There is no charitable read available for Im with Kaep, a team sitting third in the NFL Blitz division and in the bottom five percent of the field after a 2025 campaign that already felt like a warning shot. The draft did not course-correct anything. Zero steals, zero values, four major reaches, and a roster that reflects every bad instinct a manager can have at the board. The foundation is real, Ashton Jeanty at RB7 and Saquon Barkley at RB8 give this team something to build around, but Barkley arrives carrying his own baggage: coming off a down 2025 with Philadelphia, whispers of a reduced role, and a 29-year-old odometer that no one is pretending not to notice. And when the starters beyond those two are being propped up by Jayden Higgins at WR54 and a quarterback room of Sam Darnold at QB21 and Aaron Rodgers at QB29, the depth that was hoarded through reaching on player after player simply does not translate into usable lineup production. This team drafted with conviction and ended up with consequences.

There is a particular kind of exhaustion that comes not from losing but from running out of ideas, and Maye in the Hamptons has arrived at that place. The roster grades out near the bottom of the NFL Blitz division, sitting eleventh with a 3rd percentile projection, and the draft offered no relief: sixteen chalk picks, zero steals, and a major reach on Caleb Williams, taken a full round and a half ahead of his ADP. The one genuine reason for optimism is Drake Maye, who finished second in MVP voting last year and now gets AJ Brown as his alpha target in New England, which is legitimately exciting. But Maye is one player, and beyond him the projected starters thin out quickly, with Kyle Monangai grading out as the weakest of the bunch. Last season's 50th percentile finish felt like a ceiling, and nothing about this offseason suggests the ceiling has moved. Sometimes you look at a roster and see a problem to solve. This one looks like a verdict already delivered.

The Big O sits 10th in the NFL Blitz division and in the 4th percentile of the entire tournament, and the draft explains exactly why. The reach pattern here is damning: Jake Ferguson, projected TE12, was taken nearly four full rounds ahead of his ADP, and Mark Andrews, a TE14, came off the board two and a half rounds early, both in the middle of a draft where every pick carries compounding weight. Those investments were not random panics either, Tucker Kraft went in round three at TE5 pricing when round four would have done the job. The Big O spent premium real estate stacking a position that needed no emergency spending, while Michael Pittman, the projected WR44 and likely a starter, is the kind of name that appears on rosters when better options were still on the board. Jonathan Taylor at RB4 is a genuine anchor and Trevor Lawrence arriving in round seven as a QB10 is the lone

draft-room moment worth remembering, but two bright spots cannot paper over a draft that reads like someone made four separate decisions they cannot explain the morning after.

FFooball03 built this roster on the belief that correlation isn't a hedge, it's a strategy, and the evidence is right there in the pairings: Lamar Jackson and Zay Flowers running together out of Baltimore, Jared Goff and Sam LaPorta locked into Detroit's pass-heavy offense. That's the architecture. When those stacks breathe, this team breathes. The problem is that last year's 85th-percentile scoring performance has a way of raising expectations that a 22nd-percentile projection and a ninth-place division standing quietly refuse to validate. The draft didn't help as much as it could have, either. Drafting Dalton Schultz nearly four rounds before his ADP and Shedeur Sanders more than three rounds early burned capital that could have shored up depth behind the stacks. When your floor is built on correlation, you'd prefer your ceiling to be airtight, and a projected starter like Wan'Dale Robinson sitting at WR47 is not airtight. This team has a real peak. Getting there requires Jackson and Flowers and Goff and LaPorta to all be right at the same time, and that's a lot of simultaneous faith to carry across a full season.

Mendoza Effect sits eighth in the NFL Blitz division and checks in at just the 44th percentile of the field, and the draft record does little to inspire optimism about a climb. The receiver corps is legitimately elite, with Jaxon Smith-Njigba (WR3), CeeDee Lamb (WR5), and Chris Olave (WR11) projecting as genuine difference-makers, but the rest of the roster has the structural integrity of a folding chair. The quarterback situation is genuinely grim: C.J. Stroud (QB22) and Malik Willis (QB24) project as the starters, and Willis is the single weakest projected starter on the entire roster. Then there is the draft capital story, which reads like a cautionary tale. Three major reaches in the final rounds, including Keenan Allen at WR99 taken more than five rounds early and Jalen Tolbert at WR102 taken more than six rounds early, suggest the manager was scraping for depth and paying a steep premium to find it. With no obvious upgrade path and the back end of the roster built on expensive guesses, the receivers may dazzle while the team quietly drowns.

Bad Cargo is a team that will win or lose 2026 in the margins, and right now those margins are razor-thin in both directions. The foundation is genuinely strong: Bijan Robinson at RB2 is a weekly anchor, and a Joe Burrow at QB4 who slid nearly a full round past his ADP is the kind of quiet draft-day win that can quietly carry a season. The problem is that the supporting cast leaves almost no cushion. Terry McLaurin at WR24 is a serviceable starter, but Khalil Shakir at WR51 is the projected weakest link, and the gap between that ceiling and that floor is where this team will live. Baker Mayfield at QB18 adds intrigue but also uncertainty, because even with Chris Godwin in the fold, consensus opinion hasn't bought back in since his 2025 stumble, and Evans departing doesn't make that case easier. Derrick Henry was a significant reach at RB12, and if that gamble doesn't pay off, there is no obvious place to make up the points. Seventh in the division feels exactly right: good enough to beat most, not quite enough to scare anyone.

Sex, Drugs, Brock & Roll didn't build this roster on one splashy move. They built it by consistently getting more than they paid for. Dak Prescott at QB7 fell nearly two rounds past his ADP, and Marvin Harrison Jr. at WR33 slipped almost a round and a half before this team pounced. Neither pick made headlines in the moment, but that's the point. The draft as a whole logged four values and a steal against only two major reaches, and even the reaches are defensible: Jameson Williams at WR21 is a legitimate projected starter, and Michael Mayer is a late-round flier that costs nothing if it doesn't pan out. Anchor the whole thing with Brock Bowers at TE1 and a starting corps that includes A.J. Brown, Ladd McConkey, and Williams, and the ceiling here is real. A 67 percent win rate and 83rd-percentile scoring in 2025 suggest this is a team that knows how to convert a well-built roster into actual points. The 68th percentile projection is cautious, but the drafting process earned more than that.

ChrisBanes came to the Scott Fish Bowl with a plan and executed it almost without flaw. The headliner is Christian McCaffrey, a projected RB3 who anchors a backfield group that also includes Kenneth Walker III at RB10 and Bucky Irving at RB21, giving this roster an enviable foundation of running back talent across the depth chart. At receiver, Amon-Ra St. Brown lands as a WR4 and was snagged at 2.02 despite an ADP of 1.10, which is the kind of quiet theft that separates disciplined drafters from lucky ones. Rashee Rice slides in beside him as a projected WR13, and if Rice stays healthy and eligible long enough to matter, that Mahomes-Rice stack becomes one of the more dangerous pairings in the NFL Blitz division. If is doing a lot of heavy lifting there, given the off-field noise and a knee procedure keeping Rice sidelined into the summer, but the upside is real. With only one minor reach on the

entire board and multiple players acquired past their ADP, ChrisBanes built a 76th-percentile roster the right way: patient, precise, and largely without regret.

AdamBombs is what happens when a manager actually does their homework. Josh Allen anchors this roster as the QB1, and pairing him with D.J. Moore as a stack is exactly the kind of intentional construction that separates disciplined drafters from lucky ones. The secondary quarterback stack, Jaxson Dart with Isaiah Likely, adds another layer of upside, and Dart himself is the story of the draft, a QB11 projection who fell nearly three rounds past his ADP and landed at 8.05. That is not an accident, that is patience rewarded. Beyond the headliners, the board treated AdamBombs well repeatedly: six players came in as values or better, with nobody costing a significant premium. The one minor asterisk is that the projected weakest starter, Josh Downs at WR46, is still a player with a legitimate role. At the 81st percentile of the field and 4th in the NFL Blitz division, this roster has the talent to climb both tables. Clean draft, real upside, very little to argue with.

TimH24 didn't need a single flashy moment to build one of the better rosters in the NFL Blitz division. The foundation is legitimate: Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and Nico Collins at WR9 give this team a pair of genuinely elite projected starters, and the supporting cast behind them holds its own. Tetairoa McMillan (WR15), Jaylen Waddle (WR23), and Davante Adams (WR25) aren't filler, they're the kind of depth that keeps a lineup humming through injury and bye weeks alike. The draft efficiency tells the same story: sixteen chalk picks sounds boring until you realize chalk only works when you're hitting your marks, and TimH24 did, with Justin Herbert sliding all the way to pick 6.11 despite projecting as QB8, a steal that quietly upgrades the whole roster. The one blemish is Tyquan Thornton, reached for nearly five rounds ahead of his ADP, but a projected WR97 on an otherwise loaded squad is a footnote, not a problem. Third in the division, 91st percentile overall, this team earned both numbers the old-fashioned way.

MasterFett didn't win the draft with one thunderclap pick. This team was built pick by pick, round by round, in a way that kept coming out ahead. Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and Justin Jefferson at WR6 fell into the first two rounds when the board simply didn't move the way other managers expected, and MasterFett was positioned to collect both. That kind of patient positioning kept paying out: Carnell Tate at WR29 slid nearly two rounds past his ADP, Courtland Sutton at WR37 fell almost two rounds as well, and even RJ Harvey at RB28 landed a round later than expected. Six values across the draft is not an accident, it is a process. The Jalen Hurts and DeVonta Smith stack layers in a bonus that rewards the roster's overall construction rather than propping up a weak spot. Sitting second in the NFL Blitz division and at the 92nd percentile of the field, MasterFett enters 2026 as exactly what a well-executed draft looks like when the results are finally tallied.

ZachPercival sits first in the NFL Blitz division and at the 97th percentile of the entire field, and the draft that built this roster did not get there through one lucky swing. It got there by consistently coming out ahead on value. Jayden Daniels landing at QB5 when his ADP sat two full rounds earlier is the headliner, a discount that gives this team a legitimate starter at the position while preserving capital everywhere else. But the quiet story is how that efficiency repeated itself: Drake London arriving as a projected WR7, Alec Pierce slipping more than a round past his number, and Jadarian Price doing the same in double-digit rounds. Stack those outcomes together and you have a roster where the top of the lineup, anchored by Puka Nacua at WR1 and Tyler Warren at TE4, is backed by real depth that was not paid for at full price. ZachPercival did not out-luck the field in 2026. He out-drafted it, one quiet edge at a time.
