The optimism of securing DK Metcalf and Jayden Reed below their ADP dims against the stark reality of reaching for players like Kyler Murray and Jerry Jeudy much earlier than necessity dictated. As the season inches closer, Matthew Mitchell must brace for the uphill battle that awaits, hoping that unexpected breakthroughs might yet salvage what appears to be a daunting journey ahead.
