The charitable read left the building sometime around pick 3.05, when applebritters spent a third-round selection on Sam LaPorta, a TE8 projection who was sitting comfortably in the sixth-round range by consensus. Then came Travis Kelce at 4.08, a full 2.8 rounds before his ADP, and Dalton Kincaid at 5.05, another 2.5 rounds early. Three consecutive rounds burned building toward a position group that, however capable, could only ever produce one starter at a time. The rest of the roster tells you exactly what that cost: Jaylen Warren, projected RB27, is the weakest projected starter, and the board around him thins out fast. Drake Maye is a genuine asset, a QB2 who just added AJ Brown to his supporting cast in New England and looks poised for another MVP-caliber season, but one quarterback carries only so much weight in a field this competitive. applebritters sits 12th in the Pikachu division and in the 6th percentile tournament-wide. Last year's 37th-percentile finish looks like a ceiling from here.

Five major reaches in a single draft is not a quirk, it is a philosophy, and rich6206's philosophy appears to be paying full retail while everyone else shops the clearance rack. The most damning evidence sits at tight end, where Jake Ferguson (TE12) cost a fourth-round pick despite an ADP that said eighth, and Harold Fannin (TE6) was snatched nearly two rounds ahead of schedule in the third. Both are projected starters, so the aggression is not entirely without reward, but paying that kind of premium for players ranked sixth and twelfth at their position is the kind of math that leaves a team thin on surplus everywhere else. CeeDee Lamb (WR5) anchors the receiving corps and De'Von Achane (RB6) gives the roster a legitimate top-ten weapon, but below that the projections get bleak fast, with Jayden Reed (WR48) projected as the weakest starter. A team sitting at 9th percentile in the tournament with zero steals and five major reaches did not stumble into that number. It earned it.

DirrtyHarry5 sits at the bottom of the Pikachu division and in the 10th percentile of the field, and the roster doesn't offer much reason to argue with those numbers. The wideout group is genuinely strong, with Nico Collins (WR9), Rashee Rice (WR13), Tee Higgins (WR19), and Jameson Williams (WR21) all projecting as starters, but in a positionless format the question is always what surrounds that top tier, and here the answer is grim. Jonathan Taylor (RB4) is a legitimate anchor, yet the projected quarterback situation looks like a car that starts on cold mornings but probably won't make the highway. Baker Mayfield checks in at QB18, Sam Darnold at QB21, and then there's Fernando Mendoza at QB27, taken nearly three rounds before his ADP suggested he should have been. Darnold had a Super Bowl ring last season but his passing numbers were modest, heavily reliant on Jaxon Smith-Njigba, and with Kenneth Walker gone the offense is still finding its shape. There are no obvious fixes left to pull on this roster. DirrtyHarry5 may need to simply survive until the waiver wire offers something better.

JKroll77 sits at 9th in the Pikachu division and the 13th percentile of the field, and the roster, looked at honestly, does not offer much reason for optimism. The top end is real: Josh Allen projects as QB1, and Ashton Jeanty checks in at RB7. But the depth behind that pair gets thin in a hurry, with projected starters like Kyren Williams at RB15 and Kyle Pitts at TE7 carrying the middle tier, and the lineup bottoming out with Hunter Henry projected as the weakest starter at TE18. The draft did not generate much capital to work with either, logging just one steal across the entire board and six minor reaches, including Dallas Goedert taken nearly two rounds early. Pitts is worth watching given his breakout last season, and the Atlanta quarterback situation with Tua Tagovailoa in the mix adds some intrigue there, but intrigue does not move a team from the 13th percentile. JKroll77 needed the draft to be the turnaround and it simply was not.

The 0xx0 roster has a real problem, and it is not a subtle one. Justin Jefferson (WR6) and Amon-Ra St. Brown (WR4) are legitimate stars, and DeVonta Smith (WR14) and Zay Flowers (WR16) give this team a receiver group that would be the envy of most managers in the Pikachu division. But talent at one position does not win in a positionless format when the rest of the roster is dragging you down, and the rest of this roster is absolutely dragging. Trevor Lawrence (QB10) grades out fine, but the ground game is a wasteland, with Chris Rodriguez (RB48) and Isiah Pacheco (RB52) serving as the headliners on a unit that looks like a clearance rack after a fire sale. The draft did not help matters, with Pacheco representing the most glaring mistake, taken nearly three rounds ahead of his ADP. Sitting 8th in the division and at just the 29th tournament percentile, 0xx0 is a team that built a beautiful roof and forgot to pour the foundation.

tonyworth sits in the strange purgatory of the Pikachu division, ranked seventh and sitting at the 44th percentile of the field, which is exactly the kind of position where seasons are decided by coin flips and bye weeks rather than obvious talent gaps. The foundation is genuinely strong: Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Derrick Henry at RB12 give this roster a backfield core that most managers would trade a kidney for, and the draft showed real patience, picking up Patrick Mahomes and Matthew Stafford as values after both slid past their expected rounds. The problem is the margins, and the margins here have names: Tony Pollard, reached two full rounds ahead of his RB30 projection, and Saquon Barkley, who is quietly becoming a different kind of asset than the one managers fell in love with, a 29-year-old whose own team may be looking to lighten his workload. Last year's 81 percent win rate suggests this roster knows how to score points. Whether it scores enough of them in 2026 depends on which version of Barkley shows up and whether Pollard justifies the faith placed in him at 9.02.

tjones5 sits at 45th percentile in a tournament where 45th percentile teams go home quietly. The foundation is real: Puka Nacua at WR1 is genuinely elite, and Jalen Hurts at QB9 brings the kind of floor that wins weeks you had no business winning, though the offseason departure of AJ Brown to New England introduces legitimate uncertainty about whether Hurts can sustain five straight top-10 fantasy finishes without his best weapon. The problem is what surrounds those two. Omarion Hampton at RB9 and Kenneth Walker III at RB10 give this roster a credible middle tier, but the draft process shows a manager who trusted his gut too often, pulling Rhamondre Stevenson nearly two and a half rounds before his ADP and Trey Benson almost seven rounds early. Those are the kinds of bets that look bold in hindsight when they hit and quietly sink rosters when they don't. For tjones5, there is no margin for the misses to pile up. The ceiling is a playoff push. The floor is another quiet exit.

trutt01 didn't win the draft with one flashy pick. They won it by staying a step ahead, round after round. James Cook at RB5 anchors the roster, but the real story is the depth behind him: Chase Brown at RB11 and Jeremiyah Love at RB13 project as legitimate starters, meaning trutt01 never has to sweat a down week from any one player. At tight end, Trey McBride at TE2 is the kind of asset that quietly separates good rosters from great ones, and Tucker Kraft, a TE5 projection who fell more than a round past his ADP, was arguably the sharpest single pick of the draft. Fifteen chalk selections might sound boring, but chalk is just another word for not making mistakes, and trutt01 made almost none. The 2025 season finished at the 67th percentile in scoring, which is a reasonable floor to build from. Sitting fifth in the Pikachu division and projecting at the 76th tournament percentile, this team isn't a dark horse. It's a contender that did the work quietly.

TheMikeHoncho lands at 76th percentile in the field, and the draft story behind that number is quieter than most, which is exactly the point. There was no lottery-ticket gamble that happened to pay off, no hero pick that carried the whole operation. Instead, this roster was built round by round through consistent, disciplined drafting: 13 chalk picks that hit their marks, and two steals that quietly padded the margin. Dak Prescott falling more than two rounds past his ADP to become the QB7 is the kind of thing that looks like luck until you realize patient managers are simply ready when the board breaks their way. Christian McCaffrey at RB3, Drake London at WR7, and Tyler Warren at TE4 form a projected starting core that wins most weeks before the bench even enters the conversation. The lone blemish, a five-round reach on MarShawn Lloyd, barely registers against that foundation. Fourth in the Pikachu Division is the current standing, but a roster this consistently constructed has the shape of something that climbs.

Gonzo70 finished 26-10 last season and lands in the 85th percentile of the 2026 field, and neither number happened by accident. The foundation is genuinely elite: Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and George Pickens at WR10 give this roster a top-end punch that most managers would trade their draft capital to replicate, and Tetairoa McMillan (WR15) and Emeka Egbuka (WR18) keep the quality from falling off a cliff behind them. The draft itself was more workmanlike than flashy, 16 chalk picks against zero major reaches, but that discipline paid off in the spots that mattered. Marvin Harrison Jr. slid a full round past his ADP and landed at WR33, a pick that looks better the more you study the board. The one legitimate question mark sits at quarterback, where Jaxson Dart's upside as a mobile passer is real but so is his history of inconsistent passing volume and too many visits to the medical tent. Caleb Williams at QB6 steadies that concern considerably. Third in the Pikachu Division is a fine place to start a conversation about going further.

Last year's 13-23 record and a 17th-percentile scoring finish left SurplusOfCash with something to prove, and this roster looks like the answer. The foundation starts at the top, where Lamar Jackson (QB3) and Brock Bowers (TE1) give the team a pair of elite-tier anchors that most managers in this field simply don't have. Around them, the drafting was sharp: Jayden Daniels landed at pick 4.06 despite an ADP of 2.12, a full round and a half of free value that is hard to overstate when you're building a contender. Daniels also stacks neatly with Terry McLaurin, adding a layer of upside correlation that can make a single great week feel like two. A.J. Brown rounds out a starting group that projects comfortably into the top ten percent of the tournament, a 91st-percentile finish that looks less like a ceiling and more like a floor for a team this well-constructed. After a season that felt like a long winter, the rebound is not just plausible, it looks almost inevitable.

fantasyblogging sits atop the Pikachu division and in the 99th percentile of the entire field, and the draft tells you exactly why. Eleven values, zero reaches, and a roster that reads like a disciplined exercise in patience and precision. Joe Burrow at QB4 and Justin Herbert at QB8 form a quarterback room built on quality, both sliding past their ADPs to land in this lineup. The backfield is the centerpiece: Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 anchors everything, and Bucky Irving at RB21 arrived a full round and a half after his ADP suggested he should have been gone, which is the kind of quiet win that separates good drafters from great ones. At tight end, Colston Loveland at TE3 gives the team a genuine positional advantage at a spot where the field thins quickly. Even the depth carries value, with Travis Etienne at RB18 and Malik Nabers at WR12 projected to start alongside the headliners. The 2025 record of 64 percent wins and a 79th percentile scoring finish suggests this manager already knew what they were doing. The 2026 draft only confirmed it.
