WR or Bust drafted like someone who found a cheat code for one position and forgot the rest of the game existed, and the results are exactly as grim as that sounds. The draft chart tells the story without mercy: zero steals, zero values, and six major reaches across the board. Chris Godwin, projected WR38, was hauled off the board at pick 5.12 against an ADP of 9.01, a three-round overpay for a receiver who isn't even a projected top-30 option. Jaylen Waddle came at 3.12 despite an ADP sitting nearly a round and a half later. Round after round, this manager paid tomorrow's price for yesterday's names, and the cumulative cost is a roster that lands in the 2nd percentile of the field with a projected weakest starter in Jalen McMillan at WR59. Last season's 56 percent win rate and 69th-percentile scoring suggest this manager knows how to play fantasy football. Nothing about this draft suggests they remembered how.

There is not much to feel good about in the Rocket League division if you are teamflamingos. Sitting 11th in the division and in just the 10th percentile of the field, this roster grades out as one of the tournament's genuine cautionary tales, and the draft did not do much to improve the outlook. The biggest problem is not any single weakness but the quiet accumulation of missed opportunities: three major reaches, including Ladd McConkey at WR20 taken more than two rounds early and T.J. Hockenson at TE23 taken nearly three rounds before his ADP, burned capital that a bottom-tier roster simply cannot afford to squander. Meanwhile the "values" the manager found were largely aging quarterbacks nobody else wanted, Fernando Mendoza at QB27 and Aaron Rodgers at QB29, which is not exactly a windfall. Jordan Love at QB17 at least offers a ceiling if Green Bay finally commits to his arm, but Love has finished outside the top 10 in fantasy scoring two years running and his supporting cast remains shaky. Saquon Barkley at RB8 is the genuine asset here, but one star surrounded by projections like Rhamondre Stevenson at RB31 as a projected starter is a foundation that invites sympathy more than confidence.

There is a version of this season where everything breaks right for the Vikaneers, and that version requires a lot of breaking. Sitting 10th in the Rocket League division and projecting in just the 12th percentile of the field, the roster is built around a genuinely strong receiver group headlined by Justin Jefferson (WR6) and A.J. Brown (WR8), and that is where the optimism runs dry. Brown, now in New England pairing with Drake Maye after a trade from Philadelphia, carries real upside but has missed at least two games in five of his seven seasons, which is a fragile foundation for a team that badly needs everything to go right. Below that receiver group, the supporting cast grades out as a liability in plain sight: Baker Mayfield (QB18) and Kyler Murray (QB19) anchor the quarterback room, Bucky Irving (RB21) is the lone bright spot among the projected backfield starters, and Chuba Hubbard (RB29) projects as the weakest starter on the entire roster. Twelve chalk picks and one major reach suggest a draft that rarely swung for the fences, and the fences are exactly where this team needed to find something.

Last year dookiehogue finished in the 81st percentile, and whoever drafted this roster apparently decided that reputation was enough to coast on. The 2026 version projects to the 19th percentile, good for ninth in the Rocket League division, and the draft explains a lot of that slide. The biggest culprits are the two major reaches: Dak Prescott, taken a full 1.2 rounds early at QB7, and Sam Darnold, yanked off the board nearly three rounds ahead of his ADP at QB21. That is an enormous amount of draft capital spent on quarterbacks in a positionless format where two starting-caliber signal-callers provide almost no marginal advantage over one. Meanwhile, the receiver group outside of Jameson Williams and Courtland Sutton thins out quickly, and the floor is Tony Pollard at RB30, a projection that does not inspire confidence as the weakest projected starter on the roster. Tucker Kraft, George Kittle, and the rest of the tight end group are genuinely impressive, but they cannot carry a team that burned its early picks on a position it did not need to double up on.

nelittle enters 2026 sitting eighth in the Rocket League division and in just the 26th percentile of the field, and the draft tape does not offer much reason for optimism. The roster's best hope is a positionless format that lets Brock Bowers at TE1 and a loaded receiver group anchor the lineup, but the draft itself was a mixed bag at best. Zay Flowers came off the board 1.8 rounds early relative to his WR16 projection, and Demond Claiborne arrived 3.5 rounds ahead of his ADP to land as a projected RB63, which is the kind of math that quietly sinks a team by the time anyone notices. The receiver depth has real names, Chris Olave at WR11 and Luther Burden at WR22 among them, and the Caleb Williams to Burden stack gives the roster a theoretical ceiling. But when your weakest projected starter is KC Concepcion at WR50 and your running back group grades out weak across the board, that ceiling has a way of staying out of reach. There is no obvious lever left to pull here, just a long season of hoping the projections are wrong.

The Fat Daddies arrive in the Rocket League division ranked seventh and sitting at the 37th percentile, and the draft log does not offer much hope for a reversal of fortune. The roster does have some genuine talent, Ashton Jeanty at RB7 and CeeDee Lamb at WR5 give this team a real floor, but the supporting cast fades fast and the draft process made things worse at the margins. Three major reaches, including Darnell Washington at TE38 and Michael Mayer at TE39, both taken more than four rounds ahead of their ADPs, burned late capital on players who grade out as afterthoughts even when they land the starting job. The projected starter at WR, Makai Lemon at WR40, is the kind of player other teams are hoping shows up on waivers. There are no steals on the board, and the four values the manager did land were modest gains, not course-correcting windfalls. Jeanty and Lamb are real, but two good players do not fix a roster that spent its depth picks on wishful thinking.

holleratchaboyd sits at 48th percentile and sixth in the Rocket League division, which is another way of saying this roster will be decided by the small stuff. The foundation is genuinely strong: Puka Nacua projects as WR1, George Pickens as WR10, and Lamar Jackson, snagged a half-round past his ADP, anchors the whole operation as QB3. That is a top line that can beat anybody on a given week. The trouble is what happens when the margins tighten. C.J. Stroud, the projected second quarterback, is a QB22 still searching for the form that made him dangerous two seasons ago, and the context around him, a shaky offensive line, a receiver room that has dealt with injuries, offers more excuses than answers. Meanwhile, Tory Horton was the one genuine reach in a draft that otherwise showed patience, taken nearly four rounds early at WR93. None of these are killers individually. Together they represent exactly the kind of soft spots that separate 48th percentile from 65th. holleratchaboyd has the ceiling. Whether it finds the floor is a different conversation.

Compensatory Picks built something genuinely good here, and the draft log is going to haunt them either way. Four minor reaches and three major reaches dot this board, and yet the roster they walked out with features Bijan Robinson (RB2), Jonathan Taylor (RB4), and De'Von Achane (RB6) as projected starters, which is about as loaded a top end as you will find in this field. Taylor and Achane both came at value, falling past their ADPs to give the manager something to feel smart about, but the wider pattern tells a different story. Cam Ward (QB23) cost a seventh-round pick against a consensus closer to the tenth round, and Chris Brazzell II (WR101) was taken nearly five rounds ahead of where the market had him. Those are swings, not slips. The honest read is that this manager drafted with conviction on specific targets and let the prices land where they landed. Whether those convictions cash out will determine whether this team contends or simply looks like it should have.

ScaryT lands at 82nd percentile and fourth in the Rocket League division, and the draft tells you exactly why: this roster was built through patience and positioning, not lottery tickets. Four picks came in as genuine values, headlined by Mike Evans sliding a full 1.8 rounds past his ADP to land as a projected starter at WR27, and Trevor Lawrence falling nearly two rounds to become a starter at QB10. Those are the kinds of quiet wins that compound across a draft. At the top, Jaxon Smith-Njigba projects as WR3 and anchors a receiver group that runs deep with starters, while Colston Loveland at TE3 and Tyler Warren at TE4 give ScaryT a genuinely elite pair at the position. The Terry McLaurin reach at 4.07 is the one moment where ScaryT got impatient, paying 1.3 rounds early for a WR24 projection, but the rest of the board was navigated with the kind of discipline that makes a roster look easy in hindsight. Nothing flashy, just consistently better than the market.

EVS98 didn't win the draft with one flashy move. They won it by quietly coming out ahead, pick after pick. Malik Nabers fell a full round and a half past his ADP to the fifth pick, and Drake Maye slid nearly a round to open the third, and EVS98 was simply there each time to collect. That kind of consistency across six value picks doesn't happen by accident. The Jaxson Dart and Nabers stack gives the roster a live ceiling play on top of an already solid foundation anchored by Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and Breece Hall at RB14. The one real concession was taking Rashee Rice more than a round early at the second pick, but landing a projected WR13 at that spot is the kind of reach most managers would sign up for every time. Third in the division and in the 86th percentile of the field, EVS98 looks like exactly what the draft suggests: a team that never needed a steal because it never left value sitting on the table.

thereeder didn't need a single lottery-ticket moment to build one of the better rosters in the field. The secret was simply being in the right place every time the board slid in their favor. Josh Allen, the QB1 in the format, fell nearly a full round past his ADP to pick 2.04. Jalen Hurts, projected QB9, tumbled 2.3 rounds to round six. James Cook, projected RB5, fell 1.4 rounds into the third. Three of the draft's biggest value plays, all landing on the same team, without a single aggressive gamble to explain it. The result is a starting core that projects as genuinely dangerous: Allen and Hurts give thereeder elite upside at the position, Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and Kyle Pitts at TE7 anchor the skill positions, and Cook provides a high-floor rushing foundation. The late-round depth is a little speculative, but when your foundation was built this efficiently, you can afford a few swings at the margins. This team is sitting second in the Rocket League division for a reason.

Bengals or Bust sits atop the Rocket League division and at the 100th percentile of the entire field, and neither distinction feels like an accident. This roster was built the way championship teams are supposed to be built: patiently, precisely, and with the market doing most of the heavy lifting. Consider the steal column alone. Omarion Hampton, a RB9, slid a full round and a half past his ADP before this manager swooped in at 4.08. Bo Nix, projected QB15, fell more than two rounds and landed here at 8.08. Cam Skattebo, RB20, dropped over two rounds and cost nothing more than a ninth-round pick. Three players who belong on better rosters ended up on this one because the rest of the room was asleep. Layered on top of that efficiency is the Burrow-Chase stack, Joe Burrow at QB4 paired with Ja'Marr Chase at WR2, a combination that turns a good week into a great one almost by default. When the draft board cooperates this completely, the result is not luck. It is execution.
