There is no gentle way to say this: Shough It, I'm FannIN is sitting dead last in the Pokmon division and in the fourth percentile of the entire field, and the draft explains exactly why. The manager reached on four players by major margins, and the most telling of those is Tyler Shough at QB20, pulled six rounds ahead of his consensus value to anchor a Shough-Chris Olave stack that could pay off or could become the most expensive vanity project in this bracket. Kenneth Walker III cost a first-round pick when the field valued him a full round and a half later, and now Walker sits at RB10, a fine projection that still feels like overpaying for a position where value routinely fell to patient managers. The lone bright spot is Harold Fannin at TE6, a genuine difference-maker, but one elite tight end cannot insulate a roster this overextended at the draft table. Coming off a 33-percentile scoring season in 2025, this team needed a disciplined reset. It got the opposite.

Hilal enters 2026 sitting 11th in the Pokémon Division and in the 14th percentile of the field, which is the kind of draft result that happens when a manager operates like they are playing a different game than everyone else at the table. The crown jewel of the disaster is Ted Hurst, a WR85 projection taken at pick 12.12 against an ADP of 19.05, meaning Hilal burned a mid-roster pick on a player the rest of the drafting world considered a late-round afterthought, then still got him worse than they should have. That is not a calculated gamble; that is paying cover charge to get into the wrong bar. Jeremiyah Love at RB13 looks passable on paper until you notice he was taken 1.3 rounds ahead of consensus at 3.01, a spot where real value was still available. Ashton Jeanty at RB7 anchors the roster and Brock Bowers at TE1 gives Hilal a genuine top-end asset, but the rest of the draft, zero steals, zero

values, and three major reaches, confirms that the floor under this team was built on stubbornness and wishful thinking.

There is no sugarcoating what Cookin up Flowers is looking at in 2026. Sitting 10th in the Pokémon Division and projected in just the 17th percentile of the field, this roster feels like a meal that looked better on the menu than it does on the plate. The draft tells the story plainly: zero steals, zero values, and two major reaches that will hurt for months. Bryce Young at QB26 was grabbed nearly two full rounds before his ADP and is the projected weakest starter on the team, which is a brutal outcome when the position already produces nothing at its peak. Tyler Allgeier was taken nearly four rounds early at RB46, a premium paid for a player who grades out as a borderline roster piece at best. Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4, James Cook at RB5, and Travis Kelce at TE10 give this team a legitimate core, but last season's 7th-percentile scoring performance raises hard questions about whether the supporting cast can close the gap. Right now, nothing suggests it can.

MRmister5 drafted with genuine patience. Three values on the board, fourteen picks taken at chalk, and the approach was sound enough that the team sits at the 40th percentile anyway, which tells you something grim about the ceiling of disciplined mediocrity. The headliner is A.J. Brown, a minor reach at WR8, but with Drake Maye now throwing him the ball in New England, the projection feels conservative rather than generous, and Brown's health history is the only thing standing between this roster and a legitimate top-end asset. Christian McCaffrey at RB3 gives MRmister5 a second pillar, and the Jared Goff and Sam LaPorta stack adds a connective floor. But once you move past those names, the floor drops quietly. D.J. Moore fell more than a round past his ADP and still projects as a starter at WR26, which is useful, not transformative. Tyquan Thornton was reached for more than four rounds early and ranks WR97. The values were real. The math just refuses to cooperate.

Harmon25 did almost everything right on draft day. Kyler Murray fell nearly three full rounds past his ADP and landed here at a discount. Jayden Reed came two and a half rounds late. Twelve picks landed at chalk, and only one true reach blemishes the sheet. The problem is that doing everything right produced a roster sitting at 49th percentile and eighth in the Pokmon division, which is the draft equivalent of eating clean for a month and still not fitting into the pants. The ceiling is real: Bijan Robinson at RB2, Nico Collins at WR9, and George Pickens at WR10 form a legitimate core, and Jaylen Waddle quietly upgrades from a dysfunctional Miami offense to a Denver attack where Bo Nix led the league in pass attempts last season. But the floor drops fast. Juwan Johnson projects as TE20, Reed is the weakest projected starter, and last year's 33 percent win rate suggests this roster has a recurring habit of looking better on paper than it plays on Sunday.

Jhicks804 sits at 60th percentile in the field, which is exactly as comfortable and uncomfortable as it sounds. The floor here is legitimate: Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and Derrick Henry at RB12 give this roster a backfield spine that most managers in the Pokmon division would trade for without hesitation, and Drake Maye at QB2 means the passing game starts from a position of real strength. The ceiling, though, is where the margins bite. Xavier Worthy projects as the weakest projected starter at WR49, and when the difference between advancing and going home is forty points in the wrong week, that kind of output at the edges becomes the whole story. The draft board was mostly chalk, with Isaiah Likely taken 2.3 rounds early as the loudest swing, so there is no secret weapon buried on this bench waiting to change the calculus. Jhicks804 is not a threat anyone circles in red, and not a free win anyone schedules a victory dinner around. The margins decide this, and right now the margins are a coin flip with bad field position.

ngoudeau didn't win the draft on one flashy pick. The roster got built the way good rosters usually get built, by coming out ahead on trade after trade. Malik Nabers sliding two full rounds past his ADP to pick 5.11 is the headliner, landing a WR12 at a price that belonged in round three. Breece Hall and Josh Jacobs each fell roughly two rounds as well, giving the backfield real depth at WR14 and RB16 respectively. The Jayden Daniels reach at 1.11 is the one decision that invites scrutiny, taken a full round ahead of his ADP, but pairing a QB5 with Terry McLaurin in the same offense softens that criticism considerably. The floor here is a 62nd-percentile projection, fifth in the Pokmon division, which is honestly underselling a roster where the projected starters include CeeDee Lamb, Nabers, Hall, and Jacobs. The weakest projected starter is Michael Pittman at WR44. That's a roster that accumulated value quietly and ended up somewhere worth noticing.

Jynx DSLs didn't swing for the fences and miss, they just kept connecting. The foundation is real: Josh Allen at QB1 anchors a starting lineup that already has Drake London at WR7, Kyle Pitts at TE7, and Saquon Barkley at RB8 doing the heavy lifting. What separates a good draft from a forgettable one is what happens in the middle rounds, and that's where this team quietly built its edge. Pitts slid a full round past his ADP before the manager pounced, and Jauan Jennings came more than two rounds late, giving the roster genuine depth without surrendering draft capital to get it. The one spot worth watching is RJ Harvey, projected RB28, reached three full rounds early, making him the team's most aggressive and most exposed bet. If Harvey justifies the price, this roster looks deep all the way through. If he doesn't, the surrounding cast is strong enough to absorb it. Sitting 62nd percentile with a starting lineup this clean, Jynx DSLs looks like a team that draft by draft, round by round, just kept winning small.

frayser1 didn't swing for the fences and miss, didn't gamble on upside and eat a loss. They just kept winning the exchange, round after round, quietly assembling a roster that sits at the 70th percentile of the field. The foundation is genuinely elite: Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and Trey McBride at TE2 are the kind of cornerstones that make every surrounding decision easier. Then came the patience at receiver, where Garrett Wilson fell nearly a full round and a half past his ADP before frayser1 claimed him at WR17, and Davante Adams slid almost two rounds before landing at WR25. Those two picks alone represent the margin that separates a good draft from a sharp one. The Jordan Love and Tucker Kraft stack adds a bonus layer of upside that could pop on a big week. Nothing here screams reckless, nothing screams lucky. It screams competence, which in a field this deep is its own kind of statement. Division rank of fourth doesn't tell the whole story.

Make It Double did not stumble into correlation, they built toward it with intention, and the two stacks anchoring this roster show exactly how deliberate the plan was. Caleb Williams, projected QB6, is paired with Colston Loveland at TE3, a connection that gives this team a genuine upside lever every time Chicago's offense clicks. Layer in Matthew Stafford paired with Puka Nacua, the WR1 in the field, and you have a second independent detonator sitting underneath the first. When Nacua runs wild, Stafford scores points. When Loveland eats, Williams is almost certainly the reason why. The rest of the roster exists to keep the floor from caving in, and Travis Etienne at RB18, landed two and a half rounds past his ADP, gives the team exactly that kind of cushion without the manager ever having to sacrifice draft capital to get it. Third in the division and sitting in the top 20 percent of the field, Make It Double is a team whose ceiling is not theoretical. It is just waiting on the right Sunday.

BackInTheBurg didn't build this roster on one splashy moment. They built it pick by pick, and the cumulative effect lands them at 83rd percentile in the field and second in the Pokmon division. The clearest example of the approach: Justin Jefferson slid nearly half a round past his ADP, and BackInTheBurg was simply there to take him at WR6. Jameson Williams fell even further, more than a full round, and landed at WR21 on a roster that already had Jaxon Smith-Njigba projecting as WR3. Those aren't lottery tickets, those are the rewards of a manager who did the homework and didn't panic. The starter group reflects the patience: Omarion Hampton at RB9, Quinshon Judkins at RB22, Jadarian Price at RB26, and a receiving corps anchored by Smith-Njigba and Jefferson. Trey Benson is a genuine overpay at three rounds early, but one reach on an otherwise disciplined sheet is the cost of doing business. Coming off a middling 2025, this roster looks like the correction.

Nick's Pokémon division entry isn't just sitting at the top of the standings, it's sitting there with the receipts to back it up. The foundation is immovable: Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and Tyler Warren at TE4 give this roster two genuinely elite pillars before the depth conversation even begins, and while pulling Warren at 2.11 against an ADP of 3.04 technically qualifies as a minor reach, paying a slight premium for a TE4 in a positionless format is barely worth calling a reach at all. What separates this draft from a merely good one is the discipline shown in the late rounds, where Nick turned the board's indifference toward quarterbacks into an asset, landing Sam Darnold and C.J. Stroud a combined seven-plus rounds after their respective ADPs suggested they'd be gone. The rest of the roster, from Ladd McConkey at WR20 to Dalton Kincaid at TE11, is built on the same patient, value-first logic. At the 85th percentile of the field, this is what a clean SFB draft looks like, and Nick drafted one.
