As the 2025 season unfolds for Dpeng, expectations are tempered by last year's struggles. Coming off a challenging season in which they languished at the bottom of the pack with a mere 1% in scoring and a paltry 11% win rate, hopes for improvement are cautiously optimistic. While their runningback situation remains a concern with TreVeyon Henderson and Tank Bigsby failing to crack the top 20 and 50 rankings respectively, the team's wide receiver lineup offers a glimmer of hope. Anchored by CeeDee Lamb, Amon-Ra St. Brown, and Ladd McConkey, there's potential for explosive performances through the air. However, starting Keon Coleman in a pivotal role could prove problematic, given his lower standing among receivers. In the draft, strategic moves brought Patrick Mahomes and Stefon Diggs to the roster later than expected, offering some value. Yet, questionable

decisions, like reaching for Trevor Lawrence earlier than necessary, might hinder any significant leap up the standings. As they settle into the new season, ranked 11th in their division and the 9th percentile overall, Dpeng's path to redemption hinges on capitalizing on their aerial strengths while compensating for weaknesses elsewhere.
