There is no polite way to frame a 5th-percentile roster, so khobbs23, let's not try. The receiver corps is genuinely impressive, CeeDee Lamb, A.J. Brown, Tetairoa McMillan, and Zay Flowers projecting as WR5, WR8, WR15, and WR16 respectively, and that group alone could carry a contender. The problem is that almost nothing else grades out. Cam Ward projects as QB23, Tua Tagovailoa as QB31, and Tyjae Spears, the best running back on the roster, sits at RB47. That is a lot of dead weight for four good receivers to drag upfield. The draft did not help matters: Brown, the crown jewel of the receiver group, was reached on by nearly a full round, and Brandon Aiyuk, taken four-plus rounds ahead of his ADP, projects all the way down at WR81. Khobbs23 went 15-21 last season and sits 12th in the Goldeneye 007 division heading into 2026, and with no obvious lever left to pull, the math is simply unkind.

TynaMarshall lands 11th in the Goldeneye 007 division and in the 6th percentile of the field, and there is genuinely no angle from which this draft looks better on second inspection. The reach count tells the story before a single player does: zero steals, zero values, and three major reaches across a 20-round draft. The most damaging is Colston Loveland at 1.10, nearly a full round ahead of his ADP, burning a first-round pick on a TE3 when that value was sitting there free. Caleb Williams at 2.03 is defensible in a vacuum, but pairing an early Williams investment with Luther Burden and Loveland as the primary stacks means a significant portion of this roster rises and falls on one quarterback. The running back depth is the quietest problem: Cam Skattebo at RB20 and Rico Dowdle at RB32 are the projected starters, and Wan'Dale Robinson, now competing for targets in Tennessee after Carnell Tate arrived in the 2026 draft, is the kind of late-round swing that lands on rosters already running short on margin. TynaMarshall has none left.

Exploding Chairs finished 37th percentile in scoring last year and the 2026 outlook offers almost no reason to expect a climb. The draft tells a grim story: two major reaches and zero steals from a manager who needed to find edges, not create them. Pulling Jalen Hurts at 2.10 when his ADP sat at 3.12 is a minor sin, but taking Matthew Stafford at 3.03 when the market had him pegged at 6.02 is the kind of draft-capital misfire that bleeds a roster dry in the middle rounds, which is precisely where Exploding Chairs needed to build. The result is a starting group anchored by Brock Bowers at TE1 and a genuinely intriguing group of pass-catchers, but the floor caves in fast. Jadarian Price projects as the weakest projected starter at RB26, and with the team sitting 10th in the Goldeneye 007 division and in just the 11th percentile of the tournament, there is no obvious lever left to pull. Hope is not a strategy, and right now hope is about all this roster has.

Bones10U sits at ninth in the Goldeneye 007 division and projects in just the 16th percentile of the field, and the draft log explains a good chunk of why. The roster features five major reaches against just one steal, which is a punishing ratio that tends to compress a team's ceiling before the season even starts. The worst offender is Christian Kirk, pulled ten rounds ahead of his ADP to land at WR100, a price that would be hard to justify for a WR20, let alone a WR100. The receiver group grades out weak overall, with Xavier Worthy projecting as the team's weakest starter at WR49, and the reaches on Makai Lemon and Worthy himself suggest the manager was chasing upside that the numbers simply do not support. Josh Allen is a genuine asset at QB1 and Jonathan Taylor at RB4 gives this team a real floor, but when your best players are doing all the heavy lifting and the supporting cast was assembled by jumping the market on players who project as fringe starters, the math gets uncomfortable fast.

veegs enters 2026 sitting eighth in the Goldeneye 007 division and in the bottom third of the field, and the roster does not make a convincing case for a turnaround. The foundation looks appealing on the surface, with Bijan Robinson projecting as RB2 and Saquon Barkley as RB8, but the receiving corps is where this team loses the argument. Jaylen Waddle at WR23 and Marvin Harrison Jr. at WR33 are the projected starters, and neither projects as a difference-maker at the top of the position. The draft offers little comfort either. Four major reaches, including Tyreek Hill at WR77 and Calvin Ridley at WR78, those are the kinds of late-round swings that signal a manager papering over weaknesses rather than solving them. Hill and Ridley ranking that far down the board means veegs essentially spent draft capital on volume without securing quality. After a 34th-percentile scoring season in 2025, this roster needed an aggressive, precise rebuild. What it got instead was more of the same, just reshuffled.

Noah1jagger lands in the Goldeneye 007 division sitting seventh and at just the 37th percentile of the field, and the draft record offers little reason for optimism. Three major reaches define the board more than anything else: Jared Goff off the board at 4.06 when his QB16 projection suggests a round six pick was the appropriate price, Tucker Kraft snagged a full round and a half early despite projecting as a TE5, and Chimere Dike pulled nearly three rounds before consensus at WR84. That aggressive spending at Goff and Kraft is particularly damaging because those early picks could have secured genuine upside elsewhere. To be fair, noah1jagger did find Derrick Henry and Bhayshul Tuten later than the field expected, and Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 anchors the roster with real star power. But one elite running back cannot carry a team where the projected weakest starter is DK Metcalf at WR36 and the quarterback room tops out at a QB16. The foundation has a crack in it, and patching it from the waiver wire in this field is a long shot at best.

FantasyFish is a team built on quiet competence and one or two decisions that could haunt them by October. Sitting sixth in the Goldeneye 007 division at the 37th tournament percentile, this roster does not lose you sleep in either direction, which is precisely the problem. The ceiling is real: Drake Maye projects as QB2, James Cook as RB5, and both arrived at genuine value relative to ADP, which is the kind of drafting that wins close seasons. But the margins cut both ways. Reaching nearly a full round early for Lamar Jackson at QB3 when Maye was already locked in represents the sort of luxury spending that costs you depth when the season gets long. That depth question lands squarely on KC Concepcion, the projected weakest starter, a WR50 dropped into a Cleveland offense still searching for a quarterback. Concepcion has real upside if the Browns ever solve that problem, but "if Cleveland figures out quarterback" is a sentence that has aged poorly for a decade. FantasyFish lives and dies in the margins, and right now the margins are calling it even.

bpofsu didn't swing for the fences and whiff — they just kept making contact, and the cumulative effect is a roster that sits comfortably in the conversation heading into 2026. The clearest evidence is the receiver group, where Puka Nacua (WR1), Nico Collins (WR9), Chris Olave (WR11), and Rashee Rice (WR13) form a projected-starter core that most managers would envy. Olave alone represents a quiet win: a WR11 projection snagged roughly a full round after his ADP. Rice came a round early, but when a player is projecting WR13, you pay the slight premium and move on. The Shough-Olave stack adds another layer of upside if Tyler Shough carves out a real role, and Harold Fannin (TE6) and George Kittle (TE9) keep the production coming from there as well. This is a 52nd-percentile team right now, which undersells the ceiling. The receiver depth provides real insurance, the tight end pairing is legitimately above average, and bpofsu drafted the kind of foundation that tends to look smarter as the season unfolds.

rockerik01 didn't swing for the fences and whiff, didn't chase upside and get burned, just built a roster the right way, round by round. The foundation is legitimately strong: Joe Burrow at QB4 was taken about half a round early, a minor quibble on a guy who anchors this entire operation, and Justin Jefferson at WR6 gives this team a genuine top-shelf weapon on the outside. Where the draft really rewarded patience, though, was in the middle rounds. Josh Jacobs landed at RB16 in the eighth round despite an ADP that suggested a fifth-round price, and while the offseason situation surrounding Jacobs carries real uncertainty beyond football, the value if he plays is undeniable. Kenneth Walker III at RB10 similarly fell nearly a full round past his ADP. That kind of consistent surplus, not one lottery ticket but multiple positions where rockerik01 simply got more than the market said they should, is exactly what a 71st-percentile finish looks like when you open the hood and check the work.

bhsfb33 didn't need a single lottery-ticket swing to land in the 95th percentile of this field, just a draft that kept finding market inefficiencies round after round. Amon-Ra St. Brown, a projected WR4, fell nearly a full round past his ADP before bhsfb33 scooped him in the second, and Omarion Hampton, projected RB9, slid a round and a half before landing at 4.08, the kind of pick that quietly tilts a roster's ceiling upward. Chase Brown adds another projected top-12 running back taken nearly two rounds late, and Trey McBride anchors the tight end group as a projected TE2. Against a field where most managers are gambling on upside, bhsfb33 drafted like someone who read the room and just waited for the board to come to them. Third in the Goldeneye 007 division is the current standing, but a roster this consistently built at value has every reason to climb.

The 3-Legged Goats sit at 96th percentile in the field and second in the Goldeneye 007 division, and the draft record explains exactly why: seven value picks, eleven chalk selections, and only two reaches across the entire roster. That is not a team that swung for the fences and got lucky, that is a team that simply kept winning the small negotiations. Breece Hall fell nearly two rounds past his ADP before this manager grabbed him at RB14. Travis Kelce slipped a similar distance before landing at TE10. Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and De'Von Achane at RB6 give the lineup an elite ceiling before you even get to Drake London at WR7 and Jameson Williams at WR21 pushing the depth further than most rosters can match. The one blemish is Jordan James, a reach of more than five rounds for a player projected RB67, but late-round swings on upside are forgivable when the core was assembled this cleanly. This roster did not need a miracle. It just needed a manager who kept showing up prepared.

AlphaGreatness sits atop the Goldeneye 007 division at the 100th tournament percentile, and the draft tape explains exactly why. The foundation here is elite: Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Ashton Jeanty at RB7 were both good value grabs relative to their ADPs, and Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 gives this roster a genuine top-end weapon at receiver. What separates AlphaGreatness from a merely good team, though, is the discipline that ran through the middle and late rounds. Kyren Williams fell two and a half rounds past his ADP before this manager scooped him at RB15, and RJ Harvey dropped more than three full rounds before landing here at RB28, giving the roster real depth at the back of the lineup. Four steals, three values, and zero major reaches on a 17-round draft is not luck, it is process. Even David Montgomery, coming off a diminished role in Detroit and now pushing for top billing in Houston, was secured two-plus rounds late. This is what it looks like when a manager trusts the board and does not flinch.
