With little room for error and a tough road ahead, it seems the team's only real hope is that a few key players drastically outperform expectations, but as it stands, the season appears bleak.

Brown and Wan'Dale Robinson, reaching for others like Keaton Mitchell and Elijah Moore has eroded much of that advantage. With a ranking of 9th in the division

and sitting in the 22nd percentile overall, KingsRansom4 faces an uphill battle, likely to be marred by inconsistency and an over-reliance on a few star players to carry the load.
