bryantts24 sits 12th in the Oh! division and in just the 16th percentile of the field, and the roster doesn't offer much reason for optimism. The receiver group is genuinely good, with Justin Jefferson (WR6) and Drake London (WR7) forming a legitimately elite top end, and Davante Adams (WR25) and Marvin Harrison Jr. (WR33) providing real depth behind them. But that strength runs into a hard ceiling: the projected starters at quarterback are Bo Nix (QB15) and Malik Willis (QB24), which means bryantts24 is essentially asking Jefferson and London to carry water uphill in a leaky bucket. The draft didn't create any separation either, producing zero steals and zero values against ADP, with the most notable swing being a four-plus round reach on Elijah Arroyo (TE40) who projects as a TE40. After a 44 percent win rate in 2025, the path back requires things breaking right at nearly every position, and right now the construction doesn't suggest those breaks are coming.

There is no kind way to say this: Ih8Dallas is projected 11th in the Oh! division and sits in just the 16th percentile of the field, and the roster does not hide why. The QB group looks like the brightest spot on paper, with Josh Allen at QB1 and Jordan Love in the mix, but Love is the kind of player who makes your real-life team win and your fantasy team shrug, a guy who has never cracked 35 passing touchdowns in a season and has finished outside the top 10 in fantasy scoring two years running. Allen at least comes paired with D.J. Moore, giving the team one genuine stack to lean on. The problems compound quickly beyond that, though. The receiver group is projected weak across the board, and the draft did not help matters, logging zero steals and six minor reaches, including James Conner taken nearly three rounds ahead of his ADP. There is no obvious lever left to pull here, no buried value waiting to bloom. This roster is largely what it appears to be, and what it appears to be is a long season.

FantasyJimbo sits at the bottom of the Oh! division and the 25th tournament percentile, and the roster makes a convincing argument for why. The top end is real enough: De'Von Achane at RB6 and CeeDee Lamb at WR5 give this team a pulse, and Kyle Pitts at TE7 adds a reliable projected starter. But the supporting cast falls off a cliff in a hurry, with C.J. Stroud projected as the QB22 anchoring the quarterback situation and little elsewhere to compensate. The draft did nothing to improve the outlook. Not a single steal or value in the entire process, just 16 chalk selections and a major reach on Sean Tucker that burned 3.5 rounds of draft capital on an RB65. That kind of draft leaves you exactly where you started, which for FantasyJimbo means near the floor. Achane and Lamb are good enough to keep the lights on some weeks, but this roster is a long way from competing, and there is no hidden lever left to pull.

WildRosie sits ninth in the Oh! division and in just the 26th percentile of the field, and the draft did almost nothing to change that trajectory. Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Jonathan Taylor at RB4 give this roster a genuinely elite top end, but the moment you scroll past those two names the bottom falls out fast, and in a positionless format where the depth of your roster determines how many good decisions you get to make each week, that drop-off is brutal. The quarterback room checks in at QB14 and QB16 for Matthew Stafford and Jared Goff, perfectly functional and entirely uninspiring. Then consider that WildRosie burned a pick on MarShawn Lloyd at RB66, a reach of nearly four rounds, and used another early selection on Zachariah Branch at WR75, and you start to understand why the projected ceiling here is so low. Xavier Worthy projects as the weakest starter at WR49. The team went 53 percent last season and the 2026 roster grades out as a lateral move at best, a quiet decline at worst.

LakesideLenny drafted with genuine discipline. Thirteen chalk picks, a handful of minor reaches that barely register, and legitimate value on Jake Ferguson and Jalen McMillan, both of whom fell well past their ADPs. The process was sound. The problem is the roster that process built. The projected starters lean heavily on players ranked outside the top 20 at their positions, Courtland Sutton at WR37, Jordan Addison at WR43, Ferguson at TE12, and a backfield where Cam Skattebo at RB20 is the second-best option. Bijan Robinson at RB2 is a genuine anchor, and Nico Collins at WR9 and Rashee Rice at WR13 give this team a real top end. But below that tier, the floor drops off quickly, and a 28th percentile tournament projection suggests the field agrees. LakesideLenny did almost everything right at the draft table and still walked away with a roster that projects eighth in the division. Sometimes the cruelest outcome is doing the work correctly and having it simply not be enough.

TroutxManiac sits seventh in the Oh! division and projects at just the 31st percentile of the field, and nothing in this roster screams "that's about to change." The foundation is not without its bright spots, Jaxon Smith-Njigba grades out as WR3 and Ashton Jeanty projects as RB7, but the depth falls off in a hurry. Wan'Dale Robinson is the projected weakest starter at WR47, and that is a difficult ceiling to clear week after week. The draft itself offered little in the way of added value, with 15 chalk picks and zero steals across the board, meaning TroutxManiac paid market price for everything and got no surplus. The one wild card is Luther Burden, who enters 2026 riding a genuine hype wave after a dominant finish to last season and glowing Ben Johnson comparisons in training camp. But Burden is still a WR22 projection, not a sure thing, and a team sitting this deep in the percentile standings cannot afford to build its hopes on a player still in the process of proving himself.

Hurleychompers sits at the tournament's exact midpoint, and nothing about this roster argues loudly for movement in either direction. The ceiling is real: Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and Saquon Barkley at RB8 give this team a legitimate top-end, and Garrett Wilson at WR17 and Omarion Hampton at RB9 keep the quality from falling off a cliff after the first names. But the margins are where seasons like this get decided, and the margin work here is uneven. The draft ran almost entirely to chalk, thirteen picks tracking ADP without deviation, which is fine until you need late-round lottery tickets to bail you out. Instead, the two major reaches landed on Demond Claiborne at RB63 and Elijah Sarratt at WR98, both taken several rounds before the market agreed they were worth selecting. When Jayden Reed at WR48 is your projected weakest starter, you are not in trouble, but you are also not comfortable. Hurleychompers will need Chase and Barkley to play like the projections say, because there is not enough variance baked into this roster to manufacture luck.

The Chester Special didn't win the draft with one flashy pick. They won it by simply not losing rounds. Lamar Jackson at QB3 slipping two spots past his ADP in the second round set the tone, and from there the team just kept accumulating. Brock Bowers at TE1, Isaiah Likely at TE13, and Dallas Goedert at TE15 give this roster a stranglehold at the position that other managers will spend the whole season trying to solve. Tee Higgins at WR19 and Jameson Williams at WR21 project as legitimate contributors, and Javonte Williams at RB17 and Quinshon Judkins at RB22 hold up the ground game. The one moment where the draft got a little ahead of itself was Tory Horton, taken three full rounds before consensus, which is the kind of reach that can sting. But when 14 of your picks land at chalk and the headliners are Jackson and Bowers, you can afford one swing in the late rounds. The Chester Special sits fifth in the Oh! division with a 59th percentile tournament projection, and that feels like a floor, not a ceiling.

SonsOfSteel58 lands at 76th percentile in the field, and the draft log explains exactly why: this roster was built through consistent, patient execution rather than any single lottery ticket. Malik Nabers fell nearly two rounds past his ADP and landed as a projected WR12 starter. Travis Etienne slid more than a round and projects as a starter at RB18. Neither pick required a gamble, just the discipline to recognize value when the board handed it over. Up front, Joe Burrow sits as a projected QB4, giving the team a genuine difference-maker at the position, and Patrick Mahomes pairs with Travis Kelce in a stack that has quietly hummed for years. Kelce's return in 2026 after real offseason uncertainty makes that connection more meaningful than the projected TE10 number alone suggests. Four values, fifteen chalk, and zero major reaches across the full draft: that is not a flashy portfolio, but in a positionless format where depth converts directly to points, SonsOfSteel58 simply kept winning small edges until the roster added up to something worth watching in the Oh! Division.

foxworth07 didn't rebuild the field with one thunderbolt pick. They just kept winning the small arguments, round after round, and the cumulative effect is a roster sitting in the 87th percentile of the entire field. The anchor of it all is Puka Nacua at WR1, a projected top receiver who gives this team a ceiling that most managers in the Oh! division simply cannot match. George Pickens at WR10 and Jaylen Waddle at WR23 extend that strength well into the starting lineup without any drop-off in credibility. Then there is Tucker Kraft, projected TE5, who is arguably the quietest coup on the roster. Kraft was tracking toward a 1,000-yard season before a November ACL injury interrupted everything, came off the preseason PUP list before August, and now returns to a Packers offense that lost more receivers than it gained, meaning the target share that fueled his brief ascent should be waiting for him. Drake Maye landing at QB2 when the draft clock read 2.11 was simply the kind of thing that happens when a well-constructed board meets good fortune. Third in the division is the floor. The ceiling is worth discussing.

adimego didn't build this roster by swinging for the fences and hoping. They built it by repeatedly coming out ahead, and the ledger shows it. Jayden Daniels landed at QB5 while slipping nearly a full round past his ADP, and Harold Fannin came along at TE6 with a similar discount, the kind of quiet accumulation that doesn't make for dramatic draft-room stories but absolutely makes for competitive rosters. Trey McBride at TE2 anchors the back end of every lineup, and the quarterback room runs deep enough that Jaxson Dart at QB11 is essentially an afterthought luxury. Germie Bernard is the one reach worth noting, taken nearly three rounds early at WR79, though in a positionless format the cost of a swing like that lands differently than it would elsewhere. The sum of all this is a team sitting second in the Oh! division and in the 87th percentile of the field, projections that reflect what the draft already suggested: adimego did the work round by round, and the results were earned rather than stumbled into.

GiraffeSass did not come to the Scott Fish Bowl to make interesting mistakes. Sitting first in the Oh! division and in the 88th tournament percentile, this roster is the product of discipline and board awareness working in concert, and the numbers bear that out: one steal, six values, thirteen chalk picks, and not a single reach anywhere on the sheet. Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 anchors everything, and Colston Loveland landing as the TE3 a full round after his ADP is the kind of quiet win that separates sharp drafters from lucky ones. Jalen Hurts, Bhayshul Tuten, and Makai Lemon all came at a discount, and A.J. Brown and Ladd McConkey give the projected lineup genuine upside at the top. Parker Washington is the one player where the ceiling conversation is worth having, a WR35 projection built on a breakout that the Jaguars organization may not have fully intended, but even Washington as your weakest projected starter is a compliment most managers would accept without argument. This is a clean, confident build.
