The kindest thing you can say about DJB4's 2026 draft is that Jahmyr Gibbs landed at RB1, and after that the kindness runs out completely. This roster finished in the 11th percentile of scoring in 2025 and is currently sitting last in the Snorlax division, which tracks, because the draft that built it reads like a cautionary tale printed on a wall somewhere in a fantasy football museum. The manager burned a third-round pick on Brock Purdy, a QB13 projected to start, reaching nearly three full rounds early on a quarterback in a positionless format where waiting costs almost nothing. Then, as if to prove the pattern was a philosophy, Jalen Nailor came off the board five-plus rounds ahead of his ADP, a WR61 treated like a WR20. The cumulative damage is the story: six major reaches across the draft, zero steals, and a projected weakest starter in Matthew Golden at WR52. Gibbs is real. Everything built around him looks like an apology.

bro1ncos sits 11th in the Snorlax division and in the bottom 10 percent of the entire field, and the roster construction explains why. The receiver group is legitimately strong, with A.J. Brown (WR8) and Nico Collins (WR9) anchoring a deep corps, but the draft process behind assembling this team should give any manager pause: four major reaches against just one steal tells a story of a drafter who kept outrunning consensus rather than exploiting it. The most glaring example is Alec Pierce (WR32), a reach who now faces a genuine PUP-list cloud after offseason ankle surgery. Pierce has never crossed 50 receptions in a single season, which already limits his ceiling in this scoring format, and if he remains on the list past late August cut-downs he misses the first four games entirely. That is a lot of downside baked into a pick that was already early. When a roster is projected this poorly and the draft ledger leans this far toward wishful thinking, the uphill climb stops being a metaphor and starts being the whole season.

Chase-ing McGreatness enters 2026 sitting 10th in the Snorlax division and at just the 33rd percentile of the field, and there is not much in the roster construction to suggest a dramatic reversal is coming. The clearest path to relevance runs directly through Joe Burrow, a QB4 when healthy and arguably the best fantasy quarterback in the game, but the operative phrase there is "when healthy," because Burrow's injury history reads less like a medical chart and more like a disaster log, including an ACL tear, a torn wrist ligament, and a grade-3 turf toe that cost him most of 2025. Last year ended at the 5th percentile in scoring, and with a receiver corps that grades weak and a draft that produced zero steals and zero major values, there is no hidden depth waiting to bail this team out. Trey McBride at TE2 is a genuine asset, and Davante Adams and D.J. Moore give the lineup a respectable floor, but respectable floors do not climb divisions. This team needs Burrow to stay upright for 17 weeks, and if that sounds like a plan, it also sounds like a prayer.

No Aiyukses sits ninth in the Snorlax division and just below the tournament median at the 46th percentile, and the roster does not offer many places to hide. Josh Allen is legitimately elite and Tyler Warren projects as TE4, so the ceiling exists, but the supporting cast asks a lot of both of them. The draft board tells a worrying story: three major reaches, including Deshaun Watson and Kirk Cousins, two quarterbacks with nothing left in the tank being drafted multiple rounds ahead of their ADP. Those picks did not buy upside, they just cost capital. Meanwhile, the projected starter most likely to define the team's floor is Tyler Shough, a QB20 projection who enters his second year at 27 years old, which caps the leap most managers would be hoping for. Dalton Kincaid arriving as a late steal softens the blow, but finding value at TE11 is not the kind of lever that moves a team from 46th percentile to contender. The path forward is narrow and the margin for injury is thinner.

Strohley14 drafted like someone who read every prep article twice and still walked away holding a bag that doesn't quite close. The value hunting was real: Bucky Irving at RB21 slipped more than a round past his ADP, Dallas Goedert fell similarly, and Tyler Allgeier tumbled over two full rounds before Strohley14 scooped him up. Four values across the board, zero major reaches, twelve picks at chalk. That is a disciplined draft by any reasonable measure. And yet the roster sits eighth in the Snorlax division and in the 51st percentile of the field, which is the fantasy equivalent of acing the process and barely passing the class. The receiver group beyond Amon-Ra St. Brown drops off sharply, with DK Metcalf at WR36 and Courtland Sutton at WR37 functioning as a pair of solid but unspectacular starters. Goedert, listed as the weakest projected starter, checks in at TE15. None of this is catastrophic in isolation. Together, it describes a team that found discounts on furniture that doesn't quite fit the room.

bderr sits at the 52nd percentile and seventh in the Snorlax Division, which sounds like a polite way of saying "perfectly unremarkable," but the margins here are real and they cut both ways. The ceiling is genuine: CeeDee Lamb (WR5) and Justin Jefferson (WR6) form as dangerous a top-end pairing as anyone in the field can point to, and the Kyler Murray (QB19) / Jefferson stack adds a layer of upside that could flip a close week. The floor, though, has its cracks. Kenneth Walker III (RB10) and Jeremiyah Love (RB13) give the backfield some pop, but Jaylen Warren (RB27) is the projected weakest starter, and that middle tier is where tight weeks get decided. The draft leaned chalk, with 14 picks at or near consensus value, which means bderr is not outsmarting anyone on paper. Kyle Pitts (TE7) was the most aggressive early call, taken nearly a round and a half before his consensus, and how that bet lands may be the quiet hinge of the whole season.

HutchinsonB didn't need a single heist to build something worth watching in the Snorlax division. The foundation is legitimate: Brock Bowers projects as TE1, Ashton Jeanty comes in at RB7, and Drake Maye slots in as a QB2, three anchors that most managers would take in a heartbeat. Beyond those headliners, the supporting cast holds up. Zay Flowers at WR16, Luther Burden at WR22, and Marvin Harrison Jr. at WR33 give this roster real depth at the position that tends to separate good teams from great ones. The draft methodology was mostly chalk, which sounds boring until you notice that Jeanty was quietly available a full round past his ADP, a free upgrade hiding in plain sight. The one blemish is Cam Ward, reached for by 2.2 rounds and projecting as a QB23, but in a positionless format Maye absorbs most of that sting. Sixth in the division and 55th percentile feel like a floor here, not a ceiling.

ExPhillyGuy didn't make any single pick that will get replayed at the highlight reel, and that's kind of the point. This roster was built the way a good line cook works, no flash, nothing wasted, just one correct decision after another. Christian McCaffrey at RB3 anchors the top end, and Colston Loveland at TE3 gives the lineup a genuine weapon at a position where most managers are settling. Caleb Williams stacks with Loveland, which adds another layer of upside to both players when Chicago's offense clicks. Carnell Tate, the first receiver off the board in the real draft and now paired with Cam Ward in Tennessee, slots in as a projected WR29 with a ceiling that number undersells. Breece Hall at RB14 and Rashee Rice at WR13 keep the supporting cast from slipping into filler territory. The draft sheet shows 18 chalk picks and just two minor reaches, which sounds boring until you realize the chalk was consistently this good. Sitting 59th percentile in the field, ExPhillyGuy has built something that quietly belongs in the conversation.

The Bakery didn't build this roster with one flashy move. They built it pick by pick, and the ledger shows it: twelve chalk selections as the foundation, then genuine upgrades layered on top. Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 anchors the whole operation, and the manager got Malik Nabers at WR12 a full round later than consensus expected, then turned around and landed De'Von Achane at RB6 with similar efficiency. Those two quiet savings in the middle rounds compound into real roster quality. DeVonta Smith at WR14 and Brian Thomas Jr. at WR31 round out a starting group that would make most managers in the Snorlax division uncomfortable. The one wrinkle worth watching is Dontayvion Wicks at WR96, taken nearly five rounds ahead of his consensus price, which suggests the manager paid a steep premium for upside that the market wasn't pricing in. That's a single blot on an otherwise disciplined sheet. A 64th-percentile projection and a bounce back from a rough 2025 feels like a floor here, not a ceiling.

BRob 2 Electric Boogaloo sits at 76th percentile and third in the division, and the draft sheet tells you exactly why: five values, thirteen chalk picks, and not a single major reach across the board. That is not luck, that is a manager who came in with a plan and executed it. The headliner is Bijan Robinson at RB2, taken right where you'd expect, but the supporting work is where this roster quietly separates itself. Lamar Jackson landed at pick 2.10 despite carrying a QB3 projection, a half-round gift that most managers in the tournament did not get. Harold Fannin and George Kittle give the team a projected TE6 and TE9 as starters, a combination that consistently wins the position on a week-to-week basis. And then there is the David Montgomery situation: a player who relocated to Houston this offseason specifically to escape a timeshare, now projected RB23 and poised to battle Woody Marks for lead-back duties on a new team. Nobody panicked, nobody swung wildly. BRob 2 Electric Boogaloo just kept picking winners.

metzgershane sits at 93rd percentile in the field and second in the Snorlax division, and the draft sheet tells you exactly why: clean, disciplined, and nearly impossible to criticize. The foundation starts with Puka Nacua at WR1 and Drake London at WR7, two projected starters who would anchor any contender in this tournament, and the Stafford-Nacua stack adds the kind of correlation upside that separates good weeks from great ones. Below that top line, the draft discipline shows up in the details. Derrick Henry at RB12 slid seven tenths of a round past his ADP, Jordan Mason fell nearly two full rounds, and Jacory Croskey-Merritt dropped more than three before metzgershane scooped him at RB40. That is three players acquired for less than market price on a roster that also starts Omarion Hampton at RB9 and Tee Higgins at WR19. Baker Mayfield carries some real uncertainty after a disappointing 2025 and a thinned receiver room, but at QB18 the price already accounts for the skepticism. This is what a draft that does almost nothing wrong looks like.

LeJawn Brames didn't splash. There was no headline pick, no swinging-for-the-fences moment that will make highlight reels. What there was, consistently and quietly, was a manager who came out ahead at every turn, and that discipline has this team sitting first in the Snorlax division and in the 93rd percentile of the entire field. Jonathan Taylor at RB4 arrived a half-round late. Justin Herbert at QB8 slipped nearly a full round past his price. Michael Wilson at WR39 fell over a round. None of those are lottery tickets, just good process executed over and over. The one genuine vulnerability worth flagging is Sam Darnold, who projects as QB21 and will need to expand beyond what became a very JSN-centric passing game in Seattle, especially with Kenneth Walker no longer taking pressure off the offense. But Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 is a projected starter regardless of what Darnold does, and Saquon Barkley at RB8 needs no quarterback to be dangerous. LeJawn Brames built a team that wins quietly, which is usually how the serious contenders do it.
