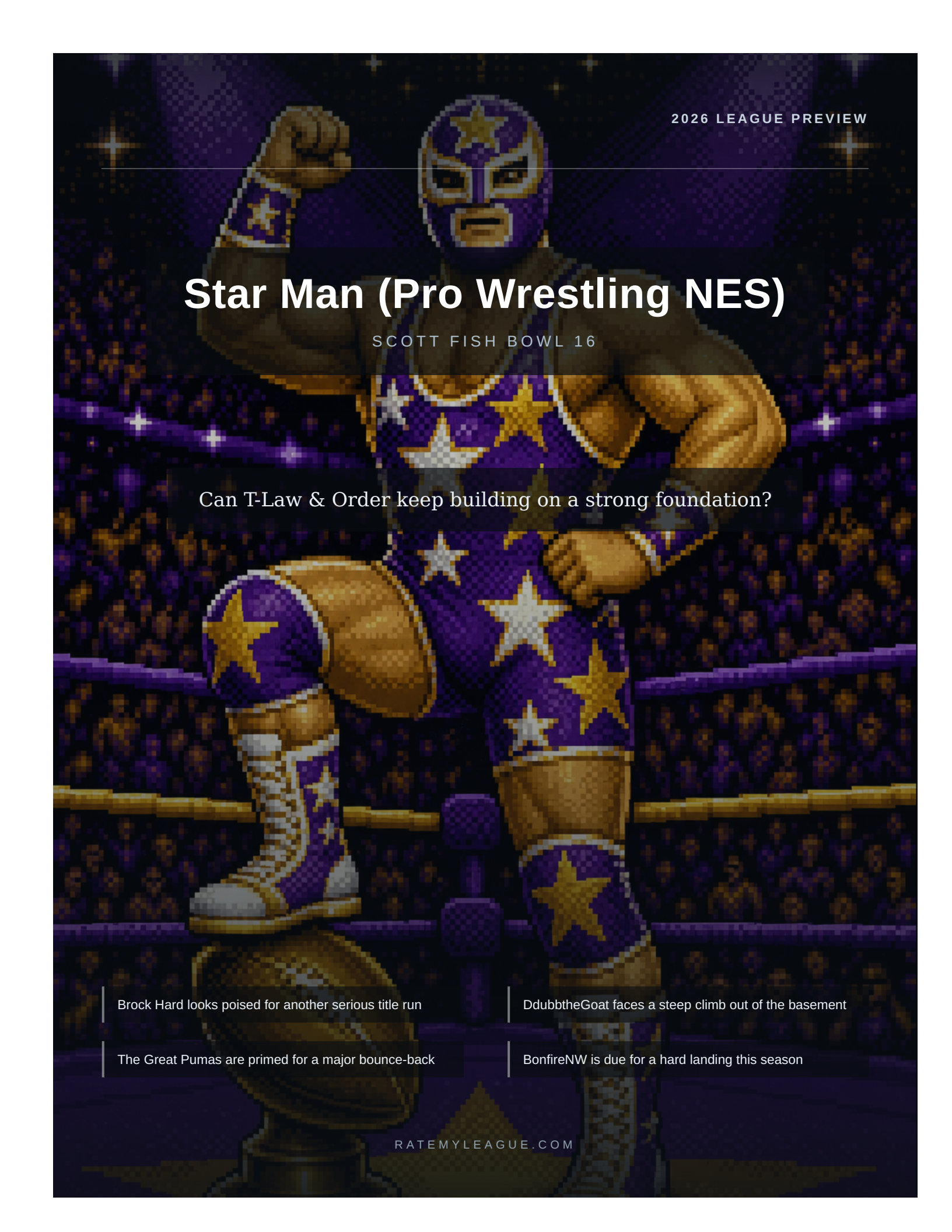

There is no way to spin what happened in the Star Man division draft, and honestly, the standings already agree: That's Monangai sits dead last in the division and at the 1st percentile of the entire field before a single week has been played. The draft tells the story cleanly. Of twenty total picks, five qualify as major reaches and eight more as minor ones, meaning this manager paid a premium for almost everything on the roster and came away with almost nothing to show for it. The headliner is Jayden Daniels, taken a full round early at 1.12, a pick so aggressive it crowded out any realistic shot at a high-end skill player in round one. And then there is Kyle Monangai, the projected weakest starter on the team, taken 2.1 rounds ahead of his ADP as if he were a prize rather than a consolation. Joe Burrow stacking with Tee Higgins gives the roster something genuine to lean on, but when the supporting cast is built on reach after reach, one good stack is a life raft, not a life jacket.

There is a version of BonfireNW that makes sense on paper: CeeDee Lamb at WR5, Christian McCaffrey sliding to RB3 after falling nearly a full round past his ADP, a wide receiver group with four projected starters ranked WR31 or better. That version won 67 percent of its matchups last year and scored in the 88th percentile. This version sits at 25th percentile in tournament projections and 11th in the Star Man division, and the distance between those two facts is where all the real questions live. The draft was almost entirely chalk, which is not inherently damning, but it means BonfireNW needed the consensus to be right, and right now the consensus says this roster underdelivers relative to its reputation. Brock Purdy, reached a round and a half early at QB13, is the clearest symptom: a draft capital commitment to a player whose upside barely justifies the cost. Last year's team felt inevitable. This one feels like a team still waiting to become what it used to be.

TouchDownHausen sits 10th in the Star Man division and in just the 34th tournament percentile, and the roster mostly explains why. The top end is real enough: Ashton Jeanty at RB7 and Saquon Barkley at RB8 give the team a legitimate foundation, and Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 is the kind of asset that can carry a week. But the shelf drops off fast, and Rashid Shaheed at WR57 projects as a starting contributor, which tells you everything about how thin the margin is. What makes the situation harder to talk yourself out of is the draft shape. Ten chalk picks and six minor reaches, mostly concentrated at tight end, suggest a manager who kept chasing positional security that never materialized into upside. Darnell Washington, taken nearly four rounds before his ADP, lands at TE38 on the projections. That is not the kind of swing that rescues a roster. Barkley falling to 4.06 was a genuine steal, but one steal does not change the arithmetic when the rest of the board reads like a slow leak.

Malinois Nation sits ninth in the Star Man division and in the bottom third of the tournament field, and the draft did little to change that trajectory. The team's most important decision came at pick 1.02, where the manager took Drake Maye a full round ahead of his ADP. Maye projects as QB2, so the logic is defensible, but burning a first-round pick on a quarterback in a positionless format is an aggressive bet that leaves the rest of the roster needing to carry extra weight. It mostly cannot. The receiver group grades out weak, with Ladd McConkey topping it at WR20 and Jayden Reed, the projected final starter, sitting at WR48. Colston Loveland at TE3 is a genuine asset, and Chase Brown at RB11 was a sensible value taken a round past his ADP, but two bright spots do not flip a roster that projects near the bottom. With three major reaches on the board and zero steals, Malinois Nation is already drawing from a shallow well heading into a long season.

DdubbtheGoat finished 2025 in the 4th percentile of scoring, and the 2026 projections aren't exactly screaming turnaround story. The roster sits 8th in the Star Man division and at just the 42nd tournament percentile, which is the kind of standing that makes a manager refresh the waiver wire at 2 a.m. hoping for a miracle. The top end is genuinely good: Josh Allen at QB1 and Justin Jefferson at WR6 anchoring a starting group that also includes Rashee Rice at WR13 and DeVonta Smith at WR14. The problem is that the drop-off after those names is steep, and the draft didn't do much to soften the landing. Three major reaches, including Josh Downs at WR46 drafted nearly two and a half rounds early and MarShawn Lloyd at RB66 taken almost six rounds ahead of schedule, suggest a manager who was already scrambling to fill out depth rather than adding from a position of strength. When your projected weakest starter is Quentin Johnston at WR41 and the draft already burned capital chasing upside that the projections haven't rewarded, there aren't many obvious levers left to pull.

BBILW is the kind of team that wins a league by staying sane while everyone else gets creative. Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and Lamar Jackson at QB3 form a genuine top-end core, and the Lamar Jackson / Zay Flowers stack gives this roster a ceiling that the division rank of seventh understates. The problem is that ceilings require floors, and the floor here is Jaylen Warren projected as the weakest starter at RB27, which means the margins between a good week and a forgettable one are razor thin. The draft was mostly chalk, fourteen picks priced close to expectation, but the major reach on Malachi Fields at three-and-a-half rounds early is the kind of dart throw that either looks brilliant or quietly haunts a playoff push. Coming off a 67 percent win rate in 2025, BBILW has the track record of a team that knows how to grind, and in a format where positionless lineups reward depth quality over everything else, Chris Olave, Zay Flowers, and Mike Evans give the margins just enough cushion to work with.

GoodyHitchDoloShoresey landed at 56th percentile in the field, sitting sixth in the Star Man division, and the draft tells you exactly why this team belongs in that conversation: not a single major reach, six legitimate values, and a starting core that holds up at every level. Drake London at WR7 and Malik Nabers at WR12 give this team two genuine difference-makers at receiver, and pairing Nabers with Jaxson Dart in a stack adds a ceiling that most managers in this field simply cannot match. Dart was the one minor reach on the board, taken about a round early, but in a positionless format where you field your best players, getting a QB11 with a direct pipeline to a WR12 is a bet worth making. Trey McBride at TE2 is the kind of quiet, structural advantage that compounds over a full season. The one question mark worth watching is Dalton Kincaid, a solid contributor when healthy but coming off a knee injury that Bills GM Brandon Beane would not fully clear heading into the year. If Kincaid gives you anything close to full availability, this roster is better than its division rank suggests.

Dirty Rotten Scoundrels didn't swing for the fences and miss, they just kept making correct decisions until the board told the story for them. The foundation is Puka Nacua at WR1, a projection that carries real weight in a positionless format where elite players at the top of the lineup set the ceiling. Garrett Wilson at WR17, Jaylen Waddle at WR23, and D.J. Moore at WR26 aren't depth pieces, they're starters, and having four receivers in the top 26 means this roster is never scrambling to fill its ten spots. De'Von Achane at RB6 adds a high-end non-receiver option that keeps the lineup flexible. The draft itself was almost aggressively sensible, seventeen chalk picks and three minor reaches, nothing that suggests hubris or panic. Kyler Murray at QB19 was taken about a round early, a mild bet that costs little if it misses. Sitting fifth in the Star Man division and in the 63rd percentile of the field, the Scoundrels aren't a long shot. They built this the quiet way, and quiet tends to hold up.

The foundation is legitimate: Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and James Cook at RB5 give this roster a backfield core that most managers in the Star Man division would take in a heartbeat, and Cook came at a modest discount, sliding to 2.08 against an ADP of 2.04. At the top of the receiving corps, George Pickens projects as WR10, a genuine difference-maker in a positionless format where quality at the top of your roster compounds quickly. The tight end group adds real depth, with Tucker Kraft at TE5 and Kyle Pitts at TE7 both projecting as starters. That 2025 résumé, a 78 percent win rate and 91st percentile scoring, tells you this manager knows how to assemble a functional roster, and this draft reads the same way: not flashy, just consistently ahead of where it needed to be.

Bijan Robinson at RB2 is the kind of foundational piece that changes a team's ceiling overnight, and the receiver group is where this roster really hums, with Nico Collins (WR9), Emeka Egbuka (WR18), Jameson Williams (WR21), Rome Odunze (WR30), and Marvin Harrison Jr. (WR33) all projected as starters. Harrison arriving as a value pick, taken more than a round after his ADP, is the kind of quiet win that separates good drafts from great ones. The manager also pairs Caleb Williams with Odunze and Jared Goff with Jameson Williams, stacking quarterback upside with receivers already in the projected lineup. Goff is easy to dismiss, but he has finished as a top-10 quarterback four straight years and brings the same Detroit weapons with him again. The Great Pumas project 79th percentile in the field, and everything about this roster says the rebound is real.

Brock Hard lands at second in the Star Man division and the 88th percentile of the field, and the draft record tells you exactly why: no dramatic swings, just a steady accumulation of equity that compounds into something real. Kenneth Walker III at RB10 and Jeremiyah Love at RB13 both fell more than two rounds past their ADPs, and Brock Hard was simply sitting there to collect them. The tight end group is where the quiet draft work becomes loud, with Brock Bowers at TE1, Sam LaPorta at TE8, Mark Andrews at TE14, and Dallas Goedert at TE15 all projecting as starters, Goedert himself arriving as a good value after falling nearly a round and a half. The Jalen Hurts and Goedert stack adds a layer of connective tissue to that investment. Then there is A.J. Brown, projected WR8 and now paired with Drake Maye in New England, a pairing that has the industry genuinely excited if Brown can stay healthy. This roster did not need a lottery ticket. It just needed the manager to keep winning the small arguments, and they did.

T-Law & Order didn't need a heist to build this roster, just a draft that kept cashing in ahead of schedule. Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 slipping to the sixth pick in the first round is the kind of quiet win that separates good drafters from great ones, and Jonathan Taylor at RB4 falling half a round past his ADP in the second is the same story told twice. Add Harold Fannin at TE6 landing a full round late in the sixth, and you start to see the pattern: this team didn't manufacture an advantage at any single moment, it accumulated one pick after pick. The starting group is loaded across the board, with Trevor Lawrence at QB10, Derrick Henry at RB12, Tyler Warren at TE4, and Travis Kelce at TE10 all projecting as legitimate contributors. The floor here is real too, a 61 percent win rate and a 78th percentile scoring finish in 2025 suggests a team that knows how to convert talent into results. Division-leading and sitting at

the 95th percentile of the field, T-Law & Order enters 2026 looking less like a surprise contender and more like the standard everyone else is chasing.
