There is no flattering angle on DynastyStump's 2026 draft, and the numbers refuse to offer one. Zero steals, zero values, and seven major reaches across the board paint the picture of a manager who fell in love with names and ignored the price tag every single time. The Fernando Mendoza situation alone is almost impressive in the wrong direction, a QB27 plucked 7.3 rounds ahead of his ADP, which means DynastyStump effectively paid a second-round premium for a backup quarterback while the rest of the field was loading up on genuine contributors. Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 is real, and Saquon Barkley at RB8 gives the roster something to build around, but the supporting cast crumbles fast, with KC Concepcion projected as the weakest starter at WR50 and Tyreek Hill checking in at WR77. After a 2025 campaign that landed in the first percentile in scoring, this team needed a reset and instead doubled down. Third in the division feels generous.

There is something quietly heartbreaking about MajorMilouFB in 2026, because the reputation arrived intact and the roster did not. Last year's 97th-percentile scoring machine has been replaced by a team projected 6th percentile in the field and 11th in Pole Position, and the draft choices that got them here deserve a long, uncomfortable look. The receiver group has genuine stars, A.J. Brown at WR8 and Nico Collins at WR9 among the projected starters, but MajorMilouFB paid aggressively for depth behind them, reaching nearly five rounds early on Rashod Bateman and more than four on Calvin Ridley, two players projected WR92 and WR78 respectively. That is not building a roster, that is hoarding lottery tickets at full price. The five major reaches scattered across the draft consumed capital that could have shored up real weaknesses, and now the team's weakest projected starter is

Matthew Golden at WR52. Somewhere between last year's brilliance and this year's blueprint, MajorMilouFB forgot that reputation does not start in your lineup.

DynastyDeviant finished 2025 at the 14th percentile in scoring and heads into 2026 ranked 10th in Pole Position, sitting at just the 26th tournament percentile, and the draft did not do much to change the math. The roster has genuine weapons: De'Von Achane projects as RB6, CeeDee Lamb sits at WR5, and Jayden Daniels comes in as QB5 after falling nearly a full round past his ADP, a legitimate find. But the draft also features three major reaches, and two of them are particularly damaging to the floor. Trey Benson, grabbed more than seven rounds ahead of his ADP, projects as RB64, and RJ Harvey, taken two rounds early, grades out as the projected weakest starter on the roster at RB28. When your cost overruns are concentrated on players at the back of the depth chart, you are essentially paying a premium to fill out a lineup rather than improve it. Achane and Lamb can carry a week, but they cannot carry a season, and right now there is no obvious move left to make that changes the trajectory.

The Open-Wheel Warriors finished 2025 in the 86th percentile, and that number still looks good on paper the way a faded trophy looks good on a shelf. The 2026 roster is a different animal. Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and Omarion Hampton at RB9 are legitimate, and George Pickens at WR10 and Garrett Wilson at WR17 give this team a ceiling worth respecting, but the projections land at the 29th percentile and ninth in the Pole Position division, and the gap between those two realities is not subtle. The draft did not close it. Thirteen chalk selections and a reach on Mac Jones at QB39 taken more than four rounds early do not describe a team building toward a surprise, they describe a team that settled. Rachaad White projects as the weakest starter at RB39, and the top-end talent, while real, has not translated into a roster that looks anything like the one that posted a 25-11 record a year ago. Last year's percentile is a reputation. This year's projection is a warning.

Terry T. built this roster the right way, patiently waiting for the market to come to him, collecting four values and zero major reaches across a 20-round draft. The problem is that patience, it turns out, is not the same thing as success. Jonathan Taylor at RB4, Trey McBride at TE2, and Jalen Hurts at QB9 give this team a legitimate foundation, but the supporting cast falls off a cliff fast enough to give you vertigo. The projected starters at receiver top out at Xavier Worthy at WR49, which means Terry needed his values to punch above their weight, and they did not. Courtland Sutton at WR37, Travis Hunter at WR62, none of it moves the needle enough to compensate. The Hurts situation adds texture to the concern: with AJ Brown now in New England, Hurts enters a proving-ground season where the rushing touchdowns that made him reliable could evaporate if the offense sputters. Terry drafted correctly and landed at 36th percentile anyway. That is not bad luck. That is the draft telling you something.

Super Paur sits at exactly the tournament's median, and in a field this competitive, the difference between a bounce-back season and another 28-percent-win campaign probably comes down to two or three roster decisions made in May. The foundation is legitimate: Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4, Justin Jefferson at WR6, and Malik Nabers at WR12 form a top line that most managers in Pole Position would trade for without hesitation. Nabers is the variable that could tip the whole equation, a WR12 projection that still has a health asterisk attached after last year's torn ACL and an offseason that had dynasty circles genuinely nervous, and his output in the early weeks could quietly separate this roster from the pack of teams bunched near that 50th-percentile watermark. On the other end, Tony Pollard as the projected weakest starter at RB30 puts a real floor on the weeks when the top-line receivers have a quiet Sunday. Super Paur is not scary, is not a gimme, and will almost certainly be decided by the slim margins that always separate median teams from meaningful ones.

Greatest show on turf didn't swing for the fences and miss, they just kept hitting singles and doubles until the lineup was quietly loaded. The foundation is genuinely impressive: Christian McCaffrey at RB3, Derrick Henry at RB12, and Breece Hall at RB14 give this team a backfield that can carry a week on its own. What makes the draft stand out, though, is the value work done in the middle and late rounds. Jordyn Tyson fell 1.4 rounds past his ADP and landed as a projected WR34 starter, and Jauan Jennings slipped nearly two full rounds to give the team a WR63 with real upside as a late add. David Montgomery adds a layer of intrigue, reuniting with a new team in Houston after his role in Detroit narrowed considerably, and a bounce-back there would push this roster from good to genuinely dangerous. Sitting 64th percentile overall with Drake Maye anchoring things at QB2, Greatest show on turf has the profile of a team that gets better as the season rolls on.

staciestern didn't need a signature moment in this draft, just a series of quiet wins that added up to something real. The foundation is hard to argue with: Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Kenneth Walker III at RB10 form a backfield core that most managers would trade their third-round pick to own, and Joe Burrow at QB4 arrived with a discount attached, slipping nearly half a round past his ADP. The Burrow and Tee Higgins stack gives this roster a connected upside trigger, a way to boom on the same week rather than cancel each other out. Kyle Pitts at TE7 fell a full round and a half into staciestern's hands, the kind of quiet correction that separates a good draft from a great one. The receiver group is average by projection, but average looks different when your floor is already this high. A 97th-percentile scoring season in 2025 suggests staciestern knows how to translate draft equity into actual points, and this roster gives her every reason to do it again.

There was no single moment that made eeenglish1's draft great, just round after round of quiet competence adding up to something genuinely difficult to beat. The clearest expression of that approach is the tight end group, where Brock Bowers (TE1), Colston Loveland (TE3), Tucker Kraft (TE5), George Kittle (TE9), and Travis Kelce (TE10) give this team a projected-starter corps that reads like a position-group fever dream. Kraft and Kelce both slid past their ADPs by more than a round, which means eeenglish1 didn't just collect elite production at the position, they collected it at a discount. The Patrick Mahomes, Rashee Rice, and Kelce stack adds a ceiling dimension that pure projection misses, since those connections tend to spike together on big days. Sitting at 79th percentile and fourth in Pole Position, this roster isn't built on a single bold bet. It's built on a draft that kept coming out ahead, and that kind of edge tends to compound.

Advance Local didn't need a lottery ticket to build a winner in 2026, just the patience to let value come to them. Tetairoa McMillan fell a full round past his ADP and landed at WR15, Sam LaPorta slipped more than a round to give the team a TE8, and Quinshon Judkins drifted a round late to fill out a backfield that already had Ashton Jeanty at RB7. Five value picks against zero steals and zero minor reaches is not luck, it is a draft that consistently out-waited the room. The one blemish, Matthew Stafford taken nearly a round and a half early, is softened considerably by the Stafford and Puka Nacua stack, where Nacua projects as WR1 and turns that reach into something with real upside. Mike Evans adds another layer of intrigue after signing with the 49ers following a difficult, injury-shortened season in Tampa, giving this roster a bounce-back candidate with a new situation. Sitting second in the Pole Position division and at the 81st percentile overall, Advance Local enters 2026 looking like a team that simply drafted smarter than most.

SteelerNationGB finished 2026's draft looking like a team that simply kept winning small battles. The centerpiece is Ja'Marr Chase at WR2, a legitimate anchor, but the more telling story is what surrounds him. Drake London at WR7 came off the board four spots later than his ADP suggested, and Brian Thomas Jr. at WR31 slid a full round past his number, giving SteelerNationGB two receivers who arrived at a discount. Then there is Carnell Tate at WR29, drafted fourth overall in real life and handed a Titans offense built around Cam Ward, a pairing that carries real upside if it clicks the way both franchises need it to. Trevor Lawrence anchors the QB group at QB10 with a projected starter designation, keeping the passing game support credible. The result is a roster sitting third in the Pole Position division and in the 81st percentile of the field, numbers that reflect exactly what the draft log shows: not one splashy moment, just a steady accumulation of edges that compound.

Da Brat Boys sit first in the Pole Position division and in the 98th percentile of the entire field, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. The foundation starts with Josh Allen, a QB1 projection nabbed five spots past his average draft position, and the crown jewel is Lamar Jackson at QB3, a steal of 1.6 rounds that gave this roster elite quarterback depth while barely denting the mid-rounds. That kind of discipline at the top cascades down the board. Ladd McConkey came in 1.4 rounds late and projects as a WR20 starter, and Jaylen Waddle quietly upgrades his situation, moving from a Dolphins offense that made fantasy managers age prematurely into a Denver system where Bo Nix threw more passes than any quarterback in the league last year. The Jackson and Mark Andrews stack adds a bonus layer of ceiling on game days when Jackson goes nuclear. One minor reach on Rhamondre Stevenson, zero major reaches across the entire roster. This draft did not gamble. It just kept collecting.
