Pooka! lands in the 9th percentile of the field coming off a 28% win rate in 2025, and nothing about this draft suggests the calendar has been kind. The headline disaster is Patrick Mahomes, taken 1.8 rounds early at 3.11 despite projecting as QB12, a reach so aggressive it cost real roster capital that never came back. Josh Downs, projected WR46, got snatched 2.2 rounds ahead of his ADP, and Darnell Mooney, a WR82, was pulled nearly three rounds early in the 16th as if the manager spotted something the rest of the field missed and absolutely did not. The draft logged zero steals, zero values, and three major reaches against a backdrop of otherwise forgettable chalk. Trey McBride at TE2 and Joe Burrow at QB4 give the roster a genuine foundation, but with Xavier Worthy projected as the weakest starter at WR49, this team is asking its best players to carry dead weight that Pooka! paid a premium to acquire. That is not a construction plan. That is a crime scene.

Threat Level Midnight enters the 2026 Scott Fish Bowl sitting 11th in the Tetris Division and in just the 23rd percentile of the field, and the draft record does little to inspire optimism. The manager burned an early fourth-round pick on Josh Jacobs, a projected RB16, when Jacobs was sitting there at an RB who would not have cost a fifth-round pick by his ADP, leaving real value on the table at a spot where this roster needed to strike. The wide receiver group is a quiet disaster, with Jayden Reed projecting as WR48 and the cupboard getting thinner from there. In a positionless format where sheer player quality wins, Threat Level Midnight's best hope is that Josh Allen and Lamar Jackson carry the lineup while Travis Kelce and Dallas Goedert chip in at TE, but that is a lot of weight to pile onto a few strong spots when the rest of the projected starters grade out as middling at best. There is no obvious lever left to pull, and the standings are likely to reflect that.

There is something almost admirable about the clarity of GoLong2122's vision, and something almost painful about where it lands them. The entire architecture here runs through Jared Goff, with Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and Sam LaPorta at TE8 serving as the two main wires in the circuit. When Goff is cooking, those stacks hum, and Baker Mayfield paired with Emeka Egbuka at WR18 gives the roster a second correlated layer to lean on. The ceiling is real. The problem is that Goff sits at QB16, meaning this team is betting its tournament life on a mid-tier quarterback catching fire at exactly the right moment, and if he doesn't, the stacks don't fail partially, they fail together. GoLong2122 is sitting 10th in the Tetris division and in just the 24th percentile of the field, which suggests the market already knows what a bad Goff week looks like for this roster. The correlation is the plan, and right now the plan looks like a very confident guess.

Mo Bell Cow finished in the 80th percentile last season, and whoever is running this team in 2026 is apparently content to coast on that reputation, because the projection tells a different story. The receiver group is the clearest symptom: the top projected wideout on this roster is Jordan Addison at WR43, and it drops off sharply from there. That is not a championship-caliber top end, and in a positionless format where you start your ten best players, weak receiver projections weigh on everyone. The backfield is legitimately strong, headlined by Jonathan Taylor at RB4, Omarion Hampton at RB9, and Saquon Barkley at RB8, but Barkley's situation deserves scrutiny. After carrying a historic workload in 2024, he declined in 2025 alongside a banged-up Eagles offensive line, and reports suggest Philadelphia may deliberately limit his usage going forward. That is a real question mark in a spot that looks like an answer. The team sits at the 35th percentile in projections and ninth in the Tetris division. Last year's results were real. This year's roster is not that team.

Two Brocks, One Rock enters 2026 sitting 7th in the Tetris division and at the 39th percentile of the field, and the roster doesn't offer much to argue with those numbers. The foundation is genuinely good: Brock Bowers at TE1 is as reliable an anchor as exists in this tournament, and Ashton Jeanty at RB7 gives the team a legitimate difference-maker. But below that top tier, the drop-off is steep and the draft did little to paper over it. The receiver group tops out at Brian Thomas Jr. at WR31, and the supporting cast trends toward the WR80s and WR90s, a neighborhood where production is a rumor. Worse, the draft leaned heavily on chalk, producing zero steals and two major reaches, including Tory Horton and Michael Mayer taken nearly four rounds before their respective ADPs. Rhamondre Stevenson projects as the weakest starter at RB31, and last year's 47 percent win rate suggests this roster has looked this way before. Bowers and Jeanty are real. Everything else is hoping the upside players find it.

Flutie Flakes spent their draft collecting value, and the receipts look tidy on paper: Trevor Lawrence fell more than a round past his ADP, Sam Darnold dropped a full round to fill out the QB room, and late-round WR additions like Jerry Jeudy and Deebo Samuel came at genuine discounts. The problem is that buying things on sale is only smart if you needed them in the first place. The projected starters here, anchored by Drake London (WR7), Tetairoa McMillan (WR15), and Colston Loveland (TE3), form a legitimate core, but Loveland was the one true reach of the draft, taken nearly a round early at 1.10, and the team's overall projection still lands at 39th percentile and eighth in the Tetris division. A 92nd-percentile scoring season in 2025 makes that ceiling look even more disappointing by contrast. Flutie Flakes did not draft carelessly. They drafted carefully, accumulated values at nearly every turn, and still arrived somewhere short of threatening. That gap between process and outcome is the most frustrating place a fantasy team can live.

Chicago Sunroof Project is the kind of team that wins 55 percent of its weeks or 45 percent, and right now the margins are pointing somewhere in between. The foundation is genuinely strong: Bijan Robinson (RB2) and Jeremiyah Love (RB13) give this roster a top-end punch that most managers in the field would envy, and the Herbert-McConkey stack adds a ceiling game whenever Justin Herbert (QB8) goes nuclear. The concern is that the draft revealed a manager willing to gamble, sometimes well and sometimes not. Breece Hall (RB14) was taken two full rounds before his ADP, and Emanuel Wilson (RB69) was grabbed nearly nine rounds early, a price that would be steep for a player ranked three times higher. Those decisions leave the margins razor-thin, because Ladd McConkey (WR20) and Jake Ferguson (TE12) are competent starters, not difference-makers. Coming off an

11-25 finish that landed in the 20th percentile of scoring, Chicago Sunroof Project has the talent to climb but not the draft capital slack to absorb bad luck. Every close week matters.

JoshWest didn't win the draft on one flashy pick. They won it by being right, again and again, in the spots where most managers drift. The anchor is Christian McCaffrey at RB3, paired almost immediately with De'Von Achane at RB6, giving this roster a top-six backfield presence that few teams in the Tetris division can match. Kyle Pitts at TE7 rounds out a starting core that projects as genuinely elite at the top. Then, where JoshWest quietly separated itself, was in the middle rounds. TreVeyon Henderson fell a full round past his ADP, landing at RB19 with real starter upside, and Jonah Coleman slipped even further before JoshWest scooped him at RB51. Fourteen chalk picks sounds unexciting until you realize most managers use those picks to gamble and lose. JoshWest mostly did not. The one exception is Elijah Arroyo, a TE40 taken nearly five rounds early, a bet that looks aggressive against his current projection. But one swing in an otherwise disciplined draft is not a crisis. At 64th percentile overall, this roster is built to climb.

AJ Browns Book Club didn't win the draft on one flashy pick. They won it by simply not losing it, round after round. The core of this team is legitimate: Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and A.J. Brown at WR8 give the roster a ceiling most managers would trade their first three picks to own, and Garrett Wilson at WR17 rounds out a starting group that would be the envy of most Tetris Division lineups. Tyler Warren at TE4 is the kind of anchor that quietly decides close weeks. The draft itself was almost entirely chalk, which sounds boring until you realize chalk means the manager knew what they were doing and did it, picking up Dak Prescott at QB7 a full round and a half after his ADP suggested he'd be gone. The one real blemish is Sean Tucker, reached on by 4.4 rounds, but one late-round gamble at the back of the roster doesn't dent what was otherwise a composed, disciplined performance. Seventy-fourth percentile projections, a 58 percent win rate in 2025, this is a team built to compete.

PNWBigFoot didn't build this roster by swinging for the fences and missing. They built it by consistently being right. The centerpiece is a receiving corps that reads like a fever dream, with Puka Nacua at WR1, George Pickens at WR10, Malik Nabers at WR12, and Rashee Rice at WR13 all projecting as starters, and that last name is worth pausing on because Rice was the most aggressive call of the draft, taken 1.2 rounds before his ADP when nobody else was ready to commit. That kind of conviction costs you if you're wrong. PNWBigFoot was not wrong. Nabers, meanwhile, came as a genuine value, slipping a full round past his ADP to land at 4.11, which is the sort of quiet transaction that separates good drafters from great ones. The floor here is real, landing at 75th percentile in the tournament and third in the division. The 2025 record of 22 wins only sharpens the expectation that this team knows exactly what it is doing.

Praying for a Jahmyrical did not build this roster by swinging for the fences and missing, they built it by being right, repeatedly, in the middle rounds where most managers give back what they gained early. The crown jewel is Justin Jefferson, landed at 2.09 despite an ADP of 1.12, a gift explained almost entirely by the hangover of a miserable 2025 season running routes for JJ McCarthy. With Kyler Murray now in Minnesota and widely projected as the favorite to start Week 1, Jefferson's WR6 projection reads less like optimism and more like course correction. Chris Olave adds another layer of legitimacy at WR11, also taken past his ADP, and Tucker Kraft at TE5 gives the roster a genuine advantage at a position that routinely separates competitive teams from pretenders. Anchor it with Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and this lineup has three projected top-six players at their respective positions before the

depth even enters the conversation. The 2025 record of 39 percent wins was the floor, not the ceiling. Division rank of second and a 76th percentile projection suggest this team knows it.

TMNT sits first in the Tetris Division and in the 88th percentile of the entire field, and the draft sheet tells you exactly why. The receiver group is the engine here: Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, Nico Collins at WR9, Zay Flowers at WR16, Luther Burden at WR22, and Marvin Harrison Jr. at WR33 form a projected starting corps that most managers would trade half their roster to assemble. That collection alone would carry plenty of teams, but TMNT reinforced it with smart drafting rather than luck. Bo Nix, projected QB15, came off the board at pick 8.07 against an ADP of 6.03, a full two-plus rounds of free value. Tua Tagovailoa fell nearly four rounds to pick 18.07. In a format where the board rewards patience and punishes panic, TMNT found the deals without forcing anything, posting just one minor reach across the entire draft. James Cook at RB5 anchors the backfield. The weakest projected starter is Khalil Shakir at WR51. Read that sentence again, because that is the whole review.
