MarkRingo came to the Scott Fish Bowl 2026 draft with a plan, and that plan was apparently to reach early and reach often. Five major reaches in a single draft is not bad luck, it is a philosophy, and the results are brutal. The crown jewel is a Kirk Cousins pick at 10.04 when Cousins was sitting comfortably at an ADP of 18.09, a full eight-plus rounds of value torched in a single moment of panic buying at quarterback, a position that projects as the team's most glaring weakness anyway. Meanwhile, Jameson Williams cost a 2.04 pick for a WR21 projection, and Marvin Harrison Jr. was grabbed nearly three rounds early for a WR33 outlook that would be underwhelming even at fair value. Parker Washington rounds out the projected starters as a player with legitimate ceiling concerns given Jacksonville's complicated receiver hierarchy. Justin Jefferson is real, and DeVonta Smith is serviceable behind him, but the supporting cast was assembled at full markup with no change back. MarkRingo sits dead last in the GoldenEye 007 division, and the draft board explains every bit of it.

Last year, J-Kwon went 30-6 and finished in the 88th percentile, which is the kind of résumé that buys goodwill heading into a new season. The 2026 roster is here to spend it all. The QB room is genuinely elite, with Josh Allen at QB1 and Jalen Hurts at QB9 anchoring the core, but the manager paid a full round early for Hurts and leaned on chalk for 13 of 16 picks, leaving almost no margin for error anywhere else. That margin has already been spent: the team projects to the 9th percentile in scoring and sits 11th in the GoldenEye 007 division, which is about as far from last year's version of this team as you can get. The projected starters top out at Tee Higgins at WR19 and Colston Loveland at TE3 outside the QB position, and the best available running back is J.K. Dobbins at RB36. A 30-6 team built on yesterday's draft board is really just a scrapbook. J-Kwon has a beautiful scrapbook.

Rebdog played the value game almost perfectly. Sixteen chalk picks, zero major reaches, and two genuine values in Isaiah Likely (TE13) and Brenton Strange (TE17), both scooped up later than they had any right to be. The discipline is real. The problem is that disciplined drafting and good drafting are not the same thing, and sitting at 10th in the GoldenEye 007 division and 46th percentile in the field, Rebdog is learning that lesson in real time. The top of the roster is legitimately strong, with Brock Bowers (TE1) and Drake London (WR7) anchoring the starting group, but the drop-off is steep enough that Michael Pittman (WR44) projects as the weakest starter. Jaxson Dart (QB11) adds intrigue as a mobile signal-caller who can hurt defenses on the ground, though his passing reliability remains a genuine question mark. Rebdog found value everywhere and still could not find enough ceiling. That is not bad luck. That is a roster.

AZRushFan went 28-8 last season and scored in the 87th percentile, so expectations arrive with this roster before it has done anything to earn them in 2026. The trouble is that the current build does not look like a team positioned to defend that standard. The receiver group is the clearest illustration: Zay Flowers at WR16 is the only projected starter at the position, and the rest of that depth chart runs from WR54 to WR102, a collection assembled largely through reach after reach after reach. Three major reaches on the board, including Matthew Stafford taken two full rounds before his ADP and Christian Kirk grabbed more than five rounds early, suggest a drafter chasing names rather than value. Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and a genuinely strong trio of Trey McBride, Kyle Pitts, and Mark Andrews at tight end give this team a real floor, but a 54th percentile projection and a ninth-place division rank tell you the ceiling has already been priced in. Last year's reputation is doing heavy lifting that this roster may not be able to finish.

guapdad sits at 56th percentile and eighth in the GoldenEye 007 division, which is about as median as a fantasy team gets, and the draft board tells the real story of why. The foundation is genuinely exciting: Lamar Jackson at QB3 and Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 give this roster a ceiling that most managers in this field cannot match, and both slid past their ADPs, which means the manager got good production at fair prices. The problem is the three major reaches, particularly Patrick Mahomes taken 2.2 rounds early at a QB12 projection, eating premium capital on a player who grades out as an upside afterthought behind Jackson. Xavier Worthy, reached 2.7 rounds early and projected WR49, is the kind of dart throw that belongs in the late rounds, not round eight. Those two picks burned the surplus that could have shored up the back end of the roster. Malik Nabers at WR12 keeps the ceiling honest, but this team wins or loses based on whether Breece Hall and Bucky Irving both stay healthy and whether the value picks in the back half actually hit.

Icey Galore sits at 56th percentile heading into 2026, and that number tells the whole story: good enough to compete, not good enough to feel comfortable. The backfield is genuinely elite, with Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1, Saquon Barkley at RB8, Kenneth Walker III at RB10, and Josh Jacobs at RB16 all projecting as starters, and Walker arriving as the draft's clearest steal after sliding more than a full round past his ADP. That group can carry weeks. The problem is what happens when it can't, because the projected pass-catchers offer almost nothing as a safety net, with Quentin Johnston at WR41 and Wan'Dale Robinson at WR47 headlining a group where the margin between a functional week and a broken one is razor thin. Jayden Daniels at QB5 keeps the ceiling honest, but this roster lives and dies on whether that backfield stays healthy and whether the bottom of the lineup finds

anything. Seventh in the GoldenEye 007 division feels about right for now, and moving off it requires the kind of luck that doesn't show up in draft grades.

aperri7 drafted like someone who had already decided who they wanted and just dared the board to disagree. Three major reaches, three minor ones, and somehow the roster came out looking genuinely good anyway. The centerpiece is a starting group that includes De'Von Achane (RB6), Amon-Ra St. Brown (WR4), Nico Collins (WR9), and Tyler Warren (TE4), all projected starters, all legitimate difference-makers. Collins was a minor reach, Warren was actually good value, and Achane slid a full round past his ADP into aperri7's lap at RB6. The wildcard is Bo Nix (QB15), who led the league in pass attempts last season and now gets Jaylen Waddle added to a Denver offense that already had Courtland Sutton. Nix has a safe floor and a real ceiling question, which is exactly the kind of quarterback you want when your skill position starters are already doing the heavy lifting. This roster sits 59th percentile in the field and sixth in the GoldenEye 007 division, numbers that feel like they underestimate what aperri7 actually built here.

OctoPuka isn't built around a single marquee move, and that's exactly the point. The foundation is Puka Nacua at WR1, a genuine top-of-the-board anchor, and the draft built outward from there with consistent, quiet competence. Four values scattered across the roster tell the real story: Travis Kelce slipping to TE10 value at pick 8.11, Aaron Jones falling nearly two full rounds, Tyler Allgeier drifting past his ADP, Khalil Shakir sitting there a round later than he should have. None of those are lottery tickets, they're just players taken at prices the market undervalued. The one blemish is Dak Prescott, reached roughly three-quarters of a round early at pick 2.11, though a Prescott-George Pickens stack gives that gamble some structural logic. Sitting fifth in the GoldenEye 007 division and at the 66th percentile of the field, OctoPuka isn't a sleeper darling or a cautionary tale. It's a team that did the work round by round and arrived somewhere genuinely worth watching.

Turboraptor didn't win the draft on one big swing. They won it on accumulation, round after round of coming out slightly ahead until the margin became impossible to ignore. Chase Brown landing at RB11 while slipping more than two full rounds past his ADP is the clearest example: the market handed turboraptor a projected starter at a steep discount, and they simply took it. Dallas Goedert and Oronde Gadsden, both projected starters at TE15 and TE16 respectively, fell a round or more each and arrived at prices that made the decisions easy. Set against a draft that also features Omarion Hampton at RB9, Joe Burrow at QB4, and Rashee Rice at WR13, those value pickups didn't save a flawed roster, they elevated an already legitimate one. Sitting fourth in the GoldenEye 007 division and at the 69th percentile of the field, turboraptor has the kind of roster that doesn't need to get lucky in the playoffs because it was already built like a contender before the season started.

TheArmoury didn't swing for the fences and miss, they just kept making the right call. Christian McCaffrey at RB3 anchors a starting group that also includes Tucker Kraft, a TE5 value who slid a full round past his ADP before TheArmoury scooped him at pick 5.12. Travis Hunter fell nearly a round and a half before landing here too, giving the roster a WR62 with genuine upside. The draft charted 16 chalk picks and three values against zero major reaches, which is exactly what a methodical, process-driven manager looks like on paper. Even David Montgomery, who lost his featured role in Detroit and signed with Houston to compete for carries again, represents the kind of calculated depth bet that can pay off if the situation breaks right. Add Caleb Williams as a QB6 starter and a 79th-percentile tournament projection, and TheArmoury looks like a team that earned its division standing the boring, correct way, arriving in third place with a roster built to climb.

Alec Trevelyan didn't need a lottery ticket to build this roster. The foundation is Ja'Marr Chase at WR2, A.J. Brown at WR8, and Chris Olave at WR11, a trio of projected starters that would headline most championship contenders on its own. But what separates this draft from a simple top-heavy exercise is how Trevelyan kept finding edges in the middle and late rounds. Chris Godwin, projected WR38, slid more than two full rounds past his ADP before Trevelyan grabbed him at 11.03, and Jacory Croskey-Merritt came off the board nearly two rounds late at WR40. Those aren't flukes, they're the compounding returns of a manager who stayed patient while others panicked. Add Tetairoa McMillan at WR15 and Garrett Wilson at WR17 rounding out the projected starters, and the roster depth becomes genuinely uncomfortable to game-plan against. Coming off an 87th-percentile scoring season in 2025 and currently sitting second in the GoldenEye 007 division, Trevelyan looks less like someone who got lucky and more like someone who simply drafted better.

marathoner_RG didn't win the draft with one audacious swing. This team was built pick by pick, the gap between expectation and outcome accumulating quietly until the ledger looked very, very good. Five values against zero steals and zero minor reaches tells you something precise: this manager wasn't lucky, wasn't reckless, just consistently right. The foundation is genuinely elite, with Bijan Robinson (RB2), James Cook (RB5), and Ashton Jeanty (RB7) all projecting as starters, and all three landed at or past their ADPs. Cook slipped a few spots, Jeanty fell nearly a full round. marathoner_RG was there both times. The one real blemish is the quarterback situation, where Kyler Murray (QB19) carries the whole weight of the position. Murray's lisfranc injury derailed his final season in Arizona, and while he enters Minnesota with a real chance to win the starting job, a QB19 ceiling with

significant health uncertainty is not where you want your variance to live. Still, this team sits first in the GoldenEye 007 division and in the top 10 percent of the field. The process was sound. The results followed.
