There is no sugarcoating what the numbers say about monchis170 in 2026: this roster projects near the very bottom of the GTA San Andreas division and sits in just the 2nd percentile of the entire field, and the draft did not generate the kind of surplus value that might excuse a rough outlook. The one genuine bright spot is Jalen Hurts, a projected QB9 who has quietly built one of the most reliable fantasy resumes of his era, but the offseason loss of AJ Brown to New England puts a magnifying glass on Philadelphia's passing game, and if the offense sputters, Hurts' rushing touchdown volume almost certainly follows. That is a precarious foundation to build around. Fernando Mendoza grading out at QB27 after being taken 8.6 rounds ahead of his ADP is the kind of draft decision that poisons the well early, consuming a fourth-round pick on a backend quarterback while James Cook and CeeDee Lamb do their best to hold the floor. They can only do so much. This team is not one injury away from trouble. It is already there.

There is no spin available for JEvans, sitting sixth percentile in the tournament and ranked 11th in the GTA San Andreas division, and the draft board tells you exactly why. The team produced zero steals, zero values, and two major reaches, one of which was pulling Jayden Daniels at pick 1.08 when the board had him going in the third round. That is not aggressiveness, that is panic spending at a position this format barely requires you to prioritize. The other anchor dragging this thing under is the Brock Purdy situation, which looked questionable on draft day and has only gotten worse since. Brandon Aiyuk is gone, George Kittle is recovering from a torn Achilles, and Ricky Pearsall is reportedly dealing with knee swelling that threatens his 2026 availability entirely. Purdy is a projected QB13, which means even in a best-case scenario he is not carrying anyone anywhere. JEvans reached, got questions instead of answers, and is now staring at a projected floor that looks a lot like the ceiling.

crewser128 enters 2026 sitting 10th in GTA San Andreas and in the 13th percentile of the field, and the draft didn't do much to change the trajectory. The roster has genuine star power at the top, Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and the Patrick Mahomes and Rashee Rice stack giving the lineup a real pulse, but the draft log reads like a series of bets that didn't quite pay out. Three major reaches, zero steals, and a Trevor Lawrence at QB10 taken more than a round early when the position runs deep in this format tells you the draft was reactive rather than opportunistic. The receiver group grades weak, and David Njoku at TE29 is the best value the draft produced, which is a thin return on 18 rounds of picks. The 2025 squad scored in the 70th percentile, so crewser128 can build a lineup, but this version of the roster projects weaker, the margin for error is slim, and there is no obvious move left to make it right.

There is no diplomatic way to say this: justinmasonfwfb is in trouble. The team sits ninth in the GTA San Andreas division and in just the 19th percentile of the field, and the 2025 season offered no reason for optimism, a 10-26 record that placed them in the 6th percentile in scoring. The receiver group carries real names, Amon-Ra St. Brown projects as a WR4 and Jaylen Waddle, D.J. Moore, and Jordyn Tyson all grade out as starters, but the draft history suggests a manager working against themselves rather than with the market: three major reaches and zero steals, including J.J. McCarthy pulled five rounds ahead of his WR37 projection and Emmett Johnson taken over three rounds early at RB54. That is not aggressive roster-building, that is paying full price plus a surcharge for assets that do not move the needle. Drake Maye is a legitimate anchor at QB2, but the surrounding infrastructure looks like a team that has already pulled every lever available and found most of them decorative.

WeaponFF enters 2026 sitting eighth in the GTA San Andreas division and in just the 27th percentile of the field, and nothing about how this roster was built suggests a turnaround is coming. The draft was a masterclass in paying retail with no discounts, zero steals and zero values across the entire board, while three major reaches define the construction. Rhamondre Stevenson, projected RB31, was grabbed nearly two and a half rounds early and is the team's weakest projected starter. Chris Bell at WR87 and Jack Bech at WR94 were pulled forward by 2.8 and 3.8 rounds respectively, burning late capital on players the market had priced much lower. Bijan Robinson at RB2 is legitimately excellent, and Caleb Williams projects as a QB6, so the foundation is not rotten at the top. But a 10-26 record and a 29th-percentile scoring finish in 2025 suggest WeaponFF already knows what happens when the best players underperform and there is no depth that was actually earned to fall back on.

MrsDSalinger sits at the 54th percentile and seventh in the GTA San Andreas division, which is about as median as a fantasy roster gets, and that ambiguity cuts both ways. The ceiling case starts with Lamar Jackson at QB3 paired alongside a tight end group anchored by Trey McBride at TE2 and Jake Ferguson and Isaiah Likely both projecting as starters, a combination that could quietly carry weeks when the rest of the roster goes sideways. The floor case is where things get uncomfortable: last season's 6th-percentile scoring finish leaves real questions about execution, and the draft offered no steals or values to suggest the room for error has widened. The one major reach, Mac Jones at QB39 taken nearly seven rounds early, does little to inspire confidence in the decision-making at the margins. Chase Brown at RB11 and Emeka Egbuka at WR18 give this team a legitimate top end, but Jordan Addison projects as the weakest starter at WR43, and in a format where thin margins decide seasons, that slot could be the one that matters most.

mohanpi didn't win the draft on one big swing. This roster was built pick by pick, and the cumulative effect is a team sitting at the 71st percentile of the field entering 2026. The foundation is obvious: Josh Allen at QB1 paired with Colston Loveland at TE3 and Tyler Warren at TE4 gives mohanpi a ceiling that most managers in GTA San Andreas can't match at those positions. The Jordan Love stacks with both Christian Watson and Tucker Kraft add another layer, and the Kraft situation is genuinely interesting, as a player who was pacing toward 1,000 yards before a November ACL tear came off the preseason PUP list ahead of schedule and returns to a Packers offense that lost more receivers than it added. Derrick Henry at RB12 and TreVeyon Henderson at RB19, the latter a value after falling a round and a half past his ADP, round out a starting group with real week-to-week upside. Nothing about this roster screams lottery ticket. It just keeps being good.

Baldbronco didn't build this roster with one flashy move. They built it pick by pick, and the cumulative effect is a team sitting at the 77th percentile with a receiver corps that reads like a fantasy manager's mood board. Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and A.J. Brown at WR8 give this team a genuine top-end that most managers would trade their draft capital to own, and Nico Collins at WR9 ensures the quality doesn't drop off after the headliners. The 2025 résumé backs the approach: a 27-9 record and 80th-percentile scoring suggest Baldbronco knows how to translate talent into production. The most understated move of the draft was landing Bo Nix at QB15 a full round after his ADP suggested he'd be gone, which quietly strengthened a roster that was already taking shape. There were no steals here, no panicked reaches, just 18 chalk picks executed cleanly and one value that mattered. In a format that rewards consistency, Baldbronco drafted like they understood exactly what game they were playing.

SDIWorldwide didn't need a heist to build this roster. They just kept winning the small moments. Joe Burrow at QB4 falling to pick 2.10, Malik Nabers at WR12 sliding nearly a full round past his ADP, Bucky Irving at RB21 dropping a round and a half before SDIWorldwide scooped him up at 8.10, and the crown jewel of the quiet work, Puka Nacua projecting as the WR1 in the entire field sitting right there at the top of the lineup. That's not luck, that's a manager who came in with a plan and executed it pick after pick. The Shedeur Sanders reach in round 13 and the Mike Washington Jr. selection in round 16 are the warts, but in a draft that went 13 chalk and four genuine values, a couple of aggressive swings in the back half barely register. SDIWorldwide finished at the 70th scoring percentile in 2025 and now projects at the 77th, a team quietly trending in the right direction through the GTA San Andreas division and building toward something worth watching.

zschenker enters 2026 sitting at 93rd percentile in the field, and the draft log tells you exactly why: no desperate swings, no reaches, just a manager who kept coming out ahead of the board. The clearest example is Jaxon Smith-Njigba, a projected WR3 who slid nearly a full round past his ADP and landed at 1.11. That kind of acquisition is quiet and easy to overlook, which is precisely what makes it valuable. Layer in Harold Fannin at TE6 and George Kittle at TE9 as projected starters, and zschenker is fielding elite production at a position where most managers are settling. Sam Darnold came in a round late at QB21, another small edge extracted from a patient approach. None of these are lottery-ticket gambles that either blow up a roster or make someone look like a genius. They are just good process, repeated. Third in the GTA San Andreas division is where the team sits right now, and with this kind of draft discipline underneath it, that number has room to move.

akerr28 sits at 95th percentile in the field heading into 2026, and one look at the draft sheet explains why. Six value picks, zero major reaches, and a roster that reads like someone actually did the homework before logging on. The crown jewel is the Dak Prescott and George Pickens stack, with Prescott landing at 4.08 despite a QB7 projection and Pickens projecting as a WR10 starter, a pairing that rewards both of them when the connection clicks. Add Jonathan Taylor slipping to 2.08 at RB4 and Brock Bowers projecting as the TE1, and akerr28 is starting genuine difference-makers, not roster filler. Travis Kelce at TE10 fell more than a round past his ADP and lands here as an additional starter, which is the kind of quiet fortune that separates disciplined drafters from lucky ones. The lone reach, Kirk Cousins at QB35, is the kind of minor blemish that makes the rest of the sheet look even cleaner by comparison. Division rank of second backs up what the numbers say: this team was built right.

Bay9er didn't need a lottery ticket to build a winner in the GTA San Andreas division, just a draft that kept cashing small edges until they added up to something undeniable. The foundation is elite: Jahmyr Gibbs projects as RB1 and De'Von Achane as RB6, and Achane came at a modest discount, sliding past his ADP to land at 2.12. That kind of value at the top of a roster compounds quickly. Drake London at WR7 and Zay Flowers at WR16 round out a projected starting group that holds up against anyone in the field. The draft logged three values and zero reaches across the entire board, which is less a flash of brilliance than a portrait of discipline, a manager who never talked himself into paying more than a player was worth. Bay9er sits first in the division, checks in at the 96th percentile of the field, and carries a 2025 résumé of 33 wins and a perfect 100th percentile scoring mark into 2026. The ceiling here is obvious. So is the floor.
