The Las Plagas Rams enter 2026 sitting last in the Resident Evil division, and the roster does not offer much cause for optimism. The draft was defined by three major reaches, and the bill is coming due: Travis Etienne at RB18 and TreVeyon Henderson at RB19 were both yanked nearly three rounds ahead of their ADPs, which means the manager paid first-class prices for coach-seat production. Jayden Daniels has genuine upside at QB5, but he was also grabbed a full round early, so even the brightest spot on this roster cost more than it should have. The projected starter pool bottoms out at Michael Pittman at WR44, and there is no obvious waiver-wire savior lurking in the depth. Las Plagas finished in the 64th percentile in scoring in 2025, a passable showing, but this roster as currently constructed does not project to replicate it. The Rams are not in a rebuild so much as they are in a quiet freefall, hoping the altitude eventually flattens out.

Last year's Racoon City Raiders finished in the 91st percentile, a genuine contender in a charity field that chews up pretenders. This year's version is projected 13th percentile, and the gap between those two numbers is essentially the whole story. The draft is where reputation curdled into regret: four major reaches, zero steals, and an obsession with tight end that saw the manager pull Kyle Pitts 1.4 rounds early, Sam LaPorta a stunning 2.2 rounds early, Chigoziem Okonkwo nearly 2.8 rounds early, and AJ Barner 2.6 rounds early. That is not a strategy, that is a fixation. Meanwhile, the quarterback group, Geno Smith, Tua Tagovailoa, Shedeur Sanders, and J.J. McCarthy, ranks QB30 through QB37, which is a genuinely difficult position from which to compete. Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and Jonathan Taylor at RB4 are real weapons, but this roster overall is projected to rank 11th in the division. The Raiders are not rebuilding. They are just, quietly and somewhat painfully, declining.

The Redfield Rock Punchers sit 10th in the Resident Evil division and at the 32nd percentile of the field, and there is not much in the draft record to suggest a turnaround is coming. Every pick landed at or near consensus value, with zero steals and zero genuine bargains across the board. You cannot fault the process exactly, but a clean draft that grades out near the bottom is still a bottom-tier roster. The anchors are real: Brock Bowers at TE1, Omarion Hampton at RB9, and Nico Collins at WR9 give this team a legitimate top end. The problem is that everything behind that tier fades fast, and the quarterback situation is quietly brutal. Cam Ward projects as QB23 and Fernando Mendoza as QB27, meaning the weakest projected starter on this roster is also the player who touches the ball on every single offensive snap. When your ceiling is capped at the position that matters most, the strong tight end corps and the passable running back depth start to look less like assets and more like furniture in a house with a leaky roof.

Chris Redzonefield won 78 percent of his matches last season and scored in the 80th percentile, which is the kind of résumé that makes a manager feel bulletproof heading into a new year. The 2026 roster, currently sitting at the 35th percentile and ninth in the Resident Evil division, suggests the bulletproofing has worn off. The engine here is a receiver corps built around Justin Jefferson, Malik Nabers, and Rashee Rice, three projected starters with genuine upside, but Nabers carries the asterisk of a torn ACL that his new head coach called "not simple," and the difference between WR12 Nabers and a compromised version of Nabers is exactly the kind of gap that turns 80th-percentile teams into 35th-percentile ones. Meanwhile, the quarterback situation is Malik Willis at QB24 and Deshaun Watson at QB34, which in a positionless format matters less than it once did, but still functions as a ceiling limiter when the rest of the roster needs everything to go right. Redzonefield is not a bad manager holding a

bad hand. He is a good manager holding a hand that requires Nabers to be fully Nabers, and that question is still open.

TUCHEL OUT drafted with discipline. Caleb Williams fell nearly a full round past his ADP, CeeDee Lamb slipped to pick 2.03, and Bo Nix came at a discount deep enough to anchor a real stack with Jaylen Waddle. Four values on a roster is a genuine achievement, and this team produced zero major reaches to offset them. The cruelty is that the math still does not work. Strip away the process and what remains is a team sitting at 43rd percentile, seventh in the Resident Evil division, built around a receiving group whose weakest projected starter is Romeo Doubs at WR53. Williams is QB6 and Cook is RB5, so the ceiling exists, but the floor is held up by Doubs, Tyreek Hill at WR77, and a TE2 in Dallas Goedert who graded as a value precisely because the market had already discounted him. Good drafting is supposed to buy margin. Here it bought a roster that is perfectly constructed to finish exactly where projections say it will, which is nowhere near the top.

The Lycan Legion arrive in the Resident Evil division sitting eighth and projecting at just the 42nd percentile of the field, and the roster offers little reason for optimism. Josh Allen is a genuine QB1 anchor, and Tyler Warren at TE4 gives the team a top-end weapon worth building around, even if pulling Warren at pick 2.06 against an ADP of 3.04 meant paying a premium at a position that does not require one in a positionless format. Below those two, the floor drops fast. The running back group is headlined by Derrick Henry at RB12 and Kyren Williams at RB15, but David Montgomery projects as RB23 and his situation in Houston is genuinely murky, a veteran who slid to a clear secondary role in Detroit last season now tasked with pushing second-year back Woody Marks for the top spot on a new roster. Montgomery may not win that competition. The draft itself produced only two values against sixteen chalk picks and one major reach, which means the construction was neither inspired nor lucky enough to paper over the talent gap.

Barry? Wheres Barry? didn't swing for the fences, didn't make a headline move, and didn't need to. The draft was just consistently correct, and that adds up. Drake Maye at QB2 came a few picks later than his ADP suggested he should, a quiet win that anchors the whole operation. The receiver group is where the roster really hums, with Jaxon Smith-Njigba projecting as WR3 and Garrett Wilson at WR17 giving this team two legitimate difference-makers before most managers have found one. Rome Odunze at WR30 and Jordyn Tyson at WR34 extend the quality well into the middle rounds. Parker Washington is the interesting name in the mix: he outperformed every expectation in Jacksonville last year, but whether the Jaguars actually commit to him over Brian Thomas Jr. or Travis Hunter is a fair question, and his ceiling concerns are real. None of this screams tournament winner, but sitting at the 56th percentile in the Scott Fish Bowl with no major reaches on the board and three genuine values, Barry? Wheres Barry? drafted a team that will be hard to embarrass.

JamarAndTheJillSandwiches are not hiding what they are. Joe Burrow and Ja'Marr Chase sit at the center of this roster like a load-bearing wall, and everything else is essentially window dressing around whether that stack catches fire. Burrow projects as QB4 and Chase as WR2, which means the ceiling on this pairing is genuinely elite, and in a positionless format where managers can just field their best players in almost any configuration, a connected stack at that tier is not a luxury, it is a multiplier. The cautionary note is that the draft leaned heavily on conviction plays, with Chris Godwin pulled two rounds ahead of his ADP and Rashid Shaheed taken two rounds early as well, which means the roster is somewhat mortgaged on outcomes the market was not ready to pay for. Jalen Hurts projects as QB9 and gives this team a credible secondary engine, but make no mistake, the correlation between Burrow and Chase is the bet. If those two click the way the projections suggest they can, fifth in the Resident Evil division feels like a floor, not a ceiling.

DisneyDadMark landed at 69th percentile in this field and fourth in the Resident Evil division, which sounds modest until you look at the roster and realize the draft board was actively fighting against this outcome. Fourteen chalk picks, three minor reaches, two major ones, zero steals. The conventional read on that sheet is a manager who panicked early and often. The roster, though, tells a different story. Ashton Jeanty at RB7 and Trey McBride at TE2 are legitimate pillars, and grabbing Jeanty as a minor reach at 2.05 looks like conviction now that he projects as a top-ten back. The major reaches are where this gets interesting: Bryce Young taken two full rounds ahead of consensus, Dontayvion Wicks pulled more than three rounds early. Both could absolutely flame out and prove every skeptic right. But DisneyDadMark also surrounded those bets with Breece Hall at RB14 and Tetairoa McMillan at WR15, which is not the portfolio of someone guessing. This is a team built on a thesis, and the thesis is holding.

DynastyCoachA didn't remake the board in a single audacious swing, and that's exactly the point. This is a roster built pick by pick, with the cumulative edge adding up to something real: an 81st percentile finish in a field where most managers are hunting the same names. The foundation is undeniable, with Bijan Robinson projecting as RB2 and Kenneth Walker III sitting at RB10, and the real craft shows in how this team was assembled around them. Bucky Irving at RB21 was pulled a full round and a half after his ADP, a quiet win that keeps the projected lineup stocked well past the obvious starters. The Jared Goff and Jameson Williams stack gives this roster a built-in ceiling game that pure positional value can't fully capture. Goff himself came in over a round late at QB16, which is the kind of patience that separates sharp drafters from lucky ones. DynastyCoachA went 23-13 last season and sits third in the Resident Evil division, and nothing about this draft suggests that level of performance was a fluke.

After finishing in the bottom 10 percent of scoring a year ago, S.T.A.R.S Fantasy Unit looks less like a struggling squad and more like a team that finally figured out what it was doing. The receiving corps alone is enough to make 2025 feel like a bad dream: A.J. Brown at WR8 and George Pickens at WR10 headline a group that also includes Ladd McConkey, Brian Thomas Jr., and Jayden Higgins as projected starters, giving this roster genuine top-end firepower at the position that drives scoring in positionless formats. The quarterback situation is quietly the most interesting part of the rebuild, though, because Dak Prescott fell to a fourth-round pick despite projecting as QB7, and Patrick Mahomes slid to the sixth round despite projecting as QB12, meaning the manager collected two legitimate difference-makers below market price. Prescott stacking with Pickens sweetens that deal further. Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 anchors the backfield. Sitting at the 85th percentile in the field and second in the Resident Evil division, S.T.A.R.S Fantasy Unit has the look of a team ready to make last season's misery completely irrelevant.

The Umbrella Corp Undertakers didn't make one splashy move that defined their draft. They just kept winning the round. Six players came off the board at better value than their ADP suggested, and it wasn't concentrated in one lucky streak. Lamar Jackson, projected QB3, slid nearly a full round past where he was supposed to go. DeVonta Smith, a projected WR14 starter, fell a clean round. Brock Purdy dropped over a round to land at QB13. Stack that with two genuine scheme stacks in Jackson paired with Mark Andrews and Matthew Stafford paired with Puka Nacua, and this roster was built with a coherence that most drafts never find. Nacua projects as WR1 overall at the position, and De'Von Achane slots in as RB6 among all running backs. The Undertakers finished 50th percentile in scoring in 2025, so execution still has to catch up to roster quality. But sitting first in the Resident Evil division and in the 95th tournament percentile, the ingredients are already there. This looks like a team that simply drafted better than most.
