As the 2025 fantasy football season looms on the horizon for team ajgruhlks, the outlook appears bleak despite some minor improvements from last year. deficiencies elsewhere. Despite a few shrewd draft picks like Darnell Mooney and Rashod Bateman, who fell significantly later than expected, the decision to reach for Zay Flowers earlier than necessary hints at desperation rather than strategic brilliance. With such an unbalanced roster, ajgruhlks faces an uphill battle to avoid another season languishing in obscurity among their peers.


