There is a version of this draft where mkcpapa walks away looking shrewd. This is not that version. The headline is Bijan Robinson at RB2, a legitimate anchor, but almost everything built around him required paying a price that the board simply did not demand. Chris Olave, projected WR11, was taken a full round before his ADP. Khalil Shakir, a WR51, cost nearly three rounds of premium. Fernando Mendoza, a QB27 with no projected starts to his name, was yanked off the board five and a half rounds ahead of schedule, as though scarcity at the position were already a crisis rather than a distant rumor. Five major reaches across a draft is not bad luck, it is a pattern, and the pattern here is a manager who drafted with urgency the board never asked for. Travis Kelce falling to a late eighth and grading out as a genuine value is the lone moment of patience on this sheet, and one good round cannot carry a roster sitting at the fourth percentile. Robinson deserved better teammates.

sbernard42 sits 11th in the Snake Division and projects in the 14th percentile of the field, and the roster itself does not offer much reason for optimism. Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and A.J. Brown at WR8 are legitimate anchors, but the talent falls off quickly after that, and Jonathon Brooks projects as the weakest starter at RB37, which is a real ask in a deep tournament. The draft did not help much either: 12 chalk picks, two values, and four minor reaches add up to a board that largely went according to script without generating the surplus equity a bottom-tier roster desperately needed. The Justin Herbert and Ladd McConkey stack is a reasonable gamble, with Herbert projecting QB8 and McConkey at WR20, but a stack is a multiplier, not a foundation, and there is not enough underneath it here to change the math. When your best-case scenario depends on everything breaking right and your floor is already the basement, the season is less a rebuilding project than a very long wait for the draft to come back around.

PCO316 sits 10th in the Snake Division and in just the 28th percentile of the field, and the roster makes it easy to understand why. The receiver group is genuinely elite, anchored by Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 and Nico Collins at WR9, and that strength carries real weight in a positionless format. But outside that group, almost nothing else is working in PCO316's favor. Trevor Lawrence projects as a QB10, which is fine, yet the manager also burned a pick on Michael Mayer at TE39, reaching nearly six full rounds ahead of his ADP. That is the kind of draft capital misfire that quietly poisons a roster from the inside, and it shows up everywhere: seven minor reaches across the board, zero steals, and a projected weakest starter in Hunter Henry at TE18. The receiver talent is a real foundation, but this roster reads like a team that drafted against the board at every inflection point and now has no obvious correction available. A terrific WR room can only cover so much ground.

Scootsmagoots86 lands at 38th percentile and ninth in the Snake division, and the roster itself explains why. The draft was almost entirely chalk, with 14 picks landing right at ADP and just two values of note, Matthew Golden and Brenton Strange, both of whom fell because the field largely forgot about them late. The real damage shows up at the top of the draft, where Brock Purdy got taken a round and a half early in Round 4, a premium price for a QB13 projection in a positionless format where quarterback value gets squeezed hardest. Justin Jefferson and Trey McBride are genuine pillars at WR6 and TE2 respectively, and Tetairoa McMillan gives this team real depth to work with. But Jaylen Warren projecting as the weakest projected starter at RB27 is a telling signal that the ceiling on this roster has already been established, and it is not very high. There is no late-round heist lurking on the bench, no obvious trade chip to flip upward. What you see is largely what Scootsmagoots86 is going to get.

Hugobrasky finished 13-23 last season with a 34th-percentile scoring output, and the 2026 projections offer little reason to expect a dramatic reversal. The roster grades out at the 47th percentile and sits eighth in the Snake division, and the draft board did not help matters: two major reaches on Kimani Vidal (RB60) and Mike Washington Jr. (RB59) in the late rounds suggest a manager grasping for upside that the rankings simply do not support. Jonathan Taylor (RB4) and CeeDee Lamb (WR5) are legitimate anchors, but the projected starting lineup leans heavily on those two carrying the load while C.J. Stroud (QB22) sits as insurance behind Caleb Williams (QB6), a quarterback who has been backsliding for two seasons and has yet to recapture his early-career form. Dalton Schultz (TE22) projects as the weakest starter on the roster, and there is no obvious upgrade path there. This team is not without talent, but the gap between the top and the rest of the lineup is wide enough to keep Hugobrasky on the outside of playoff contention most weeks.

Zain Dhanani sits at 50th percentile and seventh in the Snake Division, which sounds like a verdict, but it is really just a setup. The roster hangs on a couple of threads that could pull in either direction. Drake Maye is the most obvious one. Reaching nearly a full round early at 1.06 is a statement of conviction, and the conviction is not crazy: Maye finished second in MVP voting last season, dragged New England's offense through a thin supporting cast, and now has AJ Brown arriving via trade to give him a genuine alpha target for the first time. If Maye pushes toward QB2 ceiling rather than settling near it, this team looks different. The Joe Burrow and Tee Higgins stack offers a steadier floor, two projected starters connected by familiarity and chemistry. Jameson Williams falling a round and a half past his ADP was the draft's one real gift. The rest of the board was chalk. That is not a flaw exactly, but it means Dhanani built no margin for error in the draft room, so he will need to find it on the field.

Worm369 sits sixth in the Snake Division and in the 61st percentile of the field, numbers that feel a little low for a roster built this carefully. The calling card here is not one transformative pick but a draft that quietly kept coming out ahead. Brock Bowers landing at TE1 after sliding nearly half a round past his ADP is the clearest example: at pick 2.01, Worm369 secured the best tight end in the tournament at a discount, then turned around and added Harold Fannin as a projected TE6 starter alongside him. That kind of consistent value extraction showed up elsewhere too, with Courtland Sutton and Travis Hunter both arriving later than the market expected. The QB situation adds another layer of comfort: Lamar Jackson projects as QB3 and Jalen Hurts as QB9, both starters, both capable of carrying a week on their own. The floor here is genuinely solid, the ceiling is real, and the draft process gave this team more margin for error than the standings currently suggest.

FF_Tycoon didn't win the draft with one flashy pick. They won it by refusing to lose small moments. The receiver group alone tells the story: Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4, Drake London at WR7, and Malik Nabers at WR12 are all projected starters, and none of them required reaching. Then the tight end work compounds it. George Kittle, a projected starter at TE9, slid a full round past his ADP, and Dalton Kincaid at TE11 fell more than two rounds before FF_Tycoon scooped him up. That's not luck, that's a manager who did their homework and stayed patient while others panicked. The one blemish is Brian Robinson, taken three rounds ahead of his ADP, but a single reach at RB45 isn't going to sink a roster built this deliberately. FF_Tycoon sits fifth in the Snake division and in the 64th percentile of the field right now, which feels more like a floor than a ceiling for a team that came out ahead on nearly every meaningful transaction. The arrow points up.

Last year thekostos finished in the 7th percentile in scoring, so almost anything would have qualified as an upgrade, but this roster is not just a step up, it's a vault. The foundation starts with Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and James Cook at RB5, two projected starters who anchor the kind of lineup that turns a 22-percent win rate into a distant memory. George Pickens at WR10 adds genuine star upside alongside Chase, and Kyle Pitts, coming off a legitimate top-5 finish at the position last year, gives this team a projected TE7 who has finally started to justify the hype, regardless of who ends up taking snaps in Atlanta. The draft was mostly clean, with the team landing Cook a little later than expected and grabbing Isaiah Likely at TE13 nearly two rounds past his ADP. Jaxson Dart at QB11 is an early investment, but the overall floor here is simply in a different building than 2025. A 68th-percentile projection and a fourth-place division standing feels like a conservative estimate for a team this loaded.

Deadduck didn't win the draft with one thunderbolt pick. They won it the way a good poker player wins, by consistently getting slightly better odds than they paid for. Six value picks scattered across the board tell that story clearly: De'Von Achane at RB6 slipping past his ADP to land at 2.12, Dallas Goedert falling nearly two full rounds before deadduck scooped him at 10.12, Gunnar Helm and Eli Stowers both drifting past their marks before getting claimed in the back half. Meanwhile the stacking instinct was sharp, pairing Patrick Mahomes with Rashee Rice and Baker Mayfield with Emeka Egbuka, which means big passing games funnel points in from multiple angles at once. Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and Achane at RB6 give this team a ceiling that the division rank of third and tournament finish at the 72nd percentile probably undersell. The 2025 campaign at 39th percentile is behind them. This roster was built more carefully than that record suggests.

CoachSteve12 did not win the 2026 Scott Fish Bowl draft with one thunderbolt pick. This roster was assembled the way a good contractor builds a house, steadily, without wasted materials, and with better supplies than anyone expected at those prices. Tyler Warren, projected TE4, fell nearly a round and a half past his ADP and landed at 4.09, a quiet heist that anchors the entire operation. Josh Allen at QB1 gives CoachSteve12 the kind of ceiling that erases bad weeks, and the supporting cast was built with similar discipline: DeVonta Smith, projected WR14, slid more than a full round before being scooped at 5.04, and Mark Andrews, projected TE14, arrived nearly two rounds late at 10.09. Against the field, this team sits at the 77th percentile and second in the Snake division, a reflection of a draft that produced three genuine values, one outright steal, and zero major reaches across the board. CoachSteve12 did not gamble. He just kept being right.

Lauree's 2026 roster reads like a masterclass in knowing exactly what you're doing at the draft table, and the numbers back it up completely. The crown jewel is Puka Nacua, a WR1 projection who anchors a starting corps that already includes Jaylen Waddle at WR23, Kenneth Walker III at RB10, Josh Jacobs at RB16, and Javonte Williams at RB17, all projected starters. That is not a fantasy team, that is a curated argument. What makes this draft truly clean, though, is the discipline behind the selections: four players taken meaningfully past their ADP, zero reaches, and a steal in Dak Prescott, who slid a full round and a third beyond his ADP before Lauree scooped him up at a QB7 projection. Division-leading, 94th percentile, coming off an 86 percent win rate in 2025, this team enters the season the way a championship contender should: quietly loaded, efficiently constructed, with almost nothing left to criticize.
