Jason Easler drafted like a man who found a cheat code and discovered too late it only worked for one position. Jonathan Taylor at RB4, Saquon Barkley at RB8, Breece Hall at RB14, Quinshon Judkins at RB22, all projected starters, all reached, the whole group assembled with the anxious hoarding of someone who does not trust the process and cannot stop pulling the trigger early. The problem is that Easler burned so much draft capital accelerating those picks that the rest of the roster quietly collapsed around them. His projected starting receivers top out at Alec Pierce at WR32 and Marvin Harrison Jr. at WR33, with Michael Pittman at WR44 penciled in as the weakest projected starter on the team. His quarterback situation pairs Bo Nix at QB15 with Baker Mayfield at QB18, neither of whom inspires confidence. No steals, no values, eight major reaches across the board, a 32 percent win rate last season, and a current projection of dead last in the Pitfall division. There is no charitable read available, and the uncharitable one is not pretty.

Ted Kasten's 2026 campaign is already being written in the past tense, and the draft didn't do him any favors. Sitting 11th in the Pitfall division and in just the 15th percentile of the field, the roster's ceiling is mostly theoretical. The headliner is CeeDee Lamb at WR5 and De'Von Achane at RB6, and those two names look great on paper, but the dropoff is steep and the construction offers little cushion when things go sideways. The single most alarming decision came at pick 3.09, where Kasten spent a third-round selection on Matthew Stafford, a QB14 projection, nearly two and a half rounds ahead of his ADP. In a positionless format where that pick could have secured a high-upside skill player, burning it on Stafford is the kind of choice that haunts a roster all season. Trevor Lawrence, the other projected QB option, is a more credible talent, but even his breakout last year came wrapped in enough Jaguars confusion to limit his fantasy ceiling. Kasten isn't without pieces, but without a lever left to pull, hoping things break right is now the entire strategy.

Jarrett Behar's 2026 outlook in the Pitfall division is about as encouraging as a field goal attempt in a hurricane. He sits 10th in the division and in just the 31st tournament percentile, and the roster does not hide the reasons why. The foundation is real enough: Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and Ashton Jeanty at RB7 give Behar two of the better players in the field, and Tucker Kraft checks in at TE5. But the supporting cast collapses fast, and the receiver group is the place where this team quietly bleeds out, with Parker Washington projecting at WR35 and Chris Godwin at WR38 as the top options. Behar reached for Godwin nearly two rounds early and reached for Tyquan Thornton a stunning 4.6 rounds ahead of market, landing a WR97. Meanwhile, the quarterback situation offers little relief. Jaxson Dart carries real upside, but his track record of limited passing yardage and frequent concussion tests suggests the ceiling and the floor are uncomfortably close together. There is no obvious lever left to pull.

Gregory England's roster has a real argument, and it starts at the top. Joe Burrow at QB4 anchors a starting lineup alongside Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Colston Loveland at TE3, three projected elite options at their respective positions that can carry a week on their own. In a positionless format, that kind of concentrated quality is the whole blueprint: stack your best players and let the format do the rest. The problem is that England apparently believed in that blueprint so thoroughly that he spent the middle and late rounds chasing wide receivers who weren't worth chasing yet. Xavier Worthy, Ryan Flurnoy, Jaylin Noel, and Dontayvion Wicks were all taken well before their ADPs, with Noel arriving nearly six rounds early. That is not aggressive drafting; that is panic buying. The result is a team sitting ninth in the Pitfall division and in the 43rd percentile of the field, which is the uncomfortable math of being right about your stars and wrong about almost everything else.

Peter Schoenke enters 2026 sitting eighth in the Pitfall division and right at the tournament median, which is a polite way of saying the floor and the ceiling are uncomfortably close together. The roster does have a legitimate anchor in Christian McCaffrey, James Cook, and Derrick Henry, three projected starters who grade out well, but the supporting cast fades quickly once you scroll past them. Justin Herbert is the clearest example of the squeeze: Mike McDaniel's arrival makes him interesting in theory, but the Chargers have won 11 games each of the last two seasons by running the ball and playing ball-control, and Herbert's pass attempts have quietly slid as a result, leaving him a QB8 projection with a ceiling that keeps getting renegotiated downward. Ladd McConkey at WR20 provides a Herbert stack and was a genuine draft value, but Jayden Reed at WR48 is the projected starter anchoring the weakest part of the lineup, and there is no depth behind him that changes the math. This roster has enough to tread water and very little to do more than that.

Bryan Hurley sits at 54th percentile with a roster that will live and die by razor-thin margins, and the draft fingerprints tell the story. The receiver corps is genuinely strong, anchored by Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and A.J. Brown at WR8, with Tetairoa McMillan and Luther Burden providing real depth behind them. Hurley also built a Caleb Williams and Burden stack that could pay off handsomely in a positionless format where every point compounds. The problem is where Hurley spent his draft capital early. He reached 2.2 rounds for Kyler Murray, who projects as a QB19, a backup-tier arm that cost a premium pick. Then late, he doubled down on hope, reaching over three rounds each for Jerry Jeudy and Cooper Kupp, two of the weakest projected names on the roster. Those decisions shrunk the margin for error on a team that is already projected to start Jordan Addison as

its weakest contributor. The ceiling is real. But Hurley's 2026 season will be decided by whether the reaches haunt him when the standings tighten.

Darren Armani did not stumble into correlation, he engineered it. The centerpiece is a Dak Prescott stack that runs through both George Pickens (WR10) and Jake Ferguson (TE12), meaning when Prescott lights up a scoreboard, Armani is collecting from multiple directions at once. That is the ceiling, and it is a real one. Puka Nacua (WR1) anchors the rest of the lineup and gives Armani a genuine floor even on weeks when the stack goes cold. The concern is that the plan lives or dies on Prescott, and the roster shows limited insurance behind it, with Tony Pollard (RB30) the only meaningful change-of-pace piece in the backfield. Wan'Dale Robinson (WR47) figures as the projected starter most likely to feel squeeze, having followed Brian Daboll to Tennessee only to find Carnell Tate (WR29) already ahead of him in the target pecking order. At 58th percentile and sixth in the Pitfall division, Armani is not in a bad spot, but this team does not simmer, it either boils or it doesn't.

Tyler Loechner did not swing for the fences and whiff. He just kept making the right call, round after round, and the board rewarded him for it. The clearest example is the tight end group: Trey McBride at TE2, Tyler Warren at TE4, and Harold Fannin at TE6 were all taken at or past their ADPs, meaning Loechner got top-six production at the position without overpaying for a single player. The same discipline showed up at quarterback, where Drake Maye projects as QB2 and was acquired as a clear value. Yes, Patrick Mahomes cost about 1.7 rounds more than the market said he was worth, but pairing him with Travis Kelce as a stack is the kind of deliberate construction that earns that premium back in correlated scoring. Seven values and only two reaches across the entire draft is a profile that looks like process more than luck. Sitting at 75th percentile in the tournament field after a 68-percent win rate in 2025, Loechner arrives in the Pitfall division with a roster built on margins, and margins tend to compound.

Damien Lyon didn't swing for the fences and miss, he just kept hitting singles that added up to something real. The receiver corps is the centerpiece: Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, Drake London at WR7, Malik Nabers at WR12, and Rashee Rice at WR13 form a projected starting group that would be the envy of most managers in the field, and Lyon got Nabers a full round after his ADP suggested someone else would. Rashee Rice cost him slightly, taken about three-quarters of a round early at WR13, but that is the kind of reach that reflects confidence rather than panic, and the production projection justifies it. George Kittle landing as a projected starter at TE9 adds another reliable piece without requiring Lyon to have done anything clever. Three values on the board, sixteen picks at or near chalk, zero major reaches: that draft chart reads like a manager who knew his board and trusted it. Lyon sits fourth in the Pitfall division and at the 78th tournament percentile, a team quietly built to be a problem.

After finishing in the bottom 20 percent of scoring in 2025, Scott Atkins has rebuilt with the kind of quiet ferocity that makes rival managers nervous come September. The anchor is Ja'Marr Chase, a WR2 projection that Atkins landed at just 1.06 despite an ADP of 1.02, a small slip in the draft room that turned into a foundational win. From there, the draft became a masterclass in patience: Kenneth Walker III fell 1.2 rounds past his ADP before Atkins pounced at RB10, Bucky Irving slid similarly to become a projected RB21 starter, and Jaylen Waddle drifted a full round late into an RB/WR group that now projects eight values across the roster. Jayden Daniels stacking with Terry McLaurin adds schematic upside that the 2025 version of this team simply never had. The result is a team sitting third in the Pitfall division and in the 83rd percentile of the field, the kind of honest, structural upgrade that does not require luck to explain. The rebound is not coming. It is already here.

Ray Flowers didn't chase the flashy pick or force the dramatic swing, and the roster he built in the Pitfall division shows what quiet competence looks like over 20-plus rounds. The foundation is legitimately elite: Josh Allen and Lamar Jackson sitting at QB1 and QB3 respectively, with an Allen and D.J. Moore stack giving the lineup a connected upside ceiling that most managers would envy. The receiver group runs five projected starters through WR30, headlined by Nico Collins at WR9 and Chris Olave at WR11, the latter landing two rounds after his ADP, which is about as clean a value as a draft produces. Jackson himself slipped nearly a full round past consensus, another quiet win stacked on top of an already strong position. The reaches on Kaytron Allen and Adonai Mitchell are real and worth watching, but they represent a small fraction of a draft that was otherwise disciplined and forward-leaning. Sitting second in the division at the 85th tournament percentile, Flowers looks less like someone who got lucky and more like someone who simply drafted better than the room.

Mark Berdahl's Pitfall division lead did not come from one flashy swing. It came from a draft that kept winning small. Brock Bowers landing at TE1 when Berdahl took him eleven picks past the board's consensus is the clearest example, but the pattern repeats: Jeremiyah Love sliding a round and a half to become an RB13 starter, Isaiah Likely falling a full round to add TE13 depth, Jameson Williams drifting past his ADP to land as a projected WR21 starter. Add in the Jalen Hurts and DeVonta Smith stack, which gives Berdahl a built-in multiplier on one of the better QB-WR pairings in the field, and the roster starts to look less like a lucky night and more like a disciplined one. Five values against one minor reach across the whole board is a ratio most managers would sign for without reading the fine print. At the 89th percentile of the tournament, Berdahl is not sneaking up on anyone, but the construction earns that standing.
