DarthFantasy arrives in the Road Rash division sitting 12th and in just the 15th percentile of the field, and the roster makes it pretty clear why. The top of the lineup is genuinely impressive: Christian McCaffrey at RB3, Ashton Jeanty at RB7, and Chase Brown at RB11 give this team a thundering core that most managers would envy. The problem is what surrounds it. The receiver group bottoms out with Stefon Diggs projected at WR56 as the weakest projected starter, and nothing behind him improves that picture. The draft offered no route out of this, either. DarthFantasy registered zero steals and zero values across the entire board, and the two major reaches, Kyren Williams burned 1.6 rounds early and Darnell Washington taken an eye-watering 4.2 rounds before his ADP, suggest a manager who was trying to force a vision rather than react to value. McCaffrey and company can carry a lot, but even elite production at the top of a lineup only stretches so far when the supporting cast is this thin. This roster looks like a car with a great engine and no wheels.

There is no sugar-coating what eddiemcpigskin is looking at in 2026: an 11th-place division ranking and a 23rd-percentile tournament projection that together paint a grim picture with very few bright spots to distract from it. The quarterback room is genuinely elite, with Josh Allen sitting at QB1 and Trevor Lawrence at QB10, but that advantage evaporates quickly once you scroll down the roster. The projected starters grade out as average across the board, and the weakest among them, Wan'Dale Robinson at WR47, is a minor reach on top of it all. Brian Thomas Jr. at WR31 was pulled two rounds ahead of his ADP, and Elijah Arroyo at TE40 cost four rounds of draft capital to land a player who projects as a non-starter. Those are the kinds of draft-night decisions that narrow your margin for error before the season even begins, and eddiemcpigskin entered this tournament with almost none to spare. When your draft produces zero steals and zero values, you are essentially hoping the chalk hits perfectly, and the standings rarely cooperate with that prayer.

ReidRaukar finished in the 92nd percentile last season, and the roster that produced that result has been replaced by something that looks considerably less fearsome on paper. The receiver group is genuinely elite: CeeDee Lamb at WR5, Justin Jefferson at WR6, and Malik Nabers at WR12 give this team a ceiling that most managers would trade their whole draft for. But the ceiling has a leak, and it is located at quarterback. The manager spent a third-round pick on Jaxson Dart, QB11, a reach of 1.5 rounds, and then burned a 13th-round slot on Shedeur Sanders, QB32, a reach of 3.4 rounds. That is an extraordinary amount of draft capital committed to quarterbacks who rank well outside the top ten, and it means assets that could have reinforced the rest of the roster were spent chasing upside at the position. The Dart and Nabers stack offers a volatility play, but volatility cuts both ways. Right now, ReidRaukar is projecting 32nd percentile, a 60-point freefall from last year's finish, which is the gap between reputation and reality that this roster will spend the whole season trying to close.

jermoney played the value game as cleanly as almost anyone in this draft, collecting 16 chalk picks and landing two genuine values in Bhayshul Tuten and Kyle Monangai, both of whom fell well past their ADPs. The problem is that patience and discipline are inputs, not outputs, and the outputs here land this team ninth in the Road Rash division and in the 36th percentile of the field. The receiver group is graded weak, with Tetairoa McMillan as the best option at WR15 and the depth thinning out fast below Carnell Tate at WR29. The tight end pairing of Tyler Warren and Sam LaPorta is genuinely strong, and Lamar Jackson anchors the backfield of quarterbacks, but the floor that was supposed to materialize from all that disciplined drafting simply did not arrive. Tuten and Monangai project at RB25 and RB33 respectively, solid values on paper, yet the roster as a whole ranks where it ranks. Doing everything right and still finishing here is the cruelest thing a draft can do to a manager.

DarkstarDragons sit at 45th percentile and rank eighth in the Road Rash division, and the roster construction tells you most of what you need to know about why. The draft was almost entirely chalk, sixteen picks at or near consensus ADP, which means the manager had no real edge going in and no real edge coming out. Trey McBride at TE2 and A.J. Brown at WR8 are legitimate anchors, and the Love/Kraft stack adds a cute bonus, but below that top tier the names get thin fast. Derrick Henry projects at RB12, which is fine, and then the drop to Rachaad White at RB39 and Dylan Sampson at RB53 is not. The projected weakest starter is Makai Lemon at WR40, which is essentially the roster summarized in one sentence: good at the top, sliding fast toward replacement-level by the time the lineup fills out. There is no obvious lever to pull here, no buried value waiting to wake up. This team needs the top end to outperform projections badly enough to compensate for a middle that simply will not.

fdiaz49 is the team that wins exactly as many games as it loses, and the 2026 season looks built to continue that tradition. The foundation is genuinely impressive: Brock Bowers at TE1 and Colston Loveland at TE3 anchor the roster, and a Caleb Williams/Loveland stack adds the kind of ceiling correlation that can torch a week when it clicks. Williams at QB6 is a legitimate difference-maker. The problem is that the floor has some soft spots, and in a tournament decided by margins, soft spots collect tolls. The projected starter list bottoms out at Romeo Doubs at WR53, and the middle of the receiver group, Jordan Addison at WR43, Josh Downs at WR46, is the definition of replacement-level upside shopping. There were no steals in the draft, just 14 chalk picks and a handful of minor reaches, meaning fdiaz49 paid fair price for a fair team. Seventh in the Road Rash division and 47th percentile overall, this roster has the top-end talent to steal a great week and the median talent to give one right back.

Matt Gorman's entire 2026 ceiling is stitched together with Cincinnati thread. He drafted Joe Burrow at QB4 and then built a receiving corps around him, landing both Ja'Marr Chase (WR2) and Tee Higgins (WR19) as projected starters alongside Burrow. When that offense hums, Gorman doesn't just get points from one player, he gets an avalanche from three at once. The secondary insurance policy is Jaylen Waddle (WR23), who quietly upgrades his situation by leaving Miami's dysfunction for Denver, where Bo Nix threw more passes than anyone in the league last year. That kind of volume is a lifeboat if the Bengals stack runs cold. The concern is that correlation is a two-way street: the same game script that makes Gorman a weekly monster can also flatten him entirely. Sitting 51st percentile in the field after a 26th percentile scoring season in 2025, he doesn't have much margin for the Bengals to have an off week. This roster doesn't hedge, it bets.

There was no single moment in bmutch's draft that made the room gasp, and that's exactly the point. This roster was built the way a good poker player builds a stack: quietly, consistently, always coming away from the hand with a little more than expected. Bijan Robinson projects as RB2 and anchors the whole operation, while Nico Collins (WR9) and DeVonta Smith (WR14) give bmutch a receiver corps that can carry a week on its own. The Jalen Hurts and Smith stack adds a ceiling layer that doesn't show up in the individual rankings but absolutely shows up on big-game Sundays. Then there's the draft craft underneath it all: Jakobi Meyers landed two and a half rounds after his ADP, Malik Washington fell two full rounds, and Khalil Shakir came at a discount as well. Zero major reaches across the entire board. The 2025 campaign already validated the approach with a 64 percent win rate, and this construction suggests bmutch isn't done quietly making the right call at every turn.

JeffKrisko didn't chase the flashy move. There's no single pick here that makes you gasp or cringe, just a draft that ground out value at almost every turn and landed a starting group that is genuinely hard to argue with. Jonathan Taylor at RB4 anchors the top end, and pairing him with Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 means JeffKrisko has two of the most reliable weekly contributors in the field before the conversation even gets going. Rashee Rice at WR13 and Jameson Williams at WR21 extend that quality well past the first tier, and the Jared Goff stacks with both Brown and Williams give this roster a ceiling that could light up on the right week. Seventeen chalk picks out of the entire draft suggests JeffKrisko wasn't trying to outsmart anyone, just executing, and a 66th percentile tournament projection says that approach landed somewhere genuinely useful. This team won't wow you in August, but it's built to be competitive every single week, which is exactly the point.

daltondeldon didn't swing for the fences and miss, didn't gamble on upside and limp home, just drafted with steady hands and came out ahead on almost every transaction. The clearest illustration is the quarterback room, where Justin Herbert landed at 4.11 despite an ADP of 3.09, and Patrick Mahomes slid all the way to 7.02 against an ADP of 5.08, giving this team a projected QB8 and QB12 without overpaying for either. That kind of discipline compounds. Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 anchors the whole operation, and the surrounding cast, Omarion Hampton at RB9, Kenneth Walker III at RB10, Luther Burden at WR22, Rome Odunze at WR30, gives daltondeldon the kind of depth that makes weekly lineup decisions feel like a privilege rather than a prayer. The 2025 campaign finished at the 57th percentile, respectable but not the ceiling, and this roster, currently sitting second in the Road Rash division and at the 77th tournament percentile, reads like a team that made the most of every pick without needing a single one to be a miracle.

Born2Play sits third in Road Rash and in the 77th percentile of the field, and the draft sheet will tell you they got there messily. Two major reaches, one minor reach, and exactly zero steals across the entire board. That is not the profile of a manager who squeezed the market. But here is the thing: the players they reached for mostly worked. Dontayvion Wicks landed 4.5 rounds ahead of his ADP, Evan Engram came off the board nearly three rounds early, and yet when you look at what Born2Play actually assembled, the top of this roster is genuinely difficult to argue with. Puka Nacua projects as WR1. De'Von Achane and Saquon Barkley sit at RB6 and RB8 respectively. Kyle Pitts, Travis Kelce, and Dallas Goedert all project as starters at TE7, TE10, and TE15. The question of whether Born2Play knew something the consensus missed or simply paid up and got lucky is fair, but in a format this competitive, the scoreboard does not grade on style points.

Bakells6 didn't need a lottery ticket to build one of the Road Rash division's best rosters, just a draft that kept finding the right player at the right time. The clearest example is the receiver corps, where Garrett Wilson and Chris Olave both slid a full round past their ADPs, landing Bakells6 a projected WR17 and WR11 alongside Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, arguably the best individual player on the roster. Drake Maye fell a hair past his ADP as well, and he projects as a QB2, which means Bakells6 is starting a borderline elite quarterback who cost less than the market expected. None of these are heist-level steals, and that's almost the point: this was a draft built on consistent execution, not one big gamble that had to break right. Coming off a 2025 season that finished in the 95th percentile of scoring, Bakells6 enters 2026 sitting first in the division and in the 81st tournament percentile, which suggests the process isn't new. It's just working again.
