The wide receiver corps, led by Emeka Egbuka and Jerry Jeudy, is akin to a troupe of misfit minstrels, each note more uncertain than the last. Emeka Egbuka, the vital yet precarious lynchpin of this

passing conundrum, will need to summon his inner virtuoso to elevate the team to new stratospheres. In the draft bazaar, FFStalder demonstrated both thrift and splurge, with Bryce Young and Jahmyr Gibbs quietly acquired like hidden gems while Geno Smith was snatched up with the enthusiasm of a shopper on Black Friday.
