing. After a 2025 campaign that landed in the 30th percentile of scoring, FFChef has clearly decided that modest balance produced modest results, and the corrective is to load the chamber and pull the trigger on correlation. This team's ceiling is enormous. So is the distance it falls when Burrow and Chase both go quiet.

Underage Bijan sits first in the Bulbasaur Division and in the 93rd percentile of the entire field, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. This roster has no steals, five values, and zero reaches, which is the kind of clean ledger that separates disciplined drafters from lucky ones. Bijan Robinson at RB2 is the foundation, but the real craftsmanship shows in the mid-rounds: Chris Olave, a projected WR11 starter, fell a full round past his ADP, and Lamar Jackson, a QB3, slid a round as well and arrives paired with fellow starter Mark Andrews in a stack that gives this team a weekly ceiling most rosters can only envy. Kyren Williams lands as a projected RB15 starter at a similar discount, and Dylan Sampson rounds out the depth haul at RB53, found nearly two rounds late. The projected weak link is Jordan Addison at WR43, and the fact that Addison is the concern tells you everything about the floor here. This is what it looks like when a manager trusts the board and never panics.
