Chitty30 sits 12th in the Star Fox division and in just the 24th percentile of the field, and there is no obvious place to look for a turnaround. The foundation is real: Jahmyr Gibbs projects as RB1, Ashton Jeanty comes in at RB7, and together they give this roster a backfield that most managers would take without blinking. But the rest of the lineup grades out as relentlessly average, and average does not climb standings. Ladd McConkey at WR20 and Terry McLaurin at WR24 are serviceable, not difference-makers. The Jalen Hurts and Dallas Goedert stack offers some upside, and Goedert quietly became the most reliable piece of the Philadelphia passing game last season, but a TE15 projection is a nice bonus, not a rescue plan. Hurts himself was a minor reach at QB9, and the draft otherwise produced zero steals and one modest value, Brenton Strange falling a round past his ADP. This roster is like a restaurant with one spectacular entrée and a menu that otherwise inspires no confidence. Gibbs and Jeanty are genuinely elite, and Chitty30 will still need most of the field to go sideways just to sneak into contention.

KSUMonkeyBoy enters 2026 sitting 11th in the Star Fox division and in just the 29th tournament percentile, and the roster gives almost no reason for optimism. The receiver group is genuinely elite, anchored by Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 and Drake London at WR7, with Zay Flowers, Jaylen Waddle, and Jordyn Tyson all projected starters behind them. That is a legitimately impressive collection. The problem is that the rest of the roster looks like it was assembled by someone who just really, really loves wide receivers and sort of forgot everything else. The backfield tops out at Jonathon Brooks at RB37, and the supporting cast of Jordan James and Jaydon Blue, a player taken six full rounds ahead of his ADP, offers little cushion. Tucker Kraft at TE5 is a bright spot, but Greg Dulcich, the projected weakest starter at TE25, was reached nearly three rounds early to get there. Coming off a 66th percentile scoring season in 2025, KSUMonkeyBoy needed an aggressive rebuild. What arrived instead was more receivers and a prayer.

Guard Trap & Waggle enters 2026 sitting 10th in the Star Fox division and hovering around the 30th percentile of the field, and the draft record does little to inspire confidence that help is on the way. The top of the roster has real pieces: Amon-Ra St. Brown projects as WR4, Patrick Mahomes sits at QB12, and Tyler Warren grades out at TE4, all legitimate contributors. But the dropoff is steep, and the draft did almost nothing to soften it. Of 19 picks graded, zero qualified as steals, and three counted as major reaches, including Bo Nix taken nearly two rounds early at QB15 and MarShawn Lloyd hauled in as RB66 with three rounds of surplus draft capital spent to get there. Those are the kinds of bets that need to hit to elevate a middling roster, and neither projection suggests they will. With weak depth grades and a draft that prioritized familiarity over value, Guard Trap & Waggle looks less like a team with a plan and more like one hoping the top of the roster carries more weight than it reasonably can.

Return of the Jetta sits ninth in the Star Fox division and projects at just the 32nd percentile of the field, and the roster construction doesn't offer much reason for optimism. The good news is real but narrow: Joe Burrow at QB4 and Justin Jefferson at WR6 give this team a legitimate top-end foundation, and Rashee Rice at WR13 adds a second projected starter worth trusting. The problem is that the floor drops off fast after those names. Quentin Johnston projects as the weakest projected starter at WR41, which means the ceiling of any given week depends heavily on a handful of players delivering simultaneously. The draft didn't generate enough surplus to paper over that concern, logging zero steals and leaning heavily on chalk. The few times the manager deviated from consensus, the results skewed toward reaches, including Darnell Mooney taken nearly three rounds early. Burrow and Jefferson are real, but this roster feels like a car that runs fine on the highway and sputters the moment traffic slows.

bsherry777 sits at 33rd percentile and eighth in the Star Fox division, and the draft board does not offer much hope for a turnaround. The receiver group is the clearest drag on the roster, with Malik Nabers (WR12) as the lone projected starter worth celebrating and Travis Hunter grading out at WR62 as the next option behind him. That is a cliff, not a depth chart. The draft did produce some genuine finds, with Omarion Hampton (RB9) sliding a full round past his ADP and Oronde Gadsden (TE16) offering real late-round value, but those wins get swallowed up by two major reaches that burned capital without delivering the upside to justify it. Cam Ward (QB23) cost bsherry777 two rounds of equity at a position the manager already addressed with Drake Maye (QB2) and Jordan Love (QB17), and Malachi Fields landed at WR90 despite being drafted nearly four and a half rounds ahead of schedule. When your most glaring weakness is also where your draft spending went least efficiently, there is no obvious lever left to pull.

dlanelaster played the draft almost perfectly on paper. Fifteen chalk picks, one genuine steal in Zach Charbonnet falling more than three rounds past his ADP, and Mark Andrews arriving a round and a half late, conveniently sliding right into a Lamar Jackson stack. The process was sound. The result is a team sitting seventh in the Star Fox division and stuck at the 41st percentile, which is the kind of outcome that should haunt a manager more than a reckless draft would, because there is nothing obvious to fix. Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Saquon Barkley at RB8 are legitimate stars, and the quarterback room with Jackson leading the way is legitimately strong. But this format is positional, and the projected starting receiver group tops out at Alec Pierce at WR32, with everyone behind him ranked WR54 or lower. dlanelaster found value everywhere value existed and still ended up with a ceiling that feels stubbornly, frustratingly average, which is the cruelest thing a draft can do to someone who did almost nothing wrong.

FlavorizeThis is the kind of team that will drive its manager absolutely crazy by March, because the pieces are right there. CeeDee Lamb at WR5 and Colston Loveland at TE3 give this roster a genuine upper tier, and the supporting cast, Chris Olave at WR11, Luther Burden at WR22, Kyle Pitts at TE7, is deep enough that a few bad breaks do not sink the season on their own. The 2025 campaign was a disaster, 8th percentile in scoring, and the rebuild has produced something more credible without quite crossing into dangerous. What separates this team from the next tier is execution on the margins: Isaiah Likely following John Harbaugh to New York, where the tight end room is thin and Likely figures to be a real part of that offense, is exactly the kind of WR13-or-TE13 upside swing that decides coin-flip weeks. Shedeur Sanders taken more than three rounds ahead of his ADP is the counterweight, a draft decision that could quietly cost the manager a close matchup or two. Division 6 at the 50th percentile is fair. The question is whether fair becomes something better when the close calls break right.

Beale St. Titans didn't swing for the fences and whiff, didn't reach for upside and pray. They just kept winning small battles until the roster quietly came together. The clearest example is Josh Allen, a QB1 who slipped to pick 1.10 despite an ADP of 1.05, the kind of minor gift that sets a tone for a whole draft. From there the manager filled out a starting-caliber group with Jonathan Taylor at RB4, Harold Fannin at TE6, and a receiving corps headlined by Tetairoa McMillan at WR15 and Marvin Harrison Jr. at WR33. The draft logged three good values against just one minor reach, a tidy ledger that reflects consistent discipline rather than any single home run. Sitting 58th percentile and fifth in the Star Fox division, the Titans are not the favorite in any room they enter, but they are built on decisions that held up, and that tends to matter more in October than it does on draft night.

timglinski enters 2026 sitting fourth in the Star Fox division and at the 65th percentile of the field, numbers that feel both fair and slightly underselling of what this roster actually is. The case for optimism starts with Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Kenneth Walker III at RB10, two projected starters who give this team a legitimate floor at the top of the lineup. But the more interesting story is how the roster got built. The board will tell you that pulling Rico Dowdle at RB32 nearly two and a half rounds before his ADP was a reach, and it is hard to argue otherwise. Yet Dowdle projects as a starter anyway, which means the gamble landed. Same with Caleb Williams, flagged as the clearest major reach of the draft and still the QB6. timglinski reached, repeatedly, and came away with starters. That is either pattern recognition or fortunate stubbornness, and after a brutal 2025 that landed in the 4th percentile in scoring, figuring out which one matters quite a lot for whether this team actually closes the gap.

bsaas25 didn't win the draft with one flashy pick. They won it with accumulation. The receiver group alone tells the story: Ja'Marr Chase at WR2, Nico Collins at WR9, Emeka Egbuka at WR18, and Davante Adams at WR25 are all projected starters, and that depth keeps producing value even as you scroll further down the board. Breece Hall at RB14 anchors the backfield, and Dak Prescott and Kyler Murray give the manager real quarterback options at QB7 and QB19 respectively. Murray's situation bears watching, coming off a lisfranc injury that ended his Arizona tenure early, but a landing spot in Minnesota where the job is reportedly his to lose keeps his ceiling intact. The draft itself was mostly chalk, which sounds boring until you realize chalk means the manager got what they paid for on nearly every selection. A 64 percent win rate and a 65th percentile finish in 2025 suggest a team that already knows how to convert a good roster into results. Third in the Star Fox Division and sitting at the 70th percentile, bsaas25 looks ready to push further.

cotteman7 doesn't have a flashy story to tell about this roster, and that's exactly the point. There was no lottery-ticket gamble that paid off, no dramatic reach that somehow worked out. There were just five picks taken after their ADP, and they add up. Brian Thomas Jr. at WR31 slid more than a round past expectations, D'Andre Swift fell over a round to land at RB24, and Zachariah Branch came in nearly two rounds late at WR75. None of those moves alone changes a season, but five of them in sequence quietly tilt the math in your favor. Add a projected starter at TE1 in Brock Bowers and a legitimate top-ten option at the position in De'Von Achane at RB6, and this roster has a real floor under it. The one blemish is Jared Goff, reached nearly two rounds early at QB16, though he does give cotteman7 a productive stack with Sam LaPorta. Sitting second in the Star Fox division and at the 71st percentile of the field, this team earned its standing one quiet advantage at a time.

Ryan2340 arrives in the Star Fox Division as its top seed and sitting at the 83rd percentile field-wide, and the blueprint is almost annoyingly straightforward: pick well, pick consistently, repeat. The receiver corps alone makes a case for the whole roster, with Puka Nacua at WR1, A.J. Brown at WR8, Garrett Wilson at WR17, and Rome Odunze at WR30 all projecting as starters. That is not luck, that is a manager who came out ahead on pick after pick. Jayden Daniels at QB5 keeps the production humming at the position, and Derrick Henry at RB12 slipping to 4.09 when his ADP sat at 4.01 counts as the one moment where the draft gave Ryan2340 a little extra. The one blemish is Jalen Tolbert, taken nearly six rounds ahead of where the market valued him and projecting all the way down at WR102. One misjudgment in an otherwise disciplined draft is something most managers would sign up for without hesitation. After a 33 percent win rate in 2025, this roster looks built to correct the record in a hurry.
