The Super Mario 64 division is a brutal place to be sitting 12th, and 8lackThund3r is staring up at a very long climb. The foundation is not without merit: Josh Allen is the QB1, and the projected starters include Kenneth Walker III (RB10), Kyren Williams (RB15), and George Kittle (TE9), names that can hold their own anywhere in the tournament. But the roster grades out in the 5th percentile of the field, and when you zoom out past the headliners, the supporting cast gets thin fast, with Khalil Shakir projected as the weakest starter at WR51. What makes this harder to stomach is that the draft did not help. Three major reaches, including Romeo Doubs burned three rounds early and Woody Marks pulled two rounds ahead of schedule, left capital on the table that never came back. DeVonta Smith is a genuine wildcard, finally running his own offense in Philadelphia, but one upside dart does not solve a roster that is already out of obvious levers to pull.

There is no gentle way to say this: MadGeniusOfFB is staring down a bleak 2026, and the draft did not help matters. The receiver group is genuinely excellent, with Nico Collins (WR9), A.J. Brown (WR8), Chris Olave (WR11), and Tee Higgins (WR19) all projecting as starters, but that depth came at a cost. Collins was taken a full round early, and Brown was snagged ahead of his ADP as well, which means premium capital got funneled into a position that was already producing. The roster grades out in the 8th percentile of the field, and when you dig into why, the answer is painfully simple: outside the receiver group, there is almost nothing working in the manager's favor. Kenneth Gainwell projects as the weakest starter on the team at RB34, Patrick Mahomes carries real value but comes with injury asterisks, and nothing in the late-round haul amounts to a lever worth pulling. Last year's 50 percent win rate already told this story quietly. The 2026 version just says it louder.

Lazzo624 sits 10th in the Super Mario 64 division and in just the 21st percentile of the field, and there is not much in the roster construction to suggest a turnaround is coming. The top-end talent is real enough, Caleb Williams at QB6, CeeDee Lamb at WR5, and James Cook at RB5 give this team a genuine ceiling, but the depth behind them grades out poorly and the draft did nothing to build a cushion, producing zero steals and just one value across the entire board. The one positive draft note, Blake Corum landing as an RB35, is modest consolation. Meanwhile the tight end picture has quietly curdled: Oronde Gadsden, projected at TE16, spent last year building a legitimate case in Los Angeles only to watch the Chargers sign David Njoku in the offseason, muddying his role at exactly the wrong moment for Lazzo624. When your swing at TE depth is Hunter Henry at TE18, you are not building a floor, you are hoping the ceiling holds all season, and that is a fragile way to live in a tournament this competitive.

There is no sugarcoating the situation for mg820 in the Super Mario 64 division: this roster grades out at the 27th percentile of the field and sits ninth in the division, and the draft did nothing to change the trajectory. Seventeen chalk picks and one good value in Jalen Nailor, taken barely a round late, is not a blueprint for outsmarting the room. The receiver group is genuinely strong, with Amon-Ra St. Brown (WR4), Rashee Rice (WR13), Ladd McConkey (WR20), and Luther Burden (WR22) all projected to start, but that ceiling gets dragged down by everything around it. Lamar Jackson (QB3) is a legitimate anchor, yet the depth behind him collapses fast, with Geno Smith projecting as QB30. Then there is the Kyler Murray situation, reached two full rounds early at a QB19 projection, a swing that looks increasingly like the draft's defining mistake. When your most glaring inefficiency costs you draft capital and your best upside is already baked into the projections, the levers are gone. mg820 is playing with a short rope.

otis76 sits at 46th percentile in the Scott Fish Bowl field, which is another way of saying the margin between a deep run and an early exit is razor thin. The foundation is real: Bijan Robinson (RB2) is a genuine anchor, and Omarion Hampton (RB9) gives this roster two projected starters who can carry a week on their own. Malik Nabers (WR12) and Emeka Egbuka (WR18) extend that quality further down the lineup. The draft approach was mostly chalk, with three values and five reaches of varying severity, and those reaches tell a story. Pulling Mac Jones (QB39) six-plus rounds ahead of his ADP is the kind of swing that either looks like genius or quietly costs a manager two wins they never get back. Cam Ward (QB23) is the projected starter at quarterback, which is functional but not a weapon. This roster does not have a fatal flaw or a dominant edge. It wins the weeks when the stars hit and loses the ones when they do not, and in a tournament like this, that means the schedule and injury luck write the ending.

snarebear55 played the draft about as cleanly as a value hunter can. Christian McCaffrey fell nearly four rounds past his ADP and landed at 2.01, Travis Etienne slipped a round and a half to the eighth, RJ Harvey drifted past his number too, and Isaiah Likely closed out the back half of the draft as a quiet discount. Four values, zero steals, thirteen chalk picks, and the whole thing still resolves to 46th percentile and eighth in the Super Mario 64 division. That is the cruelest math in fantasy football: doing the work, collecting the receipts, and watching the ledger come up short anyway. The problem is not process, it is ceiling. McCaffrey at RB3 and Justin Jefferson at WR6 anchor the lineup, but the drop to Harvey at RB28 as the projected weakest starter tells the story. Every value snarebear55 harvested was a real one, and the roster still cannot clear the median. Being right about price does not help much when the goods were never going to be worth enough.

CliveCC sits at 54th percentile in the field and sixth in the Super Mario 64 division, which is exactly as comfortable as it sounds: not safe, not doomed, just permanently one bad week from either direction. The margins here are real. Jaxon Smith-Njigba (WR3) is a genuine difference-maker at the top of the roster, and the pairing of Colston Loveland (TE3) and Tyler Warren (TE4) gives CliveCC an edge that most managers in this field cannot match. But the needle moves on whether the middle holds. Jaylen Waddle (WR23) is the swing piece, and the context is genuinely interesting: he escapes a dysfunctional Miami offense for Denver, where Bo Nix threw more passes than anyone in the league last year and Courtland Sutton already occupied the WR1 role. Waddle does not need to be a star in that situation, he just needs to be reliable, which is exactly what a 54th-percentile team requires from its WR23. Chalk builds the floor here. The ceiling depends entirely on whether Waddle delivers on his change of scenery.

Cntrl Alt Elite enters 2026 looking like a team that simply drafted well, round after round, without needing to gamble on anything. The foundation is hard to argue with: Jonathan Taylor projects as RB4, Trey McBride checks in at TE2, and Tetairoa McMillan slots in at WR15, all projected starters who were taken at or near fair value. That kind of consistency across the board is how you build a lineup that hums even when nothing goes dramatically right. The one player worth watching closely is Alec Pierce, a projected starter at WR32 whose upside is real, as one of the premier big-play threats in the league, but who is currently on the PUP list after offseason ankle surgery. If Pierce misses the first four games, the team absorbs a meaningful early-season hit. Even so, Kyle Pitts at TE7 and a wide receiver group that runs several starters deep gives this roster genuine staying power. Last year's 85th percentile scoring finish was not a fluke. This looks like a team built the same way.

Metcalfe22 didn't build this roster on one flashy bet. They built it pick by pick, and the cumulative effect is a team sitting at the 71st percentile with a realistic path to doing real damage in the Super Mario 64 division. The centerpiece of the draft logic is Breece Hall, snagged at 7.04 against an ADP of 5.02, a two-round discount on a projected RB14 that quietly sets the floor for the entire roster. Pair that with Drake Maye falling half a round past his price tag to land as a projected QB2 starter, and you have a team whose best players were acquired at rates the market undersold. Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and Tucker Kraft at TE5 give the lineup genuine upside at the top, and when your weakest projected starter is Jayden Reed at WR48, the margin for error is comfortable. Metcalfe22's 2025 season ended at the 93rd percentile in scoring. The process that produced this roster suggests 2026 is not an accident waiting to happen.

CamodoDragon didn't build this roster on one flashy swing. They built it pick by pick, and the cumulative effect lands them in the top 10 percent of the field and third in the Super Mario 64 division. The foundation is genuinely elite: Jahmyr Gibbs projects as RB1, De'Von Achane comes in at RB6, and Harold Fannin sits at TE6, each of them a projected starter. What makes those names more impressive is how they got here. Achane slipped 2.07 rounds past his ADP, Fannin fell nearly a round and a half, and CamodoDragon was waiting both times. That's not luck, that's a manager who did the homework and trusted it. Jaxson Dart projects at QB11 and adds real upside at the position. The wide receiver group is thinner by projection, but in a positionless format, the ceiling of Gibbs, Achane, and Garrett Wilson as a projected starter can cover a lot of ground. This team didn't make headlines on draft day. It just kept winning the pick.

smenright27 didn't swing for the fences and miss. They just kept hitting singles that turned into doubles. The clearest proof: Saquon Barkley fell a full round and a quarter past his ADP before this team scooped him up at RB8, and Josh Jacobs slid even further, nearly two rounds past his number, landing as a projected starter at RB16. Those aren't lottery tickets, those are draft-room fundamentals executed while other managers blinked. Layer in a Jayden Daniels and Terry McLaurin stack, Daniels projecting as a QB5 with his top target already in the building, and the floor of this roster gets genuinely difficult to argue with. Brock Bowers at TE1 doesn't hurt either. The one blemish is a late-round reach on Keenan Allen, nearly four and a half rounds early, but late-draft gambles are forgiven quickly when the foundation is this sound. The result is a team sitting second in the Super Mario 64 division and in the top 10 percent of the field, built not on boldness but on relentless, boring competence.

rhawkaz sits atop the Super Mario 64 division and checks in at the 92nd percentile of the field, and the draft log tells you exactly why: this roster was built pick by pick, with value accumulating quietly rather than arriving in one lucky fall. Joe Burrow at QB4 slid nearly a full round past his ADP before rhawkaz scooped him in the third, and Sam LaPorta, a projected TE8 starter, came off the board more than a round late at 7.03. Puka Nacua projecting as WR1 gives this team a genuine top-of-market anchor, and Ashton Jeanty at RB7 and Derrick Henry at RB12 keep the pressure on every week. The draft was not flawless, Alvin Kamara reached three full rounds early and Jaydon Blue was taken nearly six rounds ahead of schedule, but in a positionless format where the best players simply play, those late-round swings do not cost rhawkaz anything it cannot absorb. The numbers here read less like a lucky night and more like a manager who knew the room.
