There is no comfortable way to frame what mpduncan75 is looking at in 2026. Sitting 12th in the Squirtle division and in just the 6th percentile of the field, this is a roster that graded out near the bottom before a single snap is played, and the draft did nothing to change the math. Of 19 picks tracked, mpduncan75 landed zero steals and zero values, relying instead on chalk picks and a draft board that leaned early and often on quarterbacks, taking Jalen Hurts at 2.06 when his ADP sat closer to 3.12, then doubling back on Jaxson Dart and J.J. McCarthy before the tournament was halfway through. Hurts projects as QB9 and Dart as QB11, which is fine as far as it goes, but in a positionless format the opportunity cost of that investment is brutal when the rest of the roster leans on projected starters like KC Concepcion at WR50. Last year's 18th-percentile finish was not a fluke. It was a preview.

There is no charitable read available for kgluva21, and the draft board tells the story before a single game is played. In a format that rewards hoarding elite talent, this roster sits at the 7th percentile of the field, and the draft behavior explains why: four major reaches and five minor reaches, zero steals, zero values. The most damaging decisions came in the middle rounds, where Dallas Goedert was yanked off the board 2.2 rounds ahead of his ADP and Rachaad White received the same treatment, with both players arriving at projected ranks of TE15 and RB39 respectively. That is a lot of capital spent to land average. Josh Allen at QB1 is genuinely good, and Ashton Jeanty is a real piece, but when the projected weakest starter is Kenneth Gainwell at RB34, the gap between the top of this roster and the bottom is less a depth chart and more a cliff. kgluva21 came to the Scott Fish Bowl draft and found a way to be wrong in every direction at once.

SuperrNova38 drafted with discipline. Fifteen chalk picks, only four minor reaches, and a genuine steal in Matthew Stafford, who fell more than three rounds past his ADP before landing here as a QB14. The value game was played correctly, and yet the roster sits ninth in the Squirtle division and in the 31st percentile of the field, which is the specific cruelty this draft deserves to have named. The projected starters read fine on paper, Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1, Drake London at WR7, Zay Flowers at WR16, but the backend of the starting lineup bottoms out at Rico Dowdle, projected RB32, which means the floor on any given week is genuinely uncomfortable. Patient drafting is supposed to insulate you from exactly this kind of outcome. You stay disciplined, you trust the process, you let the board come to you, and somehow you still end up here, watching a roster full of reasonable decisions that collectively refuse to add up to anything better than the bottom third of the tournament. Stafford was a gift. The rest was careful. The result is still a sigh.

There is no elegant way to spin a 14% win rate from 2025 into optimism for 2026, and schristy13 is not asking anyone to try. Sitting 10th in the Squirtle division and projecting at just the 31st percentile of the field, this roster feels like a team that has already played its best hand. The saving grace is legitimate: Joe Burrow at QB4 stacked with Tee Higgins at WR19 is a real weapon, and Christian McCaffrey at RB3 gives schristy13 a weekly floor that most managers would envy. But after those two names, the drop is steep and unforgiving. The next projected starters grade out as mid-tier contributors at best, and Blake Corum at RB35 is the kind of projected starter who keeps a manager up at night. The draft offered almost no relief, producing zero steals and leaning heavily on chalk, with J.K. Dobbins taken more than two rounds before his ADP standing as the most aggressive swing. It did not pay off enough to matter. The lever is not there. This is a hold-your-breath kind of season.

Gettin Chiggy With It enters 2026 sitting eighth in the Squirtle division and in just the 34th percentile of the field, and the roster makes it hard to argue with either number. The saving grace, and really the only one, is a elite group headlined by Colston Loveland (TE3), Harold Fannin (TE6), and Sam LaPorta (TE8), plus Justin Jefferson (WR6) providing a genuine anchor at the top. The problem is that everything surrounding those names grades out thin, and the draft did little to change the math. Two major reaches, Greg Dulcich (TE25) grabbed 3.2 rounds early and Tyquan Thornton (WR97) pulled four rounds ahead of consensus, suggest a manager who ran out of obvious plays and started improvising. At the quarterback position, the projected starter is Malik Willis (QB24), a dual-threat type who parlayed serviceable fill-in work in Green Bay into a starting gig in Miami but remains a fragile fantasy foundation. When your path to contention runs through Willis finding magic in South Beach, the uphill climb is less metaphor than diagnosis.

steverba23 finished 76th percentile in scoring last year and still landed at seventh in the Squirtle division heading into 2026, which tells you something about the competition level this team is walking into. The core problem is straightforward: Patrick Mahomes grades out as a QB12, and with Daniel Jones and Aaron Rodgers sitting at QB25 and QB29, there is no upgrade waiting on the bench. That quarterback ceiling drags the whole operation down before a single game is played. The receiver group looks encouraging on paper, with Puka Nacua projecting as WR1 and A.J. Brown right behind him at WR8, but the draft board suggests a manager who ran out of conviction midway through, reaching on Josh Downs by more than three rounds and Xavier Worthy by more than two. Worthy slots in as the projected weakest starter at WR49, meaning steverba23 essentially spent early capital to land a player who grades out below replacement value at the starting threshold. At 40th percentile in the field, there is no obvious lever left to pull.

ckumor33 sits at exactly the kind of roster crossroads that makes fantasy seasons interesting and nerve-wracking in equal measure. Lamar Jackson anchors the top of the lineup as a QB3, and pairing him with Jayden Daniels, a QB5 who fell a full round past his ADP, gives this team genuine upside at the position. CeeDee Lamb at WR5 is the other pillar worth trusting. The question is what happens below that top tier, because the margins are razor-thin. Omarion Hampton projects as RB9 and also slid past his ADP, so the draft table treated ckumor33 fairly when it mattered. But the projected starting group bottoms out around Jayden Reed at WR48, which means the ceiling and the floor are closer together than the headline names suggest. This team does not lose the room when rosters are announced, and it does not win it either. Sixth in the Squirtle division and sitting at the 50th percentile of the field, ckumor33 is exactly the team that beats you when you look past them and fades when they catch a bad week.

zkumor did not win the draft with one flashy swing. They won it by being right over and over again. The foundation is Saquon Barkley at RB8, a reach by the round numbers but a justifiable one given the talent, and around him sits a group that holds up deep into the lineup: Kenneth Walker III at RB10, Travis Etienne at RB18, Quinshon Judkins at RB22, all projected starters. That kind of sustained quality at the top of the roster is where tournaments are decided. Trey McBride at TE2 is the kind of positional advantage that quietly inflates a team's floor week after week. And then there is Jaylen Waddle, a player who managed viable fantasy production inside one of the more dysfunctional passing offenses in recent memory, now landing in Denver alongside a quarterback who led the league in pass attempts. The upside on Waddle at WR23 could be understated. A 55th-percentile field ranking and 5th in the Squirtle division feel like a team that the projections have not fully caught up with yet.

Legzilla came to the 2026 Scott Fish Bowl draft with a plan and executed it without flinching. The foundation is legitimately elite: Brock Bowers at TE1 and Tyler Warren at TE4 give this roster two of the most valuable players in the format, and while Warren cost a round of premium capital at pick 2.03, the return on that investment looks sound when you see what followed. Derrick Henry, Kyren Williams, and Josh Jacobs all project as starters, and Williams alone fell two full rounds past his ADP, landing in round seven despite a RB15 projection. That kind of discipline, taking real value when the board offers it rather than chasing names, is what separates clean drafts from lucky ones. Anchor the whole thing with Chris Olave at WR11 and Terry McLaurin at WR24, add a Shough-Olave stack for upside, and the weakest projected starter is Jordan Addison at WR43. Legzilla sits fourth in the Squirtle division for now, but this roster is built to move.

Skappy625 didn't need a miracle pick to build this roster, just a draft that kept finding the right player at the right time. The clearest example is Brock Purdy, a QB13 projection who slipped more than three full rounds past his ADP before Skappy625 scooped him at 8.10, the kind of patience that wins drafts quietly. From there the team stacked projected starters across the board: Bijan Robinson at RB2, Nico Collins at WR9, Rashee Rice at WR13, Garrett Wilson at WR17, and Carnell Tate at WR29, all locked in to start. That core alone would make most managers comfortable, and Jeremiyah Love sitting at RB13 as another projected starter means the depth behind the headliners is genuinely threatening. The 2025 season, an 81 percent win rate and a finish in the 86th percentile, suggests this is not a roster that got lucky and now faces a regression cliff. Third in the Squirtle division and in the 76th tournament percentile heading into 2026, Skappy625 looks like exactly what a steady, accumulative draft process produces.

There was no lottery ticket moment in tannuhr's draft, no single swing that either made or broke the room, just a steady accumulation of edges that added up to something formidable. James Cook, projected at RB5, slipped a full round past his ADP before tannuhr scooped him. Drake Maye, the QB2 projection, fell half a round and landed in the same cart. Mark Andrews came off the board nearly two rounds late at his selection, giving tannuhr a TE14 at a discount that most managers simply did not get. Four values across the draft, zero major reaches, and a starting corps that includes Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and a Cook-led ground game that projects as genuinely dangerous. This is a roster that lands at the 92nd percentile in the field and sits second in the Squirtle division not because tannuhr got lucky on one bold call, but because the draft unfolded like a well-kept ledger, every line slightly in the black, the whole thing balancing out to a number that matters.

CARLOS enters 2026 looking like someone who actually did their homework before draft day, and the results speak for themselves. Landing at the 95th percentile in the field and first in the Squirtle Division, this roster was built with patience and precision, the kind of draft that makes everyone else's pick sheet look like a rough draft. The anchor is Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, a genuinely elite projection paired with DeVonta Smith at WR14, but the craftsmanship shows in the mid-rounds. Jordan Love fell three full rounds past his ADP to land at 10.07, and CARLOS was right there to collect a QB17 projection at a QB28 price. Then stack him with Tucker Kraft at TE5 and you have built-in upside baked into the same pick. Jonathan Taylor at RB4, grabbed half a round late at 2.07, keeps the top of the lineup humming. Thirteen chalk picks, four good values, one steal, and zero major reaches. That is not luck. That is a manager who knew the board and trusted it.
