Kakariko Cucco Chuckers finished 40th percentile in scoring last season and somehow responded by drafting worse. Zero steals, zero values, two major reaches, and a draft board that reads like someone panic-bid on everything they were afraid to miss. The crown jewel of that anxious spending: Kenneth Walker III, taken 1.7 rounds early at 1.09 when the field had him pegged closer to pick 3.05, a QB4 in Joe Burrow already on the roster doing nothing to justify that kind of urgency. The Burrow/Tee Higgins stack is genuinely good, the lone corner of this roster that doesn't require a disclaimer, but one functional pairing does not a contender make. Peek at the projected weakest starter and you find J.K. Dobbins, a WR36 who reportedly returned healthy from a Lisfranc injury only to walk back into a Denver backfield where RJ Harvey and Jonah Coleman are waiting to carve into his workload. That is the floor of this roster. The ceiling is dead last in the division.

Ganondorf's Gremlins sit 11th in the Legend of Zelda division and in just the 16th percentile of the field, and the roster itself explains why. The positional strength is real but badly distributed for a team that needs volume: Drake Maye and Lamar Jackson project as QB2 and QB3, and Tucker Kraft, Harold Fannin, Kyle Pitts, and Jake Ferguson form a genuinely elite group at their position, but in a positionless format the value of that depth only goes as far as your worst projected starters, and Xavier Worthy projects as WR49. That is the number that defines this team. The draft offered no relief, producing eight chalk picks, three minor reaches, and not a single steal or positive-value swing to paper over the gaps. Emeka Egbuka and Worthy were both taken before their ADPs, which means the manager paid a small premium to land players who project WR18 and WR49. There is no obvious move left, no reclamation project hiding in the depth, and no draft-day luck to point to. This roster is more or less what it is.

Nativemania enters 2026 sitting 10th in the Legend of Zelda division and in just the 17th percentile of the tournament field, and there is not much in the draft ledger to suggest the ship is about to turn. The manager went chalk on nine picks and managed zero steals, zero values, and three minor reaches, meaning the roster is basically what it looks like on paper, no hidden upside baked in. What it looks like is a team with a genuinely exciting top end, James Cook at RB5 and CeeDee Lamb at WR5 providing real ammunition, anchored by Patrick Mahomes at QB12, but one that falls off quickly after that. The back half of the projected starters includes Tony Pollard at RB30 and Dalton Kincaid at TE11, and Pollard grades out as the weakest projected starter on the roster. After a respectable 2025 finish in the 78th percentile of scoring, the 2026 projection is a sharp step backward, and with a draft that gave this team exactly what it paid for and nothing more, there is no buried treasure left to unearth.

There is something almost admirable about the conviction here, the way nefan12 has built this entire roster around two stacks and dared the fantasy gods to cooperate. Dak Prescott paired with George Pickens, Jared Goff paired with Amon-Ra St. Brown, the whole structure is a double-or-nothing bet on correlation paying off. When it works, the ceiling is real: Pickens at WR10 and St. Brown at WR4 are both projected starters, and a big game from either quarterback amplifies the other side of the equation immediately. The problem is that everything downstream of those four players looks like filler. T.J. Hockenson projects at TE23, Josh Jacobs at RB16, and the team's weakest projected starter is Khalil Shakir at WR51. That is not depth carrying the load, that is scaffolding hoping the roof never needs support. A 25th-percentile tournament projection and a ninth-place division ranking suggest the field already sees what nefan12 maybe does not: correlation is a high-wire act, and this roster packed lightly for the fall.

Zonai Swirl enters 2026 sitting at the 27th percentile of the field and eighth in the division, and the roster offers almost no argument against those numbers. The foundation is real: Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Ashton Jeanty at RB7 give this team genuine star power, and A.J. Brown at WR8 is a legitimate weekly contributor. But the draft was pure chalk, not a single steal or value on the board, which means the manager paid market price for everything and found no edge anywhere. When your best players cost exactly what they were supposed to cost, you need the rest of the roster to punch above its weight, and Zonai Swirl cannot make that case. Jaylen Warren projects as the weakest starter at RB27, Kyler Murray grades out at QB19, and last season's 25 percent win rate with a 16th percentile scoring output is not a fluke to explain away, it is a baseline to worry about. The upside is visible, the path to it is not.

Last year's 80th-percentile finish has a way of making a roster look better than it probably is, and Jeff Matson's 2026 edition is already collecting the debt. The wide receiver group is genuinely strong, with Nico Collins (WR9), Zay Flowers (WR16), and Davante Adams (WR25) all projecting as starters, but the draft process that built this team is quietly alarming: zero steals, just two values, and a Deebo Samuel reach that stands out like a sore thumb, taken 7.5 rounds ahead of his ADP with a WR70 projection to show for it. That single pick swallowed a round-eight slot that could have addressed real needs. The quarterback situation adds no comfort, with C.J. Stroud at QB22 and Cam Ward at QB23 forming one of the weakest projected starting combinations in the field. Matson is sitting 7th in the division and in the 39th percentile of scoring, and the reputation earned last season is doing a lot of heavy lifting that the current roster simply cannot match.

LouBrunson sits at 52nd percentile like a team that has done its homework but forgot to turn it in early. The foundation is real: Puka Nacua projects as WR1, and Jonathan Taylor lands at RB4 after both slipped just past their ADPs, giving this roster genuine top-end value without requiring much draft-room heroics. The problem is that the margins cut both ways. Brock Purdy was taken 2.2 rounds ahead of his ADP to land at QB13, which is a significant investment for a player who projects as merely solid, and the back end thins out fast with Chuba Hubbard at RB29 anchoring the weakest projected spot on the roster. The Bo Nix and Jaylen Waddle stack adds a ceiling game, the kind of week where everything clicks and LouBrunson looks like a contender. Coming off a 2025 that landed in the fifth percentile of scoring, this team badly needs those ceiling games to materialize. The core is good enough to compete at sixth in the division, but the boom-or-bust edges will decide whether that reads like progress or a repeat.

Power, Wisdom & Tight Ends sits 5th in the Legend of Zelda division and at the 53rd percentile of the field, numbers that feel about right for a team that drafted with more conviction than the board rewarded. The clearest example of that conviction is De'Zhaun Stribling, pulled nearly six rounds before consensus said to bother, a move that looks either visionary or reckless depending entirely on how Stribling performs in 2026. That is the whole bet here. The foundation underneath it is genuinely strong: Bijan Robinson projects as RB2, Colston Loveland as TE3, and the Jayden Daniels and Terry McLaurin stack gives the roster a connected upside engine that most managers would be happy to build around. Kyren Williams falling a full round past his ADP was a quiet win that steadied the middle of the roster. What this team cannot afford is for Stribling to be a ghost, because a reach that large either pays in production or it just sits there, reminding you that confidence and foresight are only the same thing in hindsight.

Jake Bobo (Legend of) sits fourth in the division but lands in the 80th percentile of the field, and that gap tells you everything you need to know about how this draft went. The foundation is genuinely elite: Josh Allen projects as QB1, and Jalen Hurts came along at 4.10 despite carrying a QB9 projection, a full round later than his ADP suggested he'd last. That kind of patient accumulation at the top of the roster is how you build a team that doesn't have a ceiling problem. Drake London similarly slipped to 2.10 despite projecting as WR7, arriving just a few picks past his ADP in a draft where those fractional edges compound fast. The rest of the board reads as clean, disciplined chalk, nine picks taken right where they were supposed to go, zero reaches. No lottery tickets, no dramatic gambles, just a manager who kept coming out slightly ahead on each selection and let the math do the work. Jayden Reed projects as WR48 and represents the thinnest spot on the roster, but at 80th percentile, the floor here is already high.

There is no single moment that defines ftblmessiah's 2026 roster, no lottery-ticket gamble that either vindicates or sinks the whole operation. What you find instead is a draft built on quiet, compounding correctness. Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 anchors the group, and Trey McBride at TE2 arrived as the clearest evidence that patience and positioning pay dividends, sliding nearly a full round past his ADP of 1.08 before ftblmessiah scooped him at 2.05. That is the kind of market inefficiency that separates a good draft from a great one. Chris Olave at WR11 and Bucky Irving at RB21 fill out a starting group that projects with genuine depth, and a manager who went 24-12 last year and scored in the 86th percentile knows how to convert projected talent into actual wins. Third in the division and sitting at the 87th percentile of the field, ftblmessiah looks less like a team that swung big and got lucky and more like a team that simply kept winning the small moments until the draft was over.

TheMixmaster is running a tight ship in the Legend of Zelda division, sitting second and in the 90th percentile of the field, and the draft record tells you exactly why: nine chalk picks, three values, zero reaches. That is a manager who knew the board, trusted the process, and never panicked. The core is legitimately elite. Justin Jefferson at WR6, Brock Bowers at TE1, and Saquon Barkley at RB8 are all projected starters, and Barkley slid to 3.10 despite an ADP of 3.02, a small gift the manager pocketed without flinching. Rashee Rice is the one variable worth watching closely. The off-field situation is serious, the knee procedure will cost him time early, and his availability is genuinely uncertain. But Rice at WR13, when he is healthy and on the field, is a difference maker, and this roster absorbs the risk without breaking a sweat because the floor is already so high. Jordan Addison as the projected weakest starter at WR43 says everything about how deep this thing goes.

Luis25 sits first in the Legend of Zelda division and in the 91st percentile of the entire field, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. The headliners are legitimate: Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and De'Von Achane at RB6 give this roster a top-end core that most managers would trade a first-born for, and the supporting cast is just as carefully assembled. What separates Luis25 from the pack, though, is the discipline shown in the middle and late rounds. Caleb Williams, a projected QB6, slipped a full round and a half past his ADP before Luis25 snapped him up. Travis Kelce fell nearly two rounds before landing here. Dallas Goedert and Oronde Gadsden each tumbled past their ADPs as well. Four values across the draft, zero reaches, and a weakest projected starter in Goedert at TE15, which is hardly a flaw worth dwelling on. This roster was built the right way: patience at the board, conviction when the moment came, and no wasted picks.
