There is no polite way to say this: jpep20 is in trouble. Sitting in last place in the Gengar division and projected in just the 7th percentile of the entire field, this roster has a structural problem that the draft only made worse. The manager clearly fell in love with tight end, burning first-round capital on Colston Loveland at 1.11 and Tyler Warren at 2.02, reaching on both, when those picks needed to build a floor across the rest of the lineup. That floor never got built. The top projected starters outside that position group are Rashee Rice at WR13, Zay Flowers at WR16, and Trevor Lawrence at QB10, which is a passable collection but not one that wins leagues, and the running back cupboard is genuinely grim, with Rico Dowdle grading out at RB32 as the best of the bunch. jpep20 went 21-15 last year and scored in the 60th percentile in points, so the capacity to compete exists somewhere in there, but this draft left almost no margin for error and too few places to look for it.

tano33 sits 11th in the Gengar division and down in the 15th percentile of the field, and nothing about this roster suggests a dramatic reversal is coming. The foundation looks decent enough on paper, Brock Bowers at TE1 is a genuine asset and George Pickens projects as a WR10, but the draft eroded whatever goodwill those names generate. Four major reaches litter the board, including Darnell Washington pulled nearly five rounds ahead of his ADP and Darnell Mooney grabbed more than four rounds early, two swings that surrendered enormous positional value for players who grade out well below starter quality. The running back group is the quieter concern, with Jaylen Warren projecting as the weakest starter at RB27 on a squad that needed every pick to count. Michael Pittman landing in Pittsburgh alongside DK Metcalf, with a 43-year-old Aaron Rodgers running an offense still searching for an identity, is the kind of situation that looks fine until it very much isn't. tano33 went 18-18 last season and the 2026 roster does not obviously improve on that floor.

There is no sugarcoating the situation in the Gengar division: CarpetMunchers8806 sits tenth in the division and in just the 20th percentile of the field, and the draft record offers little reason for optimism. The manager burned a third-round pick on Bo Nix, a QB15 projection taken nearly two and a half rounds ahead of his market price, while Juwan Johnson, a TE20, was yanked almost three rounds early at a position that rarely moves the needle. Those are the kinds of decisions that quietly collapse a roster before the season even starts. The bright spots are real, Amon-Ra St. Brown projects as WR4 and pairs neatly with Jared Goff in a stack, and Malik Nabers at WR12 was a genuine value. But the floor keeps caving: Chuba Hubbard, the projected weakest starter at RB29, is what this team is leaning on once the depth chart runs thin. When your margin for error is already gone and your safety net is a RB29, the season ahead looks less like a climb and more like a controlled descent.

There is not much light breaking through the fog in Gengar Division for billsnewera, who sits ninth in the division and in just the 24th percentile of the field heading into 2026. The roster carries real strengths, starting with Josh Allen at QB1 and a functional Allen / D.J. Moore stack, but the draft log quietly tells a grimmer story. The team burned a tenth-round pick on Travis Hunter, projected WR62, reaching four full rounds ahead of ADP, then doubled down by taking Terrance Ferguson, a TE28, more than two rounds early at 12.05. Those are the kinds of bets that have to hit to justify the cost, and right now they look like long shots dressed up as strategy. Meanwhile the weakest projected starter is J.K. Dobbins at RB36, which is not a catastrophic floor but is not a foundation either. Allen is a genuine anchor and the stack with Moore adds upside, but when your margin for error is this thin and your draft swings are trending the wrong direction, ninth place starts to feel less like a bad break and more like a fair assessment.

JGoody77 enters 2026 sitting in 8th place in the Gengar division and at the 25th percentile of the field, and the draft ledger does not offer much optimism about a turnaround. The roster has legitimate talent at the top, Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and CeeDee Lamb at WR5 are genuine difference-makers, but the supporting cast thins out fast, and the draft process that built this roster should raise eyebrows. JGoody77 burned two major reaches on Deshaun Watson, taken 4.2 rounds before his ADP at QB34, and Ja'Kobi Lane, grabbed nearly four rounds early at WR89. Those are the kinds of aggressive bets that need to hit to justify the cost, and neither player grades out as a projected starter. Meanwhile, the team managed zero steals on the entire board. Coming off a 12-24 record and a 32nd-percentile scoring season in 2025, JGoody77 needed a draft that unlocked new upside. Instead, this one looks like a roster treading water while wearing ankle weights.

DGeorge40 played the draft about as cleanly as anyone in the Gengar division, landing Christian McCaffrey at RB3 half a round late and David Montgomery at RB23 nearly two full rounds after his ADP, and the receiver corps headlined by Justin Jefferson at WR6 and DeVonta Smith at WR14 looks genuinely strong on paper. The problem is that good process and good outcomes are not the same thing, and this roster illustrates the gap. The quarterback room is a quiet disaster, with Kyler Murray sitting at QB19 and the rest of the depth chart occupied by names like Daniel Jones and Justin Fields, who barely register as functional starters. The Murray and Jefferson stack offers some upside as a correlation play, but Murray himself is a shaky foundation to build around. Kaytron Allen was the one moment of real draft indiscipline, a reach of nearly four rounds, and he lands as a fringe contributor at RB61. Everything was bought at a fair price. The shelf just does not hold much weight, and that leaves DGeorge40 projecting seventh in the division and in the 34th percentile of the field.

CoachDanhausen sits at 36th percentile in a tournament where the margins between surviving and spiraling are razor thin, and the roster reflects exactly that kind of careful, precarious balance. Ashton Jeanty and Javonte Williams anchor the top of the lineup at RB7 and RB17 respectively, and the tight end group is genuinely elite, with Trey McBride, Kyle Pitts, and Sam LaPorta all projecting as starters. That is a lot of firepower concentrated at the top. But the moment the lineup leans on Xavier Worthy at WR49 as the weakest projected starter, the ceiling starts to feel like a low one. Baker Mayfield adds another layer of uncertainty, carrying a QB18 projection into a season without Mike Evans and with real questions about whether Chris Godwin and Emeka Egbuka can push him back toward his 2024 form. Nothing here collapses the season on its own. Nothing here wins it either. CoachDanhausen is the team that finishes exactly where the projections say, unless two or three of those thin margins break the right way.

Drunk Muppets landed at the 69th percentile in the field and fifth in the Gengar division, which feels about right for a team that kept ignoring the board and drafting on vibes. The thing is, the vibes were mostly correct. Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Lamar Jackson at QB3 anchor a roster that genuinely competes at the top, and neither cost them a steal, just solid drafting. Where it gets interesting is the reach column: Brandon Aiyuk came off the board 4.1 rounds early, Dontayvion Wicks a staggering 6.4 rounds early, and both times the manager looked like someone ordering dessert before the entree arrives. Maybe those bets hit, maybe they crater, but the rest of the roster has enough cushion to absorb the gamble. Derrick Henry, Breece Hall, and Chris Olave round out a starting core that is legitimately strong, built partly through discipline and partly through stubbornness. Whether that distinction matters by playoff time is the question worth watching.

Bigrog15 finished in the 89th percentile last season and somehow came back and drafted an even cleaner roster. The foundation is airtight: Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and James Cook at RB5 give this team two of the best backfields in fantasy, and both were taken at value, with Cook sliding nearly a full round past his ADP. Then Bigrog15 kept the discipline going late, landing RJ Harvey at RB28 in the twelfth round when his ADP said he should have been gone in the tenth, and snagging Chris Godwin at WR38 more than two rounds after the board expected him to go. The tight end group is the quiet exclamation point: Harold Fannin at TE6, Travis Kelce at TE10, and Isaiah Likely at TE13 are all projected starters, and Fannin in particular is positioned to build on a top-10 finish now that David Njoku is gone from Cleveland. Three steals, three values, zero major reaches. That is not luck, that is a manager who knew exactly what they were doing.

Porg1980 didn't win the draft with one flashy move. They won it by coming out ahead on pick after pick, quietly accumulating an edge that compounds over a long season. Five values against zero major reaches tells the story: Joe Burrow slid to 2.12 despite projecting as QB4, Justin Herbert landed at 4.12 despite projecting as QB8, and late-round running backs Aaron Jones, Woody Marks, and Brian Robinson all fell nearly two full rounds past their ADPs. The Burrow-Tee Higgins stack gives the roster a genuine ceiling, even if Burrow's injury history means that ceiling occasionally disappears for weeks at a time. What keeps this team humming when Burrow is upright is the receiver corps, where Jaxon Smith-Njigba projects as WR3 and Higgins sits at WR19, with Carnell Tate, Jordyn Tyson, and DK Metcalf offering real depth behind them. Third in the Gengar Division and 88th percentile across the field, this is a team that didn't need a lottery ticket to get here.

Zero Flex Given landed in the 95th percentile of the field the same way a well-run poker player books consistent profits: not by hitting one massive hand, but by winning small edges over and over until they stack up. The receiver group is the clearest evidence. Puka Nacua at WR1 and A.J. Brown at WR8 give this roster a legitimate top-end, and the Drake Maye, Brown stack adds a correlation bonus that compounds those projections on big weeks. Maye himself came in as a QB2, taken two picks after his ADP suggested, which is the kind of quiet efficiency that separates sharp drafts from lucky ones. The cloud over Josh Jacobs, whose situation off the field remains unresolved, is real and worth monitoring, but in a positionless format the surrounding talent absorbs uncertainty rather than amplifying it. Ladd McConkey at WR20 and Luther Burden at WR22 ensure the lineup stays potent no matter how that situation develops. Second in the Gengar division, with the depth to stay there.

RobFFSpin didn't walk away from draft night holding some singular lightning-bolt pick. They walked away having simply won more exchanges than they lost, round after round, until the sum of it all landed them at the top of the Gengar division and in the 98th percentile of the entire field. The foundation is Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and Omarion Hampton at RB9, two projected starters who anchor the roster with the kind of low-variance production that keeps a team in every week. Around them, the values compound quietly: Kenneth Walker III at RB10 was available more than a round past his expected price, and Nico Collins at WR9 adds a second elite receiver projection that most rosters simply cannot match. The one place where the math gets complicated is Marvin Harrison Jr., a WR33 projection still waiting on a quarterback situation in Arizona that remains genuinely unsettled. That uncertainty is real, but even factoring it in, this roster's depth of reliable projected starters makes the ceiling here feel less like a hope and more like a reasonable expectation.
