Dave finished in the 81st percentile last year, and somewhere between then and now the roster that earned that reputation quietly left the building. The projection says 8th percentile this season, which is not a slump so much as a structural reckoning. The wide receiver group has genuine teeth, Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 and Jameson Williams at WR21 giving the lineup a ceiling most teams in this division cannot match, but the supporting cast thins out fast, and the draft did nothing to inject surplus value, zero steals against four reaches. The most telling reach is Justin Herbert, taken a full round early at QB8 in a positionless format where paying a premium for a quarterback is a bet that needs to hit clean. It has not yet been proven that it will. Kyle Pitts at TE7 offers a credible high-end option, but Chigoziem Okonkwo projects as the weakest projected starter on the roster at TE19, which is a quiet drag on a team that needs every slot to punch up. Dave's reputation is real. His 2026 roster is still auditioning for it.

Paulwall3030 sits at 11th in the Tony Hawks Underground division and in the bottom 10 percent of the entire field, and the roster makes it easy to see why. The quarterback situation is the clearest symptom of a team with no easy fix: Patrick Mahomes comes at a cost of a round-12 reach, yet he projects as only QB12, and the fallback options slope downward fast through Daniel Jones at QB25 and Aaron Rodgers at a bleak QB29. That is a lot of draft capital spent chasing a position that never delivered upside. Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and Tyler Warren at TE4 give the roster genuine anchor points, and Drake London at WR7 is a real starter-quality piece, but the tier drops off sharply after those three names, and with five minor reaches and a major reach on Shedeur Sanders taken nearly four rounds before his ADP, Paulwall3030 has already spent the currency that might have corrected course. There is no obvious trade chip, no lottery ticket waiting to pop, just a team that drafted into a corner and now has to live there.

There is no charitable read available for FFsvensonDG, and the draft record confirms it: four major reaches against a single steal, a ratio that would be alarming on its own even before you look at who those reaches were on. Matthew Stafford at QB14 cost nearly two full rounds of draft capital ahead of his ADP, a brutal overpay for a quarterback who projects as a mid-tier starter when Drake Maye was apparently just sitting there, eventually falling to this team as the steal of the draft. Maye is genuinely exciting, a QB2 projection coming off an MVP-caliber season with a newly improved weapon in AJ Brown, and landing him in round three should have been cause for celebration. Instead, that capital was already burned on Stafford four rounds earlier. The ripple effect shows up at receiver, where Christian Watson and Alec Pierce, ranked WR28 and WR32 respectively, represent the best the team can offer at the position. Sitting 10th in the Tony Hawks Underground division and in just the 20th tournament percentile, FFsvensonDG spent good picks chasing mediocrity and is now paying the price.

Mikeymikeymike drafted like someone who panic-bought at every turn and somehow still landed in the bottom quarter of the field, sitting ninth in the Tony Hawk's Underground division. The reaches tell the whole story. Alvin Kamara, projected RB50, was yanked off the board 3.1 rounds before the market said he was worth touching. Jordan Love, a QB17, cost a fourth-round pick when he was a seventh-round player. Jordan Addison, a WR43, got the same treatment, going nearly three rounds early in a draft where scarcity was not the justification. The one saving grace is Josh Allen stacked with D.J. Moore, because without that pairing this preview would be a eulogy. Allen is a genuine QB1 and Nico Collins projects as a WR9, so there are real weapons here, but they are surrounded by a backfield anchored by Kamara and Tyler Allgeier, projected RB46 and RB50 respectively, two players Mikeymikeymike paid a premium to be disappointed by. The draft had no steals and four major reaches. That is not bad luck. That is a philosophy.

The Tony Hawk's Underground division is not going to be kind to 3rdandsam in 2026, and the roster grades bear that out. The foundation looks reasonable enough on paper: Jahmyr Gibbs projects as RB1, Saquon Barkley checks in at RB8, and Omarion Hampton slots in at RB9, giving the team genuine top-end firepower. But this is a positionless format, and the rest of the roster is where the wheels come off. Tee Higgins at WR19 and DK Metcalf at WR36 are passable contributors, not difference-makers, and the quarterback room tops out at Jared Goff projecting as QB16. The draft offered little relief, producing zero steals and only one value across the entire board, while the lone notable blunder, Chris Brazzell II taken nearly five rounds ahead of his ADP, represents the kind of capital misallocation that haunts a team all season. Currently sitting eighth in the division and at just the 42nd percentile of the field, 3rdandsam is a middle-tier collection of assets dressed up as a contender, and the standings are unlikely to lie.

CASkol sits at the 47th percentile and seventh in the Tony Hawks Underground division, which is exactly as unnerving as it sounds: close enough to relevant that you can't dismiss them, far enough from the top that you can't trust them either. The margins here are real. Puka Nacua at WR1 and A.J. Brown at WR8 give this roster a ceiling most teams in the division can't match, and Tucker Kraft at TE5 paired with Sam LaPorta at TE8 means CASkol is winning the position battle almost every week before the games even kick off. But the floor is shakier than the ceiling suggests. Brock Purdy at QB13 is the weakest projected starter on the board, and while CASkol does stack Purdy with Mike Evans, Evans is coming off an injury-shortened eight-game season, a snapped streak of eleven consecutive 1,000-yard years, and a relocation to San Francisco that introduces fresh uncertainty. One major reach on Jeremiyah Love and a chalk-heavy draft mean there's little hidden upside baked into this roster. What CASkol has, they largely paid full price for.

Antonio Browns Helmet did not build this roster on one flashy swing. It built it by repeatedly coming out ahead on the exchange rate. Trey McBride at TE2 landing half a round past his ADP is the kind of quiet win that compounds over a season, and Michael Pittman at WR44 falling more than two full rounds past his ADP is the sort of gift that makes a draft class look smart in retrospect. Layer in Ladd McConkey at WR20 and the projected starting corps starts looking genuinely difficult to match at the top. Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and Chris Olave at WR11 give this team a ceiling that most managers in the Tony Hawks Underground division cannot touch. The 65th percentile tournament projection reflects a roster that is good without being elite, and sixth in the division is not a comfortable address, but the draft process here earned some trust. Cautious optimism is the right call, and the draft gave real reasons for it.

SolisReport landed at the 67th percentile in this field, which sounds modest until you look at how the roster was built. The draft log reads like a manager who kept jumping off the board, five minor reaches, two major ones, zero steals. And yet the names staring back at you are Ashton Jeanty at RB7, Brock Bowers at TE1, Malik Nabers at WR12, and a Jaxson Dart and Nabers stack that has genuine upside. The most instructive case is Trevor Lawrence. Taken at 6.04 when his ADP sat at 4.11, Lawrence was a value the board handed over, and the manager took it. That feels like the exception, though, because elsewhere SolisReport was consistently paying early for players the field was happy to leave alone. Maybe that is a coherent scouting philosophy. Maybe it is pattern recognition dressed up as conviction. The roster does not obviously punish either answer. What it does suggest is that when the reaches hit, this team is a genuine contender in the Tony Hawks Underground division, and when they miss, the floor is still high enough to survive.

WeGotWaddle did not build this roster on one splashy move. They built it by never losing a round. The running back group alone tells the story: Christian McCaffrey at RB3, Derrick Henry at RB12, Breece Hall at RB14, and Javonte Williams at RB17 are all projected starters, and that kind of sustained quality across a single group is the product of a manager who knew what the board owed them and collected every time. Then there is the value work layered on top. Davante Adams fell more than a round past his ADP and landed at WR25, a starter. Rashee Rice comes in at WR13. Parker Washington, another value pickup, projects at WR35. None of these were dramatic rescues from the late rounds, just a manager consistently getting more than they paid for. The result is a team sitting 74th percentile in the field with a lineup that has almost no soft spots in the starting group. WeGotWaddle did not spike the highlight reel. They just kept winning the moment, over and over.

LFGwhiskey is not hedging its bets, it is doubling down on them, and in the Scott Fish Bowl that is a completely defensible philosophy. The architecture here is built on two stacks: Dak Prescott paired with CeeDee Lamb, and Jalen Hurts paired with Dallas Goedert. When those connections fire together, this roster does not just score, it erupts, because Lamb at WR5 and Jefferson at WR6 are already elite anchors before a single stack premium gets added on top. The Hurts-Goedert pairing layers a QB9 and a TE15 into the same game script, meaning a Hurts rushing day does not cannibalize the receiving side of the equation. LFGwhiskey lands at 75th percentile in the field and third in the division, which is a perfectly fair valuation for a team whose ceiling is genuinely exceptional but whose floor depends on correlated outcomes breaking the same direction on the same afternoon. The plan is not complicated. It just requires everything to go right at once, and LFGwhiskey built the roster betting that it will.

Last year thebuffalotrill finished in the bottom 8 percent of the field in scoring, a genuinely grim number that makes this year's roster feel like a revelation by comparison. The engine of the rebound is at receiver, where Ja'Marr Chase (WR2) and George Pickens (WR10) give this team a top of the lineup that most managers in the Tony Hawks Underground division simply cannot match, and Luther Burden (WR22) slots in as a third projected starter who deepens the threat further. Burden also connects into a Caleb Williams stack, a pairing that adds the kind of ceiling-chasing upside that low-scoring seasons tend to demand. Williams himself landed as a genuine value, falling more than a round past his ADP before thebuffalotrill scooped him at WR6 quality production under center. Kenneth Walker III (RB10) and Bucky Irving (RB21) round out a backfield that projects well above what this team put on the board in 2025. The 77th percentile projection and a second-place division ranking are the cleaner story: the floor has been raised, and the rebound is already underway.

FFRelevant sits first in the Tony Hawks Underground division and at the 96th tournament percentile, and the draft tells you exactly why. The foundation is almost comically sound: Bijan Robinson at RB2 anchors a backfield that runs nine players deep through solid contributors like Chase Brown (RB11) and Josh Jacobs (RB16), and when the positionless format lets a manager simply ice the best player available each week, that kind of depth becomes a weapon. The value hunting was just as clean. Jayden Daniels landed at 4.07 despite a QB5 projection, a full round and a half after where the field was taking him. Travis Kelce came off the board at 9.06 with a TE10 projection and a two-round discount attached. Two steals, three values, fourteen chalk picks, one minor reach, zero major reaches: that is a draft that stayed patient, trusted process, and got paid. After an 11-25 campaign in 2025 that placed this roster at the 31st scoring percentile, 2026 looks like the correction the data was always promising.
