Point Break enters 2026 sitting in 7th percentile of the field, and nothing in this draft suggests that number was a mistake. The clearest indictment is in the draft board itself: zero steals, two major reaches, and a 2025 finish at 3-33 that reads less like bad luck and more like a pattern. The major reaches tell the story. Aaron Rodgers lands at QB29 and was pulled two full rounds before anyone else wanted him, burning a pick on a player who almost certainly won't start. Romeo Doubs clocks in at WR53 and cost a round ten selection, which is a genuinely difficult thing to explain. Meanwhile, the one moment of genuine foresight, landing J.K. Dobbins at a round and a half past his ADP, produced the team's weakest projected starter. Drake Maye and Lamar Jackson give this roster a real foundation, and Tetairoa McMillan and Garrett Wilson are credible contributors, but the floor was set in rounds nine through eleven, and it is a low one.

The West Seattle Wombats finished 2025 in the 87th percentile, and it would be easy to assume that reputation carries into 2026. It does not. This roster currently projects to the 18th percentile, sitting 10th in the division, and the construction tells you why. The running back group is genuinely impressive, anchored by Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and De'Von Achane at RB6, but in a positionless format the question is whether the rest of the lineup can keep pace with that elite core. It cannot, comfortably. Jaylen Waddle checks in at WR23, reached nearly a full round early at pick 4.06, and Michael Pittman projects as the weakest expected starter at WR44. Kyren Williams cost a 3rd-round pick on a player with a 5th-round ADP, which is the kind of aggressive bet that defines a roster. The Wombats are not a bad team. They are a team that looks considerably more dangerous in the rearview mirror than through the windshield, and 2026 will ask them to prove the gap is wrong.

ManOfTroy87 enters 2026 sitting 11th in the division and in just the 18th percentile of the field, and the roster offers very little reason for optimism. The foundation is not without merit: Brock Bowers projects as TE1, and A.J. Brown slots in at WR8, giving the team a legitimate top-end presence at two spots. But the floor drops off quickly after that, and the draft did not provide much of a cushion. The single major reach of the offseason was Alec Pierce at WR32, taken more than two rounds ahead of his ADP, and the projected lineup bottoms out with Khalil Shakir at WR51. That is a lot of ground to give up every single week before the contest even starts. Last season's 39 percent win rate and 32nd-percentile scoring suggest this is not a team trending in the right direction, and nothing about the current construction signals a correction is coming. ManOfTroy87 is not in a rebuild. He is just behind.

There is a version of the Tahitian Pirates that looks almost respectable on paper, and then you squint at the rest of the tournament field and the illusion dissolves. Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 and George Pickens at WR10 are genuinely elite projected starters, and Tyler Warren at TE4 gives this roster a real anchor at a position where most managers are scraping. But the floor drops fast after those names, and the draft did nothing to paper over the gap. Cam Ward sits at QB23 yet was taken nearly four full rounds before his ADP, which is the kind of aggressive swing that has to pay off for a roster in this spot, and it almost certainly will not. Meanwhile the projected weakest starter, Jayden Higgins at WR54, is the kind of name that shows up at the bottom of a lineup and quietly costs a manager a win every few weeks. Sitting ninth in the division and in just the 19th tournament percentile, the Pirates are not a team waiting to get hot. They are a team hoping everyone else goes cold.

YAC City enters 2026 sitting eighth in the division and in just the 40th tournament percentile, and the roster makes it hard to argue with either number. The receiver group is legitimately strong, with Amon-Ra St. Brown (WR4), Rashee Rice (WR13), and Emeka Egbuka (WR18) all projected starters, and the tight end depth mirrors that quality with Colston Loveland (TE3) and Harold Fannin (TE6) leading the way. But this is where the optimism runs out, because Patrick Mahomes grades out as a QB12, which in a positionless format means the manager is leaving real points on the table every single week at the position that moves the needle most. The draft offered no relief: twelve chalk picks and zero steals means YAC City paid full price for everything and found no hidden value to offset the quarterback drag. Wan'Dale Robinson projecting as the WR47 and drawing a starting projection tells you exactly how thin the margin for error is. The recipe is fine, but the oven is broken.

El Scorcho sits at the 49th percentile, which is another way of saying the season lives and dies by the margins, and those margins are genuinely hard to read. CeeDee Lamb and Justin Jefferson anchor the roster as WR5 and WR6, which is as comfortable a foundation as anyone in this field can claim, but Jefferson carries real uncertainty into 2026 after a rough stretch alongside JJ McCarthy in Minnesota. The arrival of Kyler Murray changes the calculus considerably, and if that pairing clicks, Jefferson stops being a question mark and starts being a second elite weapon. That swing alone could be the difference between a team that wins close weeks and one that keeps losing them. The drafting was largely chalk, but the manager did squeeze value out of TreVeyon Henderson at RB19 and Luther Burden at WR22, both taken a round after their ADP. Neither is a star, but in a format decided by margins, getting a round of free equity on two starters is how you manufacture an edge. Whether that edge is enough is the honest question.

Last year's WA Liberation Front finished in the 12th percentile in scoring, which is the kind of number that makes a manager stare at their ceiling at 2 a.m. The 2026 version looks like a genuine correction. Ja'Marr Chase projects as WR2, Saquon Barkley as RB8, and Jalen Hurts as QB9, and all three are projected starters on a roster that landed Hurts as a legitimate value, taken at 5.01 against an ADP of 3.12. That is the kind of draft capital efficiency that compounds. Omarion Hampton slots in as a projected RB9 starter alongside Barkley, and Tucker Kraft projects TE5 with the added bonus of a Jordan Love stack that gives the manager a built-in ceiling-raiser on big Love weeks. The roster is not without its soft spots, Jaylen Warren projects as the weakest starter at RB27, but when your floor includes Chase, Barkley, and Hurts, you can carry a Warren. Sixth in the division and 55th percentile tournament-wide are fine starting coordinates for a team that has nowhere to go but up.

Bubble Bobble did not walk away from draft day with a story about one transcendent pick. They walked away with a roster that quietly beat the board at almost every turn. Joe Burrow at QB4 anchors the whole operation, and the stack with Tee Higgins gives this team a built-in scoring multiplier on big Bengals weeks. Bijan Robinson at RB2 is the kind of foundational piece that makes a roster feel safe before the season even starts, and Javonte Williams at RB17 and D'Andre Swift at RB24 give the lineup real depth behind him. The one genuine value find was Rico Dowdle, projected RB32, who slid nearly two full rounds past his ADP and landed in Bubble Bobble's lap at 13.05. DeVonta Smith at WR14 came at a slight cost, taken just under a round early, but a projected WR14 starter is not a player you let drift. The result is a team sitting at 63rd percentile that looks and feels like it could outperform that number, not because of one bold swing, but because almost nothing here was bought at a premium.

T-Town Grit City enters 2026 carrying the quiet confidence of a team that knows exactly what it did and refuses to apologize for it. The receipts are there: two major reaches, zero steals, a draft that looked reckless on paper and produced a roster sitting at the 69th percentile. The centerpiece of that audacity is the receiver group, built around Puka Nacua at WR1, Drake London at WR7, and Nico Collins at WR9, three projected starters who give this team a ceiling most managers would trade their whole draft board to own. De'Zhaun Stribling, taken a staggering six rounds ahead of his ADP, either looks like genius or hubris come October, and that uncertainty is the whole personality of this roster. Jared Goff is no one's fantasy lottery ticket, a QB16 with no mobility and a hard ceiling, but he connects with projected starter Sam LaPorta in a Detroit offense loaded with weapons, offering a reliable floor that quietly matters in a grind of a season. Last year's 97th-percentile scoring outfit knows how to build. Whether they built correctly this time is the only question worth asking.

Kenneth Walker III at RB10 slid nearly a full round past his ADP, Travis Etienne at RB18 fell even further, and Trey McBride, projected TE2, was sitting there at the turn of the second round when he probably shouldn't have been. Stack those values together and you have a team that got meaningfully more than it paid for across its most important pieces. The 2025 season backs the approach: an 83% win rate and a finish in the 97th percentile in scoring aren't flukes, they're what happens when a roster is built without ego. The projected starters here include Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and McBride anchoring a tight end group that also features Jake Ferguson at TE12. Third in the division and sitting at the 82nd percentile in 2026 projections, kainstrain looks like a team that already knows how to do this.

Cougsky is what happens when a manager trusts the board and doesn't flinch. The foundation is legitimately elite, with Josh Allen at QB1 and James Cook at RB5 anchoring a starting lineup that barely has a soft spot, and the draft work behind the scenes is just as clean as the names on the roster. Derrick Henry slid a full round and a half past his ADP before Cougsky scooped him at RB12, and RJ Harvey fell more than three rounds before landing at 13.08, a haul that would make most managers check the pick twice. Against a full roster of 15 picks, only two minor reaches appear on the ledger, and neither is the kind of move that keeps you up at night. Jayden Daniels at QB5 adds genuine upside behind Allen rather than filler. The 2025 season, a 30-6 record sitting in the 98th percentile of scoring, suggests this is not a manager who gets lucky once. This looks like a team built to compete deep into the tournament, and right now it sits second in the division for good reason.

Kylee's roster didn't get built on one transcendent swing. It got built the way division titles usually are, by consistently coming out ahead across almost every pick. The foundation is as strong as it gets: Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 anchors the entire operation, and Ashton Jeanty (RB7), Chase Brown (RB11), and Jeremiah Love (RB13) give this team a level of depth that genuinely changes what is and isn't a tough week. Brown is worth singling out specifically. He landed at RB11 despite slipping nearly a round and a half past his ADP, which is the kind of quiet draft-room gift that separates good rosters from great ones. George Kittle adds TE9 upside, though the Achilles he suffered late in the 2025 NFL playoffs introduces enough uncertainty that treating him as locked in for Week 1 would be generous. The fact that Kittle's ceiling is still this high, even with that asterisk attached, tells you something about how much runway Kylee built into this roster. That's 83rd percentile production, and the division lead, and they earned both the unglamorous way.
