There is no gentle way to say this: Bourbon Cowboy is projected fifth percentile in the field, dead last in the Pong division, and the roster construction offers very little reason for optimism. The top of the lineup is genuinely exciting, Patrick Mahomes paired with Travis Kelce, Kyler Murray stacked with Justin Jefferson, Saquon Barkley projected RB8, and A.J. Brown at WR8 are names that command attention. But the draft pulled three major reaches, and two of them matter here. Brown was taken a full round before his ADP at 1.10, meaning Bourbon Cowboy spent a premium pick to jump a player who was coming anyway, and Cam Skattebo was grabbed nearly three rounds early at 4.03 despite a WR8 projection of RB20 that suggests the price was very wrong. The consequence is a roster that falls off a cliff after the headliners, with Rhamondre Stevenson projected RB31 grading out as the weakest projected starter. The stars are real, but stars do not win leagues alone, and there is nothing behind them here to cover a bad week.

Sara Hoggatt sits at 5th percentile in the tournament field and 11th in the Pong Division, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. The signature move was taking De'Von Achane at 1.09 when his ADP sat at 2.07, a reach of nearly a full round in the first slot she had to make a statement. That kind of early overpay sets a tone, and Hoggatt stayed consistent to it, reaching on T.J. Hockenson by 3.8 rounds, Germie Bernard by 4.2 rounds, and Tyquan Thornton by 4.1 rounds. The board rewarded none of that urgency: Hockenson projects as a TE23, Bernard as a WR79, Thornton as a WR97. Four major reaches, six minor ones, one steal across the entire draft, landing her a receiver group where the top projected starter is Zay Flowers at WR16 and the depth dissolves fast. Josh Allen falling to 2.04 is the one lifeline here, a genuine gift from the board, but a QB1 propping up a roster this structurally compromised is less a foundation than a flashlight in a collapsed mine.

Derek McCreath sits at 8th percentile in the tournament and dead last in the Pong division, and the draft sheet explains exactly how he got there: zero steals, zero values, and a full roster built on chalk and reaches. The most damning entry is Zach Charbonnet, projected RB42 and the weakest projected starter on the roster, taken nearly four and a half rounds before his ADP. That is not a calculated gamble, that is a manager falling in love with a name and overpaying in the currency that matters most in a draft, future picks. Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and Ashton Jeanty at RB7 give McCreath a genuine top of roster, but the foundation beneath them was assembled like someone was racing the clock and losing. Elic Ayomanor, projected WR95, cost McCreath a pick seven and a half rounds earlier than consensus said to bother. The top is real. Everything scaffolding it was bought at a premium, and in the Scott Fish Bowl, you do not get a refund.

There is a version of 8-Bit Bo Blitz that looks appealing on paper: Trey McBride at TE2, a wide receiver group headlined by George Pickens at WR10 and supported by Luther Burden, Jaylen Waddle, and D.J. Moore, all projected starters. The problem is that the picture keeps shrinking the longer you look at it. The team sits 9th in the Pong division and in just the 16th percentile of the field, and the draft offers little explanation for optimism, producing zero steals and leaning heavily on chalk, with seven minor reaches sprinkled in for good measure. The quarterback situation is where the floor reveals itself most plainly: Tyler Shough at QB20 and C.J. Stroud at QB22 were both taken earlier than their ADPs suggested they were worth, and Stroud grades out as the weakest projected starter on the roster. When your quarterback spend burns capital on players ranked QB20 and QB22, you are not building toward a ceiling, you are just filling a slot and hoping. The lever has been pulled. It did not move much.

Brad Jansen's 2026 season in the Pong division has the unmistakable feel of a hand that was never quite fixable. Sitting eighth in the division and at just the 21st percentile of the field, the roster's ceiling is defined by a promising core, Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, James Cook at RB5, and Kyle Pitts at TE7, but the draft work around them doesn't inspire confidence. Pitts cost a pick 2.2 rounds ahead of his ADP, and Jared Goff was grabbed 1.7 rounds early, meaning Jansen sacrificed draft capital at spots where he needed to be finding value, not overpaying. The board shows zero steals and just two values across the entire roster. Cook qualifies as one of those values, which matters, but the depth behind the top names fades quickly, with Hunter Henry projected as the weakest starter at TE18 and WR starters Christian Watson and Michael Wilson grading out at WR28 and WR39, respectively. There is no obvious move to make this better. This is the roster.

Gary Davenport did almost everything right on draft day. He grabbed Jakobi Meyers nearly two and a half rounds after his ADP, took Keaton Mitchell and Parker Washington at genuine discounts, and finished with just one notable reach across the entire board. The problem is that doing things right and doing things well are not the same thing. Matthew Stafford, the Stafford who just set a career high in touchdowns and nearly won MVP, cost Davenport a fourth-round pick when the rest of the field was waiting until the sixth. That is a real price paid for a 37-year-old whose own team just drafted his replacement. Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 is legitimate, and Drake London at WR7 alongside Rashee Rice at WR13 gives this roster a credible top end. But Davenport's projected weakest starter is Meyers, a WR45, which means the floor drops fast. The value was found. The ceiling just never materialized, and 39th percentile is the receipt.

Chad Parsons landed at the 71st percentile of the field, and the draft sheet reads like it shouldn't have worked. Three major reaches, two minor reaches, and not a single outright steal. Yet here we are looking at a roster anchored by Christian McCaffrey (RB3), Omarion Hampton (RB9), Kenneth Walker III (RB10), and Breece Hall (RB14) all projecting as starters, which is the kind of top-end depth that wins weeks in a positionless format. The Hampton reach of nearly a full round looks prescient given where he landed in the projections, and Walker and Colston Loveland (TE3) both fell past their ADPs to give Parsons legitimate value on top of the aggression. The cost of all that conviction shows up at receiver, where Tee Higgins (WR19) and Jayden Reed (WR48) are serviceable but unspectacular complements. This roster is not balanced, it is loaded at the top and betting on the studs to carry it. In the Scott Fish Bowl, that bet has historically been worth making.

Scott Connor did not stumble into an 84th-percentile roster. He engineered it. The foundation is Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and Nico Collins at WR9, two projected starters acquired with discipline, and the structure built around them holds up just as well. Malik Nabers, a projected WR12, came off the board at pick 5.01 against an ADP of 3.11, a full round of surplus value in the middle of a draft where every pick carries weight. Terry McLaurin at WR24 followed the same pattern, landing at 7.01 when the field valued him near the end of Round 5. Then Connor kept collecting in the late rounds, landing Josh Downs, Denzel Boston, and Omar Cooper Jr. each falling nearly three rounds past their ADPs. Derrick Henry at 2.12 was an aggressive call against a fourth-round ADP, and it is the one moment where Connor paid a premium rather than extracted one. One reach in an otherwise pristine draft is not a flaw. It is evidence that the rest of the board was managed with uncommon clarity.

Carl boullosa didn't swing for the fences and miss, he just kept hitting singles that turned into doubles. The foundation is undeniable: Brock Bowers at TE1 and Joe Burrow at QB4 give this roster two of the most reliable points-per-game anchors in the entire field, and boullosa got Burrow in the second round despite an ADP that suggested he'd still be sitting there five picks later. Then the draft built quietly outward. Ladd McConkey, projected WR20, slid a full two rounds past his ADP and boullosa was right there waiting at 6.10. Emeka Egbuka at WR18 and Chase Brown at RB11 round out a starting core that never required a miracle, just sound sequencing. The 2025 season, a 22-6 record and 86th-percentile scoring, is the clearest argument that this is not an accident. Sitting fourth in the Pong division with an 86th-percentile tournament projection, boullosa has constructed a team that doesn't need to get lucky. It just needs to play.

Jonathan Meyer's draft in the Pong division reads like a quiet confidence play, the kind where you look up after the final round and realize someone just outworked the room without ever making a scene. The foundation is legitimately impressive: Lamar Jackson at QB3 and Jayden Daniels at QB5 give Meyer elite firepower at the position, and Jackson himself came at a half-round discount off ADP. The receiver group is where the draft really compounds, with DeVonta Smith, Jameson Williams, Davante Adams, Rome Odunze, and Courtland Sutton all projecting as starters, a collection built largely on value picks rather than lottery swings. Meyer did reach on Kimani Vidal and Theo Johnson earlier than the market suggested, but five value picks and a full steal in Wan'Dale Robinson, who slid more than two rounds past his ADP, means the ledger reads comfortably in his favor. Sitting third in the division and in the 87th percentile of the field, this roster did not get there by accident.

Jason Tran sits second in the Pong division and in the 96th percentile of the field, and the draft sheet tells you exactly why. The discipline here is real: two steals, three values, and only one minor reach across the entire board. Brian Robinson fell nearly three full rounds before Tran scooped him at 18.01, and Rashid Shaheed slid almost as far before landing at 15.12, the kind of late-round patience that separates drafters who trust the board from those who panic. At the top, Caleb Williams and Dak Prescott give Tran a QB group graded Strong, with Prescott stacked alongside CeeDee Lamb for the bonus synergy. Harold Fannin, Sam LaPorta, and George Kittle headline a TE group that is also graded Strong, and LaPorta himself came as a value, taken nearly two rounds after his ADP. The weakest projected starter is Chigoziem Okonkwo at TE19, which is a fine problem to have. This roster was built with a plan, executed with restraint, and it shows.

Rocky Petrella sits atop the Pong division and in the 97th percentile of the field, and the draft tells you exactly why: this was a roster built through steady, accumulating edge rather than any single moonshot. The headliner is Drake Maye, projected QB2 and the team's most notable value, sliding nearly a full round past his ADP at 2.11. But the quieter story might be Tyler Warren, a projected TE4 who fell nearly two rounds to pick 5.02, landing Petrella a legitimate difference-maker at the position without overpaying. Jalen Hurts rounds out a loaded quarterback situation as the projected QB9, though his outlook carries genuine uncertainty: the offseason departure of AJ Brown to New England puts Hurts' passing game under real pressure, and five consecutive top-10 finishes may have priced in a supporting cast that no longer exists. Petrella did reach significantly on Deshaun Watson, but with Maye and Hurts already locked in as starters, Watson's role is depth insurance, not a load-bearing beam. This roster did not win the draft on one pick. It won it on almost every pick.
