There is no diplomatic way to say this: Bluey2022 is in trouble. Sitting 12th in the Skyrim division and in just the 8th percentile of the entire field, this roster has the look of a team that drafted with hope and landed with a thud. The saving grace is a genuinely strong receiver group headlined by CeeDee Lamb (WR5) and A.J. Brown (WR8), the latter now pairing with Drake Maye in New England, a tantalizing connection that gives Brown legitimate upside if he can avoid the injury history that has shadowed him throughout his career. But that optimism stops at the skill positions and curdles fast. Baker Mayfield checks in as a QB18, taken a full round and change ahead of his ADP, which is the kind of draft-night confidence that rarely ages well. The most damning detail, though, is the draft board itself: zero steals, one value, and a major reach on Ted Hurst (WR85) that cost five rounds of equity. There is no obvious lever left to pull here, just a long season in the Skyrim basement.

There is no sugarcoating what the numbers say about Darcdawg in 2026: this roster grades out at the 11th percentile of the field, dead last in the Skyrim division, and the draft did almost nothing to improve the outlook. Of 20 picks, 15 came in at chalk and two were major reaches, including Ladd McConkey taken nearly two rounds early at pick 2.11. That is a high price for a WR20 projection in a format this competitive, and it left little room downstream to manufacture upside. The one genuine bright spot is Jaylen Waddle, a projected WR23 who quietly had a viable fantasy season even while Miami's passing offense was pulling teeth, and who now lands in Denver beside a quarterback in Bo Nix who led the league in pass attempts. That is a real upgrade in situation. But Waddle alone cannot carry a roster whose projections offer no obvious lever to pull, and with Bijan Robinson as the lone clear-cut difference maker, Darcdawg looks like a team hoping variance rescues a plan the draft could not build.

largefarva68 is sitting at the bottom of the Skyrim division and projecting out at just the 25th percentile of the field, and the roster tells you exactly why. The receiver group is a quiet disaster: Drake London clocks in at WR7, which sounds fine until you realize the next projected starter is Denzel Boston at WR58, and then it falls off a cliff from there. A positionless format rewards depth of quality, and this team simply does not have it beyond that first wave. The backfield looks better on paper, with Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and Derrick Henry at RB12 anchoring things, but a roster that grades Weak at receiver and leans this hard on its backfield is betting that one positional group can carry everything else. The wild card is Quinshon Judkins, a promising RB22 projection who broke his fibula late last season and is still working his way back to training camp. If Judkins does not return to form, largefarva68 has almost no lever left to pull, and a long season in Skyrim gets considerably longer.

There is a version of this roster that looks almost respectable on paper, and then you notice the seams. Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 is a genuine pillar, and Chris Olave at WR11 and Zay Flowers at WR16 give afvoo a receiver group that grades out strong enough to carry some weight. The problem is that everything else is doing a lot of leaning. Cam Ward projects as QB23, and he was a reach at that, taken 1.5 rounds before his ADP. Omarion Hampton at RB9 offers a credible second anchor, but beyond him the depth thins into a collection of dart throws, including Emanuel Wilson, pulled seven rounds ahead of schedule at RB69. Draft capital spent on reaches rather than values is draft capital that cannot be recovered, and with a 28th-percentile projection and a ninth-place divisional standing, afvoo is not a team waiting on a breakout. It is a team that has already pulled most of its levers and found them shorter than expected.

Dawnbreaker arrives in the Skyrim division sitting eighth and projected at just the 31st percentile of the field, and nothing about this roster suggests those numbers are about to improve. The bright spots are real but narrow: Brock Bowers projects as TE1, Tucker Kraft adds legitimate depth at TE5, and the receiver group gets a boost from Nico Collins at WR9 and George Pickens at WR10. That is a genuinely strong top end. The problem is that everything below it thins out fast, and the draft did nothing to change the trajectory. Zero steals, zero values, and four minor reaches across the board means this manager paid slightly above market for players like Jakobi Meyers and Romeo Doubs without landing a single discount. The backfield is a quiet disaster, with RJ Harvey projecting at RB28 as the best option available. A team that finished at the 55th percentile in scoring last year and still grades out this poorly heading into 2026 has already pulled most of the levers it has. There are no obvious fixes left, just hope that the projections are wrong.

Jarl Gibbs of Dtroit ran a disciplined draft, collecting values on Parker Washington, Tre Harris, and Brenton Strange while avoiding the major reaches that sink most rosters before the season starts. The problem is that discipline without upside is just a tidy road to mediocrity, and that is exactly where this team is parked: 33rd percentile in the field, seventh in the Skyrim division, with a projected ceiling that politely refuses to rise. The top of the roster is legitimately interesting, Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and Ashton Jeanty at RB7 give the team a genuine foundation, and Rashee Rice at WR13 could be a difference-maker if the universe cooperates. That last part is doing a lot of heavy lifting. Rice is coming off a suspension, a late-season IR stint for concussion symptoms, a knee procedure, and fresh reports of a probation violation that will send him to jail. When your third projected starter is simultaneously your biggest question mark and the player your ceiling depends on, the value game stops mattering. You drafted well. The roster still does not add up.

rfeaver1 enters 2026 as the tournament's most aggressively median team, sitting at 53rd percentile and sixth in the Skyrim division, which is not a death sentence and not a coronation. The roster is built on a genuinely strong receiver group headlined by Jaxon Smith-Njigba (WR3) and DeVonta Smith (WR14), and the Jalen Hurts and Smith stack gives this team a ceiling that most middle-of-the-pack rosters simply cannot access. Hurts, landed at QB9 after falling nearly a full round past his ADP, is the kind of quiet draft win that separates the 53rd percentile from the 65th. The concern is that the floor depends heavily on De'Von Achane (RB6) staying healthy and on Chuba Hubbard (RB29) holding up as the projected weakest starter, a player whose value evaporates the moment his situation shifts. rfeaver1 is not a team that wins ugly or loses memorably. It is built to hover, and whether it breaks out of that orbit comes down entirely to whether the good version of this roster shows up on the right weeks.

Drake Drake Maye Maye didn't need a lottery ticket to build a contender, just a steady hand and the discipline to let value come to them. The foundation is genuinely imposing: Drake Maye projects as QB2 and Christian McCaffrey as RB3, and those two alone give this roster a ceiling most managers in the Skyrim division are still chasing. The draft story, though, is the quiet accumulation underneath that top line. Sixteen picks came in at chalk, which sounds boring until you realize it means almost nothing was overpaid for, and Jayden Daniels fell a full round and a half past his ADP to land at 4.02 as a QB5 who also anchors a stack with Terry McLaurin. That Daniels-McLaurin connection is the kind of layered upside that compounds across a long tournament. The weakest projected starter is Hunter Henry at TE18, which is a real thing, but it reads more like the cost of doing business than a flaw in the blueprint. This roster sits at the 63rd percentile, and it earned every bit of it the old-fashioned way.

Ryluc Picard paid a premium to build this roster and got away with it completely. The draft log reads like a manager who simply refused to wait: Garrett Wilson at WR17, D.J. Moore at WR26, and Keenan Allen taken a staggering 6.3 rounds before his ADP, all pulled before the board said they were available. By the numbers, that is reckless. By the roster, that is a starting corps that projects as one of the deeper receiver groups in the Skyrim division, with Josh Allen at QB1 stacking against both Moore and Dalton Kincaid to give this team triple the ways to profit from a single elite arm. Kincaid is the one honest question mark here, a TE11 talent who has spent two years fighting a knee that never quite heals, and Bills GM Brandon Beane's "too early to tell" on his 2026 availability is not nothing. But even with that caveat hanging over the stack, Ryluc Picard landed at the 69th percentile of the field by reaching for exactly what they wanted. The board got ignored, and the roster looks great anyway.

Jorrvaskr didn't swing for the fences and miss. They just kept winning rounds. The foundation is genuinely elite: James Cook at RB5 and Saquon Barkley at RB8 give this team a top of the roster that most managers in the field would trade their entire draft for, and Trey McBride at TE2 is the kind of positional advantage that quietly inflates a lineup's floor every single week. From there, Jorrvaskr simply kept adding: Josh Jacobs at RB16, Cam Skattebo at RB20, and Caleb Williams landing as a QB6 value after slipping nearly a full round past his ADP. Seventeen chalk picks out of the whole draft might read as unimaginative to some, but chalk at the top of the board is just called "correct." The only real blemish is Demond Claiborne, reached on by over three rounds, though at pick 17 the stakes of that kind of gamble are low. The result is a team sitting third in the Skyrim division with legitimate claims on better, projecting into the 81st percentile of a very large field.

Amon-Ra, the Ninth Divine didn't need a lottery ticket to build a contender, just a draft that kept winning the small battles. Sitting second in the Skyrim division and in the 87th percentile of the field, this roster got there the quiet way: three players taken meaningfully past their ADP, zero reaches, and a starting core that reads like someone forgot to tell the field that good rosters require sacrifice. Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and Justin Jefferson at WR6 form the kind of receiver pairing that makes opponents do uncomfortable math on Sunday, and the Jared Goff stack with St. Brown adds a correlated ceiling on top of an already-strong floor. Then consider that Mark Andrews, projected TE14, slipped more than a round past his ADP and landed here anyway. No single moment defines this team, no audacious trade or midnight steal, just a manager who consistently got more than they paid for. The 2025 squad went 25-11 and scored in the 78th percentile, and this roster looks like a step up from that.

mattjac did not swing for the fences and whiff, did not gamble on upside at the cost of a floor, just drafted steadily and ended up at the top of the Skyrim division and in the 99th percentile of the field. The engine of this roster is Lamar Jackson, a QB3 projection taken at pick 2.10 when his ADP sat at 2.03, which sounds small until you realize that at the top of a draft, half a round of surplus is real money. Malik Nabers adds the kind of upside that makes a roster genuinely dangerous: a WR12 projection who was sliding down boards all summer due to ACL concerns, only to show up at training camp looking like himself again, giving mattjac a late-round Jaxson Dart and Nabers stack that could explode if that connection clicks. Four values against zero reaches on the draft sheet is not luck, it is a manager who knew what things were worth and kept getting them for less. The floor here is high, the ceiling is legitimate, and the Skyrim division already knows it.
