DMeyer1227 enters 2026 sitting in 12th place in Portal 2 and the 8th percentile of the field, and there is very little in this roster to suggest the trajectory changes. The saving grace, and really the only one, is the quarterback shelf: Josh Allen is a QB1 and Caleb Williams projects as QB6, and both carry legitimate stacks, Allen with D.J. Moore and Williams with Luther Burden. That is a genuine bright spot. The problem is everything underneath it. The projected starters grade out as an average group at best, and the weakest of them, Blake Corum at RB35, represents the floor of a lineup that cannot afford many soft spots. The draft did nothing to improve the outlook, producing zero steals and zero values against five minor reaches and one major one, Pat Freiermuth taken a staggering four rounds early to land a TE30. Coming off a 5-31 record and 14th-percentile scoring in 2025, DMeyer1227 needed an aggressive, inspired offseason. This was not that.

Captcrash43 sits 11th in Portal 2 and in the 14th percentile of the field, and the draft record does not offer much hope that the gap gets closed. Two major reaches defined the board for this team: Javonte Williams (RB17) cost a pick at 4.01 against an ADP of 6.06, and Colby Parkinson (TE31) was snagged at 12.01 when the market said round 15. Paying early-round prices for a RB17 and a TE31 is the kind of math that haunts a season, and the ripple effect shows up in a starting lineup that bottoms out at Michael Wilson (WR39) as the projected weakest starter. Drake Maye (QB2) and Trevor Lawrence (QB10) give this roster a genuinely strong position at quarterback, but in a positionless format where everyone fields their best ten, quarterback upside only carries so far when the depth chart behind it grades out average across the board. There is no obvious trade chip to flip, no late-round steal to celebrate, and no projection that currently argues Captcrash43 climbs out of the division basement.

BuntingFF drafted with admirable discipline, landing Jaylen Warren a full round and a half past his ADP and RJ Harvey nearly two rounds late, which reads like a draft-day success story until you scroll to the standings and find this team sitting 10th in Portal 2 and in just the 31st percentile of the field. That gap between process and outcome is the thing that haunts. The top of the roster is genuinely good: De'Von Achane at RB6, CeeDee Lamb at WR5, Malik Nabers at WR12, and Kyren Williams at RB15 give this team a real foundation. Justin Herbert adds intrigue with Mike McDaniels arriving to run the offense, though Harbaugh has spent two years building a program that wins games by not throwing the football, and Herbert's 15 career rushing scores in six seasons offer little hope that his legs bail out a capped ceiling. The problem is not any single player. It is that the sum of all these correct decisions still adds up to below average, and there is no clean explanation for that. There rarely is.

PotatOS Prime sits ninth in the Portal 2 division and in the 32nd percentile of the field, and the roster does not offer many reasons to argue with those numbers. The elite pieces are genuinely elite: Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Saquon Barkley at RB8 give this team a thunderous top end, and the Patrick Mahomes/Travis Kelce stack layers nicely on top of that foundation. But the production drops off fast after those names, and the draft process did not do much to build a cushion. The manager reached 7.8 rounds early on Keenan Allen, a WR99, and burned another early pick on Dontayvion Wicks, a WR96, in a draft that produced zero steals against three values. The receiver group is headlined by Davante Adams at WR25, and the projected second starter is Xavier Worthy at WR49, neither of whom inspires much confidence as a difference-maker. Dallas Goedert is a quietly useful piece, but this team needs more than quiet. When the best hope is that things break right for Mahomes and Robinson simultaneously, the margin for error is essentially zero.

DrAmbr0 enters 2026 sitting seventh in Portal 2 and in just the 37th percentile of the field, and the roster's shape explains exactly why. The elite anchor is real, Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Trey McBride at TE2 give this team a genuine foundation, but McBride arriving as the tournament's single steal, snagged at 2.05 against an ADP of 1.08, tells you something uncomfortable: the draft's best moment was getting a fair price on a player who should have cost more. From there, the supporting cast thins fast. Bo Nix and Jared Goff project as QB15 and QB16 respectively, meaning the Goff/Jameson Williams stack is built on a middling signal-caller throwing to a WR21 who was already reached 0.7 rounds early. The wideout group as a whole grades weak, and the deepest projected starter beyond the top two names is Kenyon Sadiq at TE21. McCaffrey and McBride are carrying a roster that has very little interest in helping them.

Paddi sits eighth in Portal 2 and in the 37th percentile of the field, and the roster largely explains why. The receiver group is genuinely impressive on paper, with Justin Jefferson (WR6), Chris Olave (WR11), and Garrett Wilson (WR17) anchoring a deep corps, but in a positionless format that kind of width only matters if the top-end talent elevates the whole lineup, and the top end here has some cracks. Joe Burrow (QB4) is a legitimate anchor, but the running back situation behind Jeremiyah Love (RB13) gets thin fast, and the tight end position offers nothing beyond AJ Barner (TE24) and Darnell Washington (TE38). The draft did not help matters much: Khalil Shakir (WR51) was taken a full two rounds early at 9.11, burning capital that could have shored up weaker spots, and the two major reaches on the board produced no obvious difference-maker. Paddi is a team that drafted receivers when it needed answers, and the standings are likely to reflect that all season.

Keon Coleman's Fan Club sits at 47th percentile and sixth in Portal 2, which is exactly as ambiguous as it sounds. The core is genuinely good: Jonathan Taylor projects as RB4, Amon-Ra St. Brown as WR4, and Jalen Hurts as QB9, a top tier that can carry a week against almost anyone. But this roster lives and dies by what surrounds that core, and the answers get murkier fast. Michael Pittman projects as the weakest projected starter at WR44, a real liability on the nights when Taylor and St. Brown go quiet. The draft was competent but not inspired, producing three values against zero steals, meaning the manager found reasonable prices without ever breaking the market open. Tyjae Spears and Zach Charbonnet arriving two rounds past their ADPs helps pad depth, but padding depth only matters if the starters hold up. There is a version of this season where the top end dominates and the margins never come into play. There is another version where Pittman's ceiling becomes the ceiling of the whole week.

caliking49er17 didn't win the draft with one flashy pick. They won it by repeatedly coming out ahead on value, and the cumulative effect is a roster that lands at the 54th percentile with real upside still baked in. The foundation is a receiver corps that reads like a coordinator's wishlist: George Pickens at WR10, Zay Flowers at WR16, Ladd McConkey at WR20, and Brian Thomas Jr. at WR31, all projected starters, all acquired without panic. Layered on top is a Lamar Jackson and Flowers stack, which turns every Jackson performance into a double-dip opportunity. Jackson himself fell slightly past his ADP, a small edge that still counts. The one blemish is Tre Tucker, grabbed nearly four rounds before his ADP suggested he'd be available, a reach that stands out on an otherwise disciplined sheet. Brock Bowers at TE1 quietly anchors the back end. This isn't a team built around one bold swing. It's a team built by someone who understood the board and kept taking the better end of the deal.

Natesoulis went shopping in rounds 12 through 17 like someone who already knew what they wanted and refused to wait for it to go on sale. Malik Washington, Troy Franklin, and Malachi Fields were all taken two to three rounds before the market said they were available, and the ADP sheet is not subtle about it: three major reaches in the back half of the draft, zero steals across the entire board. And yet the roster does not look like it belongs to someone who panicked. Ja'Marr Chase projects as WR2, Colston Loveland and Kyle Pitts both project as top-10 tight ends, and Kenneth Walker III and Breece Hall anchor a backfield group that grades out as average in a positionless format, which is quietly fine. Pitts is the interesting piece here, because last year's top-5 finish proved the potential was real, and the Atlanta quarterback situation, however messy it gets, seems unlikely to derail him. The 2025 squad went 29-7 and scored at the 94th percentile, so the pedigree is legitimate. Whether those late-round conviction picks look like genius or charity in December is the only question that actually matters.

Mamba Mentality did not swing for the fences and miss, they just kept making contact, and the cumulative damage lands them at 81st percentile and third in the division. The foundation is a receiver group that would make any manager in Portal 2 uncomfortable, anchored by Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 and Drake London at WR7, with Rashee Rice at WR13 and Emeka Egbuka at WR18 giving this roster genuine depth at the top end. That is not luck, that is a draft that kept finding value where others hesitated. Jake Ferguson fell a full round past his ADP before this team grabbed him at TE12, and Oronde Gadsden followed shortly after with a similar slide to TE16, meaning the tight end group was built almost entirely on patience rather than premium picks. The QB situation with Baker Mayfield is what it is, but Mayfield stacks with Egbuka, which at least creates a built-in correlation when things click. There are no dramatic stories here. Just a team that consistently came out ahead of the board, and those teams tend to be dangerous come playoff time.

SwDuke enters 2026 sitting second in Portal 2 and in the 91st percentile of the field, and the draft ledger tells you exactly how it happened: not through a single home-run swing, but through a steady accumulation of correct decisions. The anchor is Jahmyr Gibbs, projected RB1, paired with Jayden Daniels at QB5, giving this roster a foundation most managers would envy. Then came the steal that quietly defines the whole draft, Tucker Kraft slipping to pick 7.05 despite a TE5 projection, a two-plus round gift that SwDuke cashed without hesitation. Ashton Jeanty at RB7 and Josh Jacobs at RB16 add real depth behind Gibbs, and Tetairoa McMillan at WR15 anchors the receiving group. Yes, the draft did include a handful of minor reaches late, but those came in rounds where the margins are thin and upside hunting is the correct play. After a rough 2025, this roster looks like the product of someone who studied what went wrong and fixed it, pick by pick.

GLaDOS's Favorites didn't win their draft on one flashy swing, they won it on volume and patience, and the result is a squad sitting first in the Portal 2 division at the 96th tournament percentile. The core of this thing is a receiving group that keeps producing names: Puka Nacua at WR1, A.J. Brown at WR8, Nico Collins at WR9, and DeVonta Smith at WR14 all project as starters, with Mike Evans at WR27 and Chris Godwin at WR38 providing genuine depth behind them. The manager didn't manufacture that haul through bold gambles, either. Harold Fannin slipped to a WR6 pick when his projection had him going nearly two rounds earlier, and George Kittle fell a round and a half to land at TE9. Four values against zero major reaches is the kind of draft ledger that doesn't make for dramatic storytelling but makes for very real fantasy football rosters. When your weakest projected starter is Jayden Reed at WR48, you haven't built a team with a ceiling, you've built one with a floor.
