The pick that tells you everything you need to know about haleyalexis comes at 1.04, where Jalen Hurts lands nearly three full rounds ahead of his ADP in a positionless format where quarterback value is famously compressed. Taking Hurts QB9 in the fourth slot is not a bold swing, it is paying first-round prices for a player the market prices closer to the third round, and it poisons the well for everything downstream. The damage compounds from there: four major reaches across the draft, zero steals, and a roster that lands dead last in Pokmon Gold and Silver while scraping the second percentile of the entire field. Saquon Barkley is a legitimate anchor and Justin Herbert gives the roster a credible QB8 pairing, but the depth built around them reads like a late-round fire sale, Stefon Diggs taken two rounds early and fading fast, Chris Brazzell II grabbed nearly five rounds before the market agreed he was worth selecting. haleyalexis did not draft a team so much as a sequence of increasingly expensive miscalculations.

Dragonite sits 11th in the Pokémon Gold and Silver division and in the 6th percentile of the entire field, and the roster does not hide why. The top of the lineup has real names, Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and Jayden Daniels at QB5 give this team a credible floor, but the draft decisions surrounding them tell a grimmer story. Daniels cost a first-round pick taken 1.2 rounds before the market agreed he was worth it, and the value simply never came back around. Six minor reaches and one major one across the board mean Dragonite paid early-round prices for mid-round faith, and the faith is not always well-placed. Jaxson Dart at QB11 is the emblem of that tension: a player whose ceiling generates genuine excitement while his floor, marked by questionable passing volume and an uncomfortable familiarity with the medical tent, inspires considerably less. With Jadarian Price projected as the

weakest starter at RB26, there is no hidden upside quietly waiting to be unlocked. The ceiling has already been built. It just is not tall enough.

Luther Deliburden sits 10th in the Pokémon Gold and Silver division and in the 15th percentile of the field, and the draft record does little to suggest a turnaround is coming. The headline move was taking Lamar Jackson at 1.03, a full round ahead of his ADP, which is a steep price to pay for a QB3 in a positionless format where quarterback scarcity matters far less than sheer talent depth. The real damage, though, is in the accumulation of minor reaches throughout the middle and late rounds, where Deliburden consistently bought players at premiums and still landed a roster that grades out with average receivers and a TE35 as the lone tight end option. De'Von Achane and Omarion Hampton give this team a genuine backbone at RB6 and RB9, but the projected starter group bottoms out at Wan'Dale Robinson, a WR47 who is a tough sell as a weekly option. There is no obvious course correction available, no hidden value waiting to be unlocked. This roster is what it is, and what it is lands near the bottom of the division.

There is no easy way to spin this one. dmcp89 checks in at ninth in the Pokémon Gold and Silver division and sits at just the 25th percentile of the field, and the roster construction does not offer much cause for optimism. The backfield trio of Christian McCaffrey, James Cook, and Kyren Williams is genuinely elite, and A.J. Brown at WR8 gives the team a legitimate top-end weapon, but the drop-off after those four is steep and unforgiving. The receiver group beyond Brown craters quickly, with Khalil Shakir, Jayden Higgins, and Jauan Jennings all projecting outside WR51, and Shakir was actually reached for at Round 10 despite that modest projection. The draft itself reflects a manager grasping for answers rather than finding them: fourteen chalk picks, no steals, and a reach on Brock Purdy nearly two full rounds before his ADP. Purdy projects as QB13, which is fine but not the kind of upside play that justifies burning a third-round pick. The ceiling here is real but narrow, and right now the floor looks a lot more likely.

Lugia enters 2026 ranked eighth in the Pokémon Gold and Silver division and sitting at just the 32nd percentile of the field, and the draft log does not offer much reason for optimism. The manager went chalk on 12 of 18 picks and generated zero steals, which means the roster looks almost exactly like you would expect it to: average at best, with no surprise contributors waiting to outperform their projections. The QB situation is the sharpest illustration of the ceiling problem. Josh Allen is a genuine QB1 anchor, but the next arm on the depth chart is Cam Ward at QB23, who doubles as the projected weakest starter on the team. The J.J. McCarthy dart throw, taken nearly four rounds ahead of his QB37 projection, is the kind of swing you make when you are trying to manufacture upside the draft did not naturally provide. It did not work. Coming off a 15-21 record in 2025 and a 46th-percentile scoring

finish, Lugia needed a aggressive, well-timed draft to turn things around. Instead, they got chalk and a couple of misses.

Tyranitar played the value game almost flawlessly. Jonathan Taylor slid to pick 2.05, Nico Collins fell nearly a full round to 3.08, and Alec Pierce dropped nearly two rounds before this team grabbed him at 9.08. By the numbers, that is a draft where the manager consistently let the board come to them and still walked away with talent. The cruel part is that the scoreboard does not care about process. Sitting seventh in the Pokémon Gold and Silver division at the 41st percentile of the field, Tyranitar finds itself in the exact position a value-hunting team dreads: right, and irrelevant. Drake Maye anchors the roster as a projected QB2, and Maye stacking with fellow Bronco Bo Nix and Jaylen Waddle gives the lineup genuine upside. But the floor keeps interrupting. Kyle Pitts projects as TE7 yet carries his annual asterisk of doubt, and KC Concepcion, the projected weakest starter, is a WR50 holding a roster spot that the draft never quite solved. The receipts are clean. The standings are not.

Ilex Forest FC sits at 46th percentile entering 2026, the kind of team that makes you squint at the standings trying to figure out where exactly they land. The ceiling is real: Jaxon Smith-Njigba projects as WR3, Tyler Warren as TE4, and Caleb Williams as QB6 gives this roster a legitimate top-end core. The floor, though, is where the uncertainty creeps in. Williams was the one major reach of the draft, pulled 1.3 rounds ahead of his ADP, and if he disappoints, the gap between him and Jared Goff at QB16 is steep enough to matter. The Goff-Jameson Williams stack offers some insulation there, with Williams projecting as WR21. Below the top tier, projected starters like Quentin Johnston at WR41 are the kind of player who looks fine in a vacuum and decisive in a tight race. Ilex Forest finished 81st percentile in scoring a year ago, so the infrastructure exists. Whether the margins break their way this time is the only question worth asking.

Last year, PhillyFastBreak finished in the bottom 20 percent of the field in scoring, posting a brutal 8-28 record that left little to celebrate. This roster reads like a direct response to that misery. The foundation is Bijan Robinson, projected as the RB2 in the entire field, paired with a deep backfield corps that includes Josh Jacobs (RB16), Javonte Williams (RB17), and David Montgomery, who escaped a diminished role in Detroit to chase a larger workload in Houston. On the draft side, manager PhillyFastBreak showed patience, landing Chris Olave (WR11) and Courtland Sutton (WR37) after both slipped past their ADPs, adding real value to a receiver group anchored by a top-15 wideout. Joe Burrow at QB4 gives the team a reliable ceiling at the position. The 59th percentile tournament projection and fifth-place divisional standing suggest the rebound is real but not yet complete, which feels about right: this is a team that upgraded meaningfully and now needs the season to confirm it.

AVironhands didn't win the draft with one flashy move. They won it by repeatedly landing players at prices the market hadn't caught up to yet. Justin Jefferson at WR6 is the headliner, a manager sliding into pick 2.08 for someone the field was pricing nearly a full round earlier. That's not luck, that's patience paying off. Colston Loveland at TE3 arrived at 3.05 when consensus had him gone by 2.08, and the pairing of Loveland with Tucker Kraft (TE5) and Sam LaPorta (TE8) gives this roster a tier of tight end play most managers would envy. Sitting at 86th percentile heading into 2026, AVironhands has the kind of foundation that doesn't need a miracle to perform, just health and the steady accumulation of what a well-drafted roster does best. After a 54th percentile scoring finish in 2025, the upgrades here are real and visible. This team belongs in the conversation, not because one pick worked out, but because the whole draft tilted quietly and consistently in their favor.

Bronamath004 doesn't have a single flashy narrative to hang this team on, and that's exactly the point. This is a draft built on consistent execution, the kind where the manager kept coming out ahead round after round without needing one transcendent swing to bail everything out. The tight end group alone is enough to make the rest of the field nervous: Brock Bowers at TE1 and Trey McBride at TE2 are both projected starters, and McBride came at a discount, falling nearly two-thirds of a round past his ADP. George Pickens, projected WR10 and also a starter, slid almost a full round before Bronamath004 stepped in. Five values across the draft with zero steals sounds like a quiet haul, but five times coming out ahead of the market is how rosters like this end up at the 97th percentile of the field. Third in the division right now, this team has the kind of foundational quality that tends to hold up deep into a tournament, not because of one bold move, but because almost nothing here was a mistake.

Ampharos sits first in the Pokémon Gold and Silver division and in the 97th percentile of the entire field, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. This roster was built with patience and precision: seven values and a steal against just one minor reach across the whole board. The receiver group is the engine, anchored by Puka Nacua at WR1 and Drake London at WR7, with London arriving half a round later than his ADP suggested he would. Marvin Harrison Jr. at WR33 slid more than a full round past his number and lands as a projected starter anyway, which is the kind of quiet coup that separates disciplined drafters from lucky ones. Ashton Jeanty at RB7 gives the lineup a genuine backfield centerpiece, and Jordan Love at QB17 and C.J. Stroud at QB22 provide enough upside under center to keep this team competitive even in a positionless format where quarterback matters less than raw talent depth. There is very little to pick apart here. Ampharos did not stumble into the 97th percentile. They earned it pick by pick.

THoupt12 didn't stumble into correlation, they engineered it. The double stack is the architecture here: Dak Prescott paired with CeeDee Lamb, and Matthew Stafford paired with Davante Adams, meaning when this team's quarterbacks cook, the receivers cook with them, and the points compound rather than cancel out. Landing Lamb at 2.07 when his ADP sat at 1.11 is the kind of draft-room fortune that looks lucky until you realize it quietly vaults the entire ceiling, because Lamb at WR5 is the engine the Prescott stack runs on. What keeps the floor honest is the supporting cast underneath those stacks, particularly Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 giving the roster a week-to-week base load while Quinshon Judkins, back from a late-season fractured fibula and reportedly on track for training camp, offers the kind of upside that only costs you if he's not right. If the stacks fire in the same week, this team is nearly impossible to beat. That's not a contingency plan, that's the whole plan, and at the 97th percentile of the field, you trust it.
