RichMcAteer sits 12th in the Charmander Division and in just the 18th percentile of the field, and the roster explains why without much mystery. The headliner is real: Ja'Marr Chase projects as WR2, and the Jalen Hurts / DeVonta Smith stack gives the lineup a genuine pulse. But below that top tier, the floor drops off fast. Hurts and Patrick Mahomes both carry asterisks as projected starters, yet Hurts grades out at QB9 and Mahomes at QB12, meaning Rich is leaning on two quarterbacks who are fine but nowhere near the top of the position. What makes the situation harder to excuse is the draft capital spent to get here. DeVonta Smith cost a reach of 1.3 rounds, Alvin Kamara was grabbed 3.3 rounds early and still projects at RB50, and Tyreek Hill came in 2.8 rounds ahead of schedule at WR77. That is three major reaches pulling the roster backward before the season even starts, and with Chase already anchoring the top, there is no obvious move left to fix what the draft broke.

Hisler enters 2026 sitting 11th in the Charmander division and in just the 22nd percentile of the field, and the roster grades offer little reason for optimism. The foundation looks appealing at a glance: Lamar Jackson at QB3 and James Cook at RB5 are genuine difference-makers, and a healthy Derrick Henry at RB12 is no afterthought. But Jackson came at a cost, grabbed nearly a full round ahead of his ADP, and the draft as a whole produced zero steals and zero values against 16 chalk picks and two major reaches. That is not a roster built with an edge. The receiver group grades weak, with Garrett Wilson checking in at WR17 as the best of the bunch, and Brock Purdy's situation is a fog of bad news: turf toe cost him eight weeks in 2025, and heading into 2026 his weapons are a patchwork of question marks. Purdy himself is a projected QB13, which is a fine number until you remember he may be throwing to an injury report. When your ceiling depends on players staying healthy and your draft room found no bargains, the math does not resolve kindly.

There is no sugarcoating what jgreen4012 is walking into in 2026. Sitting 10th in the Charmander division and at just the 25th tournament percentile, this roster has real talent at the top but precious little margin for error when things go sideways, and they have a habit of going sideways. Brock Bowers projects as TE1 and Jayden Daniels landed as a genuine steal at QB5, so the ceiling exists, but the floor is another story entirely. Marvin Harrison Jr. graded out as WR33 heading into a season where Jacoby Brissett is the answer at quarterback in Arizona, which is a sentence that should make everyone involved uncomfortable. The draft profile did not help matters: seven minor reaches and two major ones, including Jaylen Waddle taken more than two rounds ahead of his ADP. A roster that finished in the 4th percentile of scoring in 2025 needed aggressive, well-targeted swings to climb out. Instead, jgreen4012 paid early prices for late-round production, and that math almost never pencils out.

There is a particular exhaustion that comes from doing everything right and still watching it not work. sbrownholtz24 ran a disciplined draft, finishing with 18 chalk picks, two values, and not a single reach across the entire board. The reward is a roster sitting ninth in the Charmander division and in the 27th percentile of the field. The receiver group is genuinely elite: CeeDee Lamb, Justin Jefferson, Malik Nabers, and Rashee Rice represent WR5, WR6, WR12, and WR13 respectively, and they project as starters alongside Terry McLaurin and DK Metcalf. That is real. But this format starts ten players, and Matthew Stafford at QB14 and David Njoku at TE29 are carrying their weight in dead wood at the bottom of a lineup that needs every slot to produce. Tyjae Spears was a nice value at nearly two rounds past his ADP, but Spears at RB47 is the kind of depth that pads a roster count without changing a ceiling. sbrownholtz24 colored inside every line. The picture still looks like last year's 36 percent win rate.

Sean McCormick's 2026 campaign in the Charmander division looks like a long afternoon of bad weather with no umbrella in sight. The roster projects to just the 38th percentile of the field, and the draft chart doesn't offer much comfort: 15 chalk picks and three major reaches against only two steals is a blueprint for finishing exactly where everyone expected you to, or worse. The most damaging reach is Dallas Goedert, pulled nearly three rounds before his ADP and projecting as a TE15, which is a steep price for a player who grades out as a mid-tier option at best. The one genuine star, Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1, is surrounded by a supporting cast that thins out quickly, and Isaiah Likely's move to New York with John Harbaugh gives him a path toward relevance but hardly guarantees it. Trevor Lawrence and Jordan Love give McCormick two passable quarterback options, but neither projects as an elite asset. At 8th in the division, this roster doesn't have an obvious lever left to pull.

mikem1191 had a genuinely impressive 2026 campaign, posting a 30-6 record and landing in the 76th percentile in scoring. That was then. The 2026 roster projects at the 39th percentile, good for seventh in the Charmander division, and the draft did little to improve the outlook. Nineteen of the team's picks graded out as chalk or reaches, with only one steal to show for the entire board. The foundation is real: Bijan Robinson at RB2 and De'Von Achane at RB6 give this roster a legitimate top-end backbone, and A.J. Brown at WR8 is a dependable anchor. But after that tier, the production thins out quickly, and the quarterback situation offers no cushion. Baker Mayfield grades as QB18 and Cam Ward as QB23, meaning the projected starters at the most pivotal position in positionless scoring are both decidedly middling. Last year's winning formula looks like last year's news, and right now there is no obvious move on the board that closes the gap.

jsal115 enters 2026 as the Charmander division's most frustrating enigma: talented enough to beat anyone on a given week, inconsistent enough to lose to anyone too. The roster sits at the 43rd percentile, which is exactly as mediocre as it sounds, but the margin between here and genuine contention is thinner than it appears. Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 is a legitimate top-end weapon, and pairing Colston Loveland (TE3) with Caleb Williams as a stack gives this team a ceiling that the raw numbers undersell. The problem is the floor. A 2025 campaign that produced wins just 25 percent of the time is a bruise that hasn't fully healed, and leaning on Josh Downs (WR46) as the projected weakest starter means the margins at the bottom of the lineup matter enormously. The draft was almost entirely chalk, with no steals to offset the minor reaches on George Kittle and Cooper Kupp. This team wins its division by execution, not talent gap. When the ceiling shows up, it's a contender. When the floor does, it's another forgettable week.

Char Lazard sits at 49th percentile and fifth in the Charmander division, which sounds modest until you look at what they actually built. The centerpiece is Christian McCaffrey at RB3, and around him sit Kenneth Walker III at RB10 and Josh Jacobs at RB16, a collection that gives this team a legitimate floor every single week. The draft board says Char Lazard reached on multiple players, including a Keenan Allen grab 6.7 rounds ahead of consensus and an Emeka Egbuka pull nearly a full round early, and yet the roster does not look like a team that overreached. It looks like a team that knew what it wanted and went and got it. The Goff scouting note is useful here: four straight top-10 finishes as a QB, Detroit's weapons all intact, and enough fantasy longevity to matter in a deep tournament. Whether Char Lazard's conviction on early receivers and late quarterbacks reflects genuine read or fortunate timing, the answer is mostly the same. The roster works.

Don't Hate Me! didn't win the draft on one flashy pick, they won it by never losing a round. The foundation is genuinely impressive: Josh Allen at QB1 and Ashton Jeanty at RB7 give this roster two of the highest projected players at their positions anywhere in the field, and the manager paired Allen with D.J. Moore for a stack that can generate bonus points in bunches. Saquon Barkley at RB8 adds another projected starter, though the honest read on him is complicated. After an all-time 2024 season, Barkley cooled off considerably in 2025 alongside a banged-up Eagles offensive line, and at 29 with Philly reportedly looking to manage his workload, the ceiling feels lower than the ranking suggests. Still, RB8 is RB8, and a potential step-back from Barkley still leaves this roster with Travis Etienne at RB18 and Kyle Pitts at TE7 filling out a starting lineup that holds up. The 58th percentile projection undersells what this manager actually built: a roster that quietly won the draft one sensible decision at a time.

alexmatteo94 did not luck into a good roster. Pick by pick, this draft came out ahead, and the proof is in the receiver group. Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4, Drake London at WR7, Chris Olave at WR11, and Tetairoa McMillan at WR15 are all projected starters, and McMillan himself was a genuine value, sliding past his ADP by a round and a half before alexmatteo94 grabbed him at 5.10. That is the kind of patient, opportunistic drafting that builds winning rosters without needing a single flashy gamble. The Tyler Shough and Olave stack adds a nice bonus multiplier on games where that connection runs hot. The receiver depth does not stop at the elite tier either, with Zay Flowers projected at WR16 also in the starting mix. The 2025 season at the 22nd percentile in scoring is the one footnote worth acknowledging, but the 2026 roster is a different animal. Third in the division and sitting at the 60th percentile tournament-wide, alexmatteo94 has real upside here.

Hellspawn74 sits second in the Charmander division and at the 94th percentile of the field, and the draft record tells you exactly why: four good values, one steal, and just one notable reach across the entire board. That kind of consistent execution does not happen by accident. The quarterback situation is the clearest example of the approach paying off. Joe Burrow landed at QB4 despite slipping two picks past his ADP, and Justin Herbert came along a round later than he should have at QB8, giving Hellspawn74 two legitimate difference-makers at the position without surrendering early capital to get them. The Burrow caveat is real, the injury history is too significant to wave away, but when he is on the field he is as good as it gets at the position, and Herbert is a credible insurance policy rather than a consolation prize. Meanwhile, Puka Nacua projects as WR1 and anchors what is already a deep group of contributors. There were no home-run swings here, just a manager who came out ahead on pick after pick and built something that deserves to be taken seriously.

sharpshotbryan sits first in the Charmander division and in the 95th percentile of the entire field, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. The foundation is airtight: Jonathan Taylor at RB4 was available a few picks past his ADP, Breece Hall at RB14 slid more than a round, and Trey McBride at TE2 anchors a starting lineup that has genuine elite production baked in before you even start filling out the rest of the card. The discipline shows in the volume too, with four good values and a steal on the board against just one minor reach across the whole roster, a ratio that reflects a manager who waited for the board to come to him rather than forcing selections. That steal is Daniel Jones at QB25, snagged three full rounds after his ADP, which in a positionless format is simply free upside tucked at the back of the draft. The 2025 season was rough at four percentile in scoring, but this roster is built differently, and the draft grade backs that up.
