There is no flattering spin available for FFA\_Meng, and frankly the energy required to search for one ran out somewhere around the sixth reach. The draft chart tells the story plainly: zero steals, zero values, eight chalk picks, and then a cascade of eleven reaches that span the entire board. Justin Herbert, taken at 2.01 when the market had him at 3.09, is a QB8 projection, which is fine, but not fine enough to justify burning that kind of draft capital on a quarterback in a positionless format. The second-round equivalent spent on Kyler Murray, a QB19, is harder to defend. Blake Corum lands at RB35 with a 4.4-round premium attached, making him the weakest projected starter on a roster that already carries a 2025 résumé of a 33 percent win rate and 13th percentile scoring. Last year was ugly. This draft did not introduce the corrective measures one hoped for. FFA\_Meng sits dead last in the division, and the construction of this roster offers no compelling argument against that projection.

The Jack Bech reach says everything you need to know about Uncle Bens Killer D. Bech, a WR94, was pulled off the board nearly nine rounds before his ADP, a decision so aggressive it borders on performance art. That pick consumed real capital that could have addressed the receiver group, which now leans on Alec Pierce at WR32 and Michael Wilson at WR39 as its projected starters, neither of whom inspires anything resembling confidence. The Christian McCaffrey and Jonathan Taylor anchors are genuine, and nobody is taking that away from this roster, but in a positionless format the question is always what your best ten look like collectively, and this team's collective answer is grim. Jared Goff at QB16 is a safe weekly producer in that Detroit offense, but safe and ceiling-raising are different things, and this team needed the latter. Three major reaches, zero steals, zero values, a 26th-percentile finish projected. There is no charitable read available here, and the draft sheet does not leave much room to manufacture one.

Fredmirfootball enters 2026 sitting 10th in the Man division and projecting at just the 37th percentile of the field, and the roster does not offer much reason for optimism. The anchor is supposed to be Saquon Barkley, projected RB8, but even that pillar is cracking. Coming off a 2025 season where the Eagles' offensive line fell apart around him, Barkley is now 29 and reportedly being eased away from the workloads that once made him a league-winner. RB8 is still a useful projection, but it is a long way from the ceiling this roster is counting on. Josh Allen at QB1 is genuinely excellent, and his stack with D.J. Moore provides a real upside floor, but Moore checks in at WR26 and is a minor reach to boot. The draft itself offered almost no margin for error, producing three major reaches and zero steals. After going 8-28 last season and finishing in just the 25th percentile in scoring, Fredmirfootball needed a drafting masterclass. This was not it.

notoriousdab enters 2026 sitting ninth in the Man division and at just the 41st percentile of the field, and the roster grades out in a way that makes optimism feel like a coping mechanism. The foundation is real enough: Jahmyr Gibbs projects as the RB1, and a Dak Prescott and George Pickens stack gives the team a high-upside connection on a single game script. But strip those two pieces away and the drop-off is steep. Prescott's backup options include Tua Tagovailoa at QB31 and Michael Penix Jr. at QB33, which is essentially a fire extinguisher made of cardboard. The draft did not manufacture much hidden value either, with 13 chalk picks out of 19 selections and one major reach in Pat Bryant at WR86, taken nearly three rounds ahead of his ADP. notoriousdab last season scored at the 77th percentile, so the engine has run hot before, but this roster, as currently projected, does not look like the same machine.

Derby Dawg did almost everything right on draft day, and the scoreboard does not care. Sixteen chalk picks, just three minor reaches, and a steal in Jauan Jennings, who tumbled more than four full rounds past his ADP before manager picked him up at 18.08. Disciplined, patient, process-correct drafting, the kind fantasy writers praise in think-pieces. The problem is the sum of those parts lands this team at 45th percentile in the field, eighth in the division, projected to start Michael Pittman as a key contributor. Joe Burrow and Caleb Williams give the passing game genuine upside, and the Williams-Luther Burden stack offers the tournament-week ceiling a team at this tier needs to climb. But Breece Hall at RB14, Kyren Williams at RB15, and TreVeyon Henderson at RB19 are all projecting as average-tier contributors, not difference-makers, and average-tier contributors added correctly still equal average. Derby Dawg followed the rules, hit the value, and built a team that is quietly, mathematically fine, which in a charity tournament full of ceiling-chasers is just another way to finish in the middle.

The Wide Retrievers sit at 55th percentile, seventh in the Man division, which tells you everything: good enough to beat bad teams, beatable enough to lose to good ones. The margins decide this season, and right now those margins cut both ways. Brock Bowers at TE1 is the clearest structural advantage on this roster, a projected-starter anchor taken at 2.06 when his ADP was 1.07, meaning the manager got him late and still got him. Pair that with the Patrick Mahomes and Rashee Rice stack, where a big Rice game tends to drag Mahomes with it, and there are real ceiling weeks baked into this lineup. The concern is where the floor lives. Jayden Reed projects as the weakest starter at WR48, and in a positionless format where every roster spot competes on merit, a WR48 contributes only when the players above him stumble. The Wide Retrievers will not be counted out of many weeks, but they will need Bowers to be dominant and the Mahomes-Rice connection to fire together to avoid being the team that finishes one win short of everything that mattered.

Mrblistr didn't make headlines on draft day, and that's kind of the point. The draft was quiet in the best possible way, built on four legitimate values and only one major reach across the board. Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and Nico Collins at WR9 form a projected starting duo that most managers would trade their entire middle rounds to land, and the real craftsmanship shows in how Mrblistr filled around them. Jordan Love fell nearly two rounds before being snagged at QB17, and Marvin Harrison Jr., a player who carries real upside if he finally stays healthy through a full season in Arizona, came a full round cheaper than his market price. The Jayden Daniels and Terry McLaurin stack gives the lineup a correlation bonus that compounds when Washington moves the ball. Add Jeremiyah Love projecting at RB13 and you have a team sitting at the 56th percentile that feels like it belongs higher. The floor was built quietly and the ceiling has real air above it.

No Way Mahomes sits fifth in the division and at the 58th percentile, numbers that feel undersized for what is actually on this roster. The key tension is in how it was built. Josh Downs went at 8.02 when the market said he was a round-and-a-half away, Khalil Shakir went at 9.11 when consensus had him in round eleven, and Geno Smith came off the board more than two rounds before his ADP. Three major reaches in one draft is the kind of thing that looks reckless in a recap thread. But then you look at the starters and Trey McBride is a TE2, Tyler Warren is a TE4, Travis Kelce is a TE10, and Amon-Ra St. Brown is a WR4, and the impulse to argue with the approach fades quickly. The McBride value, falling nearly half a round past his ADP, rewarded patience that the manager then spent elsewhere on conviction picks. Whether those conviction picks hold up, particularly Shakir as the weakest projected starter on the roster, is the question that follows this team all season. The floor is real. The ceiling is right there. The margin is Shakir.

TheFantasyBros didn't win their draft with one thunderbolt pick. They won it by quietly collecting interest on every round. The clearest evidence is their receiver group, where Jaxon Smith-Njigba (WR3), A.J. Brown (WR8), and Malik Nabers (WR12) give the roster a ceiling most managers in the Man division would envy, and that trio was assembled without a single major reach on the board. Nabers came 0.7 rounds early, the lone blemish in an otherwise disciplined draft that logged three values and just two minor reaches against fifteen chalk selections. Matthew Stafford (QB14) and Baker Mayfield (QB18) both slipped past their ADPs by more than a round each, giving the team functional depth at the position for essentially nothing. Chigoziem Okonkwo (TE19) is the weakest projected starter and a legitimate concern, but in a format this positionless, one soft spot is far easier to manage than it looks on paper. Sitting at 62nd percentile and fourth in the division, TheFantasyBros aren't the favorite, but they drafted like a team that expects to be relevant in October.

One Pride didn't swing for the fences and miss, they just kept making the right call, round after round. De'Von Achane slid to pick 3.09 despite projecting as RB6, Trevor Lawrence fell a full round and a half before One Pride scooped him at QB10, and Harold Fannin arrives as TE6 with legitimate upside: Njoku is gone in Cleveland, and any offensive improvement around Fannin could mean more red zone work for a tight end who already outplayed a veteran starter last year. Stack those three values alongside projected starters Justin Jefferson (WR6) and Drake London (WR7), and this roster doesn't need to get lucky, it already got smart. The one blemish is Jaylen Wright, taken nearly eight rounds ahead of his ADP, though late-round reaches hurt far less when the top of a roster is this clean. Sitting third in the division and at the 75th percentile of the field, One Pride looks like exactly what the draft record suggests: a team that consistently came out ahead.

tcbykilla61 didn't win the draft on one splashy pick. This team was built pick by pick, round by round, with a quiet consistency that adds up to something serious. The core is genuinely elite: Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Tucker Kraft at TE5 give this roster two players who project to finish near the top of their positions, and the supporting cast around them never really drops off. Drake Maye at QB2 came off the board just five picks past his ADP, a minor slip that tcbykilla61 was positioned to exploit. Sam Darnold arriving at QB21 in the eleventh round, more than two rounds after the market expected him to go, was the kind of quiet windfall that separates disciplined drafters from lucky ones. The reach on Calvin Ridley is real, and Christian Kirk at WR100 taken nearly five rounds early is the one spot where the draft grade takes a hit. But those are footnotes on a roster that lands in the 81st percentile and second in the division. The ledger tilts heavily in tcbykilla61's favor.

TheOGfantasy sits atop the Man Division at the 100th percentile, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. This is a roster built on discipline, the kind where patience at the board compounds into real advantage by the final round. Puka Nacua at WR1 is the anchor, a genuine top-of-the-market asset secured without apology, and James Cook at RB5 gives the lineup a second pillar that almost no one else in the field can match. What separates this build from merely good to genuinely clean is the value layered underneath: Bucky Irving fell nearly two rounds past his ADP, Jalen Hurts slipped more than a round before TheOGfantasy pounced, and Jaxson Dart, who carries real upside as a dual-threat passer despite some durability concerns worth monitoring, was taken at a price that prices in the risk without surrendering the ceiling. Six values and a steal across the board, zero reaches anywhere. That is not luck. That is a manager who knew exactly what they were doing and made the board prove it.
