The draft strategy has left much to be desired, having lost significant value with questionable picks like Jalen Hurts taken well ahead of his ADP, leaving the team in a precarious situation with limited potential for success. As drewdelaware trudges forward, languishing in the lower echelons of competition, fans can only brace themselves for what appears to be a long, arduous season.

As the dawn of the 2025 fantasy football season approaches, hope for ShaneSays seems all but extinguished. strategic drafting couldn't salvage much; while players like Quinshon Judkins were wisely snagged after their ADP, the missteps in reaching for others like Cam Ward have stymied any potential progress. Rhamondre Stevenson, projected as a starter, epitomizes the team's struggles with his underwhelming performance. As ShaneSays braces for another turbulent season, visions of triumph fade into a distant dream, replaced by the stark reality of their current predicament.

Notably, reaching significantly for

Woody Marks has already lost them considerable value. Given last year's struggles and their current standing at 8th in the division and 27th percentile overall, Chenzi faces an uphill battle to improve, with little margin for error and significant dependence on a few key players to overperform.


