Keith Dooney's 2026 Scott Fish Bowl entry sits at the bottom of the Rampage division, and the draft record explains exactly why. Zero steals, zero values, nine chalk picks, and ten reaches, four of them major, is not a draft strategy so much as a confession. The loudest confession is at the top: Dooney took Chase Brown at 1.10 when Brown's ADP sat at 3.08, burning nearly two rounds of value on an RB11 in a positionless format where that price tag is already steep. Then, after the damage was done, Kyle Pitts landed at 3.10 against an ADP of 5.07, another round-and-a-half gift to the rest of the field. The projected starting group reflects what those early reaches cost downstream: Quentin Johnston projects as WR41, Wan'Dale Robinson as WR47, and the quarterback situation features Tyler Shough at QB20 as the best available option. Reaching early means paying late, and Dooney paid every round.

Josh Smillie won 75 percent of his matchups last year and scored in the 87th percentile, so the expectations walking into 2026 are understandably high. The roster, however, is not playing along. Smillie sits 11th in the Rampage division and projects to just the 17th percentile in scoring, a fall steep enough to make last season feel like borrowed glory. The draft did not help his case: three major reaches, including Sam LaPorta pulled a round and a half early and Tre Tucker taken nearly three rounds before the market agreed, suggest a manager who drafted his wishlist rather than the board. Drake Maye is a legitimate anchor at QB2, and Ashton Jeanty at RB7 gives the lineup a real floor, but those two bright spots are surrounded by a supporting cast that projects as thoroughly average, with Tony Pollard sitting as the weakest projected starter at RB30. The gap between the manager who finished at the 87th percentile and the team that projects to the 17th is not a slump. It looks more like a reckoning.

Will Faiella's draft reads like a cautionary tale told in slow motion. The receiver group is genuinely good, with Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, Drake London at WR7, and Chris Olave at WR11 giving this roster real upside, but everything else was undermined by a draft board that kept reaching early and landing on the wrong names. Three major reaches define the session: Calvin Ridley at WR78, taken five rounds ahead of his ADP; Troy Franklin at WR80, taken four rounds early; and Alvin Kamara at RB50, a 38-year-old body pulled nearly three rounds before the market caught up. The running back situation projects weak, with Rhamondre Stevenson at RB31 as the projected top starter. The QB situation has its own problems, as Kyler Murray, taken a round early, is currently in a quarterback competition in Minnesota after a lisfranc injury derailed his final season in Arizona. Faiella landed at 19th percentile in the tournament and tenth in the Rampage division, and nothing in this draft chart suggests the math is about to change.

Nick Choplick enters 2026 sitting ninth in the Rampage division and in just the 27th percentile of the field, and there is not much in the draft ledger to suggest a turnaround is coming. The roster carries genuine upside at the top, Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and De'Von Achane at RB6 are legitimate weapons, but the supporting cast fades quickly, and the weakest projected starter, Jordan Addison at WR43, tells you exactly how thin the margin for error is. The draft itself offered almost no relief: fifteen chalk picks, zero steals, and two major reaches in Zach Charbonnet and Jordan James that sacrificed draft capital on players ranked RB42 and RB67 respectively. After a 2025 campaign that landed in the 11th percentile of scoring, Choplick needed an aggressive, high-variance offseason to change the trajectory. Instead, he got a roster that looks largely the same, just slightly more expensive in the spots that matter least. The lever was there to pull. It just never moved.

Jim Berwa sits eighth in the Rampage division and in just the 28th percentile of the field, and the roster explains why without requiring much detective work. The peak is real: Jahmyr Gibbs projects as RB1, and Rashee Rice at WR13 gives Berwa a genuine top-end weapon, though pulling Rice at pick 2.11 against an ADP of 4.02 means he paid a steep premium for that privilege. Below those two, the drop-off is swift and unforgiving. Derrick Henry at RB12 and Jameson Williams at WR21 are serviceable starters, but Berwa reached for Henry almost a full round early and found no draft-day steals anywhere on the board, finishing with fourteen chalk picks and zero bargains. A Goff-Williams stack offers a ceiling game on a big Detroit afternoon, but Jared Goff himself projects as only QB16, and when your best path to a points explosion runs through a mid-tier quarterback, you are not so much chasing a championship as hoping one falls into your lap.

John Baker did everything right and ended up with a roster that still feels like it is missing something, which is the kind of outcome that keeps fantasy managers staring at spreadsheets at 2 a.m. The value discipline is real: five players came off the board later than their ADP suggested they would, zero reaches anywhere on the sheet. Kenneth Walker III at RB10 fell nearly a round into Baker's lap. Bryce Young slid two and a half rounds. And yet the projected starters tell a quieter story. The wide receiver group leans on Terry McLaurin at WR24, Marvin Harrison Jr. at WR33, Parker Washington at WR35, and Chris Godwin at WR38, a starting corps where the fourth name is a legitimate question mark given that Jacksonville's front office has shown no particular commitment to keeping Washington as their lead option. Jonathan Taylor and James Cook at RB4 and RB5 are genuine assets. But Baker lands 7th in the Rampage division and in the 38th percentile of the field, proof that patience at the draft table is a necessary condition, just not a sufficient one.

Ken Pespisa's 2026 roster is the fantasy equivalent of a solid B student, good enough to pass every test but never quite acing one, and in the Scott Fish Bowl that kind of ceiling lands him sixth in the Rampage division and around the 40th percentile of the field. The foundation is genuinely strong: Josh Allen at QB1 paired with D.J. Moore in a live stack gives this lineup a weekly floor most managers would take, and Tyler Warren at TE4 is the kind of quiet advantage that compounds over a long season. The margins, though, are where this team gets complicated. Brian Thomas Jr. was taken 2.8 rounds ahead of his ADP, a significant commitment to a WR31 projection, and the back end of the roster leans on Rico Dowdle as the projected weakest starter, a RB32 who won't win a week by himself. After a brutal 2025 that put Pespisa in the 11th percentile of scoring, the path back runs directly through whether Allen and Warren justify their roles every week while the middle of this roster quietly overachieves.

Leo Paciga did not chase the spectacular in the 2026 Scott Fish Bowl draft, and his roster is better for it. The headliner is Puka Nacua at WR1, a genuinely elite projection that anchors the whole operation, and Paciga surrounded that centerpiece with a run of wide receivers, A.J. Brown at WR8, George Pickens at WR10, Zay Flowers at WR16, and Ladd McConkey at WR20, that would make most managers in the Rampage division quietly nervous. The process was just as clean as the result. Fifteen chalk picks mean Paciga was not gambling on upside that the market had already priced in, and Jordan Mason at RB41 arriving a round and a half late counts as the kind of quiet win that compounds over a roster. The one blemish is Rashid Shaheed, taken two full rounds ahead of consensus, a reach that stands out precisely because everything else was so disciplined. At 55th percentile entering the season, this team projects well above its current standing and has the top-end receiver talent to go considerably further.

Mike Faiella did not stumble into correlation, he built toward it, and the Joe Burrow / Ja'Marr Chase stack sitting at QB4 and WR2 respectively is the clearest evidence of that intent. When Cincinnati's passing game hits, Faiella does not just benefit from one piece of it, he benefits from both ends of the same lightning bolt. The surrounding cast is constructed to amplify that ceiling rather than hedge against it. Nico Collins at WR9 and Tetairoa McMillan at WR15 give Faiella the kind of projected-starter depth that turns a good Burrow week into a dominant scoring week for the whole lineup. Burrow himself was a genuine value, slipping nearly a full round past his ADP, which means Faiella secured the centerpiece of this architecture without overpaying for it. The 2025 campaign landed at the 15th percentile, a number that almost certainly reflects variance more than construction, because this roster is projected in the 90th percentile of the field. The plan is coherent, the stack is elite, and the ceiling is real.

Shane Hallam didn't win the 2026 Scott Fish Bowl draft with a single thunderbolt pick. He won it the way a good poker player wins a long session: by consistently getting slightly more than he paid for. CeeDee Lamb at WR5 slid nearly a full round past his ADP before Hallam grabbed him at 2.06, and Dak Prescott came along almost a round late at 4.06 to give Hallam a QB7 who also stacks directly with Lamb. Add Brock Bowers at TE1 and Luther Burden at WR22, both taken after the field had moved on, and you have a core that looks less like luck and more like a plan. Six values against zero major reaches across the entire draft is the kind of ledger that lands a team in the 93rd percentile of the field, which is exactly where Hallam sits heading into 2026. After an 18-10 campaign a year ago, he returns with sharper tools. Third in the Rampage Division feels like a floor, not a ceiling.

Damien Scott lands at 97th percentile in the field and second in the Rampage Division, and the draft record tells you exactly how he got there: methodical, patient, and consistently ahead of the market. The foundation is legitimately elite. Trey McBride at TE2 came off the board at 2.01, more than half a round after his ADP of 1.08, a quiet coup that set the tone for the whole draft. Omarion Hampton at RB9 fell nearly a full round past his ADP before Scott scooped him at 3.12. Those are not lucky breaks, they are the product of a manager who knew what things were worth and waited. Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and Caleb Williams as a QB6 starter give the lineup a legitimate ceiling. Even the weakest projected starter, Jadarian Price at RB26, is a perfectly serviceable floor. Scott's 2025 landed at the 31st percentile, which makes this roster feel less like a continuation and more like a correction, built quietly and built right.

Ray Mencio sits first in the Rampage division and in the 98th percentile of the entire field, and the draft record explains exactly why: seven values, two steals, and only one major reach across the whole board. The foundation is airtight. Bijan Robinson at RB2 came off the board at 1.08 when his ADP sat at 1.04, a near-perfect entry point on the best running back in the field. Justin Jefferson at WR6 slid nearly a full round past his ADP, and Jayden Daniels and Justin Herbert both fell into the QB5 and QB8 projections at a discount, giving Mencio as strong a quarterback room as anyone in this tournament will field. The steal that really stands out is Jaylen Warren, a projected RB27 starter who tumbled more than two full rounds past his ADP and still lands as the weakest projected starter on this roster, which tells you everything about the depth behind him. The one blemish is Darnell Washington, reached 4.4 rounds early, but when the rest of the roster looks like this, one late-round overpay barely registers.
